

REPORT FOR 1938.

The General Committee have pleasure in submitting the Annual Report and Audited Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1938.

1. The late Mr. F. H. Melland. Although this report deals with the year ending 31st December, 1938, the Committee feel it would be incomplete without reference to the very great loss the Hospital has sustained through the tragic death of its Chairman, Mr. Frank Hulme Melland, on the 3rd February, 1939.

Mr. Melland's connection with the Hospital had lasted for nearly 10 years during the whole of which time the work of the Hospital was one of his chief interests. He held the positions of Secretary, Treasurer and Chairman, the latter position for two periods of 2 years each. During his term as Secretary he was responsible for a complete revision of the Hospital constitution which was ultimately embodied in a formal scheme sanctioned by an order of the Charity Commissioners. Melland represented the Hospital on various official bodies including the Surrey Regional Committee of the British Hospitals Association and the Surrey Voluntary Hospitals Consultative Committee.

Mr. Melland's wide knowledge of Hospital work made him an ideal Chairman; there was no subject discussed at Committee Meetings to which he could not make a useful and interesting contribution and his place will be very hard to fill.

- 2. Legacies and Donations. During the year legacies of £50 each were received from the Trustees of the Will of J. H. Stevens deceased (per Lloyds Bank Ltd.) and from the Trustees of the Will of T. C. Fitton deceased. The Caterham and Warlingham U.D.C. very kindly increased their annual donation from £50 to £100 and an anonymous benefactor sent a donation of £50.
- 3. Income Expenditure and Statistics., Income from all sources was £3,756. 2s. 3d, shewing an increase of £306. compared with 1937. Expenditure was £3,983. 10s. 11d., shewing an increase of £110. At the end of the year the Hospital current account at the Bank was overdrawn to the extent of £136. 17s. 10d. Full details of the income and expenditure appear in the accounts but attention may be directed to one or two items.

It will be observed that there has been a very welcome increase of some £180 in donations whilst receipts from Patients


(including X-Ray fees) shew an increase of £330.

There is a serious drop in the receipts from the Penny a Week Collection Fund, but this is explained by the fact that the new Ladies Committee (see Paragraph 12) has not been functioning very long and very much better results are expected next year.

The receipts from the Hospital Gala shew a decrease of nearly £100, but this is attributable to the fact that for the first time Whyteleafe held its own Hospital Week and did not join with Caterham as in previous years. The excellent result of the Whyteleafe Gala is referred to later in this report.

During the year the number of In-patients received was 408; of this number 282 were surgical and 126 were medical cases, 268 were cured, 71 relieved, 27 remained in statu quo, 20 were transferred to other Institutions and 22 died. 252 operations were performed during the year. The number of Out-Patients' attendances during the year was 443. In the Massage Department 493 treatments were given and 240 Electrical Treatments. In the X-Ray Department 353 cases were dealt with.


The Hospital has 25 beds in all, 14 for women and children,

6 for men, and there are 5 Private Wards.

- 4. The Treasurership. The Committee regret to record the resignation, on the ground of ill health, of Mr. G. R. White from the position of Treasurer which he had held for over seven years. The Committee have, however, been most fortunate in securing the services of Mr. L. W. A. Herbert of Ninehams, Caterham, as Mr. White's successor.
- 5. Resignations from Committee. The Committee very much regret to record the retirement from the Committee of Mr. A. A. Meredith, Mr. R. P. Nyren and Mr. H. D. Greenwood. In view of the many services rendered to the Hospital not only by Mr. A. A. Meredith but also by his father the late Mr. A. J. R. Meredith, the Committee appointed Mr. A. A. Meredith to be a Vice-President and a Life Governor of the Hospital.
- 6. Exterior Decoration. It was reported during the year that the exterior of the Hospital buildings required attention as they had not been painted or decorated since 1927. Although the lowest estimate was £85, the Committee felt that the matter could not be delayed and the work was put in hand. The thanks of the Committee are due to Mr. H. R. Martin for kindly preparing a specification and for supervising the work.
- 7. Woldingham Horticultural Society's Garden Scheme. The Committee are happy to record the success which attended the inauguration of the Woldingham Horticultural Society's Garden Scheme. Under this scheme residents in Woldingham were invited to open their gardens to the public without charge and collections were made on behalf of the Hospital. In all approximately £50 was raised, and the thanks of the Committee are due to Mr. G. Moore and his Committee who organised the scheme on behalf of the Woldingham Horticultural Society, for this excellent work. It is sincerely hoped that the scheme will this year be extended to other parts of the district. The Committee would be most grateful if any garden owners, who are willing to co-operate will communicate either with the Secretary of their local Horticultural Society or with the Hospital Secretary as soon as possible, as lists of gardens to be opened during the Summer are being prepared.
- 8. Hospital Gala. This year's Gala was again very successful, a total sum of £245. 6s, 0d. being handed to the Hospital for its general funds. The grateful thanks of the Committee are due to all those who took part in the Gala Week activities, but special mention should be made of the assistance rendered by the President, Mr. James Blair, Mr. A.

- E. Hammond, who acted as Chairman of the Gala Committee, Mr. J. A. Pattenden who acted as Secretary and Mr. Sanders, the Treasurer.
- 9. Warlingham Hospitals Week. This year the Warlingham Hospitals Week was again run as a separate function and resulted in a cheque for £30 being handed to the Hospital for which the Committee express their thanks.
- 10. Whyteleafe Gala Week. For the first time Whyteleafe held their own Hospital Gala celebrations. At the special request of the Whyteleafe Gala Committee, the Hospital Committee agreed to allocate the proceeds to the building fund for the proposed new Hospital, and no less a sum than £150 has been placed on deposit at the Bank for this purpose.
- 11. Hospital Dance. This event took place on the 20th January, 1939, and resulted in a profit of £29. 10s. 0d. Thanks are particularly due to Mrs. F. T. Hill and Miss M. Nettleton for the work done by them in organising the Dance, and to the School Managers for the use of the Hall at the Central School at Wapses Lodge.
- 12. Penny-a-week Collection Boxes. The work of organizing the distribution and collection of boxes has kindly been undertaken by Mrs. J. Blair. Sub-Committees of ladies have been formed in the various districts and have done splendidly. Mrs. Enriquez has taken charge of Chaldon, Mrs. Rees-Davies of Whyteleafe, Mrs. Henderson of Woldingham, Mrs. Grant of Warlingham and Mrs. Meredith of Caterham Valley. Toc H have kindly taken charge of the Caterham Hill District, and it is hoped to have a complete canvas of all districts completed at an early date.

If any readers of this report would like a box, or if there are any boxes which have been overlooked and require to be emptied, a 'Phone call or a note to the Treasurer at the Hospital or to Mrs. Blair (Caterham 35) will at once be attended to.

13. Linen Guild. The thanks of the Committee are extended to all who are helping to continue the useful work of the Linen Guild. The Woldingham Group (20 members) has undertaken to overhaul and repair the linen and members of this group visit the Hospital for one morning each week. This valuable assistance is organized by Mrs. Frank Elliott of "The Larches," Woldingham, who would be pleased to welcome new members. The Whyteleafe members are making certain articles such as sheets, dressing cloths and slings, and other members are helping in the making of hot water bottle covers, operation stockings and children's garments. To subscribers to the Guild the grateful thanks of the Committee are extended

and their continued interest invited, and to those who would like to join the Linen Guild as helpers or subscribers particulars will be willingly supplied by the Matron. Particulars of the Linen Guild account will be found on page 14.

- 14. Silver and Tinfoil. A quantity of silver, tin and lead foil has been received and sent for sale during the year. The amount realised was £4. 1s. 5d. It is felt that this sum could be considerably increased if everyone in this District would save their silver paper for the Hospital, instead of throwing it away.
- 15. General Committee. This Committee and the General Purposes Committee have met alternately each month during the year. The late Mr. F. H. Melland was elected Chairman of the General Committee for the second year in succession and Mr. A. E. Hammond was re-elected Chairman of the General Purposes Committee. Doctors Hodgson-Jones, F. Heber, H. Rees Davies, P. Thwaites and Trafford were nominated by the Caterham and District Medical Society to serve on the General Committee. As there were several vacancies on the General Committee, Mr. H. F. Hazelden of Warlingham was co-opted on to this Committee and he is eligible for re-election.
- 16. Annual General Meeting of Subscribers. This was held on the 18th May, 1938, at the Soper Memorial Hall. The Chair was taken by Mr. E. T. Parkes of Woldingham. The President, Mr. Harry Lloyd, and the Vice-Presidents were reelected. Messrs. L. W. Paul, H. D. Greenwood, A. E. Hammond and the late Mr. F. H. Melland were reelected to the General Committee. The Hon. Secretary and the Hon. Treasurer presented their reports which were duly adopted, following which the late Mr. F. H. Melland gave details of the proposal to build a new Hospital as mentioned in the previous year's report. At the close of his address the matter was submitted to the vote and received unanimous approval.
- 17. Details of the amounts received from the Alexandra Day Collections, Pound Day, League of Mercy, Help Yourself Fund, etc., appear in the accounts. The Committee again express their thanks to all who have helped in any way during the year; to the donors of gifts in kind, and also to the Local Press for kindly inserting notices, etc., free of charge.
- 18. A special debt of gratitude is again due to the Honorary Auditors, Messrs. Chalmers, Wade & Co., for so kindly auditing the Accounts and preparing the Balance Sheets, etc., to the Caterham and Warlingham Urban District Council for the use of the Council Chamber for Committee Meetings, to

- Mr. F. G. Brind for organising the Hospital Cup Football Competitions; and to the various Clubs for their kind support.
- 19. The credit for the efficiency of the Hospital is due to the members of the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff, X-Ray, Massage and Electrical Staff, to the members of the local Medical Society, and to the Matron, Sisters, Nurses and Staff who have given such loyal and unstinted service to the Hospital.


