

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.

Your Board have to present their 52nd Annual Report, in abridged form again.

The detailed lists of Subscriptions and Donations have been prepared and may be inspected at the House Governor's Office at any time.

The Annual General Meeting unanimously re-elected Major W. Harcourt Webb as President, and Mr. J. James as Honorary Treasurer.

The Board of Management, at their first Meeting of the year, unanimously re-elected Sir Sidney Law, J.P., as Chairman, and Mr. J. M. Standish as Vice-Chairman. The Standing Committees were re-elected en bloc.

Obituary.—With very deep regret, your Board report the great loss sustained during the year, by the death of Mr. J. Wardale King. Mr. King had, before being elected to the board of Management, given valuable services for a number of years in many ways. The vacancy thus created was filled by the appointment of Mr. T. Share, of Wollescote, who had been actively associated with the Hospital in connection with the Lye and Wollescote Carnival Committee, the Lye and Wollescote Egg Collection and the Contributory Fund for a very long time.

Staff .- Thanks are accorded to the Medical, Nursing, Clerical and other Staffs for their services during the year, which was probably one of the most difficult in many ways owing to the restriction on the admission of civilians, rationing and the general shortage of staff: Arrangements for the reception of convoys of wounded were put to the test and proved to have been very efficiently organised, and an atmosphere of co-operation among all those engaged was obvious. Members of the medical and surgical staff were called upon to undertake work at various Emergency Hospitals and this made it necessary, as far as was possible, for the remaining members of the staff to shoulder heavier responsibilities. The Board hope that in the near future the Honorary Staff will be sufficiently relieved to resume their normal attendances, and the Board take this opportunity of thanking the civilian population for the very tolerant manner in which they accepted the position. The nursing problem has been very much affected owing to the compulsory direction by the Ministry of Labour to other Hospitals of Nurses six months after becoming State Registered, and no adequate substitutes being provided. Your Board are aware that the nursing position generally throughout the country is most unsatisfactory and the number of probationer nurses entering the profession is gravely insufficient. The position calls for urgent and well-counselled advice as to future steps to be taken.

Preliminary Training School.—Your Board, acting upon the recommendations of the General Nursing Council for England and Wales, have decided to establish a Preliminary Training School for Nurses, and as soon as the property which they own becomes available, the necessary alterations will be carried out. It is hoped that the School will afford accommodation in the first place for 12 students for each session.

Chaplaincy.—The resignation, on account of health reasons, of the Reverend Stephen Pritt, A.K.C., was received with very much regret and the Bishop of Worcester was approached, but owing to the very difficult times the vacancy so created has not been filled, as many members of the Clergy are serving in H.M. Forces. Mr. Pritt's services are greatly appreciated and your Board tender him their warmest thanks and best wishes.

Annual Subscriptions.—£594 8s. 10d. was received from Annual Subscriptions, which was slightly less than that of the previous year. There are still many residents in the Hospital area to whom your Board feel that they must again appeal.

Gymkhana Committee.—Another very successful Gymkhana was held on August Bank Holiday Monday, as a result of which the Hospital received $\pounds 1,530$ 16s. 9d. Improvements to the Hospital grounds, particularly the jumping arena, have been carried out. To the whole o' the (ymkhana Committee and their supporters, your Board tender their most grateful thanks and hope the Committee will continue to meet with every success. **Corbett Hospital Sports Committee.**—The Corbett Hospital Sports Committee, who organised the Sports on the 22nd July, raised £288. The event was attractive and very well managed, and it is hoped it will become an annual event. Your Board take this opportunity of expressing their thanks to the Committee and supporters for their valuable work.

thanks to the Committee and supporters for their valuable work. Voluntary Association.—The Voluntary Association, under the Chairmanship of Mr. J. M. Standish, again increased their support by raising £2,094 16s. 9½d., an increase of £291 15s. 8½d. over the previous year. To the promoters of the various efforts and all who in any way assisted your Board record their high appreciation. The Hill Street Boys' School, who collected £94 1s. 0½d.; Mr. J. H. Mees, for the Rose Day collection, £244 1s. 3d.; the Midland Red 'Bus collection, £111 19s. 2d.; and the Licensed Houses, £160 4s. 6d.—especially the Foxcote Arms, Wollescote, who again won the Shield with a collection of £120; Messrs. Stuart and Sons' Athletic Club, £151 15s. 0d.; the Stourbridge Branch of the Warriors' Club, £200 as a result of the Ball; and "Anonymous Friends" of the Hospital, who raised £231 9s. 4d. by promoting Dances; Mr. W. H. Williams, who organised the Darts Competition; and the "Wollaston Special Effort," £121, per Mr. Elt, must be mentioned. The response to Mr. Standish's Appeal in connection with Christmas festivities, was again a marked success. £168 9s. 8d. was raised, and to all donors the thanks of your Board are accorded.

Contributory Fund.—The Contributory Fund raised £11,843 3s. 7d., and although the Committee experienced much difficulty owing to the absence of permanent staff, the result is considered most satisfactory, and to the Contributors. Employers, Chairman and Committee Members, your Board record their most grateful thanks. The amount raised was £400 less than in the previous year and is accounted for by the fact that a number of factories have become redundant and a large number of the workers have been transferred to other areas. It does appear probable that the rate of contribution will come up for review and contributors will be invited to increase their contributions.

Linen Fund.—The Linen Fund Committee collected £112 14s. 4d., against £124 11s. 0d. in the previous year, but this was not due to any lack of effort on the part of the honorary organisers and collectors. Probably the many calls by other charitable organisations in connection with the Services account for the decrease. The amount raised was a valuable contribution towards the cost of linen, and thanks are again tendered to the donors, honorary organisers and collectors and others who assisted in any way. The list of the amounts received from each area will be found on page 15.

General—National Health Service.—The proposals contained in a White Paper on a National Health Service have engaged the attention of your Board very much during the past year, and they feel that as far as possible every effort should be made to continue to improve facilities so that patients may derive the best service that medical and nursing ability can give.

The General Income from all sources for the year amounted to £31,593 15s. 4d., and after deduction of Expenditure, left a surplus of income of £645 19s. 9d. Various Church collections totalled £125 16s. 6d. This was slightly less than in the previous year. It is hoped that as soon as circumstances permit a Hospital Sunday Committee might be set up to cover the whole district and that a very substantial increased sum will be raised. The full year's operation of the Scales of Salaries recommended by the Rushcliffe and Hetherington Committees for Nurses and Domestic Staff accounts for an increased expenditure of over £2,000. The remainder of the expenditure compares very well with the previous year. The activity of the Hospital may be gathered from the comparative figures on page 8, and at the earliest opportune time your Board propose to review their Building programme, as the rapidly increasing demands on the Hospital are great and the accommodation suggested in the Re-building Scheme of 1934 will be inadequate. Other forms of treatment are being introduced and larger accommodation will have to be planned for, especially in the future Out-patient Department.

In conclusion, your Board thank all the donors and friends of the Hospital who have contributed in any way during the year, and hope that they may continue to enjoy their confidence. A very large number of letters of appreciation have been received from late patients.
