

ANNUAL REPORT

1946

The Governors have pleasure in submitting to the Subscribers the 86th Annual Report of the District Infirmary.

The passing into law of the National Health Services Bill was a major event of the year 1946, and your Board realise that when the Act comes into operation many changes will be made in the method of administering what has been for eighty-six years a voluntary hospital. Reference to this matter is made elsewhere in the following pages.

Your Chairman, Deputy-Chairman and the General Super-intendent have attended meetings of the Regional Council of the British Hospitals' Association on several occasions, and kept in touch with the developments of hospital policy. Mr. Clegg and the Assistant Secretary have represented the Infirmary at meetings in connection with the Contributory Scheme movement. Conferences took place during the passage through Parliament of the National Health Services Bill with Mr. Hervey Rhodes, the member of Parliament for Ashton-under-Lyne, and his interest in the work of the Infirmary was highly appreciated.

Despite many difficulties a large amount of vitally important work has been carried out in the wards and special departments. The staff have given whole-hearted service, and many letters bearing testimony to their skill and patience, and other evidences of deep gratitude, have been received.

The nursing shortage is more acute than ever, and the Government seems powerless to help the hospitals in their struggle. Waiting lists are phenomenally high and much avoidable suffering, as well as interference with working capacity, are the inevitable results.

FINANCES.

The accounts, duly audited and certified as correct, will be found later on in this Report. The receipts on General Purposes Account at £45,196 are lower by £5,351, but in 1945 they were higher than normal. Annual Subscriptions in 1946 were greater, but donations, mayoral efforts and free legacies shewed a considerable decrease. Workpeople's contributions, after we had paid a record sum to other hospitals for treating our members, shewed a final net total slightly larger than that of 1945. We received £2,000 less for payments on behalf of patients. On the other side of the account nearly £600 more was spent upon food, over £2,000 more on the surgical and medical side, £500 additional on the domestic side, and over £6,000 additional on wages and salaries. Total payments amounted to £54,446, or £9,184 more than in 1945. Governors are powerless to prevent these increases and can only carry out their duties with an eye to the welfare of the patients. The total deficit on this account is now £29,244.

(d) THE THOMAS OLDHAM BEQUEST-

This Estate is still in process of being wound-up by the Executors of Mr. Oldham in the United States of America. The total receipts since 1939 have been £29,791.

The thanks of the Board are accorded to the Mayors and Mayoresses of Ashton, Mossley, Dukinfield, Stalybridge and Hyde for their efforts during the past year, and to all the various agencies, societies and individuals who have so willingly given valuable financial help. The outstanding efforts of the Denton Hospital Fund Committee, the Ashton Operatic Society, the Bowling Clubs of the district, and many other special functions prove that the valuable work of the Infirmary is recognised. Details of these donations appear later in this Report.

LADIES' WORK SOCIETY AND SEWING PARTIES.

The Governors express their appreciation of the valuable help they have received from the Ladies' Work Society, ably led by Mrs. Percy Hibbert (Hyde), and of the Ladies' Sewing Parties which are held at the Infirmary twice weekly. The "Bring-and-Buy Sale" organised by the former body raised £84, and other efforts resulted in the handsome sum of £117. Out of these monies the Society paid for a number of rubber air rings, several electric clocks, sheets, pillows, wool to make extra comforts for patients, and curtain material for the Nurses' Home. Their latest activity is an appeal for funds to provide a number of "Dunlopillo" mattresses for specially acute cases in the wards. Mrs. Hibbert has resigned the presidency after two years' devoted service, and has been succeeded by Mrs. G. W. Page, of Ashton-under-Lyne. Miss H. Hall retains the position of Honorary Treasurer, and Miss Marshall, the Matron, is the Honorary Secretary. The accounts are shown later in this Report.

The ladies who form the Sewing Parties have given another year of faithful service in making up, mending and marking hospital linen, and carrying out other useful work for the benefit of patients and nurses. They would welcome new members. They meet at the Infirmary on Monday and Thursday afternoons.

The members of the Women's Voluntary Service and others who have so regularly attended to administer the Canteen in the Patients' Waiting Hall are deserving of great praise for their willing help.

CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME AND OTHER WORKPEOPLE'S COLLECTIONS

The new rates of weekly contributions have now been in operation for a full year. It is gratifying to note that the workpeople have given loyal support to the revised scheme. Out of the gross receipts of £26,142 5s. 11d. the large sum of £8,932 was paid to other Contributory Schemes for treatment of our members in various hospitals throughout the country. We received, on the other hand, £3,960 for treating members of outside schemes in the District Infirmary. This reciprocity is one of the most valuable features of the movement and saves a vast amount of worry and anxiety to those who have to seek hospital treatment, often when far away from home and friends. The final net balance shewn in General Purposes Account is £15,462 16s. 1d., an increase on the previous year of £38 7s. 4d., for which the Governors are truly grateful.

In the collection of the weekly contributions the Infirmary has again had the valued help of the district Workpeople's Committees, and of many voluntary collectors and office staffs of works and factories. To all of them congratulations on the success of their efforts and thanks for their self-denial are gratefully tendered. The Ashton and District Workpeople's Committee were again very helpful in working the Saturday afternoon canteen for visitors.

BOARD OF GOVERNORS

At the last Annual Meeting of Subscribers, Mrs. Bessie Wood, O.B.E., Alderman J. D. Doyle, Councillor J. H. I. Radcliffe, J.P., C.C., and Mr. Edward Oakden, were elected to fill vacancies. The sudden death of Mr. Oakden during the time this report has been in preparation came as a sad shock to his colleagues. Mr. J. Sheldon took the place of Mr. E. B. Bracken as workpeople's representative for Mossley, and Mr. Samuel Taylor was appointed to represent the Co-operative Cot Committee. Later in the year, Councillor Mrs. J. Bagshaw vacated her seat as the representative of Tintwistle Parish Council, her place being taken by Councillor Leslie Hardy. Mrs. Clara Kay, after considerable service, found it necessary to resign her seat on her removal to Somerset. The Governors regret the passing of Councillor Andrew Farley, who had for many years been the nominee of the Lancashire Public Assistance Com-He has been succeeded by Councillor Alfred Gantley, J.P.

MEDICAL BOARD

Mr. Philip H. Bleasdale, F.R.C.S.E., and Mr. W. S. Brindle, F.R.C.S.E., after giving valuable service to the country in the Armed Forces, have returned to their posts on the Infirmary Staff. Dr. Wilfred E. Lawson, the Ophthalmic Surgeon for 40 years, resigned his office and has been accorded the sincere thanks of the Governors. In his place Dr. S. H. Faulkner, M.D., M.B., B.Ch., B.A.O., D.O.M.S., of Manchester, has been elected. Mr. Thomas Moore, F.R.C.S., of Manchester, and Mr. M. Meir who had acted as Resident Surgical Officer for seven years, were appointed Honorary Surgeons, and Dr. Thomas H. Chadwick, M.B., Ch.B., D.A., R.C.S. & P., has accepted the post of Visiting Anæsthetist.

The Governors congratulate Mr. C. M. Dransfield, Assistant Orthopædic and Fracture Surgeon, on securing the Fellowship of the Royal College of Surgeons.

Mr. Norman Wood, Senior Honorary Dental Surgeon, returned to duty after an illness, and Mrs. Amy H. Hawley, L.D.S., and Mr. Alan Hobson, L.D.S., have been appointed Honorary Assistant Dental Surgeons.

It is with genuine regret that the Governors announce the resignation of Mr. William Cameron, who has for 31 years served the Infirmary as Honorary Surgeon, and was a year ago made a Vice-President of the institution as a tribute to his fine record of service. Mr. Cameron's services will not be entirely lost to the Board for, under the Rules, he has been appointed a Consulting Honorary Surgeon. The good wishes of the Governors, of his colleagues and of many of his former patients will go with him into his semi-retirement.

Dr. J. J. McShannon retired as Honorary Clinical Assistant on leaving the district to reside in Northern Ireland, and Drs. R. A. Wishart Kerr and R. S. Holgate have accepted Assistantships.

THE NURSING STAFF.

The thanks of the Governors are due to the Matron (Miss Marshall) and her staff for their splendid work during a year of exceptional difficulty. The Matron, in collaboration with the Medical Board under the able chairmanship of Dr. Bernard Bowman, made every effort to increase the staff and bring to the notice of parents of suitable girls the advantages of a nursing career without, however, any really tangible results.

The Nurses' Prize Day and Reunion was held in October when the President, Mr. Herbert Knott, J.P., presented the prizes and certificates to successful nurses in the hospital and State examinations.

DOMESTIC STAFF.

As a result of negotiations to which the British Hospitals' Association was a party, the National Joint Negotiating Committee published scales of suggested wages and working conditions for domestic staffs, including porters. Your Governors adopted the scheme, which will add considerably to the working expenses but should make for a contented staff.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.

Once again it is the pleasing duty of the Governors to tender an expression of sincere appreciation to the large number of kindly-disposed associations and individuals who have given timely help in so many ways. It is quite impossible in a necessarily restricted report such as this to give a complete list of the many donors. We must, however, pay tribute among others to the Stamford Park Joint Committee, Cheetham Park Committee, the Red Cross Society and Order of St. John, the Women's Voluntary Services, the Co-operative Cot Committee, Ashton and District Workpeople's Committee, Ashton Moss Market Gardeners, Hurst Military Band Club, Miss Alice Goddard and friends, the Toc H. Library Service, and the various Churches and Sunday Schools of the district. Mention must also be made of a gift by Mr. Carey M. Bowden, J.P., of tubular steel chairs for the Patients' Waiting-room. The people of the States of Victoria. Queensland, Western Australia, Southern Australia and New South Wales, and of South Africa have helped us by sending parcels of foodstuffs as gifts. Letters of sincere appreciation of these gestures of sympathy with the sick in the hospitals of the Mother Country have been sent to the donors, and the Governors have been deeply touched and greatly encouraged by such striking evidence of their desire to minimise our hardships. We received also through the American Red Cross Society very acceptable gifts of clothing and equipment.

THE NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICES ACT.

It may be of interest to Subscribers to know that, through the efforts of the British Hospitals Association—of which the District Infirmary is a part—many improvements were made to the Bill in its progress through Parliament. If the Act is administered with broad-mindedness and with the welfare of the sick always paramount, much benefit will accrue to the health of the community. The hospitals will be freed from the necessity of making constant appeals to the generosity of the public, as the State will meet all the costs of management; but there will still be scope for charitably disposed persons to

supplement the efforts of the State by helping to pay for extra comforts and social amenities which cannot well be provided by the taxpayers. The Act makes provision for the receipt of legacies and gifts for purposes specified by the donors.

For years to come the State will be confronted by an enormous task in its endeavour to meet the needs of the community. It is conceded on all hands that there is a lamentable shortage of hospital beds, so that many existing hospitals will have to be enlarged and modernised, many entirely new hospitals built; greatly increased and adequately paid medical and nursing personnel will have to be provided, much more research work undertaken and every effort made to ensure that humane and enlightened treatment is given to those who most need hospital service. At the same time it will call for watchfulness on the part of those who administer the hospitals and by the Government itself to avoid bureaucratic control and uneconomical expenditure.

As regards the District Infirmary, it is not yet known exactly how the Act will affect it. It will, however, have a "Management Committee," probably much smaller in number than the present Board of Governors. This Committee will be linked up with a "Regional Committee" for Manchester and district, and we may obtain representation on the latter, although it will not be a large and unwieldy body. For certain purposes we may be linked up with adjacent hospitals, as units of 1,000 beds are considered to be more economical than a number of comparatively small hospitals working independently of one another. The Government is said to be busily engaged in preparing for the change-over and in framing regulations as to the methods of administering the hospitals. and these regulations are eagerly awaited. Successive Boards of Governors, throughout the eighty-six years of the Infirmary's existence, have been composed of men and women who were imbued with a desire to help their more unfortunate brethren. The Board of to-day will regret in many ways the passing of the "old order," but every member will feel well repaid if the new regime achieves the good results which are hoped of it. In little more than a year's time they will hand over their task—never a very easy one—to the powers that be. They take this opportunity of thanking the many thousands of the district who have so admirably supported the work of the Infirmary, and they consider that the subscribers will feel that, despite many difficulties, the Governors have endeavoured faithfully to play the part of Good Samaritans.

Almoner's Report.

During 1946 many changes have taken place in the hospital world, and there is much speculation regarding the future. It is certain, however, that an increasing number of patients will find their way to the Almoner's Department, and much may be done to facilitate the rehabilitation of all disabled persons.

In the year under review, guidance has been given with regard to the numerous facilities available at the present time. Visits have been made in this connection and the necessary introductions completed. Considerable use has been made of the limb-fitting sections provided by Government departments, and, in addition, several patients have benefited by a

period of training at the Centre at Egham.

Apart from the resettlement of disabled Servicemen and women, the usual work has continued. Thirty-six surgical appliances and six artificial limbs have been supplied, part of the cost having been met through the generosity of the Welfare Fund, when other sources have failed to materialise. Although there are comparatively few convalescent homes available at the present time, 18 patients have been able to enjoy much needed relaxation at various homes, mainly Southport. Deep appreciation has been expressed by those who have taken advantage of this service. Contact has been maintained when advisable with discharged patients, and many home visits have been made to clarify and, where possible, dispel difficulties which would otherwise prevent patients from attending for very necessary out-patient treatment. crutches kindly provided by the Workpeople's Committee have been in constant use and are conveniently housed in the cupboard so considerately provided.

The W.V.S. have helped with the problems of transport, and several emergencies have been successfully overcome. Accommodation has been found for the relatives of patients normally residing a considerable distance from the hospital and the welfare officers of many firms in the vicinity have co-operated for the benefit of injured and sick employees. This interest and co-operation is acknowledged with gratitude, for it forms the pivot upon which the social work must

revolve.

It is too soon to determine the effects of the new regulations governing the welfare of school children, but much of the work in connection with the provision of surgical appliances and convalescence is done through the medium of the Children's Ward.

The Annual Statement of the Honorary Medical Staff.

The Honorary Medical Staff has undergone many changes during the past twelve months.

It is with regret that we report the retirement of Mr. Cameron and Mr. Lawson, who have given such untiring service to the Hospital.

The absence of Mr. Brindle through illness has thrown an extra strain on the two new Assistant Surgeons—Mr. Thomas Moore and Mr. M. Meir—who have recently been appointed to the Honorary Staff.

Mr. Bleasdale was unanimously elected to be a Senior Honorary Surgeon on the Honorary Staff and Dr. H. Selbourne's appointment as Assistant Physician confirmed.

The Honorary Staff have been fully conscious for some time of the need of an experienced Visiting Anæsthetist to instruct the Resident Staff in the administration of anæsthetics. This purpose has been achieved by the appointment of Mr. T. H. Chadwick as Visiting Anæsthetist and the creation of an additional post for a Resident Anæsthetist.

We welcome, too, Mr. S. H. Faulkner as our new Ophthalmic Surgeon in succession to Mr. Lawson. He has entered into his appointment with enthusiasm and has been a most helpful colleague at the meetings of the Medical Board.

The Honorary Medical Staff reports with gratification the continued high percentage of successes in the Final and Preliminary Examinations of the General Nursing Council. This is in no small measure due to the efforts of Sister Tutor and the Lecturers.

The Honorary Medical Staff are deeply grateful for the devoted and loyal service carried out by the Nursing Staff under the direction of the Matron. They have worked under the most extreme difficulties and the Sisters have set an example and shown a sense of responsibility.
