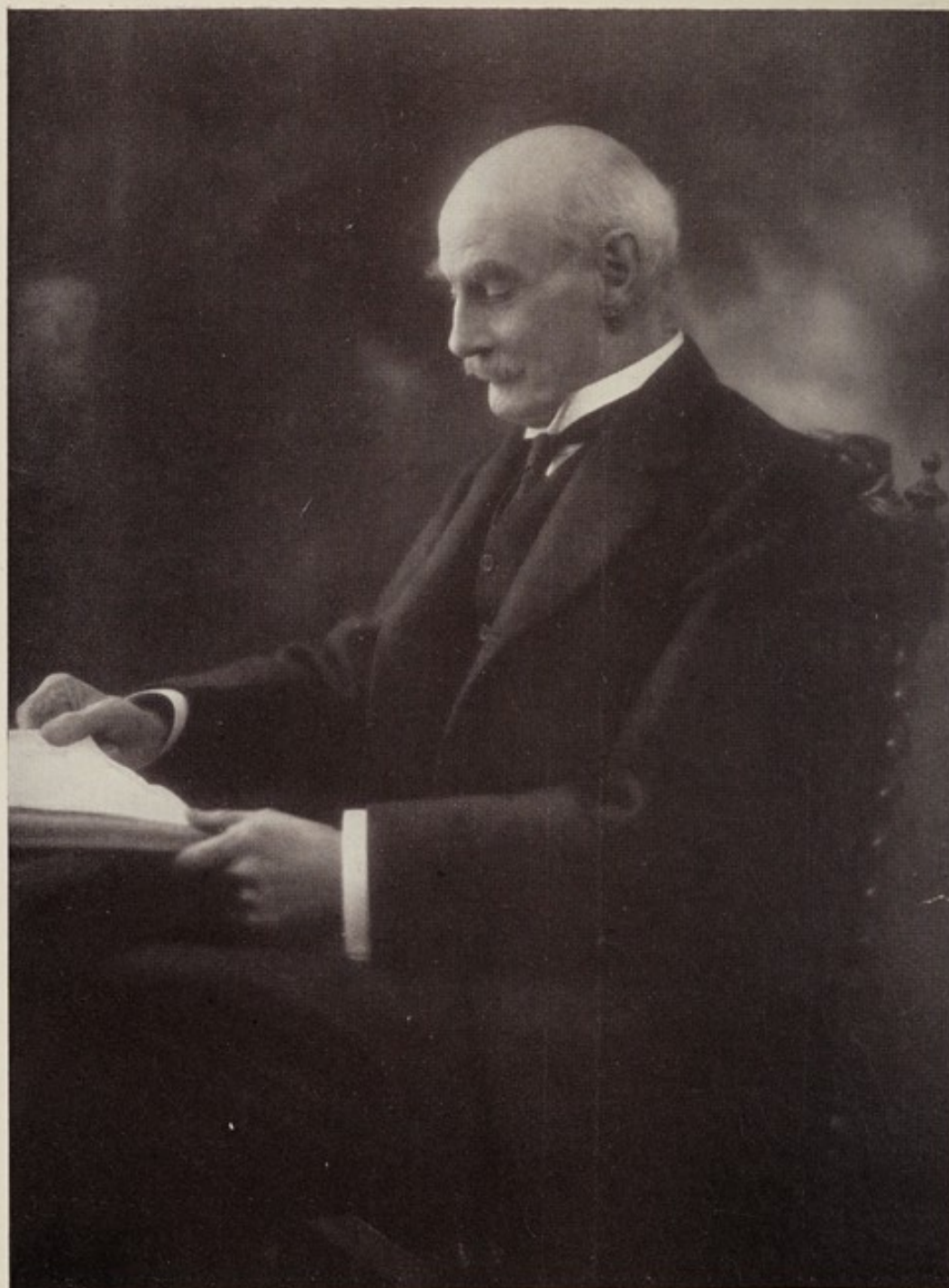

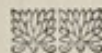

REPORT

of

The Committee of Management for the Year, 1928.

THE Committee of Management have the honour to submit to the Governors the 88th ANNUAL REPORT of the Dorset County Hospital for the year ended 31st December, 1928.

During the past year the number of patients admitted was :—Male 353 ; Female 352 ; Children 195.

Total number of In-patients 900.

Four hundred and seventy-eight operations were performed Of these 278 were major operations (Intra-abdominal 140, Extra-abdominal 338) ; 200 were minor operations.

The Balance on the Ordinary Income and Expenditure Account of £718 15s. 11d. has been debited to the Capital Account.

The Income and Expenditure Account accompanies this Report, and gives full details of Income and Expenditure.

CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

The Committee again desire to draw attention to the growing strength of this Scheme, which continues to provide a substantial proportion of the Ordinary Income of the Hospital. During the year new centres have been established at Compton Valence and Stoke Wake, thus bringing the total number of branches up to 30, embracing 86 Parishes. The total collection for 1928 reached the record sum of £1465 8s. 3d., being an increase of £93 0s. 6d. on the receipts for 1927. During the year under review, no less than 371 members were admitted as In-patients, whilst a considerable number were treated as Out-patients. Such In-patients were collectively treated for a period of 9638 days or an average of 25.978 days each, but out of the total of 371 no less than 50 were patients for over 50 days, nine for over 100 days, and three for over 200 days whilst two members remained as patients for the whole year. These facts are in themselves more than sufficient to show that the Scheme has proved a considerable boon to the 371 members referred to.

The control of the financial side of the Scheme involving the supervision of the various branches is solely managed by the Hon. Treasurer (Mr. Edwin Stevens) whilst the Hon. Secretary (Mr. W. R. Marks) devotes a considerable amount of time to the Dorchester Centre which produced a very gratifying result during the year and the Committee therefore desire to tender their best thanks to these gentlemen, and also to the Joint Committee of the Scheme, the Branch representatives, collectors, and all other voluntary helpers who so ably assist in this valuable work.

Further particulars of the Scheme appear at the end of this Report.

OBITUARY.

With deep regret we report the deaths of Mr. T. A. Pearce, and Mr. S. D. Allen who for many years as members of the Committee of Management have rendered the Hospital invaluable services. In addition to his other work, Mr. Pearce as one of the Honorary Financial Secretaries, has given much time and wise advice which will be much missed by the Committee.

APPOINTMENTS.

We announce with much pleasure that Miss Edith Pearce, A.C.A. has very kindly consented to serve as one of the Honorary Financial Secretaries in the place of her father, the late Mr. T. A. Pearce.

Dr. G. G. Morrice, M.D. (Camb.), F.R.C.P. (London), has again been good enough to place his services as Hon. Physician at the disposal of the Hospital for another year.

Dr. William Burton Sutherland, M.B., Ch.B., was appointed House Surgeon in October, 1928, in place of Dr. J. Furman, B.Sc., M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., resigned.

The Regular Staff of Nurses consist of the Matron, 6 Sisters, 1 Masseuse, 4 Staff Nurses, and 18 Probationers.

We congratulate Nurse Wallis and Nurse Tann on passing their final state Examination December 21st, 1928.

ANNEXE.

The Annexe which was established for the reception of private paying patients, accommodated one hundred and five patients, one less than last year. The Annexe fills a much needed want.

OPHTHALMIC DEPARTMENT.

During the year ending 1928, the attendances at the Eye Department were 1,126. This figure was made up of 255 new patients and 871 attendances of old patients, of the 255 new patients 156 were cases of Refraction (glasses), and the remaining 99 were composed of various Diseases of the Eye.

Throughout the year there has been a gradual increase in the number of patients attending and the results have been very satisfactory.

DENTAL DEPARTMENT.

The following cases were dealt with in the Dental Department during 1928 :—

Out-patients and In-patients 530. An increase of 96 on the previous year.

It is hoped to carry out certain structural improvements during the coming year for the greater comfort of patients using this Department.

X-RAY DEPARTMENT.

This department continues to do much useful work which shews a considerable increase on the figures for last year.

75 Opaque meal and screening examinations were carried out.

476 Patients were radiographed and 119 treatments were given.

During the past year a new 30 m.a. transformer set has been installed, metalix tubes adopted and the whole Department brought up to date at a cost of about £500.

This has very materially added to the efficiency of the Department and resulted in a great improvement in the work done.

The metalix tube is a new type which is self-protecting and does away with the heavy and cumbersome lead lined boxes which were formerly used.

It is not generally understood by those outside the Medical Profession that the scope of X-Rays is far wider than the filming of fractures and foreign bodies, and is invaluable for the detection of various lung diseases in an early stage, such as tuberculosis and also for the treatment of various skin diseases, growths, etc.

The Sister in charge has carried out her duties in a very praiseworthy manner, and has contributed largely in bringing the Department to a high state of efficiency.

The arrangements in the Dark-room which were unsatisfactory, owing to the increased work are now quite brought up to date by the institution of tank development, whereby much time has been saved.

VIOLET RAY, SUNLIGHT AND MASSAGE.

These Departments under the direction of the Hon. Medical Staff have performed most useful service, 229 new cases having been treated in the Massage Department and 62 in the Ultra Violet Ray or Sunlight Treatment.

The Equipment has been brought up-to-date and is in a very efficient condition for the performance of these services.

GENERAL.

NEW MOTOR AMBULANCE.

The New Motor Ambulance which has been provided for the Hospital through the efforts of his Worship the Mayor of Dorchester (Mr. E. W. Tilley), Messrs. P. E. Crabb, C. J. Foot, and E. Howard, and other residents of Dorchester, is now in use, and is giving great satisfaction, and we desire to repeat our deep appreciation to all who so kindly helped to raise the necessary funds.

OPERATION TABLE AND NEW HAND AMBULANCE.

A modern Operation Table has been placed in the Operating Theatre through the generosity of Mrs. Papillon, whilst Mrs. Winwood has kindly presented the Hospital with a New Hand Ambulance.

Chief Officer A. R. Jeffery and the Members of the Dorchester Fire Brigade have kindly given valuable service in connection with Fire Drill for the staff of the Hospital and for periodical inspection of the Fire Extinguishing Apparatus.

The New Heating Apparatus installed last year at a cost of £2000 has been a success.

EGG WEEK, 1928.

The "Egg Week" held on March 24th and 28th, 1928, again proved a great success. The organisers being as in the past four years, Mrs. E. R. Sykes and Miss A. Clapcott, with many friends to help them. 22,722 eggs were received, also the sum of £3 5s. 6d. towards buying fresh eggs during the Winter months.

To all the organisers and to those who gave eggs and who brought them to the Hospital we record our grateful thanks.

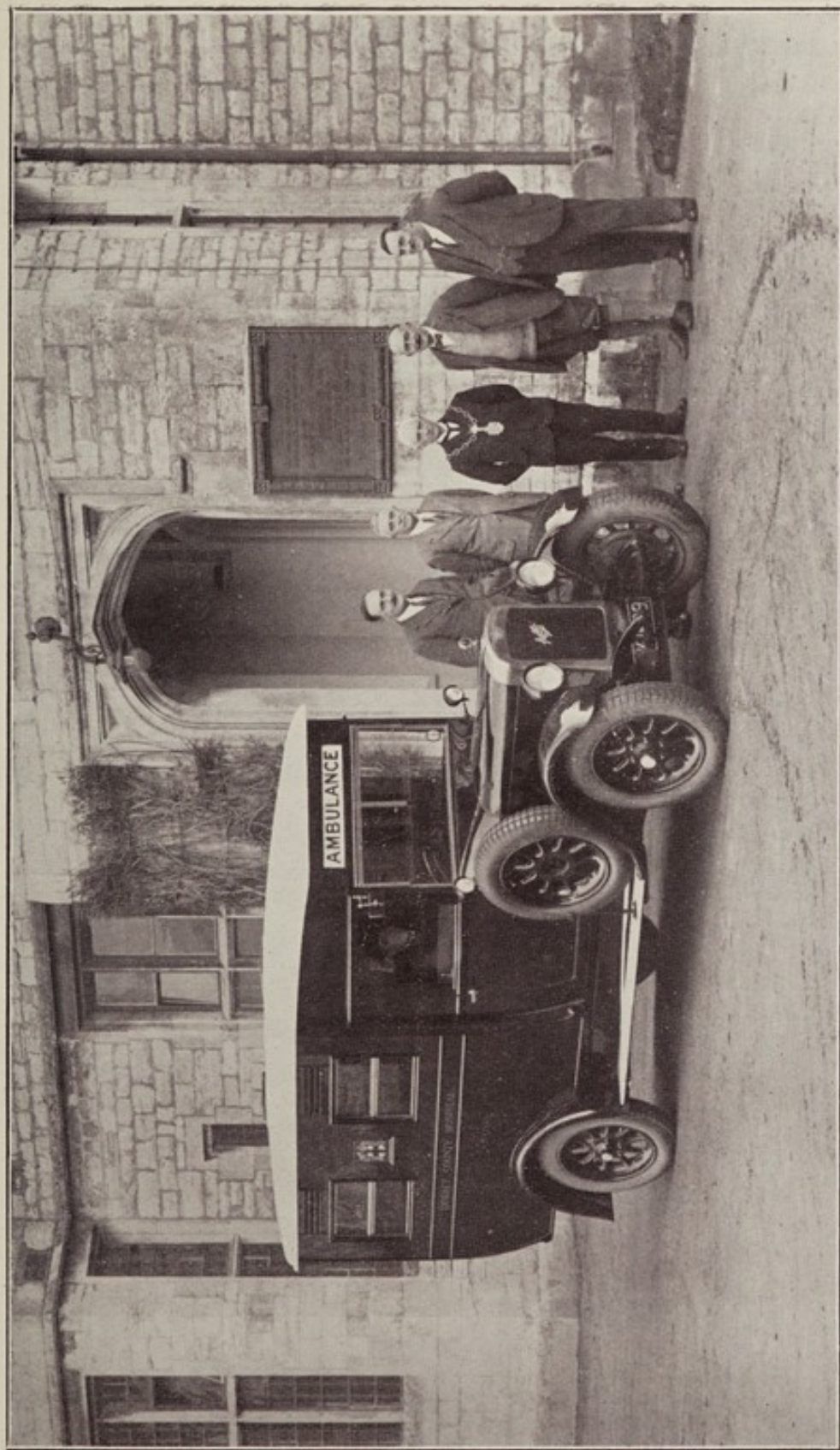
It is hoped to hold the collection again this spring, the dates chosen being **March 13th and March 16th.**

EMPLOYEES' CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

The attention of all Governors and Employers of labour is drawn to the benefits to be derived by all Employees and others who at any time may desire to claim admission to the Hospital either as In-patients or Out-patients.

All In-patients have for several years been required to pay 10/6 per week *towards* the cost of their maintenance.

The Contributory Scheme was launched in the year, 1922, and Members thereby insure against the risk of having to pay the 10/6 per week.

The Rules are :—

- (a) Members who have been on the Roll for three months and have regularly paid their weekly subscriptions are on admission to the Hospital charged 5/3 per week only.
- (b) After six months' Membership they are on admission entitled to free treatment.
- (c) The minimum subscription is 1d. per week for a single person and 2d. per week for a contributor and his wife and children up to the age of 14 years.
- (d) The subscription also covers Admission as Out-patients to all Departments, viz. : X-Ray, Massage, Sun Light, Dentists and Ophthalmic.
- (e) Maternity cases are alone excluded from the benefit of the Scheme.

Employers of labour (including those of domestic servants) are urged to advise their Employees to become Members.

The Scheme is under the management of an entirely separate Committee and the whole of the work of collection is performed voluntarily, so that every penny subscribed is paid over to the Hospital without deduction.

Thirty Branches have been established as set forth in the annexed Summary, which also gives the names of the district Collectors in Dorchester.
