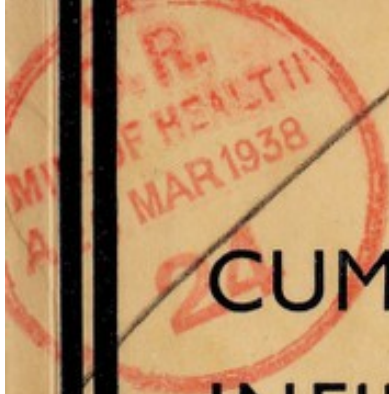

You can bestow additional benefit to the Hospital, without cost to yourself, if you agree to the following scheme

All Subscribers to the Hospital who pay Income Tax pay their subscription out of Income *upon which they have already paid Income Tax*. Consequently an Annual Subscription of £1 1s. represents a gross amount of £1 8s. 0d., assuming the Income Tax to be 5s. 0d. in the £.

If a Subscriber is prepared however to covenant by deed undertaking to pay a regular annual subscription for a period of seven years, it is possible for the Hospital to recover from the Inland Revenue Department the tax which has been paid by the Subscriber.

Under the Scheme, a subscriber will pay the Hospital his or her usual subscription of £1. 1s or more and the Hospital will then be able to claim repayment of 7s. 0d. for each £1 1s. subscribed. The £1 1s. subscription will thus appreciate to £1 8s. 0d.

The Scheme cannot be made retrospective and can only apply to subscriptions that are paid after the necessary Deed has been signed, and, of course, only to those who pay Income Tax.

The Secretary-Superintendent will arrange the recovery of tax each year without trouble to the subscriber, and will be pleased to give any further information.

In the event of the death of the subscriber the covenant becomes void.

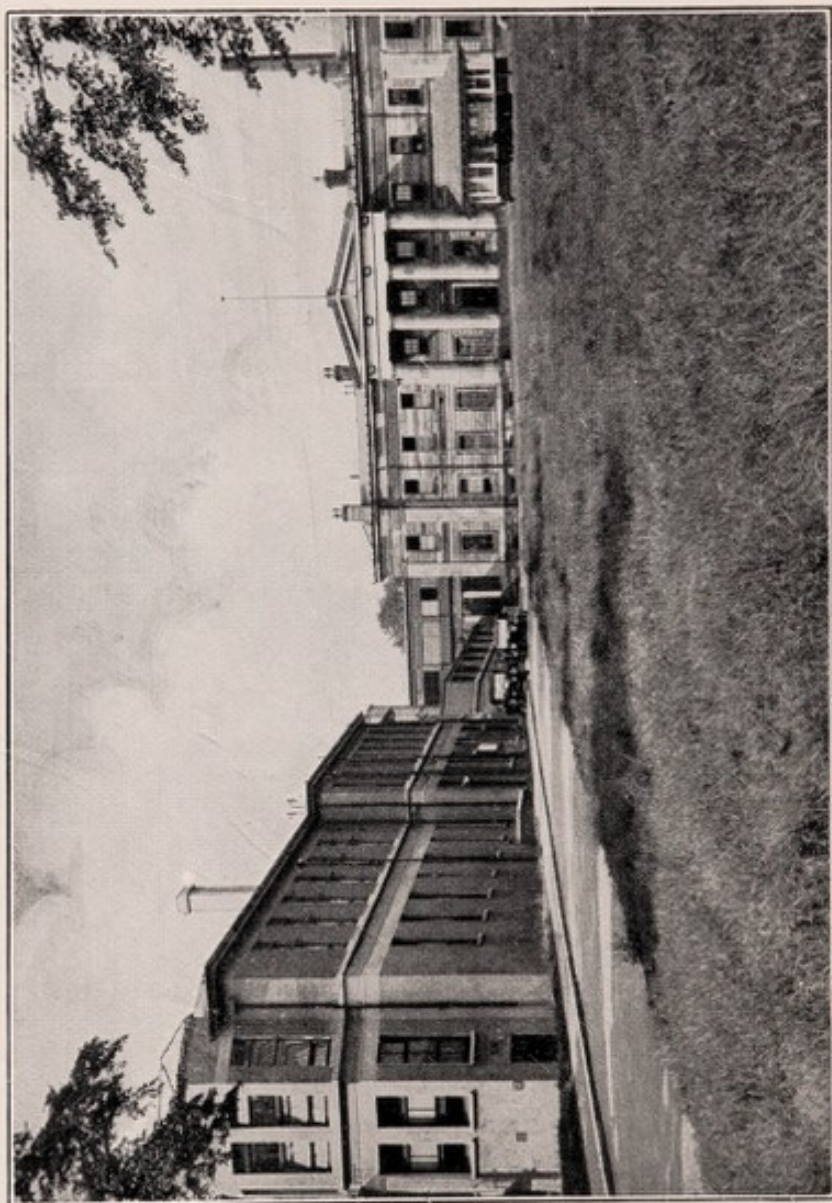

NINETY-SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT

The Committee of Management have pleasure in submitting their Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1937.

The daily occupation of beds during 1937 was 139.6, compared with 140.7 in the previous year, and the average stay of patients 18.8 as compared with 18.9 days in 1936. ^{Occupation of Beds.} The patients sent to Silloth Convalescent Institution through the Agnes Moore Fund were 43, compared with 47 in the previous year. Patients under Rate "B" Scheme numbered 9; their aggregate stay being 175 days. In addition to these numbers, 103 patients were sent to Silloth and other Convalescent Institutions, and the cost of their treatment was met by Approved Societies and other sources.

The estimated cost of the Out-patients' department, namely, £3,502 19s. 3d., is, as previously, allowed for in estimating the cost of patients. ^{Cost of Patients.} A comparative table for In-patients for three years is submitted :—

The total Ordinary Income amounted to £20,836 10s. 2d., and the Ordinary Expenditure to £23,650 19s. 3d. ^{Income and Expenditure.} Excess of total Expenditure over total Income was £2,710 5s. 11d.

The Statement of the Financial Position, on 31st December, 1937, shows a Debit Balance of £1,519 5s. 0d.

The Committee once more acknowledge most gratefully the continued substantial assistance of the General Workers' Committee and the Hospital Sunday and Saturday Fund Committee, who contributed the welcome sums of £4,050 and £2,087 15s. 0d. respectively.

During the year the Committee have had most practical evidence of the benevolent feeling of several deceased friends of the Infirmary, and acknowledge very gratefully receipt of the following legacies. With the exception of those under £100, they have all been transferred to Capital Account, in accordance with the Statutes :—

Recommendations.

The Committee considered, during the year, the question of the circulation of recommendation forms to subscribers and donors. In view of the fact that such a small proportion of these forms are used compared with those sent out, the Committee decided that, in future, to avoid expense and waste, these forms should not be generally circulated, but would be available at any time when required on application to the Secretary-Superintendent. The Committee wish to emphasise the desirability, in the interest of each patient, that he should present on his first attendance a letter from a doctor. This is not intended to raise a barrier against the attendance of any person who has not a doctor.

In the last Annual Report, it will be remembered that in this connection the Committee were awaiting the result of their application to the Commissioner for Special Areas for a grant towards the Infirmary's extensions. As a result of their application, the Commissioner referred the plans to the Ministry of Health for consideration, and since that time they have been the subject of conferences between the Ministry, the Infirmary and the County and City Councils. As the result of an agreed policy arising out of these conferences, the original plans have undergone considerable change, and a revised scheme prepared, which was generally approved at a representative meeting of the Infirmary and the Local Authorities on the 12th January, 1938. The total estimated cost of the final scheme is £200,800, and it is hoped, in view of the fact that it has been drawn up in accordance with the view of experts from the Ministry of Health, that the Committee will receive an early and favourable reply from the Commissioner for Distressed Areas to whom a renewed application has been made for a grant on the extended scheme.

These plans will in effect increase the accommodation of the Cumberland Infirmary from 151 to 316 beds. Amongst other things there will be increased facilities for the treatment of general surgical and medical patients, a new children's ward, providing for the isolation of cases in accordance with modern practice, a new boiler house, and extension to the laundry, and appropriate additions to the nurses' home and domestic staff accommodation. Furthermore, as the direct outcome of the Infirmary's co-operation with the Local Authorities in providing a base hospital competent to deal with every type of case needing specialist attention, a small proportion of the accommodation of the extended hospital will provide for certain statutory liabilities of the Local Authorities in respect to maternity, gynæcological and other types of cases.

The Committee feel that the efforts they are making to cope with the ever increasing demand for an adequate and efficient hospital service will be appreciated by the people of Carlisle and Cumberland. They realise that the expenditure of the Infirmary will increase in proportion to its growth, but they hope that steps they are contemplating for increasing the income, which have already been adopted in most hospitals throughout the country, will, with the co-operation of the public, be equally successful in Cumberland, and relieve the Committee to a great extent of anxiety in this respect.

Building
Fund.

In view of the foregoing paragraph, the Committee desire to bring to the immediate attention of subscribers and the public the state of the building extension fund. As will be seen on page 26, the amount in hand including the new operating room fund is £25,362. During 1937, donations amounting to £900, were received to these funds, which included an amount of £361 from the General Workers' Committee. As the Infirmary will be called upon to find a very considerable sum towards the extensions, the Committee earnestly appeal for immediate and substantial assistance towards this fund.

Honorary
Medical Staff.

One inevitable consequence of the extended accommodation of the Infirmary, not only in numbers of beds, but in new special departments which will be provided, is an increase in staff, and the Governors have approved the appointment of an Honorary Gynæcologist and Obstetrician to serve in the dual capacity as consultant to the Infirmary and the Local Authorities. It is expected that the appointment will be made early in 1938.

New Equip-
ment.

In accordance with the Committee's policy of keeping the Infirmary in the forefront of modern practice, the following appliances and machinery have been added to the equipment of the Infirmary during the year. They have all been of direct benefit to the patients, and are greatly appreciated by the staff in various departments :—

A new portable X-ray ward set costing £300. This is of the latest type and will give much more satisfactory and certain results than the old machine, and by being shock-proof, ensures the complete safety of both patient and operator.

A new aspirating machine, which will enable the medical staff to deal more quickly and effectively with any case of sudden hæmorrhage which may occur in any department of the Infirmary.

The efficiency of the heating system was also increased by the installation of a new boiler feed pump, and the overhaul of the old pump, at a total cost of £200.

A pair of pressing and finishing machines, costing £183, have been added to cope with the increasing work of the laundry.

A new potato-peeling machine, and modern sinks, have been provided in the kitchen at an approximate cost of £75.

Amongst other instruments and appliances new and up-to-date equipment has been purchased for use in connection with blood transfusion and fracture cases.

The Committee have to report that 11 nurses passed through the preliminary training school into the wards. Seven nurses entered and passed the State preliminary, 11 nurses the State final, and 7 nurses the hospital final examination.

Nursing Staff
and Training
School.

The Committee are proud of the fact that once more the examination results of the nurses were 100% successful, and are very appreciative of the excellent coaching the nurses in training have received from the Matron and the Sister Tutor, which produces such a consistently good record.

7,694 patients were interviewed by the Almoner on their first or second attendance during the year as against 6,812 in 1936. Of these, 3,644 were insured patients, some 5,000 brought letters from their own doctor, and 400 brought recommendation forms. Records have not been kept of the total number of interviews with patients, but they are at least four times the above number. As will be seen from the accounts, £4,542 15s. 2d. was received from patients and their societies, compared with £3,983 19s. 6d. in 1936.

Almoner's
Department.

Once more the Infirmary has had to bear the great financial burden of treating persons injured as the result of road accidents in the district. 221 cases attributable to motor accidents were treated during the year. Cases admitted to the wards numbered 128, being an increase of 46 over the number admitted last year. In-patient treatment for these cases cost the Infirmary £976 6s. 10d., towards which an amount of £147 11s. 10d. was received. It is estimated that some 9 beds were occupied daily throughout the year by this class of patient, and the Committee are as concerned at this encroachment upon the accommodation required for the many urgent cases on the waiting list as they are at the financial loss involved in treatment of accident cases.

Pathological
Department.

The year 1937 has been one of continued and increased activity in this department. A total of 8,401 specimens were examined, which represents an increase of 680 on the figure for 1936. Of these, 3,542 were samples of milk for analysis, which exceeded the previous year's figures by 960.

The facilities of the department have been greatly improved by the extensions which have been completed during the year, providing accommodation for a bio-chemical laboratory, and the appointment of a bio-chemist in the person of Mr. L. H. Easson, B.Sc., Ph.D., who took up his duties in September.

Committee of
Management.

The Committee refer with regret to the resignation of the Very Rev. Cecil H. H. Cooper, Dean of Carlisle, on his relinquishing office. The Committee are most appreciative of his sympathetic interest and help in their work, and wish him health and happiness in his retirement.

Deaths.

The Committee express the deepest regret at the death of four gentlemen who have rendered memorable work to the hospital.

Mr. Norman Maclaren who passed away on 12th August, was appointed Assistant Surgeon in 1904, and full Surgeon in 1912. He resigned the office under the Statutes in June, 1936, and was appointed by the Governors Consulting Surgeon. He was a man of wide interests, and his knowledge and grasp of the general administration of the Infirmary were recognised by the Governors when they unanimously appointed him as Treasurer of the Infirmary on the death of Mr. E. W. Stead. As Treasurer, Mr. Maclaren was able to throw all his energy into the Infirmary scheme of extensions, the completion of which had for long been his great ambition. The launching of this scheme and the success of the new operating room fund were greatly due to his initiative.

His untimely death was a great loss to the Committee, and it brought to an end an association with the Infirmary lasting 63 years, begun on the election of his father, the late Mr. Roderick Maclaren, as Surgeon in 1874.

The Committee have decided to provide a permanent record of his work by means of a suitable memorial and inscription.

Dr. R. Dundas Helm, who died on the 4th January, 1938. Dr. Helm's association with the Infirmary began in 1896, on his appointment as Assistant Physician. In the following year, on the retirement of Dr. Lockie, he was appointed Honorary Physician, which office he held until his retirement in 1922, when he was appointed Honorary Consulting Physician to the Infirmary. He was a member of the Committee of Management for 40 years, becoming an ex-officio member in 1897 on his appointment to the office of Physician, and, latterly, as a representative of the Vice-Presidents.

Mr. Robert Fulton, who had been one of the prime movers in the organisation of the General Workers' Committee. This Committee, it will be remembered, was formed originally for the purpose of removing a great burden of debt from the Infirmary general fund. Mainly owing to Mr. Fulton's enthusiasm and organising ability, this object was achieved, and since then, under Mr. Fulton's energetic direction, the Committee has collected substantial contributions from the work-people in the district served by the Infirmary to the extent of some £4,000 annually. The Committee of Management place on record their grateful appreciation of his work.

Mr. C. J. Wilkinson, who was a Governor of the Hospital, and a member of the Committee of Election. During his lifetime, Mr. Wilkinson was a great friend of the hospital, and proved a most liberal benefactor under his will.

This report would not be complete without reference to an event which might be well described as one of the landmarks in the history of the Cumberland Infirmary. In September, the Committee received, with profound regret, the resignation of Mr. J. G. Howitt, who for 48 years had served them as Secretary. In 1889 Mr. Howitt was called upon in an emergency caused by the death of the previous Secretary to carry on the work temporarily. This he did so efficiently and enthusiastically that the Committee appointed him permanently, and this confidence he justified over a period representing nearly half of the life of the Infirmary. The respect and esteem in which he was held were voiced at a meeting of the Governors and staff when presentations were made to Mr. Howitt by the Chairman, who also expressed the good wishes of the Committee for a long and happy retirement.

Administra-
tion.

In view of the considerable development of the hospital in the near future as the base hospital for the area, the Committee decided to widen the scope of the duties of the Secretary, and in place of Mr. Howitt, appointed Mr. J. S. Rippier, Assistant House Governor at the General Infirmary at Leeds, as Secretary-Superintendent. Mr. Rippier had also gained considerable previous experience of hospital administration in appointments at Norwich and Plymouth.

The Committee also felt that the time had come when there should be an official deputy to the Secretary-Superintendent, and appointed Mr. A. Pickering, who had for some years been Mr. Howitt's right hand man, as Assistant Secretary.

Thanks.

The Committee have pleasure in expressing their hearty thanks to the following for their loyal services and continued help during the past year :-

The many voluntary blood donors who have continued to render signal service to their fellows by their life giving and saving work for our patients.

All those who have contributed to the continued success of the efforts of the General Workers' Committee and the Hospital Sunday and Saturday Fund Committee.

The members of the Cumberland Infirmary Linen League, and to Miss Barnes, its Honorary Secretary, for their unflagging enthusiasm, whereby the Infirmary is relieved of the burden of great expense on linen and uniforms. Full particulars of the work of the Linen League may be found on page 76.

The members of the Ladies' Working Party, who meet at the Infirmary week by week, and unassumingly do so much valuable work in the renovation of bedding and linen.

Mrs. Donald and her friends, who so successfully carry on the canteen. The refreshments provided are greatly appreciated by the patients awaiting their turn in the out-patients' department, especially those who have come from a distance.

The members of the Carlisle Rotary Club for their great help in conveying patients from the Infirmary to the Silloth Convalescent Home by means of their voluntary motor service.

Miss Webb and Mr. K. Payne, with the members of the Carlisle Boys' Brigade, and the organisers of Aspatria and district egg collections for their efforts, which resulted in the magnificent total of 7,690 eggs being received by the Infirmary.

The allotment holders for their kindness in contributing gifts, and to Mr. Martin for arranging the conveyance of the fruit and vegetables to the Infirmary.



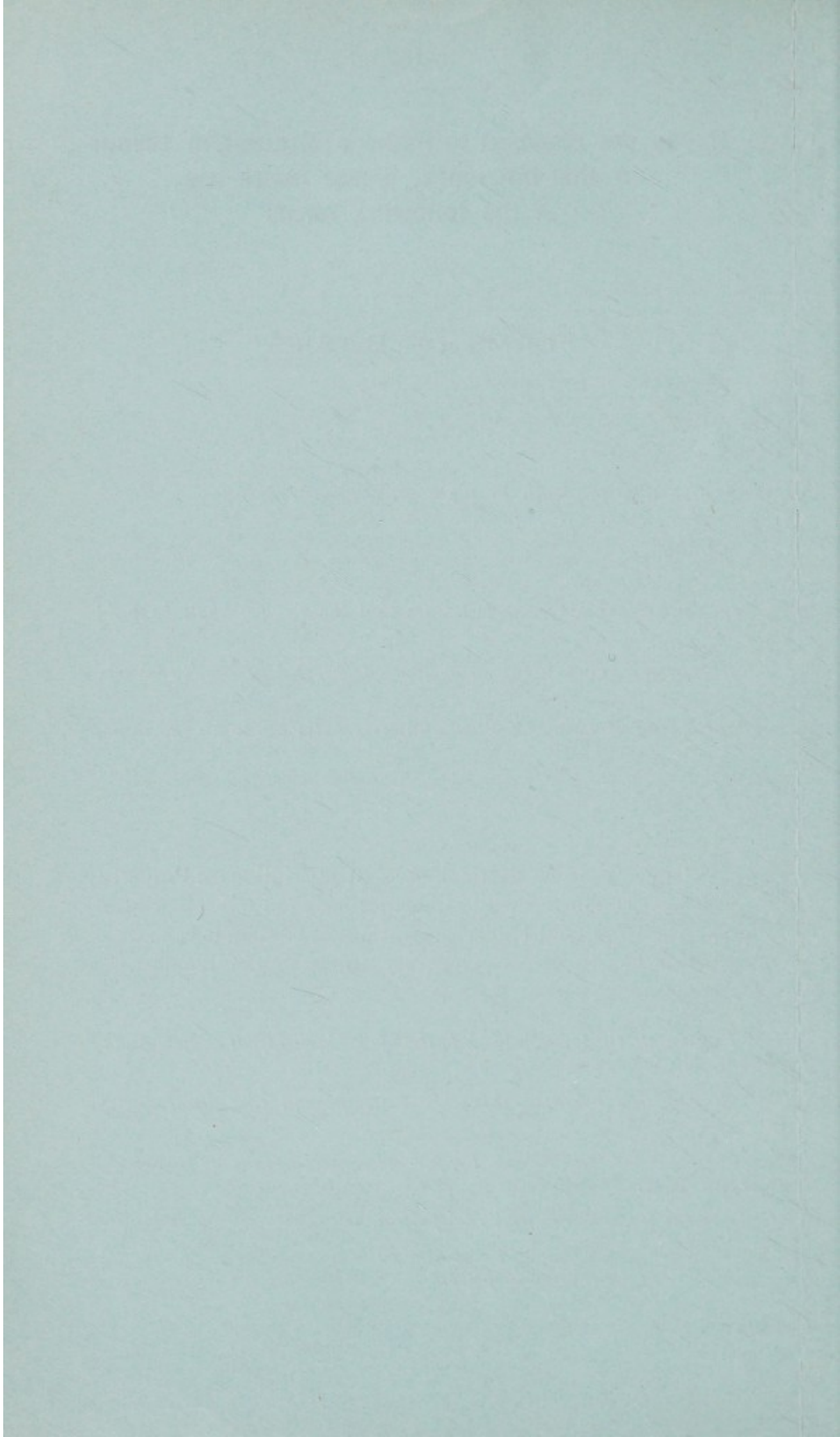

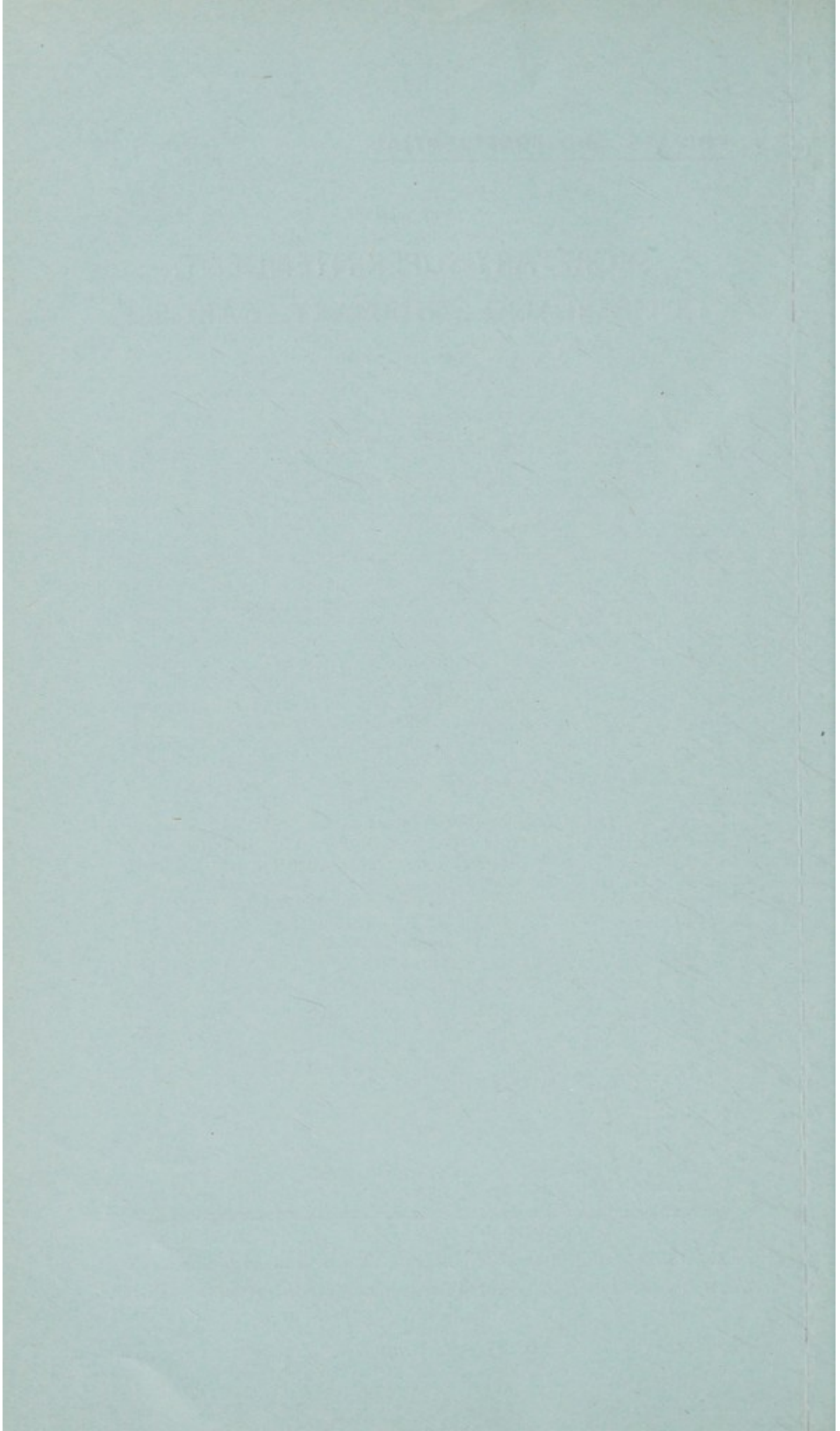

OBJECT.

The object of the League is to supply all the Household Linen for use of Patients in the Infirmary.

RULES.

Each Vice-President is responsible for the Collection of Subscriptions and Work from not less than six Associates.

Each Vice-President is to pay a Subscription of 2s. 6d., and each Associate is to subscribe not less than 1s. annually, and to provide two or more articles of Linen.

Those who do not wish to give Linen may become Honorary Associates by subscribing not less than 5s. annually.

LINEN LEAGUE REPORT, 1937.

The policy of the Linen League has always been progress, and it is satisfactory to be able to record increases in the Twenty-ninth Annual Report. The number of Associates is 1,975, an increase of 77 on last year's total. 1,397 articles have been sent to the Infirmary, compared with 1,365 in 1936. A sum of £432 10s. 10d. has been collected in subscriptions.

The Annual Exhibition was held on 4th March, and was opened by Mrs. Phythian-Adams. There was a wonderful display of linen and blankets in the Board Room. The Children's Dressing Gowns, Frocks, and Hot Bottle Covers, kindly made and given by the girls of Red Gables and Wykeham House Schools, were much admired. Great interest was taken in the new Marking Machine presented to the Sewing Room by the League. The machine does its work so well that even when the articles marked fall to pieces the marking remains intact. A brisk trade was done at the Kate Greenaway Stalls, which realised £32 19s. 8d. The Vice-President in the Kirkoswald district organised a most successful Rummage Sale, at which a sum of £20 10s. 0d. was made. Congratulations and grateful thanks are extended to the Associate and her many friends who have assiduously laid hands on all the Bun Pennies in circulation in the neighbourhood. £33 10s. 4d. has been raised by this effort. The money has been placed on deposit in the Savings Bank, and will be used to equip three of the beds in the new wards. Several other combined efforts have been made in aid of the League—Moss Litter Works (Gretna), Steam Laundry (Gretna), Toll Bar (Gretna), Blacksmith's Shop (Gretna), Kirkoswald Women's Institute, L. & N.W. Steam Sheds. These efforts are not only valuable for the grist they bring to the mill, but for the interest they arouse among people who would otherwise know nothing of the League. Gratitude is expressed to organisers and helpers.

The Menders meet at the Infirmary every Friday, and do most valuable work. Everything that can be mended, patched, or darned is tackled with enthusiasm, and the menders have the satisfaction of knowing that they are prolonging the life of the Infirmary linen. The selvages and hems are torn off all unmendable articles and put into a sack. When the sack is full, the rags are sold for half-a-crown. The remnants end their days as cleaning cloths.

There is a saying that the door to success is always labelled "Push." The Linen League was begun with a push. It has been carried on with a push, but the greatest push of all will be needed in the days to come. As soon as ever the first whisper of extensions was heard, the Vice-Presidents and Associates began to budget for the equipment of the beds in the new wards. A sum of money has been placed on deposit which will ensure the equipment of 20 beds. The Finance Committee relies on the League for the supply of all the linen that is needed, and for the provision of all the Uniforms. The demands of the Infirmary as a base Hospital will be greater than they have ever been in the past. These demands, however, can be met if the readers of this report will broadcast an S.O.S. among their friends of the increased needs, and by so doing enlist the help of a great army of new supporters.
