



MAINTENANCE FUND.

The General Committee have pleasure in rendering their Report and Financial Statement upon the working of the Hospital for the 12 months ending 31st December, 1927.

The number of in-patients admitted during the year was 355, as compared with 272 during 1926; the number of out-patients treated 180, as compared with 144 during 1926; making a total number of patients treated during the year 535, as compared with 416 during 1926, an increase of 119 patients.

Since the opening of the Hospital 1,158 in-patients have been admitted and 685 out-patients treated, a total of 1,843 cases.

The total Income for the year amounted to £3,816 18s. 5d., 45.9 per cent. being derived from Workpeople's Contributions and 54.1 per cent. being derived from other sources.

The total Expenditure for the year amounted to £2,904 2s. 4d., of which £417 6s. 2d. has been expended upon Extensions. The deficiency of £510 2s. 10d. brought forward as at the 1st January, 1927, has been redeemed.

Bills accrued due and payable on the 31st December, 1927, amounted to £278 15s. 7d., thus reducing the balance of funds from £402 13s. 3d. to £123 17s. 8d.

The actual cost of maintenance and administration, after making the necessary adjustment for accounts outstanding amounted to £2,463 9s. 9d.

A provision of 2/6 per case has been made as representing the cost of treatment of out-patients.

The net cost of in patients has therefore been £2,440 12s. 3d., and this figure has been taken into consideration in arriving at the costs set out in the Schedule attached hereto.

The Committee wish to place on record their appreciation of the action of the workmen in agreeing to the 1½d. per week contribution for the 12 months. This action enabled the Committee to go forward with greater confidence upon their programme for the Extensions.

In accordance with the promise made at the time the 1½d. was agreed upon, the Committee has now arranged that the 1d. per week be reverted to.

The Committee testify with gratitude to the work so efficiently carried on by the Honorary Medical Staff, and the Matron

and her Staff, and extend to them very warm appreciation of the services rendered during the past year.

The interest of the Staff attached to the Hospital has largely contributed to its success and to the comfort and well being of the patients.

The Committee pay tribute to the general interest and support, both financial and in other directions, shewn towards the Institution by the general public during the past year, workpeople who have contributed under the Contributory Scheme, to donors, to tradespeople and their assistants, to organisers and supporters of the various functions held on behalf of the Hospital, to the Staffs engaged at the various Day Schools of the District, and to Places of Worship.

The Clergy and Laymen of the District have taken a deep interest in the Sunday Services, and their assistance in this necessary direction are appreciated.

Acknowledgement with thanks is expressed to the local Press for publicity given in matters connected with the Hospital, including the Matron's weekly report; also to Mr. W. A. Sadler (Public Auditor), who has voluntarily given his services to the Institution.

Mr. G. Hanney has continued his very excellent work in the capacity of honorary hairdresser, etc., to the Institution.

COMMITTEES.—Coleford, Blakeney, and Drybrook Hospital Workers Committees have, during the year, continued untiringly their work on behalf of the Hospital, and grateful thanks are expressed both to the Committees and their supporters, for the good work they are doing.

It is hoped that in the near future Committees will be set up in other areas of the District.

The total amount expended in extending the Institution has amounted to £6,570 0s. 5d., and during the year provision has been made for a Maids' Kitchen, Lavatory, Bathroom, together with extra equipment of the laundry.

The Committee propose spending a further sum of £400 upon Extensions during 1928.

Ever before the Committee is the first object of the Hospital—that of cure or relief of suffering—and by a gradual process the Hospital has been built, extended and equipped to this end. The continued interest of the public is earnestly appealed for.






