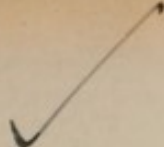

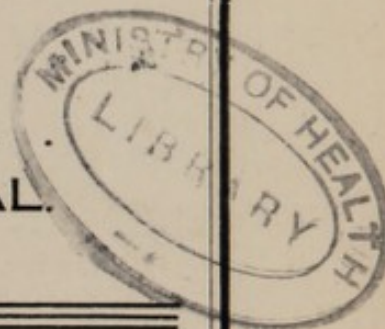

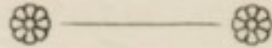

# *Report of the Board of Management*

*For the year ending June 30th, 1928.*



THE history of the Fourth Year of the Hospital has been marked by steady progress rather than by outstanding happenings, but the Board are happy to be able to present a Report no less satisfactory than the three which have preceded it.

Reference to the statistics on another page will disclose that the number of patients treated in the general wards has been rather less than last year, but, as they have remained in Hospital on the average five days longer, the number of "bed nights" spent has been considerably greater, viz.: 4638 as against 4427 and when it is remembered that, if we were to adhere strictly to the number of patients for which these wards were planned the highest possible number of "bed nights" would be 4380, it will be realized that our capacity has been fully taxed.

The number of patients availing themselves of the Private Wards has been rather less than in any year since the Hospital was opened.

Dr. W. E. Fildes has joined the Honorary Medical Staff, in the room of Dr. P. T. Catto, who has moved from the District.

Having left Congleton Mrs. Richmond retired from the Board and Mrs. F. C. Johnson was elected in her place at the last Annual Meeting, when we were also fortunate in adding Mr. Thomas Warrington to the Board.

During the year the entire interior of the Hospital was painted and decorated; much of this work had been purposely left undone when the building was newly completed.

The children at the various Schools again provided a very large number of eggs for preservation in the Spring, while many individuals sent eggs throughout the year for current use, and for store. "Pound Day" produced a very large number of parcels of useful household stores, and various gifts at different times gave proof of the interest of many people in the Hospital.

The patients were suitably entertained at Christmas time, again by the aid of special gifts, without calling upon the ordinary revenue of the Hospital.



In the past year the system, whereby the gardens had been maintained by contract, was abandoned, and, Mr. Ralph Cotterill having kindly volunteered to supervise, a local Ex-service man has been employed for two days a week, to do the necessary work, with help from the Porter, in such time as he can spare in view of his other duties. It is hoped that this experiment may prove successful. The Board feel that beautiful surroundings play no small part among the amenities of the Hospital, while the kitchen garden is of considerable practical value. Messrs. L. Pointon & Son, of Biddulph, gave, and planted in the grass, a very large number of Spring flowering bulbs, which should make a brave show next year.

It is unfortunate, in a sense, that the Carnival takes place at the beginning of the Financial Year so that by the time the Board can issue their Report, another Carnival has taken place, obscuring the memory of that to which the Report must refer. The attendance at the Carnival of 1927 was prejudicially affected by rain in the morning; the spectacle, in the Streets and in the Park, was worthy of the reputation which this event has established; and the Committee were able to pay to the funds of Hospital £200, and to slightly increase their reserve. It is now known that an even better result will be recorded next year.

The Accounts, which are presented with this Report, reveal a healthy state of affairs; in the main they speak for themselves and call for little comment.

The largest amount of income—apart from payments by patients—from any one source comes from the Industrial Fund, which, with trade still bad, has furnished £650. It is satisfactory that a larger number—88 as against 67 last year—of the wage earners, have directly benefited from their contributions by receiving free treatment.

Though there is a slight reduction in the total amount of payments by patients, those by patients in the general wards shows an increase; what loss there is is accounted for by the fact that fewer patients happen to have belonged to those Approved Societies, which make payment for Hospital Treatment by way of "Additional Benefits," and by the smaller number of Private patients.

The amount of General Donations and Subscriptions is not so much less than in the previous year as at first appears, as in that year the proceeds of "Alexandra Rose Day" were included under that heading, while this time they are separately entered: there are, however, some Subscribers of former years whose names we miss in this year's list, we hope to see a double entry against their names next time, and we also hope to enlist new Subscribers.

Receipts under "Invested Funds" are less, because last year there was a larger repayment of Income Tax than will occur again, and because substantial repairs to the Old Hospital property became imperative.

The Payments in the Revenue Account remain fairly constant; that for "Surgery and Dispensary" varies from year to year according to the stock of Drugs, Dressings, &c., remaining in hand, and to the need for new apparatus; this item shows a substantial reduction as compared with the previous year. "Laundry and Cleaning" also is considerably less as more washing was done on the premises, which to some extent accounts for the higher figure under "Salaries and Wages," which increase also includes the salary of an additional Probationer employed for a time, and her employment rendered unnecessary the engagement of temporary help, so that no expenditure appears this year for "Extra Nursing."

The sale of silver paper appears for the first time among our receipts, having produced the welcome sum of £12, representing no small amount of consideration and trouble on the part of many.

The "Capital Account" shows a notable increase in our Invested Funds, most of which was made possible by a legacy of £40 left by the late Sergeant James Doran, a gift of £500 from the Administrators of the late Mr. W. T. Keeling, and a gift of £100 from the Misses Hollinshead, all of which the Board very gratefully acknowledge.

In the course of the year it became evident that the Scheme for provision of Emergency Wards and additional bedrooms for the Staff—to which reference has been made in earlier Reports—should be no longer postponed, and, though no definite action was taken within the year, the Board feel that a short statement of what has since been done is due to our Supporters. Tenders for the erection of a block containing 2 Emergency Wards and 6 bedrooms, to the plans and specifications of Mr. J. Herbert Hall, of Manchester, were called for, and that of Messrs. T. & E. Cooke, of Congleton, for a sum of £2770 was accepted and the work is now proceeding. Towards this cost, and that of equipping the new block, Mrs. Moseley has given £1000 which she had promised in memory of her late husband, Mr. David Moseley, and for which we are deeply grateful, and the Board propose to devote to this purpose the £300 standing to the credit of the Capital Account at the end of the year, and a further £100 of the £300 since received from the 1928 Carnival. Although the provision of the extra bedrooms will cause a saving of rent for outside rooms, which represents a capital sum of some £650, so that an expenditure of this amount of capital would not reduce the income of the Hospital, the Board are anxious, if possible, to avoid encroaching upon their invested Funds. A Committee of Ladies will shortly be taking steps to raise additional money; the Board are very grateful to them for undertaking this, and commend their efforts to the liberal support of the Public.

The thanks of the Board are due to so many bodies and individuals that it is quite impossible to name them all; other individual supporters, however, will not resent our making special mention of Mrs. Saxon and



Brigadier General Sir William Bromley Davenport, each of whom has every year provided a very handsome sum, the former by organising a Dance, and the latter from the Capesthorpe Theatricals.

We are very deeply indebted to the Contributors to the Industrial Fund and their Committee, to those responsible for the arrangements for and success of the Carnival, to the Collectors of Subscriptions, to the Donors of Money and Gifts, and to all members of the Public who have helped in so many ways.

The Board must also again place on record their high appreciation of the services rendered to the Hospital by those connected with its administration—the Honorary Medical Staff and the Consultants whom they have called in—the Matron and her Nursing and Domestic Staff, who have earned the good word of Doctors, Patients, and Board alike—the Honorary Secretary, Treasurer and Auditor—and last, but not least, the Assistant Secretary, Mr. F. E. Garwood, who by his indefatigable efficiency has lightened the labours of the Honorary Officials, and done much to ensure the smooth working of the Hospital.

The Board trust that the Public generally by, their continued support, will enable them to maintain unimpaired the valuable service which is undoubtedly rendered to the District by the Hospital.

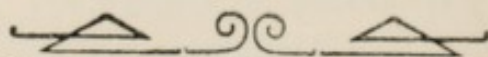
