Report of the Board of Management

For the year ending June 30th, 1929.



The experience gained after 5 years working of the Congleton War Memorial Hospital enables the Board to report with confidence to the Public that the Institution is rendering an ever increasing service to the District, and that, so keen and widespread is the interest taken in its welfare, we may fairly hope to continue, and even improve, upon that service.

The statistics, which we publish herewith, reveal that the number of patients "bed nights" has been no less than 842 in excess of the number recorded last year—the number of patients treated in the General Wards is greater by 57, and of those in Private Wards by 16.

The outstanding features of the year's events have been the completion and opening of the extension, whereby accommodation has been provided for emergency cases, which it is desirable to segregate for a time from the General Wards, and for the larger staff, which soon after the Hospital was opened was found to be necessary. The extension was opened on May 25th, by Lord Moynihan, the President of the Royal College of Surgeons, who both at the Town Hall, and at the Hospital, proved that he is as skilful with the tongue as with the knife.

We refer to the financing of this extension later in our report.

Vacancies on the Board are occasioned by the lamented death of Mr. Sam Burgess, and by the fact that Mrs. Moseley has left the neighbourhood: though Mr. Burgess had been prevented by the state of his health from very frequent attendances at meetings, the Hospital had no warmer friend: while Mrs. Moseley by her munificent gift of £1,000 towards the extension, and by her great interest and work for the Hospital, had proved herself a supporter whom we can ill afford to lose.

The various annual efforts for the Hospital were again most successful—Egg Week—as always largely owing to the enthusiasm of the Schoolchildren, again produced an ample supply of eggs, for storing. "Pound Day" produced more gifts of groceries etc. than ever, but the peripatetic collection carried out by the Bright Young People, to whom we owe so much, made it impossible to publish as hitherto an accurate list of donors: while the Carnival of 1928, thanks to the hard work of Committee and participants, furnished £300.

The figures in the Accounts do not show many noteworthy variations from last year. Donations and Subscriptions are rather less, probably owing to the fact that Donations were, during the year being solicited—and generously given—to the extension Fund. Church

collections show a notable increase due to the Services of Thanksgiving for the King's recovery, while the Industrial Fund, which we have come to regard as one of our main pillars of support, has given us an extra £50. On the expenditure side such increases as there have been are no more than could be expected having regard to the increased number of patients.

Our endowments have again been increased by the legacies of £100 each left by the late Mr. Joseph Worrall and Mr. William Billington, which have been invested.

It will be seen from the Accounts, which accompany this Report, that those relating to the Extension have not been finally closed: it is, however, possible to say while the expenditure has, through economies effected in carrying out the work—in which matter we owe much to our Architect, Mr. Herbert Hall, and to Mr. Garwood, our Assistant Secretary, who acted as Clerk of the Works—been less than was anticipated, we are within measurable distance of providing for the whole cost without having recourse to any invested capital.

Apart from Mrs. Moseley's gift of £1,000, to which reference has been made, and some substantial sums which the Board have been able to provide from revenue, a very large proportion of the cost has been furnished by a Ladies Extension Fund Committee—with Mr. A. Stuart Johnson as its indefatigable Treasurer—who have secured a splendid response to their appeal for donations and under whose auspices Mrs. J. Saxon has—with an infinite amount of energy—organised a "Mile of Sixpences" Scheme, which, if it has not quite reached the mile, has produced £275.

It is difficult, when recording thanks due to a number of people each year, to avoid the appearance of doing it as a mere matter of form—the Board would, however, have it believed that they do owe, and feel, very real gratitude to the Medical Staff, the Matron and Nursing and Domestic Staff, the Honorary Secretary, Treasurer and Auditors, and last but not least of the Establishment to the Assistant Secretary, and also to their supporters generally, The Carnival Committee, The Industrial Fund Committee, the League of Remembrance, of Marlboro Gate, London, by whom a large amount of voluntary needlework has been done, Collectors, Donors of gifts of money and every individual, who has in any way helped to make this, our fifth year, compare so favourably with the years which have gone before, and so productive of encouragement in anticipating the years to come.

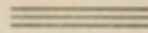
