REPORT

OF THE

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

for the year ended 30th September, 1928.

The Board of Management has much pleasure in submitting to the Governors its Report and Statement of

Accounts for the year ended 30th September, 1928.

The activities of the Institution have again reached a higher level than in the previous year. The Statistical returns which follow will reveal that the work done has been greater than ever, the demands on the Institution having been heavier than at any previous time; while financial returns show that despite of industrial depression the Institution has been favoured with such a measure of support that it was self-supporting during the year, and we close with a balance in hand on our current maintenance account. It has, indeed, been not only an eventful year, but one which shows that the Infirmary is the object of a generous sympathy, and that our trust and confidence in the goodwill of the community is abundantly justified.

The most noteworthy items in the above statistics are those of attendance in the X-Ray and Massage Departments. Very careful examination into the needs of the Hospital in these departments has been made, and an additional Masseuse was sanctioned to cope with the ever-increasing demands, but a satisfactory solution of dealing with the large number of patients attending for X-Ray has been deferred pending the appointment of an experienced Staff Nurse to the Department.

The Board very much regret that the number of accidents and emergency cases which have been admitted has not allowed of any reduction of the number of cases awaiting admission, but to those who wait a great amount of courage and hope is imparted in the section of the

Report dealing with the New Infirmary.

The inadequacy of the accommodation has occasioned the Board of Management anxiety, and the responsibility of providing, without delay, the extended facilities for the treatment of both in and out-patients must be met by all sections of society.

OBITUARY.

The loss of Mr. William Clark, J.P., who was intimately associated with the Infirmary for 45 years, is very keenly felt by all members of the Board. He will long be remembered for his powerful chairmanship of an Institution whose problems and difficulties have been many and very complex. His tenacity and patience will always remain a cherished memory by his colleagues, and his ideals a guidance to those who desire to see accomplished all that which is best in the great and noble movement of the Voluntary Hospital. In recognition of his valued services to the Institution a bed has been named to perpetuate his lifetime association with the Infirmary.

From the list of Trustees the names of Mr. Harry A. Brundell and Mr. Robert Robinson have been deleted, both these gentlemen having passed away during the year.

Mr. Brundell's services in connection with the acquisition of the New Infirmary Site were highly appreciated, and the loss of his advice upon professional matters will be keenly felt. He was always a ready and willing colleague, and his presence at the Meetings of the Board gave much confidence to the other Members.

Mr. Robinson will be remembered best by those whose association with the Infirmary extends over a number of years, but his services as a Trustee and his sympathy with

the sick were appreciated by all.

ROAD ACCIDENTS.

The question of the increased responsibilities which casualities, arising from motor accidents, have thrust upon your Board has received very careful and earnest consideration of the British Hospitals Association's Regional Committees. With a view to obtaining adequate remuneration for services rendered, many schemes have been suggested, but none have proved to be really sound and practicable. Your Board advise that no extraordinary steps should be taken without such steps be approved and recommended by the Association referred to above, and be consistent with the policy of voluntary hospitals. Those who have studied this matter are aware that it is a national problem, for every Hospital in the country is more or less affected. A National scheme for dealing with it is being slowly worked out.

FINANCE.

It is very gatifying to present, in spite of industrial depression, a favourable record of income and expenditure.

There has been an excess of income over expenditure of £1,090 ls. 5d., which has been used to reduce the accumulated deficit from £7,647 6s. 9d. to £6,557 5s. 4d.

The Board are very grateful for, and warmly acknowledge, the increased subscriptions received from employees who have contributed regularly each week through their places of employment. From this source £12,881 has been received, which forcibly emphasises the urgent necessity of enrolling all wage earners to become members of the Contributory Scheme. To those heads of firms whose employees are not contributing weekly an earnest appeal is made to bring the matter to their notice so that the contemplated increased accommodation at the New Infirmary may be maintained without financial anxiety.

It gives the greatest satisfaction to the Board to record the continued loyalty of those engaged in the mines, railways, glass, metal, and building trades, and sincere thanks are tendered to each for the munificent help they have so ungrudgingly given.

During the year the number of new Subscribers has increased, and the Board is very gratified that the Directorates of the Colliery Companies, with the exception of one, have continued to contribute amounts equivalent to one-third of their Workmen's subscriptions.

The Board is grateful for the large amount of support which it has received from all Employers of labour.

The very best thanks, appreciation and congratulations of the Board of Management are tendered to the Demonstration Committees for their continued and increased assistance. The Board recognises the importance of the work which they are doing in bringing to the notice of the outside districts the claims of the Institution.

Increased income has been received from grateful patients and Approved Societies, but it is very disappointing that so few of the National Health Approved Societies make grants to Hospitals in respect of the treatment of their members. The hope is expressed that the Minister of Health will see his way to reimburse hospitals for all services rendered to insured persons.

EXPENDITURE.

The total amount of expenditure is increased as compared with last year, but upon close examination of the accounts it compares favourably with last year's.

With due regard to efficient and proper care of patients and staff the utmost economy has been exercised, and taking into consideration the multiplicity of many parts of Hospital equipment occasioned by having patients and Staff housed in four separate buildings, the Board is satisfied that the administration is managed on sound lines.

LINEN LEAGUE.

The Linen League is again to be specially commended for its continued practical help in providing the linen and garments for patients and for the welcome Christmas gifts which were given to the In-Patients.

The Board is conscious of the large amount of hard work and perseverance which is exhibited by the members of the League on behalf of the Institution, and warmest thanks are tendered for their valued assistance.

GIFTS.

To Lady Harewood and Mrs. Warde-Aldam and their loyal helpers the best thanks of the Board are tendered for again assuring a year's supply of eggs. The annual egg collection day is one which is very highly prized and its usefulness is specially commended. The various Clubs in the neighbourhood are also thanked for their valuable assistance in this connection.

Regular gifts of fruit and vegetables have been received from Messrs. W. E. Cox, Ltd., and the great amount of interest and sympathy which their gifts represent is much appreciated and highly esteemed.

The Board appreciate the generosity of the many friends who sent gifts of every kind during the year, and to them hearty thanks are offered.

NEW INFIRMARY.

The optimistic note which was sounded at the last Meeting of Governors has been fully justified. The contracts for the completion of the first block have been let. Building of the Superstructure was commenced in May, and good and rapid progress is reported.

The Board is conscious of the tremendous debt of gratitude which it owes to all those who worked cheerfully both before and during the memorable bazaar held in March, when £10,861 3s. 11d. was paid into the Building Fund Account.

The success of the venture created a new courage to go forward with confidence on the building scheme which had been held up for lack of funds. The assistance which the Bazaar organization rendered both financially and morally is deserving of the warmest thanks and appreciation of all in Doncaster and district. It demonstrated to the utmost the desirability of unity and concentration upon the task which has been undertaken.

The interest and help which everyone so readily gave is acknowledged with profound gratitude and sincere thanks.

A detailed statement of account will be found on page 14 of the Report.

It is with a sense of gratitude and confidence that your Board report the receipt from The Doncaster Collieries Association, Messrs. Barber, Walker & Co., Ltd., The Rossington Main Colliery Co., Ltd., of the first and second instalments of the £25,000, £5,000 and £4,000 promised respectively towards the building of the first block.

For this evidence of the desire to help to provide adequate and efficient hospital accommodation, the Board tenders its warmest thanks and appreciation.

Your Board make a most earnest appeal to employers, employees and others to aid them in raising £70,000, being the balance required for the completion of the first block of the New Infirmary.

Grateful and warmest thanks are tendered to all who have in any way contributed to the success of the year's work of the Building Fund. It is most gratifying to see the result of their generosity manifest itself in the progress which is being made with building operations.

To the members of, and contributors to, the Women's Effort Stamp Scheme the grateful thanks of the Board are extended. The hard work and courage which they have put into the effort, to attain such success, is deserving of the greatest admiration.

Your Board have duly recognised the difficulties of raising so large a sum as £100,000 immediately, and they commend to everyone the desirability of giving a definite sum spread over a period of years, and would also remind the Governors that income tax may be deducted from the amount subscribed provided a Covenant is entered into agreeing to give a fixed amount for seven years.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT.

In presenting a comprehensive Report it is particularly difficult to express adequately the thanks and appreciation due to the many organizations and individuals who have so generously and loyally assisted the Institution during the year, but to all the best and most sincere thanks are tendered. The Board of Management is particularly grateful to Mr. Nicholas Jackson for his professional services and advice which he has so readily given in connection with legal matters and administration affecting both the maintenance and building funds.

Mr. Jackson's generosity and helpful advice is deserving of the gratitude of friends of the Institution.

The professional and honorary services of the Auditors, Messrs. R. L. Marsden & Co., are also heartily appreciated and acknowledged.

The Board desire to place on record its appreciation of the loyal and efficient services of the Medical, Nursing and Administrative Staffs. They work at high pressure, in scattered buildings and often under conditions of acute difficulty, but their loyalty is beyond praise, and the work of the Institution was never more effectively performed than at present.



Doncaster and District Mine-Workers' Infirmary Fund.

SIXTH ANNUAL REPORT-1st DECEMBER, 1928.

This sixth Annual Report further serves to emphasise the continued success of the Mine-Workers' Infirmary Fund Scheme, and it will be seen by an examination of the Balance Sheet that at least an annual income of £10,000 is assured from this source. Having regard to the terrible depression in the Coal Industry during the past year, involving continued unemployment and short-time, the £9,465 subscribed by Colliery Workers during this period represents a great achievement which has only been made possible by real sacrifice and a genuine desire to help in the consummation of a great and worthy cause.

It is indeed gratifying to report that nine large Collieries in the Doncaster District, employing upwards of 30,000 workmen, are now consistently contributing 2d. per week per workman, viz., 8s. 8d. per annum, not infrequently out of a very meagre income, and it seems opportune to point out that during times of depression this method has distinct advantages, in providing a stable and reliable income to the Infirmary, over other

methods based on the fluctuation of income.

It is a matter for regret that this principle, which has certainly made progress in various other Industries, is not yet the universal rule for all employees in the district, but it is hoped that before long a policy will be adopted by the Board of Management to bring all workers within the purview of this arrangement.

Due to increased contributions from the Mine Workers, we are allotted, in accordance with the rules of the Constitution, a further representative on the Board of Management, making nine in all, for the ensuing year. This will give one representative to each subscribing

*Colliery.

Since our last Annual Meeting another start has been made with the erection of the new Infirmary and it is sincerely hoped that the first section will be completed without further reverses.

Success in this direction can only be secured by the

loyal co-operation of all concerned.

Colliery workers have always been prepared to play their part in this matter and we rightly expect a generous

response from Employers.

Owners have generously assisted in this work, despite the deplorable times through which the industry has been passing, and it is sincerely hoped that their example will be emulated by others who, up to the present, have been less sympathetic.

In a matter of such urgency, Employers cannot be excused by trade depression any more than workers can

by short-time and low wages.

Accidents will continue to occur at our Collieries after the greatest care is exercised, and in justice to those who unfortunately meet with such accidents, the best and most expeditious treatment must be provided, and whilst, unfortunately, there is not legal compulsion that hospitals should be part of a Colliery equipment, it is the bounden duty of all such Companies to render generous assistance in the provision of such Institutions elsewhere.

We again desire to tender our sincere thanks to Mr. Mears, Secretary-Superintendent of the Infirmary, for auditing our accounts, and for the help he has given us in various ways.
