





The Committee of Management for the Year 1927.

THE Committee of Management have the honour to submit to the Governors the 87th Annual Report of the Dorset County Hospital for the year ended 31st December, 1927.

During the past year the number of patients admitted was:— Male 340; Female 294; Children 157.

Total number of In-patients 791.

Three hundred and ninety operations were performed. Of these 163 were major operations (Intra-abdominal 95; Extra-abdominal 68). Two hundred and twenty-seven were minor operations.

The Balance on the Ordinary Income and Expenditure Account of £485 16s. 4d. has been debited to the Capital Account.

The Income and Expenditure Account accompanies this Report, and gives full details of Income and Expenditure.

CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

The Committee are much gratified with the working of this Scheme which is now on a sound footing and promises to provide a substantial annual income for the Hospital.

Not only does it considerably assist the funds of the Hospital but it is of great financial benefit to those members who have occasion to obtain Hospital treatment.

During the year a branch was formed for the Parishes of Moreton and Woodsford, and many members have been enrolled. This now brings the total number of branches up to 28 embracing 84 parishes. The total collection for 1927 reached the record sum of £1,372 7s. 9d., being an increase of £158 14s. 11d. on the receipts for 1926. During the year 257 members were admitted as In-patients whilst a considerable number were treated as Out-patients. Such In-patients were collectively treated for a period of 7,252 days. The full charge which these patients would have been required to pay amounts to the sum of £543 18s. 0d.

The Committee desire to place on record their grateful thanks to the many voluntary helpers who assist in this valuable work.

APPOINTMENTS.

Lord Ellenborough, for eight years Chairman of the Committee of Management, was elected President on the 25th February, 1927, and continues to give the Committee the great benefit of his advice and assistance.

- Mr. W. J. Brymer was elected Chairman, and Colonel G. R. Tod, Vice-Chairman.
- Dr. G. G. Morrice, M.D. (Camb.), F.R.C.P. (London), has kindly consented to serve the Hospital for another year as Hon. Physician.
- Dr. W. Russell, B.A., M.B., C.H.B., B.A.O., resigned his position as House Surgeon in October, 1927, and has been succeeded by Dr. J. Furman, B.Sc., M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P.
- Dr. G. R. P. Aldred-Brown, B.A., M.B., B.Ch. (Oxon.) was elected Hon. Physician in April, 1927.

Mr. W. Grant Oliver, L.D.S., R.C.S.E., Hon. Surgeon Dentist, resigned in July, 1927, and Mr. N. Alwyn Goudge, L.D.S., R.C.S.E., was elected to take his place.

The Regular Staff of Nurses consists of the Matron, 7 Sisters (including the Massage Sister), 4 Nurses and 17 Probationers.

All are available for re-election, with the exception of Mr. A. D. Jackman, who has resigned after 16 years of valuable work for the Hospital.

ANNEXE.

The new Annexe referred to in the Report for 1926 is now well established and has been in use during the year. As is well known, this Department was added to the Institution for the reception of paying patients, and by this means the smaller wards in the Main Building have been available for other patients. The Committee are pleased to be able to state that the Annexe has proved to be a source of profit to the Hospital.

The number of patients treated has been 106.

OPHTHALMIC DEPARTMENT.

The new Ophthalmic Department presented in memory of the late Mr. William Watkins, J.P., by his family and by the Society of Dorset Men in London, was declared open by Mr. Llewellyn Watkins, F.C.I.S., on the 17th February, 1926, when Sir William Lister, K.C.M.G., F.R.C.I., was kind enough to give an address. The number of new patients who received treatment during the year was 185. The number of old patients' attendances was 355, making the total number of attendances 540.

This department, under the direction of Mr. T. Colley, M.B., Ch.B., M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P. (Lond.), is doing splendid work and the Committee desire to repeat their deep gratitude to the Donors.

X-RAY DEPARTMENT.

A new and up-to-date apparatus is now being installed which should add considerably to the efficiency of this Department.

GENERAL.

Under the direction of Mr. E. Macgregor Duncan, M.I. Mech.E., M.I.E.E., Consulting Engineer, a new heating system has been installed throughout the Hospital at a cost of nearly £2,000; the outlay has been heavy but we think that it is justified by the result.

A collection of tinfoil has been started, and it is hoped to develop this scheme during the coming year.

We record with gratitude the effort that is being made by Messrs. E. W. Tilley, J.P., P. E. Crabb, C. J. Foot and E. Howard, and other Dorchester Residents to raise funds to provide the Hospital with a new Motor Ambulance.

After careful consideration the Committee have accepted the Pension scheme for Hospital Officers and Nurses. We are convinced that such a Scheme is necessary, but its adoption will entail heavy additional expenditure. We are grateful to Miss E. Pearce, A.C.A., for her work in connection with this Scheme.

THANKS.

The Committee wish to place on record their deep appreciation of the way in which the Hon. Medical Staff and Surgical Staff, the House Surgeon, the Dispenser, the Chaplain, the Secretary, Matron, Sisters and Nurses, and the General Staff of the Hospital have responded to the demands on their services, and for their self-sacrificing efforts on behalf of the patients.

The number of Eggs received for the Hospital from the collection, organised by Mrs. Sykes, was 23,203. We are most grateful to those who gave the eggs, and to all who helped with the collection, and to the carriers who brought the eggs to the Hospital, free of charge.

Miss Williams, the Teachers and pupils of the Dorchester High School, have generously undertaken to support a cot in the children's ward. The Committee are very grateful to them for their generosity.

The Committee desire to express their gratitude to the Proprietors of the "Dorset County Chronicle," and the "Dorset Daily Echo," for continuing to publish, free of charge, all information about the Hospital, and to them and to the Proprietors of the "Daily Telegraph," for supplying their newspapers, gratis, for the use of the Patients.

Alexandra Rose Day Collection, under the direction of Miss Marsden, produced the sum of £54 6s. 0d. We are very grateful to all who helped in Dorchester and District.

We thank Mrs. F. James and the members of the Dorset Working Women's Club for their great kindness in again making-up linen articles for the Hospital.

We desire also to thank Mrs. Nash-Wortham and the members of the Ladies' Linen Guild for their valuable assistance. A report by Mrs. Nash-Wortham appears elsewhere.

Entertainments and Dances have been organised in the Town and District to help the funds of the Hospital. To all who have so kindly helped to make them a success we extend our appreciation and hearty thanks.

We thank all those who have so generously sent gifts of game, vegetables, fruit, flowers, books and magazines, and other presents.

In conclusion the Committee desire to express their deep gratitude to all the supporters of the Dorset County Hospital and at the same time to plead for increased financial support.

The following figures will show at a glance the enormous increase in the ordinary expenditure of the Hospital since pre-war days, that is the year 1913. This is mainly accounted for by the big increase, not only in the average number of patients per week, but also in the average weekly cost of maintenance. It is true the ordinary receipts have correspondingly grown, but the statement will show how imperative it is that our receipts should be increased to cope with the demands of the Hospital.

CHAPLAIN'S DEPARTMENT.

It might seem to some that a visit to the Hospital had as its sole aim bodily recuperation, but it may be of interest to know that the spiritual welfare of the patients is not overlooked. (To that end a Chaplain is appointed at a salary of £50 per annum). At the present time the Rev. Joseph Pulliblank, Rector of Holy Trinity, Dorchester, holds the appointment, assisted in the work by the Rev. H. F. E. Tilney-Bassett.

Each Sunday a Service is held in the Hospital Chapel at 9.30 a.m. for the Staff and such patients as are well enough to attend.

Also a Service is held in one of the Wards every Friday so that the "Cot Cases" may not feel themselves neglected. In addition to these regular services, the Wards are visited constantly by one or other of the Clergy.

The official Chaplain is C. of E., but he makes it his endeavour to inform the local Clergy and Ministers of other denominations when any patient desires further ministrations than he is able to offer.

The Chaplain is glad at all times either to receive letters of Commendation from the Clergy of neighbouring Parishes when Patients are admitted from outside (when he will give them his best care and attention, or on the other hand he is glad to welcome the visits of Local Clergy, who by their more intimate knowledge of the Patient have opportunity of supplementing the regular Pastoral visiting).



THE CHAPEL—DORSET COUNTY HOSPITAL.

The first portion of the Hospital to be built was the North Wing, but the Architect, Mr. Ferrey, provided for a Chapel to be placed in the South Wing, as soon as funds could be collected for it. This Wing was given in 1858, and was called The "Bankes Wing," in memory of Mr. Bankes, of Kingston Lacy, who bequeathed money for this purpose. At the same time Mr. Robert Williams, of Bridehead, came forward, and with great generosity provided the Chapel in memory of his brother-in-law, Mr. Acland (who had changed his name to Troyte) as shewn on the brass inscription attached to the West gallery. "This Chapel was built A.D. 1862, by Robert Williams of Bridehead, in affectionate remembrance of Arthur Henry Duke Troyte, one of the chief founders of this Hospital who entered into his rest 19th June, 1857."

The work was carried out by Mr. Wellspring from the design of Mr. Benjamin Ferrey, and was dedicated 9th April, 1862, by the Bishop of the Diocese, Walter Kerr Hamilton. Although the Chapel is simple in character, it is in keeping with the architectural style of the rest of the Hospital. There is one unusual feature which is apt to escape notice—A boldly designed horizontal string-course runs over the windows on both sides of the body of the Chapel on which are cut in large letters standing out open from the back, two verses from the 103rd Psalm, "Praise the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all His benefits. Who forgiveth all thy sin, and healeth all thine infirmities."

The fine East Window, by Messrs Lavers and Westlake, of London, was given by Col. (now) Sir Robert Williams and his two sisters, in memory of their father, who gave the Chapel, and of a brother. It was dedicated by Bishop John Wordsworth on the 22nd April, 1899, the various subjects selected being appropriate to its connection with a Hospital. The centre light depicts under the similitude of "The Good Shepherd," our Lord's love and care for His people. The side lights are intended to fix attention on two Christian

virtues, "Faith, and Thankfulness." The Northern light shews the Woman whose daughter was healed (St. Matt. xv.) with the words, "O woman great is thy faith"; and the Southern light shews the one leper out of ten who returned in gratitude, "He fell on his face at His feet, giving Him thanks" (St. Luke xvii.) The upper portion of the window contains figures of Angels, holding and displaying scrolls. Over the centre light is the promise, "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these My brethren ye have done it unto Me." In the North light, the Motto, "Christo in pauperibus," and in the other light "Crux mihi anchora," can be seen, the former of these having been adopted as the Hospital motto.

The same spirit was also shown in the treatment of the smaller windows in the body of the Chapel. Thus in the windows on the North wall may be read, "Cast thy burdens upon the Lord"; "God is our refuge and strength"; and in the South windows, "Himself took our infirmities and bare our sicknesses" (that text being selected by Bishop Hamilton at the dedication), and "I am the Lord that healeth thee."

On each side of the East window there now hangs two large oil paintings which have what is probably a unique origin. They were given to the Hospital by Mrs. Floyer of West Stafford, being designs by her uncle, Mr. William John Bankes of Kingston Lacy, for two Church windows; one, "The raising of the widow's son," for the Church of St. Michael Penkevil, Treqothnan, Cornwall; the other, possibly representative of Resurrection for the Church of Lamorran, Cornwall. They are both composite designs being figures brought together from the pictures of various mediæval artists.

In the first named, the figure of our Lord is by Beato Angelico, from his picture, "The Raising of Lazarus."

The Widow is taken from a painting by Ghirlandajo.

The two bearers. who hide their faces, are from a picture at Parma by Ludovica Carracci.

In the other painting, the figure of our Lord is from a work by Bonnifaccio; St. Peter from Garafola; and St. Paul from Palma Vecchio. Four Angels with musical instruments are taken from G. Bellini, and the fifth Angel from Victor Carpaccio.

Below are the words, "Till Angels wake thee with a strain like thine."

There are three Memorials on the walls of the Chapel. The oldest is to Mr. Herbert Williams, whose name appears among those who were most active in the founding of the Hospital; he was the first elected Treasurer, and continued his good work until he died in 1878, a period of about 40 years.

On the South Wall is the Brass in memory of Rev. C. W. Bingham, who held the responsible office of Chairman for 33 years, from 1849 to 1881.

On the North wall is recorded the splendid work of Dr. W. Vawdry Lush, Hon. Physician from 1872 to 1904. His death occurred in the Board Room during a Committee Meeting on 7th December, 1904.

EMPLOYEES' CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

The attention of all Governors and Employers of labour is drawn to the benefit to be derived by all Employees and others who at any time may desire to claim admission to the Hospital either as In-patients or Out-patients.

All In-patients have for several years been required to pay 10/6 per week towards the cost of their maintenance.

The Contributory Scheme was launched in the year 1922 and Members thereby insure against the risk of having to pay the 10/6 per week.

The Rules are :-

- (a) Members who have been on the Roll for three months and have regularly paid their weekly subscriptions are on admission to the Hospital charged 5/3 per week only.
- (b) After six months' Membership they are entitled to free treatment.
- (c) The minimum subscription is 1d. per week for a single person and 2d. per week for a contributor and his wife and children up to the age of 14 years.
- (d) Members are also entitled to Admission as Outpatients to all Departments, viz., X-Ray, Massage, Sun Light, Dentists and Ophthalmic.
- (e) Maternity cases are alone excluded from the benefit of the Scheme.

Employers of labour (including those of domestic servants) are urged to advise their Employees to become Members.

The Scheme is under the management of an entirely separate Committee and the whole of the work of collection is performed voluntarily, so that every penny subscribed is paid over to the Hospital without deduction.

Two hundred and fifty-seven Members were admitted as In-patients, free of charge, during 1927. Had they not been Members of the Scheme they would have been liable to pay £543 18s. 0d.


