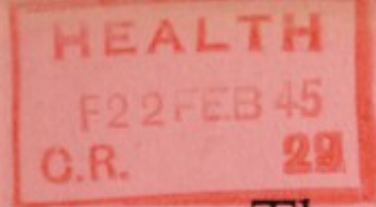

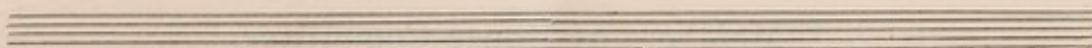

REPORT

For the Year 1944

The Forty-fifth Annual Report of the Board of Management for the year ending 31st December, 1944.

The Board are pleased to report another year of progress in the work of the Hospital and District Nursing.

The Hospital has continued to participate in the Emergency Hospital Service and Blood Donors Scheme organised by the Ministry of Health.

Due consideration has been given to the proposals for the establishment of a National Health Service as outlined in the White Paper issued on the subject by Parliament and particularly with reference to the part to be taken in such a service by the Voluntary Hospitals of the country. The Board have supported the pronouncements made thereon by the British Hospitals Association, and which are being submitted for the consideration of Parliament.

The total number of patients who received attention at the hospital during the year was 2,365, of whom 909 were in-patients and 1,456 were out-patients. The average number of beds occupied was 36 and the average length of stay of patients in hospital was 18.5 days. 566 surgical operations were performed.

The X-Ray Department dealt with 781 patients and 299 treatments were given in the Physiotherapeutic Department.

District Nursing continues to be of real value in the homes of the sick or injured, and is undertaken throughout the hospital district. The names of patients are placed on the visiting list by Medical Practitioners in the area and no charge is made for the service of the Nurses, but donations in appreciation of the service are always welcomed. During the year the Nurses paid 5,720 visits to the homes of 293 patients.

Further details of the work, residence of patients etc., are printed on page 6.

It is with profound sorrow the Board record the death on the 16th July of Mr. William Hyde, J.P., who for over thirty years rendered conspicuous and valuable service to the hospital. Mr. Hyde joined the Board in 1914, from the year 1918 to 1931 was Vice-Chairman and he occupied the position of Chairman from the year 1931 to the time of his death.

By his leadership, sound judgment and unfailing interest in all that concerned the welfare of the hospital, and not least by the personal contacts made by his frequent visits there, Mr. Hyde won the respect and affection of everyone connected with the hospital.

The Board have gratefully accepted the offer of Mrs. Matson to present to the hospital the portrait in oils of her father, Mr. William Hyde, and the portrait has been hung in the Boardroom.

Mr. Robert Duckworth, J.P., has been elected to the vacant Chairmanship and Councillor G. E. Wilmore, J.P., has been elected Vice-Chairman.

Once again it is the pleasure of the Board to extend to the Visiting Surgeons, the members of the Honorary Medical Staff and other Officers, their grateful appreciation of the valuable services they have rendered during the year. The kind, considerate and efficient manner in which the Matron and Nursing Staff have carried out their work has received many expressions of gratitude from patients and given much satisfaction.

It is with deep regret reference is made to the recent death of Mr. John H. Watson, M.B., B.S., F.R.C.S. who during a period of twenty years achieved a high degree of success in the position of Visiting Surgeon. His skill and kind and genial disposition inspired all who were associated with him.

Thanks are again tendered to the Ladies of the Linen League for their many activities for the benefit of patients in the hospital.

The income from the Voluntary Weekly Contributory Scheme has reached the record figure of £5,372/16/5d. which is 44% of the total income of the year. Under the uniform reciprocal arrangements agreed to by the British Hospitals Contributory Schemes Association, of which the Hartley Hospital is a member, payments amounting to £770/2/4d. have been made in respect of the treatment of contributors in other hospitals. The thanks of the Board are again expressed to all those who have assisted in the collecting and remitting of weekly contributions.

The expenditure incurred during the year in maintaining the hospital and all its Services was £10,770/14/5d. The provision of District Nursing cost £667/7/6d. which with the £770/2/4d. paid to other hospitals, brings the total expenditure to £12,148/4/3d.

The total income amounted to £12,123/14/8d. which was derived from the following sources:— Annual Subscriptions, Donations and the proceeds of special efforts, £2,314/19/6d., the Voluntary Weekly Contributory Scheme, £5,372/16/5d., Service to patients, £2,490/16/10d., from invested funds, £1,763/18/2d., and miscellaneous items including donations for the services of District Nursing, £181/3/9d.

The expenditure for the year exceeded the income by £24/9/7d., which, deducted from the balance brought forward, leaves the sum of £534/16/10d. to be carried forward to 1945, and in addition there is £1,400 in the Renewals and Repairs Account reserved to meet expenditure on work deferred in consequence of the war.

The Endowment Fund amounts to £46,316/18/2d. A bed has been named "The Margaret Hey Bed" by virtue of a seven year's covenant entered into by Mr. Wilson H. Hey, F.R.C.S. and The Colne and District Co-operative Society Ltd., commemorated the centenary of the Co-operative Movement by entering into a seven years covenant and a cot has been named accordingly.

Any annual subscriber who will sign a covenant for seven yearly payments can considerably increase the value of the subscription to the hospital at no additional cost to himself. A sum of £89/15/6d. was received from this source during the year. For further information thereon, Subscribers are referred to page 25/26.

The casual vacancy in the office of elective member of the Board has been filled by the appointment of Mr. H. Bannister, J.P., of Foulridge. The three elective members who retire in accordance with Rule are Councillor E. Duckworth, J.P., Mr. H. Bannister, J.P., and Miss E. M. Whitworth, and they are eligible for re-election.

The Board express their thanks to the Individuals, Societies and Firms who have so generously assisted the funds with subscriptions, donations and special efforts; to the donors of gifts and comforts for patients; to the members of the Police Force and St. John Ambulance Corps for ready and willing help on many occasions.

In conclusion the Board feel they cannot enumerate the valued assistance of all sections of the Public to the work of the hospital, but they trust all will accept thanks and gratitude for such generous help throughout the year. All that can be done will be done to meet the needs of those requiring aid, and the Board are confident that the support of the townspeople will not fail them.

VOLUNTARY WEEKLY CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME RULES

- 1.—The funds raised by the weekly contributions shall be applied:—
 - (a) In the maintenance of the Hartley Hospital.
 - (b) In maintaining the services of district nurses.
 - (c) In contributing **towards** the cost of the consultations of specialists.
- 2.—Contributors in need of benefits must in all cases present to the Organising Secretary at his office, 2a, Albert Road, Colne, a form obtained from their medical attendant before either a recommend for any hospital or authority to visit a specialist can be issued. In cases of grave urgency the form must be presented as early as possible.
- 3.—Twenty-six weeks after entry to the scheme, contributors, or their dependents* shall be entitled to:
 - (a) Maintenance and Nursing without charge in the general wards of the Hartley Hospital.
 - (b) A voucher for admission for special treatment (not maintenance charges) or for the consultation of specialists at other hospitals with whom arrangements have been made
- 4.—In the event of admission to any Hospital outside Colne the contributor should communicate with the Organising Secretary at the earliest opportunity.
- 5.—All benefits under the scheme will cease at the expiration of 26 weeks from the date of discontinuance of contributions to the fund.
- 6.—In urgent cases where it may be necessary, on the advice of the medical attendant, to consult a specialist at the home of the patient, a grant (not exceeding £1 1s. 0d.) may be made towards the cost incurred; providing that the conditions of Rules 2 and 3 above have been complied with.
- 7.—No responsibility will be accepted for any fees or expenses incurred by contributors or members of their families visiting specialists on their own initiative. No payment will be made for any treatment or operation by specialists privately arranged.
- 8.—**No payment** will be made from the Hospital funds for any expenses incurred for treatment in any private nursing home or private ward of any hospital, nor can contributions be made from the funds for any surgical or other appliances required by contributors.
- 9.—The funds shall not be applied in providing for treatment of infectious or contagious disease, tubercular (except surgical treatment), mental diseases, or maternity patients; such patients being otherwise provided for.
- 10.—Contributors may appeal to the Board of Management in any case not dealt with in the rules, and the decision of the Board shall be final.
- 11.—Contributors may make their weekly payments through the firm by whom they are employed or as individual contributors direct to the Organising Secretary.
- 12.—A meeting of the representatives of contributors shall be held annually to receive the report of the year's work and the application of the funds, and to elect representatives to serve upon the Board of Management.

** Dependents shall only include the wife and children (under 16 years of age) who are not workers.*

The basis of the scheme is the payment of 2d. per week on earnings under £2 and 3d. per week where the earnings are £2 and over, such contributions to be deducted from weekly earnings by the employer, or paid direct at the office, 2a, Albert Road, Colne.
