The Board of Management has much pleasure in submitting its Report and Statement of Accounts to the Governors.

### OPERATIONS.

The foregoing again proves the urgent necessity of increased accommodation; the percentage of the daily occupied number of beds reaches the extraordinary figure of 98, a parallel of which is not to be found in any of the surrounding district hospitals.

The increased numbers attending the Casualty and Out-patient Departments bears testimony to the large amount of work, time and thought given by the members of the Honorary Medical Staff to those who seek the benefits of treatment which the Infirmary provides, and the Board of Management is particularly mindful of the difficulties with which they have to contend in the discharge of their much appreciated services.

The Board of Management desires to again place on record the valuable assistance rendered by the Schofield Convalescent Fund and District Nursing Associations in co-operating with the after-care of patients. This help is very gratifying and warmly acknowledged.

### CHAIRMANSHIP.

In March of this year Mr. W. Clark, J.P., was reluctantly compelled to resign the Chairmanship. He took this step after careful consideration and upon medical advice, but it was encouraging to your Committee that he expressed his intention to continue his association with the Infirmary by remaining a member of the Board of Management. The Board felt that the loss of his services as Chairman was nothing less than a disaster, and place on record its unbounded sense of obligation for all he has done for the Institution during the long period, now more than forty years, during which he has been intimately associated with its management, and more especially for his unremitting labour as Chairman of the

Committees during the last five years. The Board have learned to value more highly his unbounded courtesy and sympathetic consideration of divergent and often conflicting views, his ripe experience and practical knowledge of hospital work, and it is sure that no abler man could occupy the Chair, and regret that it cannot express to its own satisfaction its admiration and affection.

The Committee very much appreciate the services of Mr. A. A. Bell, the Vice-Chairman, who undertook, at very short notice, the onerous duties of Chairman, and to him warm and hearty thanks are given.

### HONORARY FINANCIAL SECRETARY.

Mr. W. E. Lister resigned the post of Honorary Financial Secretary on account of his leaving the district, and your Board accepted with deep regret his resignation. The Committee is conscious of and desire to recognise the valuable services rendered for eight years as Honorary Financial Secretary and nineteen years as Honorary Secretary, and realise that during his associations with the Institution he did not spare himself in time and thought in promoting its best interests. He made the cause his own, and to-day we benefit by his good, able and untiring work on behalf of those who are sick.

### OBITUARY.

The Institution has lost a great and true friend in the death of Mr. W. E. Atkinson. For the greater part of his life he was most closely associated with the work and affairs of the Infirmary, both as one of the Trustees and as a most valuable experienced member of its Committee.

The Committee is also greatly indebted to him for his services to the Institution as Honorary Solicitor over a long term of years, without any desire for remuneration, in which proved to be an exceptionally heavy task; nor can they forget that as Honorary Secretary to the Schofield Convalescent Fund, for more than thirty years, he discharged almost without assistance an immense amount of important work. The Committee feels deeply the inadequacy of its words to express the recognition which it knows to be due to the memory of one who thought no time too valuable and no pains too great in the sacred task of alleviating suffering and distress.

### FINANCE.

In spite of the detrimental effect of the coal dispute, your Committee is very pleased to present to you, having due regard of circumstances, a very favourable financial report. The deficit for the year is £1,064 3s. 3d., and added to the accumulated deficit brought forward, £6,583 3s. 6d., making a total accumulated debt of £7,647 6s. 9d.

It will be observed that the year's deficit is the lowest for the past four years, being mainly due to the magnificent assistance and loyalty of those who have contributed regularly each week and to the strict supervision of expenditure; it must be borne in mind that at one period of the year the accounts showed a total deficit of £12,000, and, therefore, much anxiety was occasioned.

The pledge given by the Mine Workers' representatives, that the loss of revenue sustained would be made good, has been honoured, the whole of their contributions having been devoted to the Maintenance Fund and will continue to be so until such time as the accumulated deficit has disappeared. The Board desire very sincerely to thank all those who have so loyally continued their support and also to the new contributors.

Your Board of Management is again pleased to report a still further reduction in costs, as is clearly shown by the following:—

Without impairing, in any way, the efficient treatment and welfare of the patient, the expenditure is—taking into account the amount of increased work done—£2,405 less compared with last year.

### GIFTS.

The whole hearted support of Lady Harewood's Egg Day Appeal has again assured a 12 months' supply of eggs, and the Board desires to record its warmest thanks to all who contributed in any way to its success.

The Linen League is also heartily congratulated for its continued valued assistance in providing linen and garments for the patients. The Board is conscious of the large amount of work and personal interest taken in this branch of the administration, and the generosity of the Linen League is most warmly acknowledged.

### DEMONSTRATIONS.

The Income received from the several Demonstration Committees is very encouraging and again amplifies the importance of the work of the Institution in the areas surrounding Doncaster. The best thanks and appreciation of the Committee are tendered to all who have helped to make these efforts a success.

### HOSPITAL CO-ORDINATION.

During the year the problems surrounding the question of hospital co-ordination has received the serious consideration of the Board, which has signified its willingness to co-operate on the lines indicated in a letter sent out from the Ministry of Health.

In view of contemplated Legislation regarding the administration of those hospitals governed by County and Local Authorities the importance of the subject cannot be denied and your Board of Management is determined to pursue a line of policy which is consistent with all that is best within the Voluntary Hospital Movement.

### NEW INFIRMARY.

Since the last Report the Committee decided that in view of the depression in trade it could no longer afford to bear the expense of the Appeal Office and in January of this year the Office was closed and the administration transferred to the Secretary Superintendent.

Owing to the lack of funds it has not been possible to make any headway with building operations but, with a view to doing so at an early date, the Directorate of the several collieries have been approached to make known to what extent they would help financially with the project.

At the time of presenting this Report eight of the ten collieries have promised substantial help and overtures continue to be made to the remaining two.

It will be readily appreciated that the Scheme cannot possibly be carried out without first obtaining large contributions from the chief industries in the area which the hospital serves.

The Committee is deeply indebted to the many donors, organisations and societies who have contributed to the Building Fund; such help has been a great encouragement, particularly at this time, when the question of finance gives cause for much anxiety.

At a Public Meeting, the Mayor (Councillor H. M. Marshall, J.P.), presiding, it was decided to hold a Gigantic Bazaar in the Spring of 1928, and for this purpose the Scarbrough Barracks have been lent by the West Riding of Yorkshire Territorial Association, free of charge. The general arrangements are now well in hand and the several committees appointed are working enthusiastically, so much so, that the success of the venture is assured.

### ACKNOWLEDGMENT.

The continued professional assistance of the Solicitors, Messrs. Atkinson and Sons, and the Accountants, Messrs. R. L. Marsden and Co., is very much appreciated, and the Board tenders to them its sincere thanks for their valued and able services.

Your Board records its gratification for the services of the Chaplain from the Parish Church, the several Vicars of the Parishes, and other Ministers of Religion, who have contributed so much to the happiness and welfare of the patients by their regular visits to the Wards.

The most grateful thanks of the Board of Management are tendered to all who have answered the call of the Institution and helped to forward this important healing work.

To the Honorary and Resident Medical Staff, Nursing, Domestic and Administrative Staffs, the Board conveys its appreciation and thanks for their continued loyal and efficient service.

It would be difficult to enumerate in full all the various benefactors and voluntary workers to whom the Institution is bound by ties of gratitude for the help so ungrudgingly given, but the Committee take this opportunity of tendering its sincere thanks.

### FIFTH ANNUAL REPORT-26th NOVEMBER, 1927.

By an examination of the figures contained in the Statement of Accounts now presented it will be seen that, compared with the previous full year of 1925, the contributions received from several Collieries are considerably reduced, whilst in other cases substantial increases have taken place.

An explanation for the decreases is found in the disastrous stoppage in the Coal Industry of last year. After the termination of this dispute very few Collieries were able to make their deductions for the Fund until the beginning of January of this year and even then on very depleted numbers. In other cases contributions did not come into effect until a much later date.

Bentley is a case in point, whose first contributions were not received until the latter end of April. The income from this Colliery for the present year is £478 14s. 4d., as compared with £1,261 7s. 7d. for the year 1925.

It was hoped that consideration might be given to the payment of the arrears accumulated during the stoppage, but owing to short employment and the crushing burden of the weekly stoppages from the workmen's wages for other purposes, such a course has been found impossible, and in consequence the Fund has suffered a financial loss to this extent. It will be observed that a notable increase in contributions has taken place in connection with Thorne Colliery. £491 11s. 3d. has been received from this source, whose first contribution to the Fund was in last year, representing £39 3s. 0d. This welcome increase is due to the fact that Thorne workmen are now whole-heartedly supporting the Doncaster Mine-Workers' Scheme. As rapid developments are now taking place at this Colliery, it is expected that in a very few years Thorne will be one of the largest subscribers to the Fund.

It is gratifying to note, and clearly demonstrates the sound principles of the Fund, that although the scheme was inoperative for the greater part of last year, the same has been rapidly re-established on its original basis and is again working with entire satisfaction.

Our thanks are due to Mr. Mears, Secretary-Superintendent of the Infirmary, for auditing these Accounts, and for the valuable assistance and advice he has freely given when required.
