

COVENANTED SUBSCRIPTIONS TO THE CARDIFF ROYAL INFIRMARY.

THE INCOME TAX ALREADY PAID BY THE SUBSCRIBER RECOVERABLE BY THE INFIRMARY.

* The Income of Charities is exempt from Income Tax, and if a Subscriber, who is an Income Tax payer, is prepared to covenant by deed to pay a regular annual subscription for a period of seven years, it is now possible for the Infirmary to recover the tax which has been paid by the subscriber, and so to increase the amount actually received by the Infirmary by 25 per cent. without increasing the amount payable by the subscriber.

A subscription of £1 hitherto paid to the Infirmary represents a gross amount of 25s., from which 5s. has been deducted for Income Tax.

Under this scheme the subscriber will covenant to set aside from his gross income 25s. annually for the benefit of the Infirmary. He will pay his Income Tax as before, and will forward to the Infirmary his usual net subscription of £1, and he will fill in a form (which will be supplied by the Office), stating that he has paid Income Tax at the rate of 4s. in the £, amounting to 5s. The Infirmary will then be able to claim repayment of the 5s., and the £1 subscription will appreciate to 25s. In like manner a £5 subscription will appreciate to £6 5s. Od., a £10 subscription to £12 10s. Od., and so on, pro rata. Further, the subscriber, if liable to Super Tax, can obtain relief from such tax in respect of the subscription and the Income Tax thereon.

It is proposed to invite any subscribers of sums from £1 upwards, who feel that they can thus bind themselves to maintain their subscriptions for a period of seven years, to sign the necessary covenant, and so increase the funds available for the Infirmary.

The scheme cannot be made retrospective, and can apply only to subscriptions that are paid after the necessary Deed has been signed, and, of course, only to those who pay Income Tax.

Any subscriber who is willing to adopt this scheme is requested to write to the Secretary at the Infirmary Office, 67, Newport Road, Cardiff, who will then prepare and furnish the necessary Deed of Covenant for completion by the subscriber. This Deed, when completed, will be returned to the Office for safe custody.

N.B.—In case of the death of a subscriber within the seven years the Agreement becomes void and does not create any charge on his or her estate.



Board of Management meets Quarterly.

ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT FOR THE YEAR 1927.

Owing to the continuance of acute depression in our principal industries, the period covered by the Ninety-first Annual Report of the Board of Management of the Cardiff Royal Infirmary, has been one of great difficulty. The Board are, nevertheless, able to report that they have been able to conclude the year with a credit balance of £1,413 19s. 0d. Having regard to the difficult circumstances of the time this is at least an earnest of our endeavours to avoid piling up a load of depressing and crippling debt.

It must be borne in mind, however, that the accumulated debt due to loss of revenue during and subsequent to the Ccal dispute still remains, and is shewn in the amount of our overdraft.

Much as we should like to extend the work of the Infirmary, we feel that the best interests of all will be served by wise conservation of our resources, and whilst we have not hesitated to open new wards—e.g., the Ware Ward—when the way seemed fairly clear, we have thought it prudent to keep before our minds the business man's ideal of paying his way.

The Work of the Infirmary.

Fortunately, we have been able to do this without reducing the activities of the Infirmary below the standard to which we have recently been accustomed. On the contrary, the figures given in the Report of the Medical Superintendent show that the average daily number of occupied beds was practically the same in 1927 as in 1926, viz., 328.9 against 328.6. There was a decrease in the actual number of patients treated. In 1927, 4,765 inpatients were treated to a conclusion as compared with 4,921 in 1926. This decrease was due to an unfortunate case of smallpox discovered early in the year. Only very urgent cases were admitted during the subsequent period of quarantine and the total admissions were consequently lower.

We may here take the opportunity of paying a tribute to the Infirmary staff and also to Dr. Picken, the Medical Officer of Health, for the great promptitude and care with which this grave emergency was dealt with. No other case of smallpox developed, and except for the necessary period of quarantine, the work of the Infirmary was not interrupted, whilst the patients were made happily secure against any chance of infection.

The number of out-patients treated during the year was very much greater than in 1926, namely, 30,078 as against 28,513, and it is satisfactory to record that the waiting list for Ophthalmic out-patients has been extinguished.

It is worthy of note that in recent years the average cost per Reduced occupied bed has been substantially reduced, as the following Bed. per figures show:

1924. 1925. 1926. 1927. £155 11s. 4d. £149 19s. 2d. £153 2s. 7d. £144 10s. 2d.

It will be noticed that there was a check in the progressive reduction in 1926, but this was due to the abnormal cost of coal during the coal dispute.

There has been a reduction, too, in the cost of treating outpatients, the figures for the same years being :-

1924. 1925. 1926. 1927. 6s. 10d. 7s. 10 d. 7s. 0d. 6s. 6d.

The importance of these figures lies in the fact that with a reduction in cost we are able to treat a larger number of patients, and had it not been for the quarantine period referred to above more patients would have been admitted in 1927 and the cost per occupied bed would have shown a still more substantial reduction.

The work of the Infirmary has been greatly facilitated and The the treatment of patients improved by reason of the William Nicholls Nicholls Convalescent Home at St. Mellons. This has now been Convalesopen for more than a full year, and the Board of Management have had ample opportunity of judging its great value and assistance. Apart from the fact that there are three times as many beds available as there were at Lavernock, the William Nicholls Home has room for expansion, which will be made use of as time and resources allow.

Reference was made in our Report last year to the effects of the Coal Trade dispute on our revenue, particularly in the matter of workmen's subscriptions. We are glad to say that, notwithstanding the continued depression in trade, our income for 1927 on working account, was a considerable improvement. It reached £68,428 18s. 10d. as compared with £59,782 8s. 5d. in 1926 and £72,258 18s. 7d. in 1925. The expenditure in 1927 was £69,069 7s. 5d., as against £69,277 19s. 9d. in 1926.

We wish especially to call attention to the fact that workmen's workmen's contributions have returned near to their normal level. Whereas Contribuin 1926 these had fallen to £16,459 10s. 5d., in 1927 they were £23,586 6s. 10d., as compared with £25,503 3s. 5d. in 1925. Workmen's contributions are so important a source of revenue that the Board of Management feel they must place on record their appreciation of the loyal support of the thousands of men for whom the Infirmary specially caters.

Non Contributing Districts. The support of the workmen is derived from a very large area, but there are still districts within easy reach of Cardiff which make no contribution under this head to the funds of the Institution, yet take advantage of its services. It has sometimes happened that cases have come into the Infirmary from districts that contribute nothing to its upkeep and have occupied valuable beds while patients from districts that contribute generously and regularly have had to be placed on the Waiting List. That is not fair to our regular subscribers. It is, indeed, an abuse of the Institution.

We have given careful thought to this matter during the year and having regard to all the circumstances we have decided that the benefits of the Infirmary shall be available in the first place for those who contribute to its support. We cannot, in the name of humanity, refuse to accept cases that are in need of immediate attention. That we must do, wherever they come from, and whether they contribute to our funds or not. But we have come reluctantly to the conclusion that, in the interests of our loyal supporters, we must in future decline to admit patients from non-contributing districts unless their condition requires urgent and immediate attention and relief.

Motor Accidents.

Another matter that has given us serious cause for reflection is the liability thrown on the Infirmary by motor accidents. The number of patients admitted for treatment owing to motor accidents is increasing year by year, and it is estimated that the cost to the Infirmary of treating these cases is close on £3,000 per annum. We get no obligatory contributions towards this heavy expenditure from the patients or the insurance companies, or those who may have been the cause of accidents, though we have occasionally received voluntary acknowledgments of our services. We trust this anomaly will eventually be removed by legislation entitling hospitals to claim under Third Party Policies. Meanwhile, we are glad to see there is a movement amongst motorists to make good this omission. The Chief Constable of Cardiff, Mr. J. A. Wilson, O.B.E., has initiated a scheme whereby a Motorists' Fund has been established and every motorist is being asked to buy a half-crown badge which can be stuck on to the windscreen of his car. The scheme has been taken up with enthusiasm and thereby the Infirmary has benefitted to a considerable extent.

Income-Tax Reclaim. Are the subscribers aware that by signing an Agreement covenanting to pay their subscriptions regularly for seven years, the Infirmary can recover the Income Tax which has already been paid by the subscribers on these amounts? The additional yield to the Infirmary approximates twenty-five per cent., and as the obligation lapses on death, there seems no reason why greater

advantage should not be taken of this provision. Particulars of the Scheme will be appended when the Report is published in book form, and meanwhile the Secretary will be pleased to answer any enquiries.

Many ways of helping the funds of the Infirmary have Help from been adopted during the year. Mr. Henry G. Lewis and Mr. quarters. S. H. Lewis, of Messrs. Hall, Lewis & Co., have presented us with two railway trucks bearing the name of the Infirmary and these have been leased for a period of five years, the firm paying the cost of upkeep.

Sir William and Lady Thomas added to their long list of Beds given to the Institution by a contribution of 1,000 guineas to name a Bed as Thank-offering for their younger son, Geoffrey George Mansell Thomas.

The "Daily Mirror" presented £500, contributed by children readers, and named a children's cot "The Daily Mirror Gugnunes" Cot" in perpetuity.

Through the good offices of the Voluntary Committee, a Concert of surpassing excellence and interest was given by the generous kindness of Messrs. Moss' Empires, Ltd., at the Empire Theatre, Cardiff, in September last, resulting in the handsome sum of £236.

The Glamorgan County Police have contributed £243 10s. 10d., the entire proceeds of a match between the Police XV and the Cambridge University XV. Since 1925, the Glamorgan Police Athletic Club has contributed no less than £675 2s. 8d. in connection with football matches.

The Nursing Staff collected for the funds on the occasion of the visit of the King and Queen in April last, and for this wholehearted effort, in addition to the efficient discharge of their duties in the wards, we are deeply grateful.

The happy inspiration of giving the patients' visitors an opportunity to help has been realised with the utmost courtesy and efficiency by Mr. G. P. Marsh, the Head Porter, resulting in contributions for the year amounting to £498 ls. 6d.

The combined efforts of the University College Students and the Students of the Technical College have now placed the Annual Rag and Demonstration on a plane never hitherto attempted in Cardiff, providing the public with a week's wholesome entertainment and an addition to the year's Income of no less than £1,250. For sheer fun and lighthearted gaiety, the Students' Week makes for a brighter Cardiff, and their publication, "The Wail," brings laughter and a mass of unverified information to thousands of

homes not only in Cardiff but over the wide area to which the Infirmary itself ministers. The Board tenders its gratitude to the Students with a lively anticipation of yearly favours to follow.

The schoolchildren have also helped. They contribute yearly a sum of from £350 to £400, and it was a kindly thought on the part of Sir William James Thomas to offer to place a tablet on the Infirmary walls recording the schoolchildren's gifts. Arrangements will be made to take advantage of Sir William's much appreciated kindness.

Amongst the generous gifts received during the year the Board would like in particular to mention that from Mr. James E. Turner, J.P., and Mrs. Turner, who sent a thousand guineas "for the endowment of a bed in recognition and in furtherance of the good work the Infirmary is doing in relieving human suffering." Mr. Turner expressed the wish that the bed should be named "The Fred Turner (Lisvane) Bed, in memory of his eldest son who gave his life in the Great War," and this has been done.

On re-reading this Report, I feel that numbers of our friends and organisations have not been mentioned. The space at one's disposal is limited, but all receipts and gifts will be duly recorded in the Report when it is published in book form, and to which the attention of the Governors is hereby directed. It makes interesting and for the most part encouraging reading, and we trust that any reader who has not hitherto subscribed will do so now, that his name may be included in next year's Report.

May I add that it is the custom to refer here to gifts of a special or exceptional character, or of historical or topical interest, but there is no individual mention of the many habitual annual subscribers, some of whom contribute really generous amounts. To quote one example: the present High Sheriff, Mr. D. G. Hall, sends us every year £208 (£104 for the parent Hospital and £104 for the William Nicholls Convalescent Home at St. Mellons.)

Friendly

The Friendly Societies continue their good work. Since the Societies' Good Work, commencement of their effort they have contributed £3,095 to the funds of the Institution and this support from so respected and wellorganised a body of citizens must have a great moral as well as practical influence. The Friendly Societies are setting a good example in organised effort and we trust that it will be widely followed.

Tin-Foil Collections.

The collection of tin-foil has also yielded good results. Seven tons of the material have been sent to the smelters already, and the Infirmary has benefitted to the extent of £429. Our collectors

have been very busy and tinfoil has reached us from places as far afield as South Africa and Buenos Aires.

Reference has been made in a preceding paragraph to the Ward. opening of the Ware Ward. We had hoped that the ward might be opened early in the year. It was ready and equipped; but we felt that, having regard to the grave financial outlook, we could not accept the additional responsibility.

Towards the close of the year, however, the Committee decided to take its courage in both hands and appeal to the public for the necessary funds to open the ward. A "100,000 Shillings Fund" was launched with enthusiasm. Helpers soon gathered around us and by the end of the year, six weeks after the opening of the fund, 43,036 shillings, nearly half the amount required, had been subscribed. Neither this Fund nor any portion of it is included in our r venue for the past year. It is treated entirely separately, and not recorded as ordinary income.

The Ware Ward was therefore opened on January 4th, 1928, and the Board of Management sincerely hope that in the coming year their policy will be justified in the result. Only by the opening of this new ward is it possible to bring relief to the 1,900 people who are on the waiting list, and when the tale of another year is told we hope that we shall be able to record with gratitude that the Infirmary is meeting all the demands that are being made upon it.

The Board have to record, with deep regret, the death of Mr. Obituary. Charles E. Dovey, J.P., one of the Life Patrons of the Infirmary, who has been actively associated with the Institution for many years and whose devoted service and great generosity have been of incalculable benefit. It is a sad reflection that the community and the Infirmary have lost in the one year no fewer than one ex-Mayor and three ex-Lord Mayors of Cardiff, viz.: Lord Pontypridd, Alderman Sydney Jenkins, Captain Morgan Thomas, and Alderman Dr. James Robinson.

Among other friends of the Infirmary who will be greatly missed are:—Miss Alice Scale, Mr. T. S. Lewis, Mr. Sully Stowe, Mr. Thomas Stevens, Mr. Ivor Wyndham Radeliffe, Mr. A. F. Hill, Mr. Thomas Thrift, Mr. Frank Forsdike, and one of our most beloved and respected members of the Resident Medical Staff, Dr. Wyndham Jones.

The Samaritan Fund. The Board have learned with great regret of the resignation, for family reasons, of Miss Maud A. David from the post of honorary secretary of the Samaritan Fund, which was founded in 1895 for the purpose of helping necessitous in-patients who have recovered from their illness but have not regained sufficient strength to return to work. Miss David has been secretary of the Fund since 1904, and her work has been of the greatest help to patients. Miss David's place has been taken by Miss M. Stewart, who has been one of our most active voluntary workers.

Needlework and Linen Guilds. The lists of the Committees of the Needlework and Linen Guilds will be found on page 175, but the Board feels that this modest statement which has been prepared by the Ladies should not pass without a special recognition of the extraordinarily helpful character of these Auxiliaries, which provide linen for this great Institution and suitable garments for many of the patients to wear during their residence at the Hospital.

The year under review is also notable for the gracious gift of a Blotter received from Her Majesty The Queen, through the good offices of Mrs. Ellis Jones of Adamsdown Vicarage, and which realised by means of a competitive sale the substantial sum of £28. Her Majesty's kind sympathy with the efforts of these Ladies is deeply appreciated and inspires them in the continued development of their special service to the Institution.

Honorary Medical Staff. Having regard to the anomaly as to length of service which has existed since the association of the Infirmary with the Medical School, it was decided after careful consideration to extend the age limit for Members of the Honorary Medical Staff to 65, thus bringing it into line with the Regulation governing the appointments made by the Medical School. This extension has the immediately happy result of retaining for a further period on the active Staff of the Institution a number of its most distinguished Members.

Upon Dr. Paterson's appointment as an Honorary Consulting Surgeon to the Ear, Nose and Throat Department, Mr. A. Mason Jones, M.D. (Edin.), F.R.C.S. (Edin.) was elected Honorary Surgeon, and the appointment of an Honorary Assistant Surgeon to the Department will be made on 22nd February, 1928.

Professor James Henry Dible, M.B., B.Ch. (Glas.), M.R.C.P. (Lond.), Professor of Pathology and Bacteriology in the Welsh National School of Medicine, was elected an Honorary Pathologist and Bacteriologist, upon Professor Kettle's appointment to the Chair of Pathology at St. Bartholomew's Hospital, London.

In closing their report the Board desire to record their great admiration and appreciation of the services of the Staffs. All, without exception, have given of their best to the noble work which the Infirmary is doing, and we feel that the more the real greatness of this work is known the more the public will support it and enable us to extend it.

An examination of the comparative figures will show that there has been a slight decrease in the number of In-Patients admitted. This is entirely due to the fact that a case of smallpox was discovered in one of the wards at the end of February last, and the resulting period of quarantine, during which only serious emergency cases were admitted, caused a large drop in the numbers of admissions, and this fact has materially affected both the waiting list and the amount of work done during the year. Practically the whole staff and all the patients had to be vaccinated to obviate the risk of further cases of smallpox, and I should like to express my sincere thanks to Dr. Picken, Medical Officer of Health, and his staff, for the great help they rendered in this and other directions. It says much for what was done that no other case developed in the Infirmary, and at the end of the period of quarantine, we were able to carry on under full pressure.

It had been hoped that the Ware Ward might be opened early in the year, but the serious financial position resulting from the protracted industrial troubles during 1926 rendered this impossible,

although the ward was ready and equipped. This has also had its effect in preventing any reduction of the waiting list.

The Out-Patient Department statistics shew an increase in the number of patients seen. One very satisfactory feature to which I would like to call special attention is the extinction of the waiting list for Ophthalmic Out-Patients. The question regarding this waiting list was raised at a meeting of the Board of Management in the autumn, and at that time there were nearly 500 cases waiting to be seen. After consultation with the three members of the Honorary Staff concerned, a scheme was evolved to deal with the problem. The execution of this scheme naturally meant a great deal of extra work on the part of our ophthalmic surgeons, but they dealt with it to such purpose that by the end of the year there was no waiting list in that Department, and it is hoped that this desirable state of affairs may continue. We are deeply indebted to the Honorary Ophthalmic Surgeons concerned for their splendid co-operation.

In my last report I drew attention to the valuable work Registrar's being done by Dr. R. H. Enoch, the Resident Registrar. I have special pleasure in mentioning his work once again, especially the First Annual Clinical Record, which is an entirely new publication. This record contains a complete statistical table of all the in-patient work accomplished during 1926, and will be exceedingly useful in time to come, not only to members of our own staff, but to the staffs of other hospitals all over the kingdom. The work of compiling it was only rendered possible by the unselfish cooperation of members of the Medical and Surgical Staff, to whom I would wish to tender my warmest thanks.

During the year, it became necessary for us to make some Massage changes in this Department, owing to the new rules and regulations of the Chartered Society of Massage and Medical Gymnastics. Under these rules, it became necessary, if we were to be recognised as a training school, to have a fully certified teacher in charge of the department. Leave was accordingly granted to Mrs. Wright, who had for so long been in charge, so that she might qualify as a teacher, but after fully considering the question, she decided not to pursue it further, and resigned. Mrs. Wright, by her conscientious work, has been of great assistance in the department for many years, and one would desire to extend to her the thanks of all with whom she has worked. Through the good offices of the Chartered Society of Massage, we were enabled to obtain the services of Miss Smith, who is fully qualified as a teacher, and she is carrying on the work of running the department and of teaching pupils. A permanent appointment will be made in due course to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Mrs. Wright.

Much useful work has been done in this department, which Department deals with everything relating to patients' contributions towards their maintenance whilst in the institution. Miss Morgan has gradually extended the sphere of her activities, so that now she is interviewing not only In-Patients, but casualties and Out-Patients Her work is essentially that of an almoner, and by her assiduity, discretion, and tact, she has put her department on a sound and permanent basis. By referring to the annual accounts, it will be seen how she has succeeded in augmenting the income from the specific sources mentioned above.

Additions and Im-

It is impossible, in the space at my disposal, to give more provements. than an outline of the various additions and improvements that have been effected during the year. In the first place, I should like to mention the improvement that has been carried out in the Aural Out-Patient Department. With the increasing work in the department, it was found necessary to remove the partition wall between the examination room and the dark room. This gave a valuable increase of space in which to work, and by converting the old sterilizing room into a dark room and by adding a small partition in the main hall, the department was made much more convenient for working in. Dr. Beatty, who is in charge of the Dermatological Department, found himself handicapped by the lack of a room in which to administer treatment. It was found possible to allocate to him a room in the main corridor, which after fitting out according to his requirements, has been of the greatest possible use to him in his treatment of patients. The X-Ray Department has been brought up-to-date by the installation of developing and washing tanks, which have improved results and turnover to a great extent. Further improvements were made possible by the kind action of the 38th Welsh Divisional Artillery, who gave us a new X-Ray couch, complete with all modern accessories, including the latest type of X-Ray tubes. They have given this as a memorial to the officers and men of the Welsh Artillery who gave their lives in the Great War, and the couch bears an inscription to that effect. We have also to thank Mr. H. L. Sheen, a brother of Professor A. W. Sheen, for the gift of a Coolidge X-Ray tube. The treatment side of the department has also been brought up-to-date by the reconstruction of the treatment room and the gift of a new switch-board, for which we are indebted to the Cardiff District Union of the National British Women's Total Abstinence Union. To make space for our stationery stock, a new storeroom for the Dispensary was erected through the kindness of our Chairman, Sir William Diamond, thus releasing the old Dispensary store. The new storeroom, which occupies a part of the waiting room for Out-Patients, has made it possible to centralize the dispensary stores to a much greater extent than was previously possible.

The new Rockfeller laboratories for the Medical Unit were completed in the summer and were ready for occupation at the beginning of the October term. This building is magnificently built and equipped, and whilst not directly under Infirmary control, forms a valuable addition from the teaching and research points of view. Other improvements which do not directly affect us are the new Common Room for students, which has been erected on the space formerly occupied by our carpenters' shop; the new Lecture Room for the Surgical Unit, which takes the place of the old Common Room, and the new carpenters' shop, which as been made from the old burnt-out garage at the foot of the garden of No. 50, Newport Road. As part of the arrangement entered into with the Medical School, the lecture room will be available for meetings of different kinds, e.g., meetings of the Board of Management and of the Linen Guild and other meetings of a similar nature.

An electrically driven circular saw has been fitted in the ground floor of the new carpenters' shop. This enables a lot of work to be saved in the sawing of tree trunks and other large timber for use as firewood, and it is also useful in many other directions. A Cox's Ignite Heater was put into one of the cooking stoves in the main kitchen with a view to effecting some economy in the consumption of gas. Some slight economy has been effected, but what is perhaps more important is the fact that it has enabled a higher standard of efficiency in cooking to be attained.

Once again, so much work has been done by our own labour, Painting that it would occupy too much space if it were all detailed. An and Cleaning extra amount of painting has been done this year, as there was a lot of work indicated in connection with outside iron and wood work. Extra labour was taken on temporarily for this purpose, and for a comparatively modest expenditure of money practically the whole of the outside wood and iron work of the Hospital was painted and renovated, and as both labour and materials were under our own direct supervision, the work was carried out to our satisfaction in every respect.

This work, it will be realised, comprises quite a lot, and is responsible to a great extent for the increase in the wages paid for direct labour.

The greater part of the Maternity Hospital; Thompson Painting Theatre; Casualty Department, including Theatre and Waiting Inside Work. Hall; New Lift Cage; Mametz Staircase; Engineer's Office; Painters' Shop; Telephone Room; X-Ray Dark Room; Bathroom, Mametz Ward; Dispensary Waiting Room and Store; Stationery Store; Room, Bedford House; Ware Side Ward and Corridor; Room, 1, Longeross Street; Skin Treatment Room; Enquiry Office; Day Nurses' Cubicles; Head Porter's Office; V.D. Clinic, all rooms upstairs, Waiting Hall and two rooms

downstairs; Men's Lavatory and all furniture of Out-Patient Department; Furniture, Llanbradach Ward; two rooms, Secretary's Office; Registrar's Office; three Sister's Sitting Rooms; Male Students' Lavatory; Store Boys' Pantry; Ware Ward, floor stained and varnished; Dormitory, 50, Newport Road.

In addition, a lot of routine work in the way of painting furniture and glazing has been done.

Cleaning.

Ophthalmic Wards; Seager Theatre; Thomas Andrews Ward; Professor Sheen's rooms; Main Theatre; Main Cellars and Refrigerating Room cleaned and whitelimed; Calorifier House under Shand Block cleaned and whitelimed; X-Ray Department; Laundry Callender Room; Casualty Approach and Lift Well; Out-Patient Department; Charles Radcliffe Wards; "1925" Ward.

In addition, all the windows of the Infirmary have been cleaned regularly.

Other Work.

Under this heading there is a diversity of work to reports Amongst the most important there has been much done to old chimney stacks, principally on the oldest part of the Infirmary over the main entrance. A number of these have been partly o entirely rebuilt, as they were in a dangerous condition. All thir work has been done by direct labour. The chimney stack at Anthony House has also been rebuilt in the same way, and some cracks which had appeared dealt with at the same time. We have also manufactured by our own labour a large number of concrete curbs, and a considerable number of these have been put in place at various parts of the grounds to tidy up the side walks; Several hundreds of slates have been renewed over different parts of the Institution, and the tremendous storms rendered necessary much more work of this nature than would have been otherwise the case. There have been regular inspections of all lift machinery and of the numerous electrical appliances and fittings, with repairs where found necessary. The three boilers which supply steam for heating and power have been regularly inspected and cleaned and numerous replacements and repairs carried out on the pipes supplying the different parts of the Infirmary. All necessary sanitary work has been done by our own labour also. Electric light has been installed in Anthony House, which has proved really useful to the nurses in training.

Nursing Committee. A Nursing Committee has been appointed, under the Chairmanship of Dr. D. R. Paterson, to deal with all questions regarding the choice and education of Nurses. I should like to express my thanks to this Committee for the help they have afforded the Matron and me in this direction.

The gold, silver and bronze medals, generously provided by Nurses' endowment by Sir William James and Lady Thomas, and awarded Medals. annually to the three best Nurses of the year, have been gained by the following three Nurses respectively:-

Gold Medal .. Nurse Marjorie Judd Lewis. Silver Medal .. Nurse Kathleen Button. Bronze Medal .. Nurse Kathleen Gibbons.

All through the year we have received valuable assistance V.A.D. from V.A.D. Nurses. They have given ungrudgingly of their time, many of them at a cost of considerable sacrifice, and one would like to express to them the best thanks of all the regular staff.

The members of the British Red Cross Society have organised Blood themselves in a really efficient manner for blood donor service and have rendered most valuable help in this direction. Service of this nature can hardly be overestimated, for it is actually in many instances a question of life or death, and we should be very remiss in our duty were we not to extend to them our most cordial thanks for their self-sacrificing devotion to duty for the sake of patients of whom they know little, except that they need their gift of blood.

The members of the local Branches of "Toc H" have also Service. given their services freely, and were it not for what they have done, we should undoubtedly have had to increase our clerical staff, with that amount of additional cost to the Institution. Not only have they helped in the clerical branch of our work, but they have also helped in the Casualty Department, and relieved porters for more urgent work in the theatres and elsewhere. We are indeed grateful to them for all they have done, and especially for the cheery and spontaneous manner in which they have done it.

The figures for 1927 show a certain decrease as compared with those of 1926, and while this is due to a number of factors, it has to be borne in mind that this Department of the Infirmary has been working at very high pressure during the last few years. Indefinite yearly increases are not therefore to be expected and the stage has now been reached when a certain degree of upward or downward variation in these figures is to be anticipated. The number of emergencies, however, is practically maintained at last year's level and it is to be emphasised that this class of obstetrical case has been tripled since 1922.

These figures show that the Obstetrical Department of the Infirmary continues to be increasingly recognised as the centre to which such emergencies should be referred. The general experience is that they are now sent in sooner than was previously the case, and this is all to the good of the mother and child.

The number of emergency cases admitted would indicate that the proportion of abnormalities of pregnancy and parturition continues to be high. This is borne out on investigation, when fully one-third of the cases are found to be abnormal. The abnormalities are, in a number of cases, grave, and emergency obstetrical operations, sometimes of a most serious and extensive nature, are often necessary for the relief of the patient.

The ante-natal clinic is now running under the joint adminis tration of the Infirmary and the City Health Authorities, and much valuable work is carried out there as the result of which many cases are admitted for ante-natal treatment who, in other circumstances, might have run a grave risk in later pregnancy or during labour.

The Clinical Laboratory which was fitted up at No. 8, Glossop Terrace, in October, 1924, is developing in its usefulness. The experience is that it is a most valuable adjunct to the clinical work of this Department, and a most important asset in the scientific nvestigation of the various disorders of pregnancy.

It can be repeated that the Maternity Department of the Cardiff Royal Infirmary is now regarded by the public, both medical and lay, as a permanent and well-established institution, on which an increasing reliance is being laid for the prompt and effective alleviation of the appropriate type of patient.

The great value of this Home as an auxiliary to the parent Institution will be realised when it is stated that 835 patients were received in the Home during the year. As 1927 was the first complete calendar year during which the Home was in commission, it is not possible to make an actual comparison with the previous year's record, although upon the basis of the nine months' work in 1926, when 652 patients were received, it has been anticipated that the total number of patients admitted during last year would have reached 900. Two factors operated against this record being achieved. One was the occurence of the case of smallpox in the Infirmary, already referred to, which led to the Convalescent Home being closed also to the admission of patients for nearly a month. The other was the fact that in order to relieve the waiting list at the Infirmary, a number of bed cases were transferred to the Home to make room for new and urgent cases to be admitted. This had the effect of reducing the possible number of admissions for purely convalescent cases. Notwithstanding these facts, however, we were able to afford convalescent treatment to about 500 more patients than in 1925, our last year at Lavernock, a fact which, taken in conjunction with the many expressions of appreciation and gratitude given by the patients, only emphasises the extreme value of Sir William Edgar Nicholls' noble gift of a property which so admirably lends itself to the purpose to which it is being devoted.

It will be a great pleasure to the Board to know that Sir William and Lady Nicholls continue to take a very close interest in the welfare of the Home. They visit it whenever occasion offers, and they are most generous in their gifts for the comfort of the patients and the nursing staff, particularly at Christmastide.

The enjoyment of the male patients was enhanced by the gift of a billiard table for which we are indebted to Mr. Edward Williams. The old laundry room was cleared and renovated and the table placed there and it has proved a wonderful boon in the entertainment of the men on wet days and evenings. Messrs. Thompson and Shackell, Limited, very generously presented a fine cabinet gramophone. This too, has been greatly appreciated. Records to the value of two guineas were very kindly presented by Mr. Grizelle, of Messrs. Heath & Sons, Ltd., to whom our thanks are also due.

Many musical parties have visited the Home during the year and we would specially mention the visit of the Cardiff City Tramways Band, who through the good offices of our good friend, Mr. Howell David, gave a most enjoyable concert on the Terrace one evening in the summer.

Our special thanks are due to Mr. C. C. L. Williams, of Llanrumney Hall, for his many valuable gifts of rabbits, which add to his many kindnesses demonstrating his interest and thoughtfulness for our work at St. Mellons.

Although very much hindered by the bad season, the work on the land surrounding the Home has gone on steadily. As far as possible, labour has been devoted to utilitarian purposes such as growing vegetables and fruit for the use of the patients both at the Infirmary and the Home. A small paddock which had been ploughed early in the year produced as fair a crop of potatoes and greens as the weather allowed and produce to the value of £60 19s. 0d. was sent into the Home for consumption as well as £58 4s. 0d. worth to the Royal Infirmary, whilst the sum of £55 16s. 6d. in cash was realised by the sale of fruit, tomatoes and flowers. Another small field is in process of being prepared for vegetable growing. All the fields came into our own possession in August last, the grazing tenancy having expired in that month. The whole of the fences have been put in good repair. There are thirty-four ewes and a ram grazing the fields at present.

A profit of £27 7s. 10d. was made on the pigs bred during the year, and stock to the value of £48 0s. 0d. remained on hand at the end of the year.

I think Mr. Pritchard, the Head Gardener at the Home, is deserving of praise for his untiring efforts to keep the grounds in order and beauty and at the same time to make as much of the work of his staff as is possible, productive.

I wish here to pay a tribute to the great help we have again received from Mr. James A. Wilson, O.B.E., the Chief Constable of Cardiff. As is known, he is Chairman of the Home Sub-Committee, and he takes the keenest interest in all the affairs of the Home and the land attached thereto. We are indebted to him for his good offices in obtaining as a gift a motor lawn mower, which has proved of immense help in dealing with the extensive lawns on the property. Mr. Wilson was also instrumental in profitably arranging the matter of the sheep grazing, already referred to.

The water supply, which for a very long time, had been a source of anxiety owing to its frequent insufficiency has at last been improved by the provision by the Council of a new main coming from Llanedarne, so that it is hoped that our troubles in this respect are now at an end.

Mention may be made of the disposal of a very small portion of land on the extreme corner of the garden attached to the Newport Road Lodge. This piece was scheduled under the Newport Road Widening Scheme, and a suitable boundary wall is to be erected by the County Council to replace the hedge removed.

A very satisfactory feature of this report on the Home is that the Accounts show a reduction in the cost per occupied bed, as compared with 1926, of £12 7s. 5d.

In conclusion, I should like to extend to all those who are associated with me in the work of the Infirmary my very best thanks for their loyal and cordial co-operation. Without that co-operation, the work would be a thankless task, but with it, it becomes an inspiration towards the ideal of making the Cardiff Royal Infirmary one of the best hospitals in the kingdom.

The Income on Working Account for the year amounted to Expenditure £68,558 Os. 8d., which includes the Maternity Hospital revenue, £2,857 Os. 6d.; the William Nicholls' Convalescent Home (St. Mellons) revenue, £563 8s. 4d.; and £24 0s. 0d. for Pupil's Lecture Fees at Anthony House.

> Expenditure on Working Account amounted £66,468 5s. 0d., which includes £8,977 ls. 5d. on the upkeep of the Infirmary's Auxiliaries: the Maternity Hospital, £4,757 9s. 8d.; the William Nicholls' Convalescent Home, £3,628 15s. 9d., and the Preliminary Training School for Nurses at Anthony House, £590 16s. 0d.

> In addition to the above mentioned Income and Expenditure on Working Account, the sum of £2,730 4s. 3d. was expended on Capital Account (including the investment of Legacies and Donations amounting to £1,800), and Capital Donations of £2,054 7s. 7d. were received, the balance being defrayed by Working Account.

That the year under review has yielded a modest surplus is a proof of the high standard of the work of the Infirmary, and the recognition of this by a very widely diversified community, a recognition which is expected to extend and become more systematic as industrial conditions improve. A satisfactory result of the year's working is also an evidence of the careful and efficient management of the Institution and its resources. Much could be said in this respect, but the position is fully illustrated by a comparison of the actual expenditure with that estimated at the commencement of each half of the year. The two Budgets for 1927 totalled £68,534. The actual expenditure amounted to £66,468—a saving of £2,066.

The help afforded by the special Fund for the maintenance of Beds in the Thompson Ward is keenly appreciated, whilst the services of the Needlework and Linen Guilds, and the Samaritan Fund tend to supply most desirable amenities without entrenching on the ordinary funds of the Institution. In this connection, the Chairman, Sir William Diamond, is exceptionally alert. He has never yet failed to secure a friend to supply a requirement really needed, but rather outside the scope of routine expenditure. Recent instances of this acquisitive infection are the delightfully spontaneous gifts of an up-to-date typewriter by Mr. T. P. Webber, and a Burroughs' Adding Machine by Mr. W. E. Hinde.

The recognition of Alexandra Day has not declined, as had been so gloomily prophesied, 1927 yielding a record contribution of £1,096, whilst the somewhat similar observance of "Mothers' Day" maintained its promise of the previous year, yielding the very acceptable sum of £251.

Amongst other activities rendering welcome support may be mentioned the increasing usefulness of Golf and Bowling Clubs, the exhibition of the Infirmary Film under the direction of Councillor D. J. Jones, Chairman of the Film Committee, and the steady and persistent work of the local and district committees instituted from time to time by the Revenue Committee. Of recent additions, that of Penarth has maintained a steady progress; Risca, in Monmouthshire, has given evidence of a real vitality; Llandaff has been instituted, and Roath Park and Penylan have contributed to a year's revenue close on £700.

A few remarks on the development of the Tinfoil movement may be permitted, and an expression of thanks and congratulation to Mr. Hauser and his Committee and their especially efficient honorary secretary, Mr. G. G. Evans. The collection of tinfoil and silver paper was first mooted in September, 1926. year 1927, seven tons were collected, realising £429. In a recent letter, Mr. Evans says: ". . . Our thanks are largely due to the interest and enthusiasm of thousands of school children, guided by their Masters and Mistresses; Hotel Proprietors, Clubs, Tobacconists, and others too numerous to mention. The "Evening Express" and "South Wales Echo" have from time to time given us every facility for our appeals, and to them we are very grateful. We do not want this fruitful source of revenue to diminish, but rather to go on increasing, with one object in view, to increase the revenue, and here we would like to reiterate our desire that every member of the Committee be good enough to take a special interest in this matter of creating new helpers in this feature of our Infirmary life."

One of the most interesting gifts of the year was a Bedspread given to Lady Diamond by a friend with a view to helping the funds. This friend proved to be Mrs. H. T. Owen, Newport Road, Cardiff, a lady who gracefully acknowledges to advancing years, which have, however, brought her a host of affectionate friends and admirers. The Bedspread was made by her own hands and represented years of patient work. Mrs. Owen hoped that it would realise £50. Another friend was needed. Sir William's acquisitive gift did not fail. Mr. Llewellyn Morgan placed the great resources of Messrs. David Morgan Ltd., at our disposal, and a competitive sale resulted in £275—a record Bedspread!

It is confidently hoped that the Governors in their various localities will do all they can to spread the Friendly Societies' effort, so that the little Box may ultimately find its way to every breakfast table, that it may receive its weekly Thank-offering for the Infirmary. The delightful reception given to the workers at the end of the year by Sir William and Lady Diamond marked an appreciation of the work which is shared by everyone associated with the Infirmary. We are also deeply grateful to Miss Lottie Wakelin and her Concert Party for the splendid programme given on this occasion, and for Mr. Kittow's inimitable contributions. The other quarterly gatherings were charmed by the excellence of programmes provided by the Fireside Follies and the Delysians and to whom we would also tender our grateful thanks.

Will the Governors of their kindness encourage this effort by offering their help to the Honorary Secretary, Mr. S. R. Marsh, 7, Ascog Street, Cardiff? It is noteworthy that the Assistant Secretary, Mrs. Marsh, holds this year the important office of President of Cardiff Friendly Societies' Council—a unique distinction for a woman, and one that could not be filled more worthily.

During the year, a great effort at economy has been made, and no films are now taken except at the written request of one of the Honorary Staff, or the Medical Superintendent. It is gratifying to note that the treatment plant has been thoroughly reconditioned, and made up-to-date, by the addition of certain new pieces of appraatus, very kindly presented by the Cardiff District Union of the National British Women's Total Abstinence Union, and that, by virtue of this gift, the building has been arranged suitably for all superficial therapy.

It has not, however, been thought desirable, in the present somewhat uncertain state of deep-therapy methods, to enter upon a very costly apparatus and structural alterations which would be necessary if this plant were installed.

Thanks to the generosity and consideration of the 38th Welsh Divisional Artillery, the X-Ray Department has been presented with an excellent modern X-Ray couch, with all accessories. This forms the Memorial to the Officers, N.C.O.'s and Men of that Division who fell in the War, and it has been of the greatest possible value to the work of the Department. The latest type of tube has been installed, and has improved the quality of the skiagrams very materially.

I would like to add my appreciation of the continued and most valuable services of Miss C. M. Phillips, and the Nurses under her.

Of the Out-Patients treated, fracture cases formed a very large proportion.

The number of artificial sun treatments given shows a large increase on the previous year; the total number during 1927 being 5,086. The commoner types of cases treated were arthritis, rheumatic conditions, varicose ulcers, septic sinuses, rickets, tuberculous glands and cases of debility.

In October, 1927, three students started training for the examination of the Chartered Society of Massage and Medical Gymnastics.

To conform with the new regulations of this Chartered Society, Miss D. M. Smith, who holds the teacher's certificate, has been in charge of the Department since October, 1927, and her services are greatly appreciated.

I am very anxious to put on record the valuable help given by all those on the Staff of this Department.

The Committee of the above Society is somewhat encouraged in being able to submit to the contributors a more favourable report for the year 1927 than was the case for the preceding one.

The total receipts for the year ending December 31st, 1927, amounted to £24,106, an increase over 1926 of £7,647.

Of course, it was the big row in the industrial world that stung and even paralysed everything that was beautiful in 1926, and its aftermath keeps staring in the face every effort made towards ameliorating the lot of the injured and sick of our City and District.

Yet, in spite of all this, a multitude of working men and women found courage to give their few pence every week, conscious of the fact that by so doing they were not only performing a duty to themselves, but perpetuating the glorious principle of helping others.

But there is not as yet in this City and community a sufficient awareness among all classes of their duty, not only to the Hospital, but also to themselves and their families. The impression that the Hospital is merely a charitable institution must be replaced by a consciousness that it is the guardian of the people's health, and that individual happiness and true prosperity largely depend upon its mission and work.

It has always been the aim of the Cardiff and District Hospital Society to foster this consciousness and to keep up the spirit of duty toward the Hospital.

And for the Society to reap a full harvest there must be some move made, either by the workers within a business, be what it may; or by the employers themselves, to make the work of this Infirmary Scheme better known.

The Secretary of the Society will be pleased to give any additional information to prospective contributors, or advice to employers who wish to have the scheme introduced in their businesses.

The Committee desires to thank all those that helped in this great work of the Society.

The Committee have much pleasure in presenting their 33rd Annual

During the year 46 applications have been received from the Infirmary for help for necessitous cases leaving after operations and treatment. About 30 Surgical Appliances have been supplied, the cost varying from 4s. 6d. to £3 15s. 0d. each.

At the last Annual Meeting £12 was voted towards the purchase of an artificial arm costing £20, without which the patient concerned would have been unable to continue her employment. Extra nourishment has been provided for a month in a case of great poverty.

Several ambulance fares have been paid.

Four requests were made for a month's train fare, to and from the Infirmary, to enable patients to continue necessary massage after their discharge.

Two patients were sent to Dulwich House and Porthcawl respectively, to recuperate before returning home. We should be grateful for Rest Tickets

for this year.

During 1927 £68 14s. 5d. has been spent in grants as compared with

£42 5s. 7d. in 1926.

All cases are carefully enquired into before application is made, and where possible, patients contribute to the cost. The need for and the usefulness of this Samaritan Fund have been amply proved in 1927.

Gifts of clothing will be especially welcome, as numbers of patients are found to be poorly equipped in this respect. Such gifts may be sent to:
