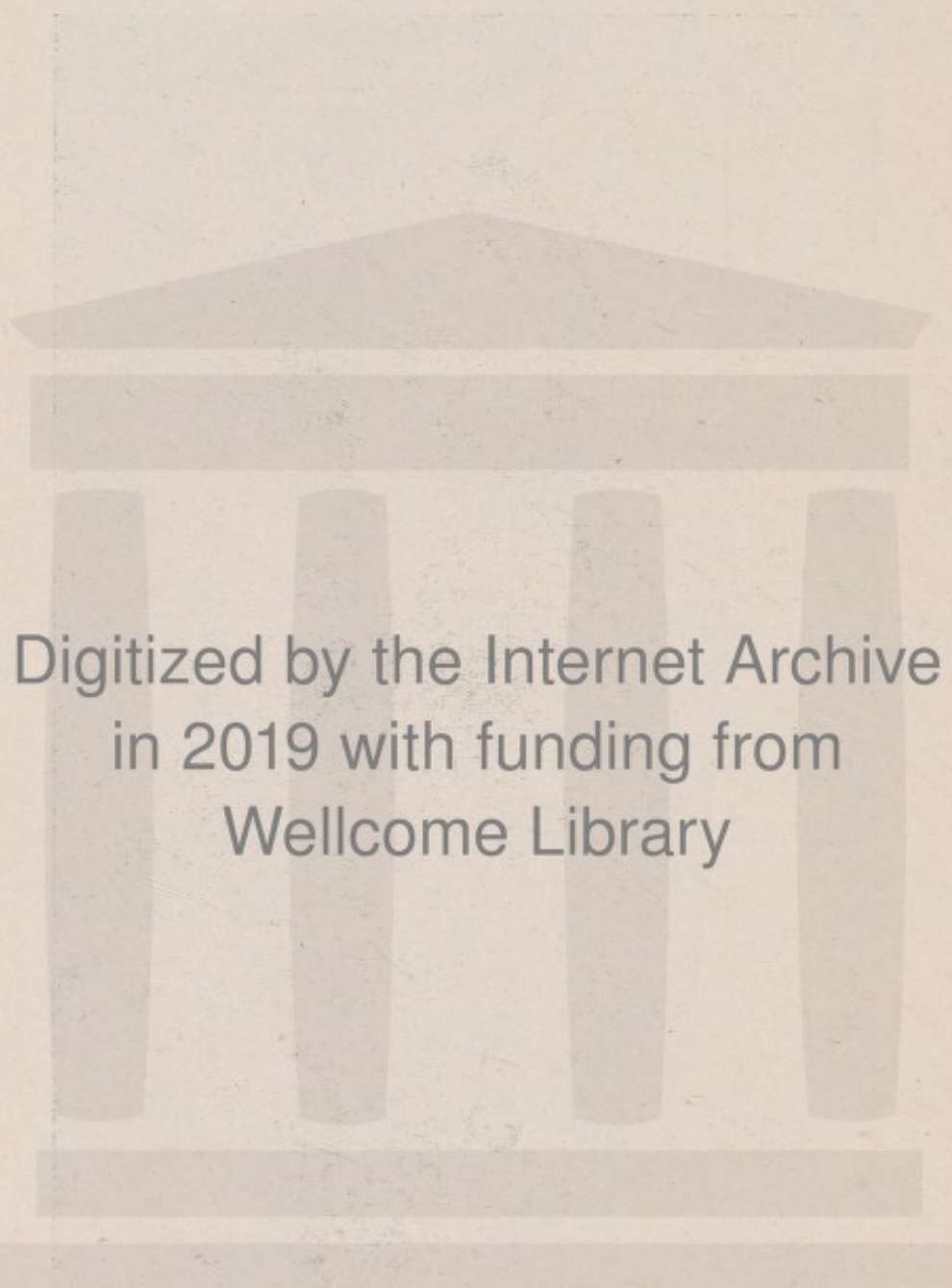
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MAINTENANCE FUND.

The General Committee have pleasure in rendering their Annual Report and Financial Statement for the twelve months ending 31st December, 1928.

The number of In-patients admitted during the year was 315, as compared with 355 during 1927; the number of Out-patients treated 170, as compared with 180 during 1927, making the total number of patients treated during the year 485, as compared with 535 during 1927.

Since the opening of the Hospital 1,473 In-patients have been admitted, and 855 Out-patients treated, a total of 2,328 cases.

The Income to the Maintenance of the Hospital amounted to £2,565 14s. 11d., and to Extensions £287 12s. 3d., a total Income for the year of £2,853 7s. 2d., 40.75 per cent. of which was derived from Workpeople's Contributions, and 59.25 per cent. from other sources.

The total Expenditure for the year amounted to £2,644 2s. 3d., of which £217 13s. 3d. was expended upon extensions.

Bills accrued due and payable on the 31st December, 1928, amounted to £273 7s. 11d., leaving a balance of Funds of £338 10s. 3d.

The actual cost of maintenance and administration, after making the necessary adjustments for accounts outstanding, amounted to £2,421 1s. 2d.

A provision of 2/6 per case has been made as representing the cost of treatment of out-patients.

The net cost of in-patients amounted to £2,399 16s. 2d., and this figure has been taken into consideration in arriving at the costs set out in the Statistical Table attached.

The Committee testify with gratitude to the work carried on by the Honorary Medical Staff, and the Matron and her Staff, and extend to them very warm appreciation of their services rendered during the past year.

The interest of the Staff attached to the Hospital has largely contributed to the success of the year's working, and to the comfort and well being of the patients.

The Committee acknowledge the generous support, financial and otherwise, shewn towards the Institution by the public during

the year, workpeople who have contributed under the Contributory Scheme, to donors, to Tradespeople and their assistants, to organisers and supporters of the various functions held on behalf of the Hospital, to the staffs engaged at the various Day Schools, and to Places of Worship.

The Clergy and Laymen of the District have taken their usual interest in the Sunday Services, and their assistance in this connection is highly appreciated. Mrs. George Fellowes contributed to the pleasure of the Sunday Services by acting as Organist.

Thanks are also expressed to the local Press for publicity given in matters connected with the Hospital, including the insertion of the Matron's Weekly Report.

Mr. W. A. Sadler, Public Auditor, very kindly gave his services in connection with the audit of the accounts, also Mr. G. Hanney continued his services as hairdresser, etc., to the Institution.

The Hospital Workers' Committees of Coleford, Blakeney, Ruardean, and Drybrook rendered valuable assistance to the Institution during the year, and grateful thanks are extended both to the Committees and their supporters. As a result of their work, the income for the upkeep of the Hospital has been appreciably augmented.

Thanks are also extended to the Linen Leagues of Cinderford, Coleford, Blakeney, and Ruardean Woodside for their help.

THE LATE DR. BANGARA MEMORIAL.

The Committee of the above decided that the Memorial to the late Dr. Bangara, who rendered such valuable services to the Hospital, should take the form of something advantageous to the Institution. The residue of the Fund, after the provision of a photo of the late doctor, and an inscribed brass plate, laid at the Hospital to his memory, amounted to £150 3s. 6d. This sum has been invested in Trustee Stock, and in accordance with the Trust Deed will be devoted to the endowment of the X-Ray and Ultra Violet Ray Treatment apparatus at the Hospital.

The Trustees of the Fund are Mr. Joseph Morrison, M.E. Mr. R. E. Westaway, J.P., and Mr. W. Meredith, M.E.

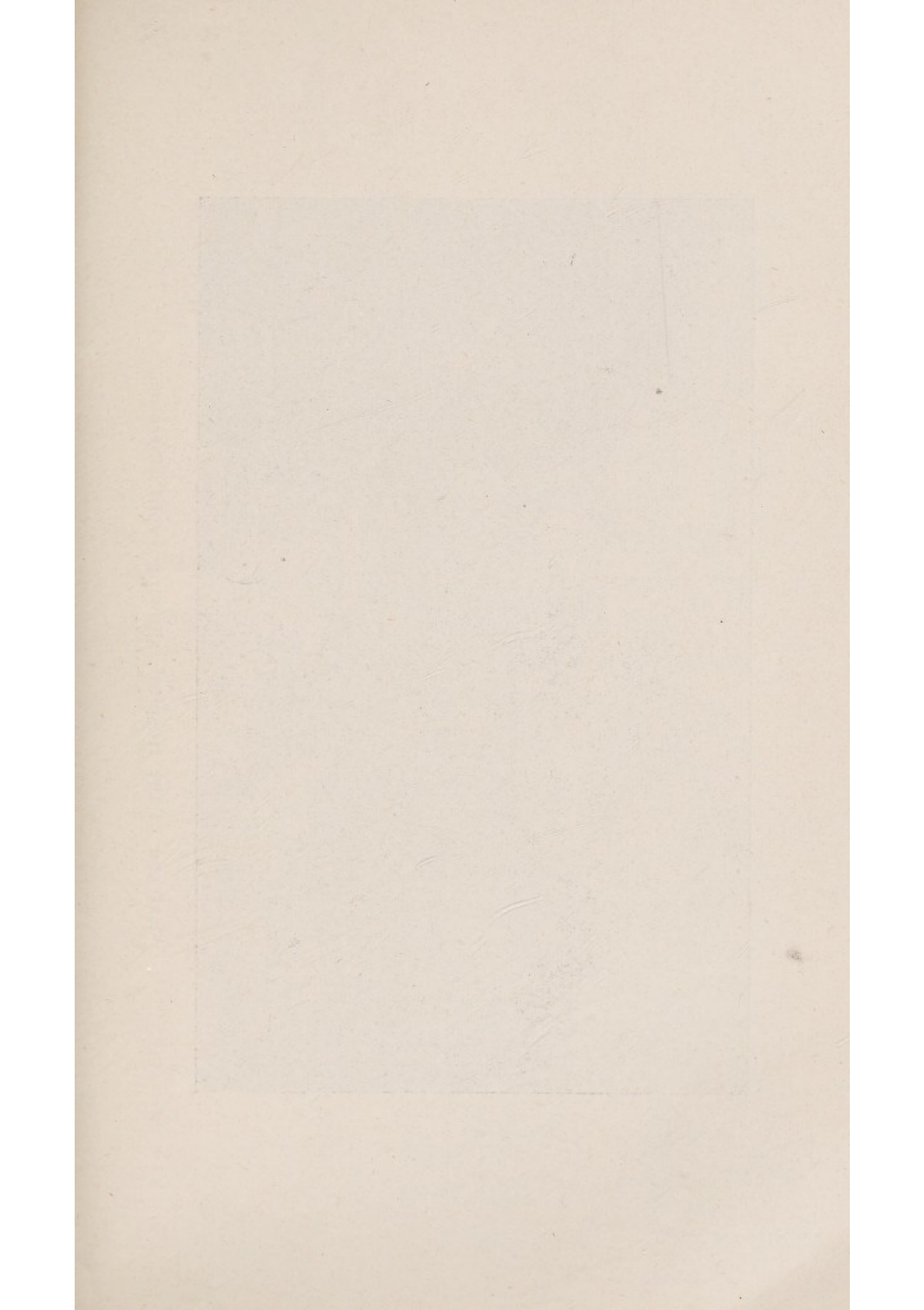

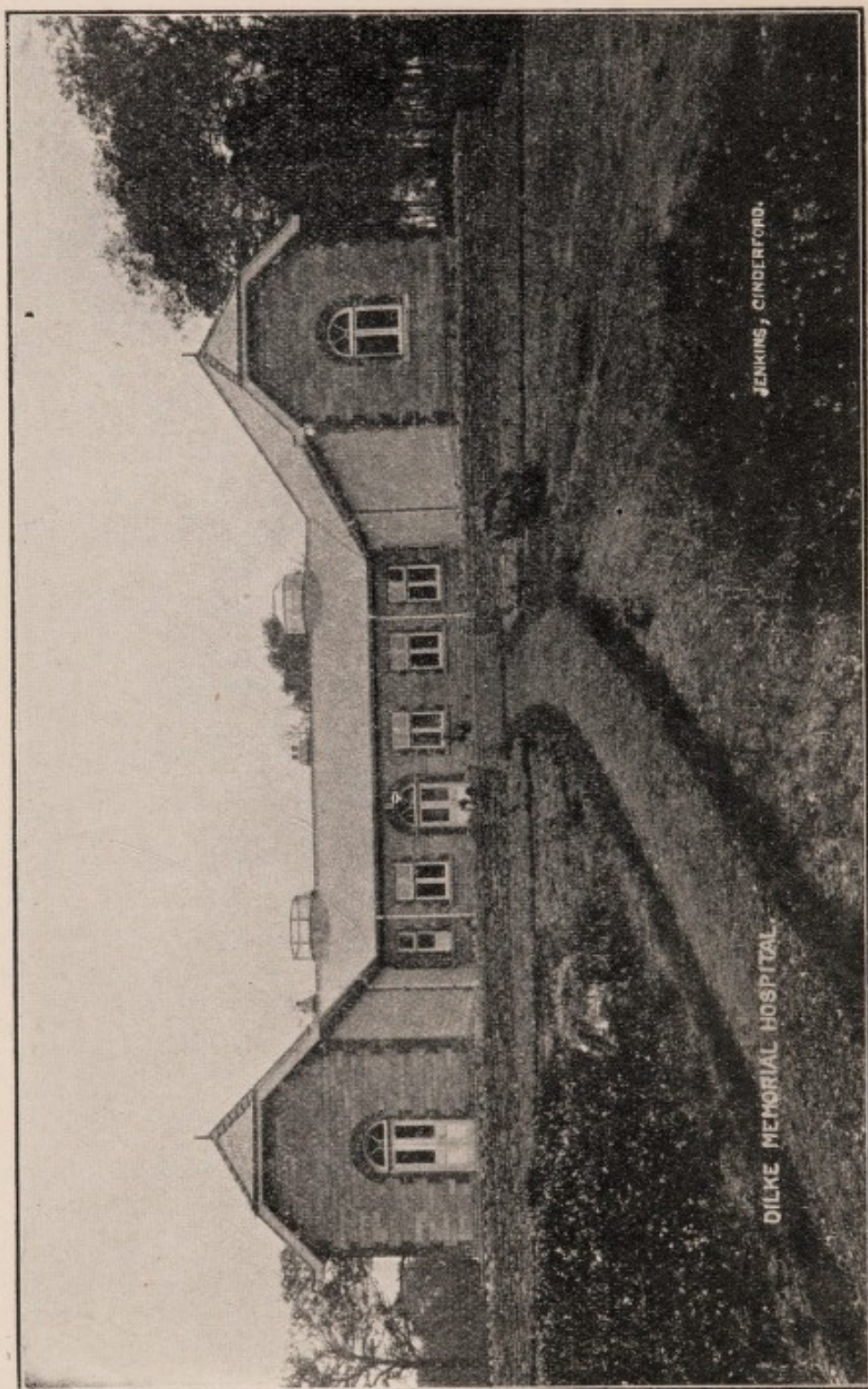
