REPORT FOR 1946.

The year 1946 was a sad one in the history of the Hospital in that, owing to the impossibility of obtaining the necessary nursing and domestic staff, it was forced to close at the end of July, after carrying on its work for children for 74 years, the only break being owing to the flying-bomb attacks in 1944 when it was temporarily closed from July 25th 1944 to February 8th, 1945. Since that re-opening there had never been enough staff to use both wards. The utmost praise is due to the staff which carried on in ever decreasing numbers through the first half of 1946.

At first it was hoped to be able to re-open through affiliation with a larger hospital, and several of these were approached with this end in view, but, owing to the policy of regionalisation foreshadowed in the National Health Bill, these negotiations came to nothing. At the same time the Chevne Hospital for Children, which had left its Chelsea hospital at the outbreak of war and was unable to get the use of it again, was looking out for premises to rent, and eventually the Trustees of the Hip Hospital arranged to let it to the Cheyne Hospital for a vear at least from Christmas, 1946. A Special General Meeting of Subscribers was called on November 1st to obtain their consent to this arrangement, and it was felt that no better use could be made of the hospital under the circumstances. Instead of standing empty it would be doing good work for children requiring long treatment and ineligible for admission to ordinary hospitals. The Meeting therefore endorsed the action of the Trustees. The Committee of Cheyne Hospital were most anxious that some members of the Hip Hospital Committee and other friends should retain their interest in the Hospital although inhabited by new children, and there is no doubt that a very warm welcome will be given to Chevne.

This change necessitated the retirement of Miss Reid, Matron of the Hip Hospital for nearly 9 years, and the gratitude of all its supporters is due to her for her magnificent work throughout that time, which included the most difficult years of its history during the war.

Miss Sharpe will also be retiring after over 26 years as Secretary, though she will continue to attend to the Hip Hospital correspondence and accounts. The Committee are most grateful to her for all the work she has done,

At their Meeting on 1st November, 1946, the Committee were very glad indeed to vote pensions to Miss Reid and to Miss Sharpe, both of which have been so very well earned and for which the recipients have expressed their gratitude; this recommendation was cordially confirmed at the (Special) General Meeting of the same date.

Although The Cheyne Hospital will pay all the running expenses, the Hip Hospital will still be responsible for structural repairs and maintenance, so it is hoped that some of the regular subscribers, especially those who signed covenants, will continue their support, though the Committee will quite understand if others do not. This whole question must be reviewed in the light of circumstances after the appointed day, April 1st, 1948, for the new National Health Service to begin.

In spite of no Maintenance Fees coming in after July the accounts show a credit balance due to the receipt of several substantial unexpected sums, including a legacy of £100 from the late Miss A. M. Styan, formerly an indefatigable worker on behalf of the Hospital and one of its leading voluntary Teachers before the days of the Hospital School; a legacy of £50 from the late Mrs. Reece, who delighted to visit the Hospital up to within a short time of her death; £226 15s. 6d. in memory of the late Roy Vinson contributed by his friends; and £100 from Mr. J. L. Fuller in memory of his wife. It was the wish of the donors of the last two amounts that the money should be spent on some special equipment for the benefit of the children. but this was not feasible during the year and the money was temporarily invested. A final payment from the estate of the late Mr. R. F. Baker was received during the year but, as this was bequeathed to Capital, the amount (£1,220 4s. 2d.) is shown in the Balance Sheet and not among the donations.

A letter was received from the Private Secretary to our President, The Duke of Gloucester, soon after his return from Australia, saying how sorry His Royal Highness was to hear that the Hospital had had to close for the present, but was glad that Cheyne Hospital was making use of it.

Mrs. Dinwiddy and Mr. B. Crosbie-Hill resigned from the Committee and Mr. H. P. Archer was elected to it.

The Committee thank most warmly all those who helped the Hospital during the year by voluntary services or by gifts in money or kind. The list of special donations to the "Blue Bird" Fund, which has now reached a total of £1,020 2s. 3d., will be found on page 10.

The Sevenoaks Presbyterian Church continued to hold their Sunday Services at the Hospital throughout the year, and on two occasions Hugh Ward, being empty, was lent to Kippington Parish for Sales of Work; all concerned expressed their appreciation of the kindness of the Committee in letting the parish use the ward, the brightness of which helped considerably in making the Sales a success. The Women's Section of Toc H. held their weekly meetings at the Hospital during the first quarter, but after that were able to return to the Toc H. Headquarters in High Street.

The Committee once more express their thanks to the Matron and Staff, to all the Officers, and to Mr. G. Young, who again audited the accounts free of charge.

Finally we must console ourselves with the fact that our Hospital continues to minister to the welfare and happiness of children who are ill, and to restore them to health, for that the Hospital was built and we must try to ensure that under the new Health Act it will continue to do this, no matter under what name or by the aid of what individuals.
