### Annual Report of the Board of Management, 1940

The Board of Management presents to the Subscribers the Annual Report of the work of the Hospital, and the Honorary Treasurer's Statement of Accounts for the year.

The number of In-patients treated to a conclusion was 2,674, a decrease of 105, and the daily average of beds occupied 133.26, a decrease of 11.18 as compared with 1939. The weekly cost of each patient was £3 4s.  $3\frac{1}{2}$ d. compared with £2 15s.  $9\frac{1}{2}$ d. in the preceding year.

The number of new Out-patients was 13,658, being an increase of 1,448, and the total number of attendances was 63,090, an increase of 5,190.

The Income, after transferring £660 os. 10d. to the Legacy Account was £28,291 4s. 2d., an increase of £4,854 9s. 1d., and Expenditure £28,425 9s. 1d., an increase of £1,719 18s. od., leaving a deficiency of £134 4s. 11d.

Expenditure during the year has of necessity been quite abnormal, but owing to a certain Government grant, and to splendid support given by the public, the year closes with a much smaller deficiency than might have been expected.

One of the most striking schemes for the benefit of the Hospital is that which was organised by the Sportsmen of the district, who with the invaluable aid of "Silver Fox" raised a sum of no less than £1,252 os. od.

Satisfactory as the financial position may sound at the moment, it must be remembered that as soon as circumstances permit the Board will be faced with a heavy expenditure in providing a new Out-patient Department, together with additional beds for patients, both of which objects are absolutely essential if the Hospital is to carry out efficiently the work for which it exists. A certain number

of beds are now reserved for Air-raid casualties, and were used for this purpose during the Raid last year, and for this reason the number of ordinary In-patients shows a certain decrease compared with the preceding year. This reduction of available beds, combined with a large growth in the population of the district, has strained our accommodation to the utmost, and it is much regretted that many patients have been kept waiting a long time for admission.

The Workers' Contributions show a large increase, and Mr. Stanley T. Davis, the organiser, is heartily to be congratulated upon the success of his untiring efforts, in which he received most valuable assistance from the collectors.

An agreement has been made with the Children's Hospital at Battledown whereby that Institution will receive some of our patients when occasion arises, and so far as accommodation permits. The Children's Hospital now shares the benefit of our Contribution Scheme, so that Contributors can send their children to that Institution without any further payment.

#### Gold Medal.

The Medal was won this year by Nurse Alice Florence Harris, who obtained the highest number of marks for nursing and conduct. Nurse Gladys Margaret Cameron, from the affiliated Hospital at Evesham, was awarded the book prize.

To all who have rendered assistance during the year the Board is deeply grateful, both to those who have carried on ordinary peace-time work, and also to those who have performed war-time duties in securing the safety of the Hospital against results of enemy action.

### Board of Management and Medical.

The death of Mr. T. D. Deighton was a serious loss to this Hospital, for he had most justly earned a very high reputation in the profession to which he belonged. Fortunately it was found possible to obtain Mr. G. N. Barker's release from the Army, and he was appointed Ear, Nose and Throat Surgeon in place of Mr. Deighton; a position he fills with conspicuous ability.

Among those closely associated with the Hospital who have passed away are Mr. W. L. Mellersh, Mr. A. W. Bryant, Mr. W. H. Horsley; also Mr. L. O. Hiscock, for many years a most faithful servant.

The Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff have earned the gratitude of all concerned for the patience, skill and care they have invariably shown in the treatment of those under their charge.

The Board also wishes to express high appreciation of the valuable help rendered by Dr. J. R. Collins, Mr. Victor Bonney, Mr. A. Leeming, Mr. N. Pike, Dr. A. Tom and Miss F. K. Costello, who have so freely given their services to make good the temporary depletion of our Staff owing to the call of military duties.

There have been many changes on the Resideut Staff, and at the present time Mrs. A. W. Mucklow is House Physician, Mr. D. Dangerfield, House Surgeon, and Mrs. D. K. Souper, House Surgeon to the Eye, Ear and Throat Department.

It is hardly possible to speak too highly of the services rendered by the Matron, (Miss Fox-Davies) in these most trying times, while the Sisters and Nurses under her charge have shown the greatest courage in facing Air-raid warnings, and have carried out their duties under exceptionally difficult circumstances.

The Secretary, Mr. J. Cumming Smith, and his Staff, are much to be congratulated for the way in which they have faced their task which has been largely increased by the multitude of forms to be filled up for the benefit of various Government Departments.


