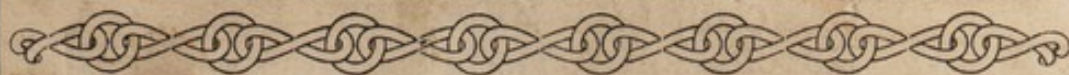

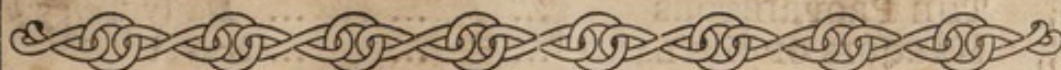

REPORT.

THE Council beg to report that during 1928, 37 Patients have been under treatment in the Hospital, being 8 less than last year. One death has occurred in the Hospital during the year, and 36 Patients have been discharged cured and relieved. The days in Hospital have been 674 as against 644 last year.

263 Out-Patients have had their injuries attended to at the Hospital, the total number of visits being 2,416.

The income has been £1,216/2/8. This does not include the amount raised by the Carnival effort, particulars of which are given below. The income shows an increase of £267/17/4 as compared with last year.

The expenditure for maintenance (excluding cost of X-Ray apparatus) has been £956/3/6, as against £849/17/4 last year. The average cost of maintaining the Hospital per day £2/12/3, the average cost of each Patient per day £1/8/4.4, and the average number of Patients per day 1.84. The expenditure includes the sum of £35/19/7 for improvements to the building and wards, necessary for the better handling and treatment of Patients, and £74/7/3 for the provision of new beds, furniture and house linen.

In accordance with agreement, the sum of £31/15/9 has been returned to the North Skelton Workmen in consideration of cases from North Skelton Mines being admitted into Skelton Hospital free.

The Hospital Carnival which was held in July last, proved in every way satisfactory, and resulted in a profit of £138/0/1. This sum was placed to the credit of a separate account—"Hospital X-Ray Account," the balance of which now stands at £138/15/7. The Council are greatly indebted to all those who so willingly gave their services towards the success of this effort.

The Council have pleasure in reporting that a complete up-to-date X-Ray apparatus has now been installed at the Hospital at a total cost of about £320. With the exception of a few accessories yet remaining to be paid for, the whole of this cost has been met out of the general fund. During the next few weeks the Council will make a special effort to raise subscriptions to augment the X-Ray fund, and it is hoped shortly to repay to the general fund the whole of the cost of the apparatus. The advantages of having X-Ray treatment available at the Hospital has already been demonstrated in several cases, and the Council feel sure that subscribers will appreciate the efforts which have been made to bring the Hospital up to the highest state of efficiency.

The thanks of the Hospital are tendered to the Committee of the Brotton Hospital Cup Competition whose effort this year realised the sum of £30. Also to the Committee of the Farmers' and Tradesmen's Ball, the Brotton Motor Club, and to all other subscribers and donors for their continued support.

Dr. Caldwell, having sold his practice, has tendered his resignation as House Surgeon to take effect as from 1st March. The Council recognise and fully appreciate the good service rendered to the Hospital by Dr. Caldwell during the twenty-nine years he has held the position.

The Council again desires to express its thanks to the Nursing Staff, the Medical Officers, Auditors, and Officials for the satisfactory manner in which the work of the Hospital has been carried out during the year.

Subscriptions for 1929 are now due.
