## Draft Report for the Year 1942.

---

The year was an uneventful one, the work of the Hospital going on normally. The average number of beds occupied throughout the year was 34. At the end of the year there were 36, the largest number that can be taken in war-time. The health of the children was exceptionally good, with no infectious diseases.

The children had a very festive Christmas, with Christmas trees kindly given by Mrs. Herries, gifts from the Duke and Duchess of Gloucester, as usual, and many others, and also entertainments.

The Committee desire to express their grateful thanks for all the help the Hospital received in the way of voluntary service, gifts of all kinds, and entertainments for the children, who much enjoy them.

Monetary gifts received from dances and the opening of the grounds of "Emmetts," Ide Hill, were again allocated to the "Blue Bird" Fund (for adding a Staff Dining-room and other capital expenditure after the war.) The details of these receipts are shown on page 9. Especial thanks are due to Mr. H. G. Hawkes for the substantial sums obtained from dances held at the Amherst Arms Hotel, but all smaller contributions are most gratefully received.

The sum of £105 given by the Kent County Constabulary from the proceeds of the Variety Entertainment in Warships Week, was a very welcome addition to the Hospital Funds. This was invested in Savings Bonds on behalf of the General Fund.

Very successful Pound Days were again held, the pounds totalling over 2,700 and the money £47 19s. 6d., a record sum.

The Committee congratulate Sir John Laurie on becoming a Baronet at the conclusion of his very successful year of office as Lord Mayor of London.

With the death of Sir Edward Meyerstein the Hospital lost a most generous benefactor, who will be greatly missed. The Committee regret also the death of Mr. Sydney Thompson, brother of the late Canon H. P. Thompson, for many years a Trustee, Chairman and Chaplain of the Hospital.

In memory of Miss Marion Rose, old nurses and patients gave four electric clocks to the Hospital. A memorial plate will be fixed below the clock in the entrance hall.

No Sale of the children's work was held, but it is hoped to have one in the summer of 1943.

The Hospital Savings Group went ahead splendidly, the total for the year being £217 17s., including over £45 contributed in Warships Week.

The Committee regret the departure from Sevenoaks of the Rev. N. Scorer, who for a long time conducted the Sunday morning Service in Rose Ward, and always took a great interest in the Children. Mr. and Miss Waters have very kindly taken his place, and their help is much appreciated, as is that of all the Sunday School teachers.

The Committee tender their thanks to all the Officers and Staff of the Hospital, and especially to Mr. G. Young, who again audited the accounts free of charge.
