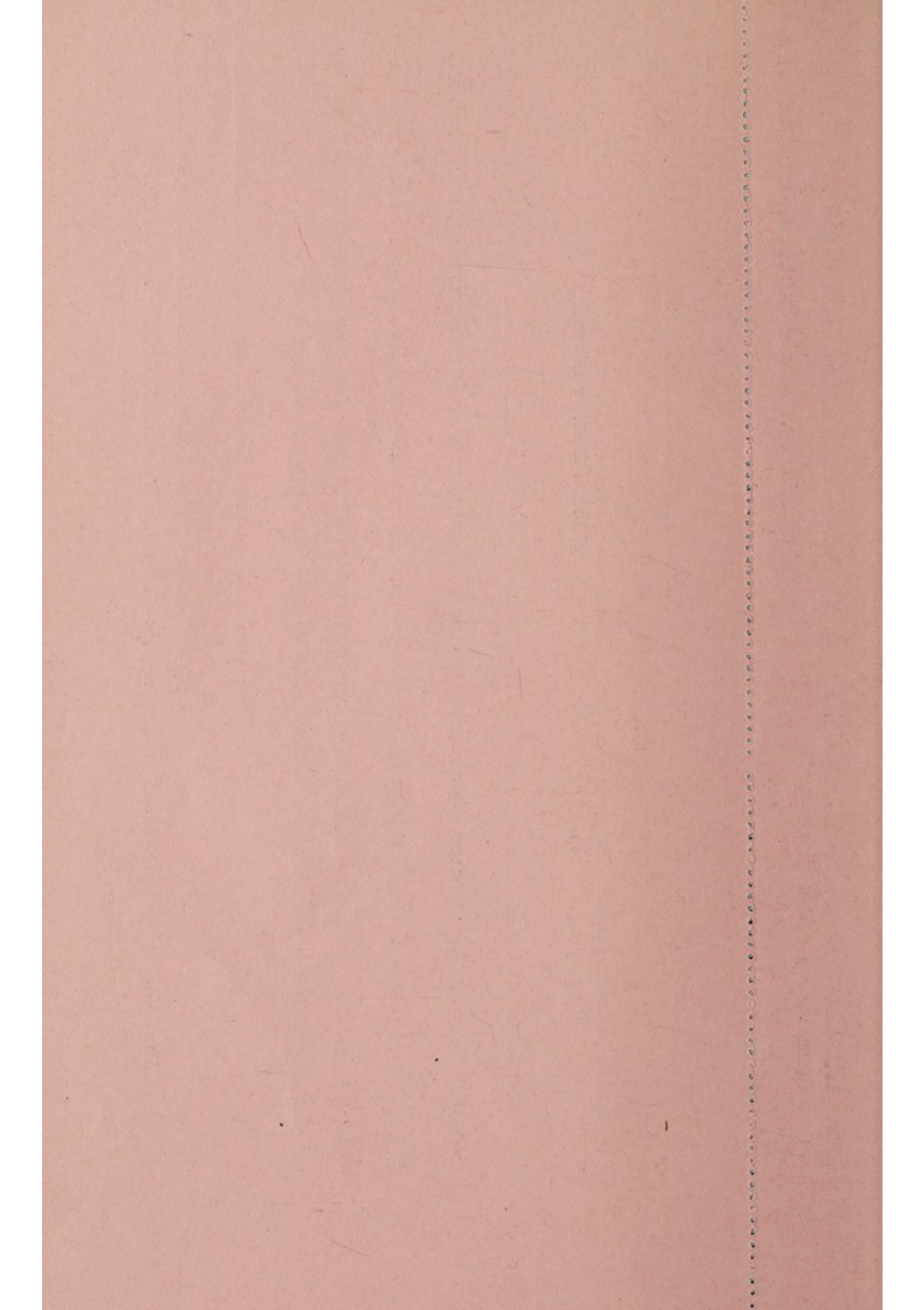

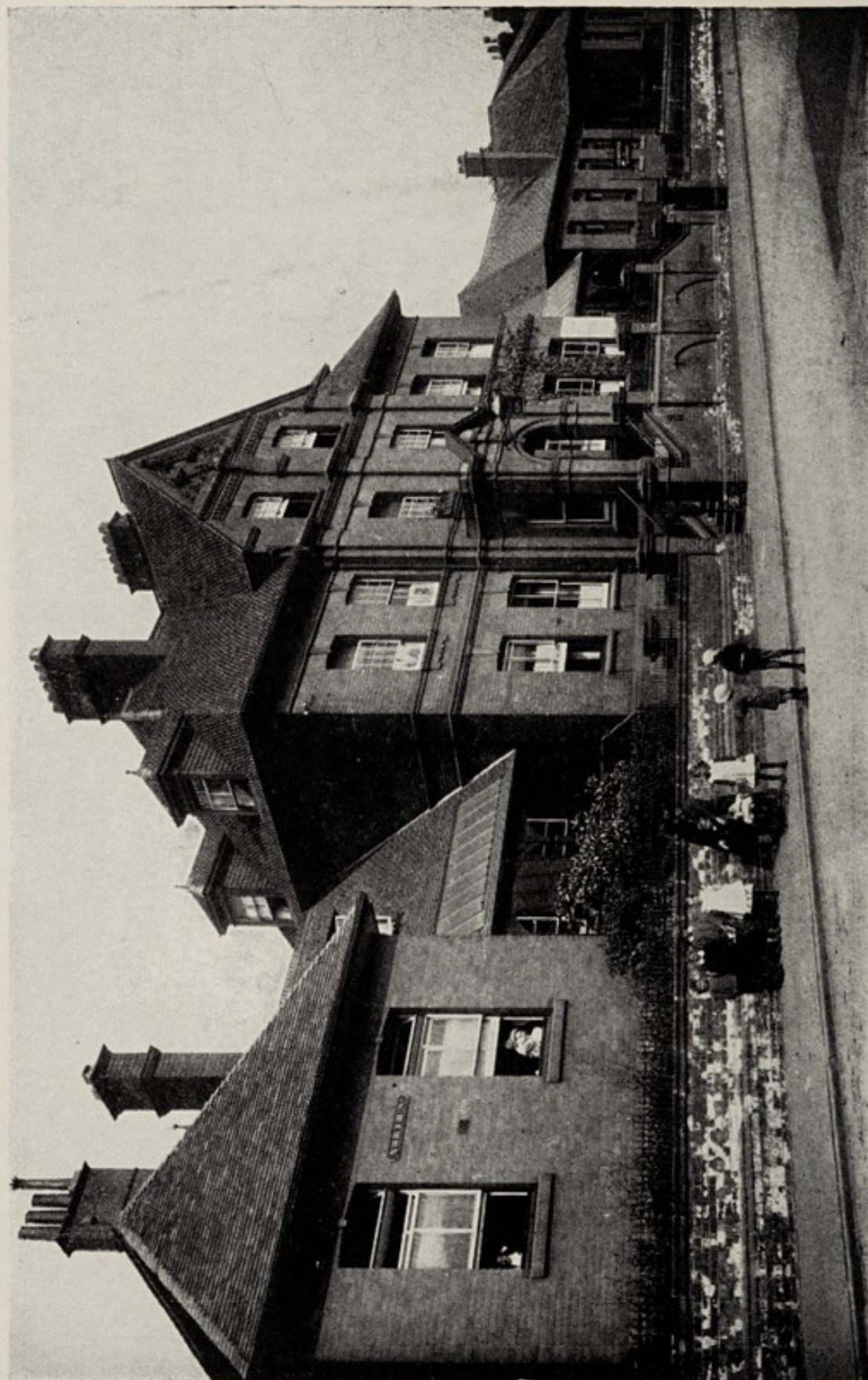

General Rules relating to Admission of Patients.

Parents or Guardians seeking admission for a Child as In- or Out-Patient must obtain a recommend.

All persons unable to pay for adequate medical attendance are suitable objects of the Charity.

Patients who, in the opinion of the Medical Officer, are capable of receiving equal benefit in the Out-Patients' Department are not admissible as In-Patients.

The following cases are inadmissible: Infectious Diseases other than Typhoid Fever, Confirmed Consumption, Insanity, or Incurable Diseases.

In consequence of the continual pressure on the accommodation, preference is given to the most urgent cases, and those less urgent are dealt with as Out-Patients until vacant beds arise.

Urgent cases are admitted free at all times.

County patients living at a distance should not be sent until a statement, giving full and precise information as to their complaint and present condition, has been forwarded to the House Surgeon and Secretary, who will reply by return stating whether or not the case appears suitable for admission, and if so, when a bed will be vacant.

Attention to this last rule is most desirable, as it is very distressing to the Medical Officers, as well as dangerous to the Patients, if cases have to be sent back on account of no beds being available.

Fifty-First Annual Report

OF THE

Board of Management

FOR THE

YEAR ENDING JUNE 30TH, 1928.

THE Board of Management have pleasure in presenting to Subscribers and friends of the Derbyshire Children's Hospital the Report for the year ending 30th June, 1928.

During the year under review 810 In-patients have been treated and the Out-patients attending the Hospital have numbered 5,478, showing an increase over the previous year of 161, who made 40,792 attendances.

The result of the year's working shows a deficit of £11 11s. 10d., making a total deficiency on Revenue of £2,145 7s. 11d.

From a perusal of the Revenue Account, it will be seen that the Expenditure shows an increase of £493 2s. 2d. over the previous year, partly accounted for by the cost of constructing a new Bath Room and Visitors' Waiting Room in the Administrative Block, and thereby effecting a much needed improvement in the domestic arrangements of the Hospital.

On the other hand, the Board are pleased to report an increase of Income amounting to £362 12s. 10d., and it is gratifying to note that such increase is derived from practically every source of income.

The Working Men's Fund Committee generously supported by the L.M. & S. Hospital Fund (Derby Centre), have again rendered splendid service, having by their hard work and enterprise collected the handsome sum of £2,676 4s. 5d., and to this Committee and their Secretary, Mr. C. Robinson, and to the various firms, and all others who have helped to maintain the Working Men's Fund, the Board tender their hearty thanks and sincere congratulations for the work done and on the success achieved.

Mr. Edwin Goodwin is to be congratulated on the result of his efforts on behalf of the Hospital, whereby he has personally collected the sum of £167 1s. 0d.

The Board tender their sincere thanks to the Lady Collectors who by their patience and perseverance, year after year, render such valuable assistance to the Hospital.

The Board also have much pleasure in extending their most grateful thanks and congratulations to Mrs. Tunncliffe, Mr. A. H. Glastonbury, and Mr. J. H. Dix, Mrs. Fred Ogle and Mrs. Harry Ogle, Mrs. Downes, Ald. R. B. Chambers and the Derby School Teachers for their kindly and generous help on behalf of "The Belper Cot," "The Denby and Kilburn Cot," "The Ripley Cot," "The Duffield Cot," and "The Derby School Children's Cot," respectively, which has contributed in no small degree to the increase of income referred to.

The Board also desire to thank Miss L. Grace Aspley for again so generously devoting the proceeds of her Dancing Display, amounting to the handsome sum of £112 15s. 0d., to the funds of the Hospital, making a total contributed by this lady of £400 5s. 6d., and they offer her their warmest congratulations on the wonderful success attained.

The hearty thanks of the Board are also extended to Mrs. Soller, who so kindly promoted and organised a British Celanese Ball, which resulted in the splendid sum of £155 5s. 6d. being handed over to the Hospital Funds.

The Annual Ball in aid of the Hospital was held at the Assembly Rooms on January 4th, and was pronounced a huge success, the funds benefiting to the extent of £76 1s. 5d.

The Board are pleased to report that Miss M. Elsom, M.B., B.S. (London), has been appointed Hon. Anaesthetist to the Hospital.

To the Hon. Surgical and Medical Staffs for their generous help and the devotion of their skill, time and attention to the needs of the children, the best thanks of the Board are given.

The Board desire to record their highest appreciation of the attentive and efficient manner in which the various departments of the Hospital have been controlled by the Matron (Miss A. Dight), and also their satisfaction with the loyal and cheerful manner in which the Members of the Nursing Staff, and all other Members of the Staff, have carried out their duties.

In conclusion, the Board wish to express their deep sense of gratitude to all those who have so generously responded to the Appeal issued last Easter on behalf of the Extension Fund. The total contributions either paid or promised now amounts to the approximate sum of £4,300, leaving a balance of £12,700 to be raised to meet the requirements set out in the Appeal. It is with the utmost confidence that the Board appeal to all classes of the community for their help and support to enable them to carry out the work of extension so urgently needed, and so increase the Hospital's sphere of usefulness amongst the sick and suffering children of the town and County of Derby.

Medical Report, 1927-28.

THE Honorary Medical Staff have much pleasure in presenting their Annual Report.

During the year 810 Patients have been treated in the wards of the Hospital; while 5,478 have attended as Out-Patients. Operations requiring anæsthetics were performed in 455 cases.

Of the 59 deaths which occurred in the Hospital, 14 occurred of Patients within forty-eight hours of admission. Of the total number, 45 were of Patients under the age of two years.

The Nursing Staff now consists of 5 Sisters, 1 Staff Nurse and 17 Probationers.

During the past twelve months the following epidemics have broken out amongst In-Patients : Measles, 30 ; Whooping Cough, 2 ; Chicken Pox, 1 ; Diphtheria, 11 ; Scarlet Fever, 5 ; Mumps, 2 ; and Cerebro Spinal Fever, 1.

Fifty-First Annual Meeting

WEDNESDAY, 31st OCTOBER, 1928.

The Fifty-first Annual Meeting of Subscribers and friends of the Children's Hospital was held on Wednesday, the 31st October, 1928, at the Hospital, North Street.

In the absence of the President Mrs. H. FitzHerbert Wright; Mr. W. Allan Reid (Chairman of the Board) occupied the chair, and amongst those present were the Mayor (Coun. A. Sturgess), Mrs. W. A. The Secretary announced apologies for unavoidable absence from Mrs. H. FitzHerbert Wright (President), Mrs. W. Woolley, Mrs. Downes, Mrs. Eking, Capt. H. FitzHerbert Wright, Capt. J. A. E. Drury-Lowe, Col. G. A. Lewis, Dr. R. M. Wilson, Mr. J. G. Rolley, and Ald. R. B. Chambers.

ANNUAL REPORT.

The Chariman, moving the adoption of the Report and Balance Sheet, referred to the absence of Mrs. FitzHerbert Wright, and said he was sure they would sympathise with her when they knew the reason why she was not present. It was because a happy event was very imminent in her family, and, although having regard to her youthful charm it seemed absurd, she would probably very soon be a grand-mother again. Everyone would be glad to hear that all was well. Another matter to which he desired to refer was the grave illness of their esteemed vice-president, Lord Harrington. He was glad to see in the papers that on Monday there had been an improvement in His Lordship's condition and just before that meeting he was still further delighted to hear that improvement was well maintained. He sincerely hoped and prayed that His Lordship's life might be spared for a continuation of the help and usefulness which he had shown towards the hospital in the past.

Turning to the Annual Report, the Chairman said it was no less pleasing or encouraging than it had ever been. The record of attendances was thoroughly satisfying. There was a deficit on the year's working of £11 11s. 10d., whereas on that of the previous year they had had a balance to the good of £130 9s. 4d. There was, however, an increase of expenditure of £493 2s. 2d. over the previous year increased by carrying out much needed improvements in the domestic arrangements of the hospital. This had been very necessary. Really the expenditure had only been normal. The Working Men's Committee had been one of the mainstays of the hospital and it was impossible to speak too highly of the work that committee had done. He was sure he was voicing the feeling of all the members of the board when he said he wished that committee success in the future and hoped for a continuation of their good work. Mr. Edwin Goodwin had again been busy and had personally collected the sum of £167 1s. 0d. They could always rely on something substantial from Mr. Goodwin, and personally he thought it was wonderful what he had accomplished on behalf of the institution. He also wished to mention the work of the lady collectors. Their efforts were pursued in all sorts of weather and some householders perhaps felt that they had cause to reproach themselves that they were not always at home when the lady collectors called.

The Chairman referred to the fact that the Cot Fund had increased and said how grateful the board were to Miss Grace Aspley for again devoting the proceeds of her dancing display to the funds of the hospital. Speaking of the efforts of Mrs. Soller and the British Celanese Co., he pointed out that within less than twelve months two sums of £500 each had been handed over, other sums had been raised and dances had realised £155 5s. 6d. The last dance organised by Mrs. Soller only realised about £3, but the board had been handed a cheque for £33, which represented £30 from the British Celanese. There ought to have been 200 more people at that dance and it was very regrettable that the effort did not meet with a bigger response. Far from being discouraged, however, Mrs. Soller intended to carry out her plan, which was to have another ball in February. He hoped it would be the success it deserved to be. With regard to the Extension Fund, he wished to say he was grateful to all who had helped so far, but much remained to be done, and it could only be done if the fund achieved thorough success. He appealed to everyone to do all they could to achieve that success. The land for the extension was lying barren and all they required was the money without which operations could not be begun. They wanted another £12,000. It must be raised; they could not let the matter remain idle; the hospital was doing too great a work for it to be hampered for the lack of funds. He moved the adoption of the report.

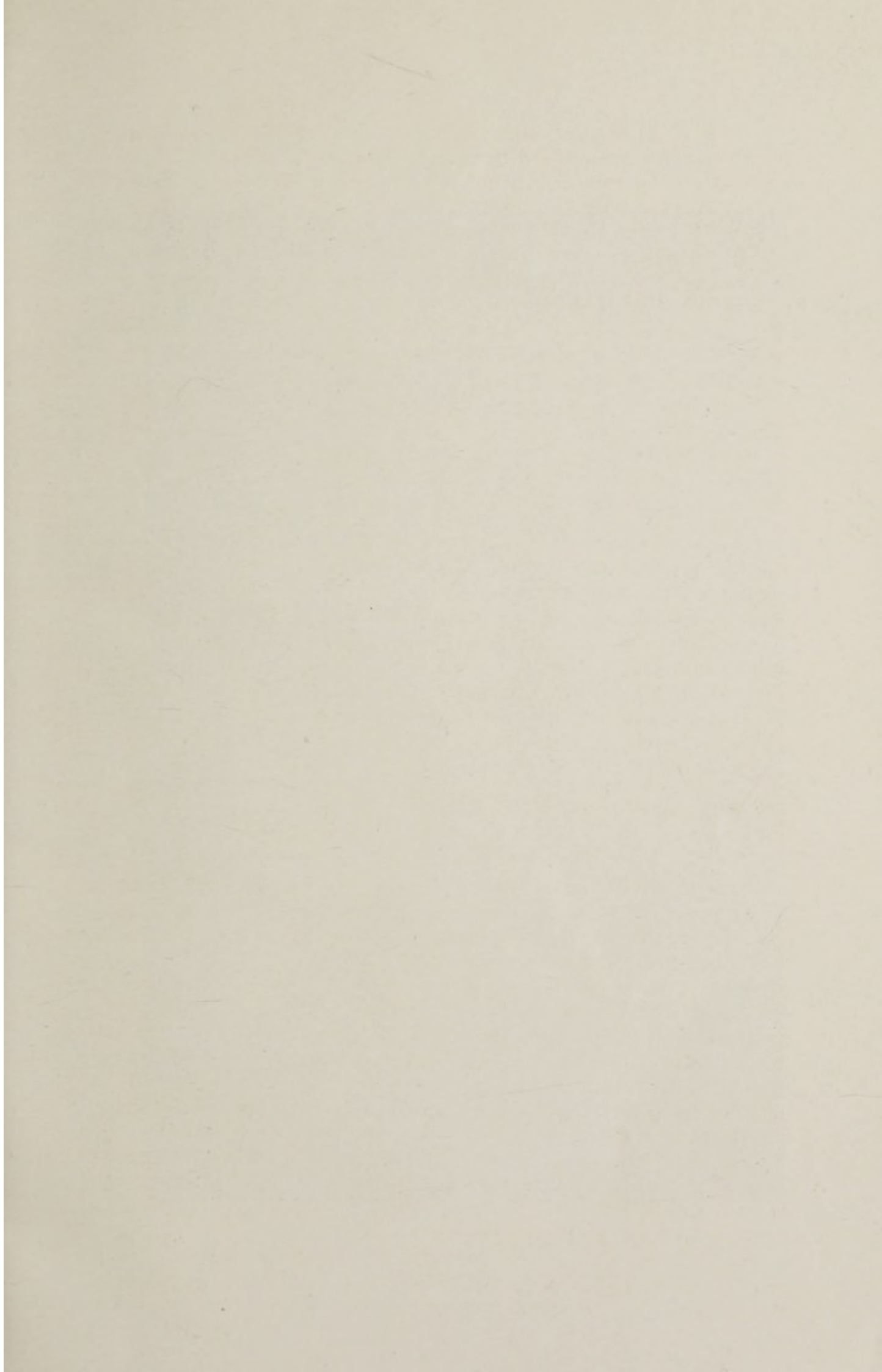
MR. F. H. FRERE seconded, and referred to the repairs and improvements which had been put off until they could be put off no longer. He endorsed what the Chairman had said with regard to the Working Men's Committee, and spoke of the efforts of the L.M.S. Working Men's Fund and the single-handed achievements of Mr. Goodwin. Mr. Frere also spoke of the help the hospital had received from the Clothing Guild under the able management of Mrs. Woolley and Miss A. Dight (Matron). They had received 170 garments for the little patients and these had proved a tremendous help in the work of the hospital. Referring to the work of the medical and nursing staff, he remarked that they were more than ever indebted to the matron for the way in which she carried on the hospital. He also wished to mention the services of Mr. Whiston, their able secretary, who was very quiet and very modest. There were, however, not many days in the year when he was not working for the hospital.

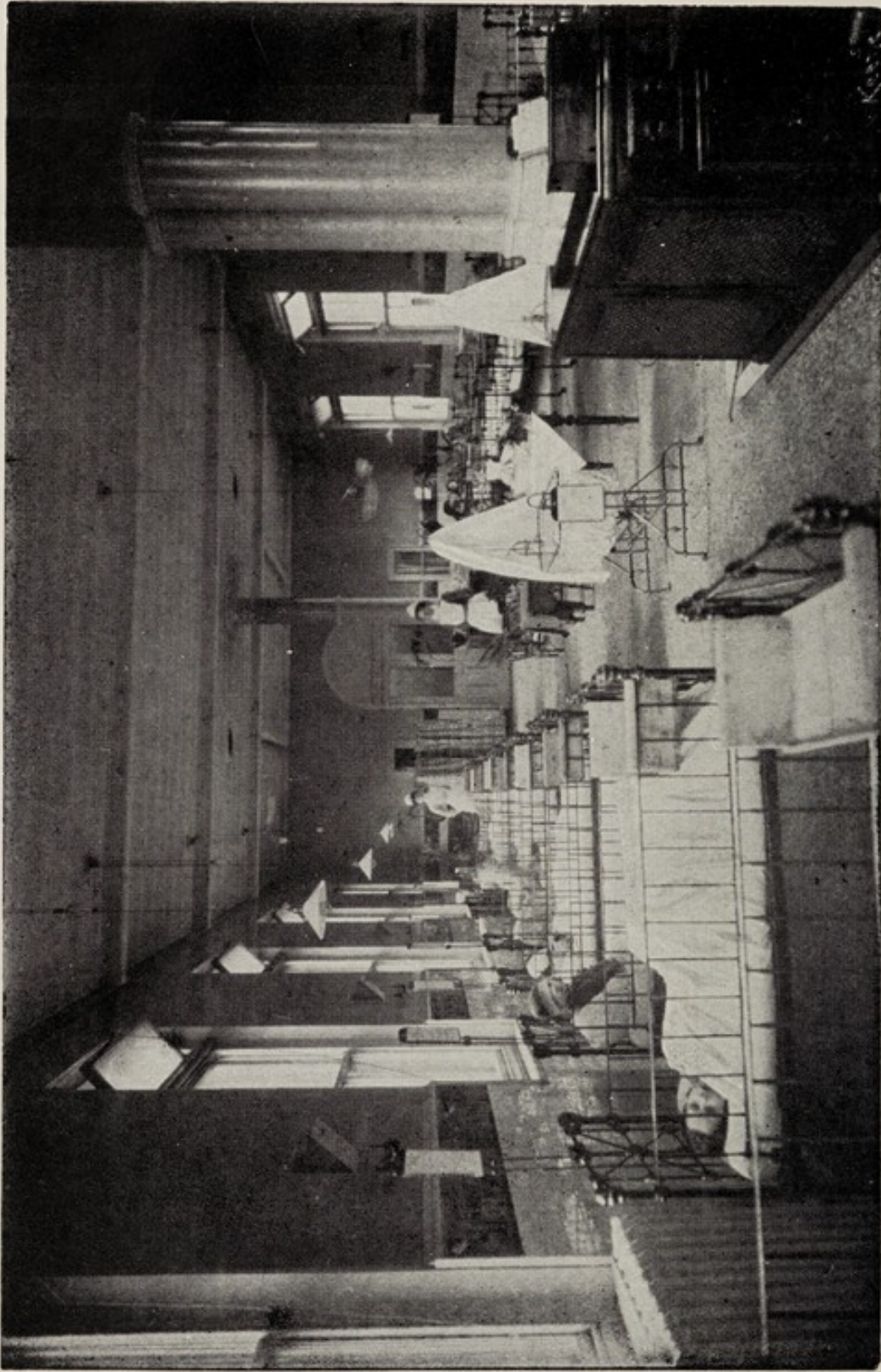
They had already received or been promised £4,300 towards the Extension Fund. That did not appear to be a very generous response from a town and county like Derby. The L.M.S. had contributed £1,000 of that sum and the British Celanese had given £200. He hoped that during the next few months they would make bigger strides towards the realisation of the amount required. A start ought to be made on the building, but they could not do it without the money, and it was "up to" all connected with the hospital and everybody in Derby and county to do their best.

The report was adopted.

RE-ELECTION OF PRESIDENT.

MR. C. M. HOBSON moved that a very hearty vote of thanks be accorded to Mrs. H. FitzHerbert Wright for the services she has rendered to the hospital during the past year, and that she be re-elected President for the ensuing year. A year ago, Mr Hobson proceeded, they had asked Mrs. FitzHerbert Wright to become President and it was whilst the hospital was in the throes of a great enterprise, perhaps the greatest that the hospital had ever undertaken, that they asked her to retain office. When she consented to retain office she proved that their confidence in her had not been misplaced. She had done everything she could for the hospital during the past year, but what about themselves? Ought they not to show that her confidence in them was not misplaced? She, he was assured, did not want thanks, she wanted £17,000 for the Extension Fund. The hospital stood at the cross-roads. They had raised £4,300, but left £12,700 to be raised before the work of extension could be begun. If the people of Derbyshire did not raise it, it would be letting down Mrs. FitzHerbert Wright, and, what was worse, they would be

letting down the children. The tendency of the time was to trust children more and more. Children were the only people who preserved a right sense of values. It was a pity the "grownups" could not abdicate and let the children rule instead. He wanted the people of Derbyshire to feel thoroughly uncomfortable until the extension of the hospital had been achieved. If he could only move the people to do something for the Children's Hospital he would feel that he had not spoken in vain. He wanted the people with healthy, happy children to be thoroughly uncomfortable; that the kisses of their children should scorch them because of the children who were in pain. They lived in a murky age; "rapid and shallow," as Merriman said of the Arno. But it had one good feature—they were coming to care more and more for the children, their health, their happiness. That hospital was a proof of the new spirit. He could not believe that the people of Derbyshire would let that labour of love languish for want of support; they they would be guilty of the blackest treachery to their President and the children if they did.

MR. F. STAPLEFORD seconded, and said no mere man could have done better for the hospital than Mrs. FitzHerbert Wright. It had been a big disappointment to the board that the response to their appeal for the Extension Fund had been so small. They had got to get out amongst the people and raise the money. The Children's Hospital was not kept before the people as it should be and unless things were so kept before the public by posters and other publicity devices the public would forget all about them.

The motion was carried.

VOTES OF THANKS.

THE MAYOR OF DERBY moved that the best thanks of the meeting be given to the Board of Management, the hon. officers, the Ladies' Collecting Committee and the Working Men's Fund Committee, for their valuable services during the past year, and that the following members of the Board be re-elected: Messrs. H. T. Ann, H. C. Bemrose, Capt. T. H. Bishop, R. B. Chambers, F. H. Frere, W. Hart, C. M. Hobson, Col. G. A. Lewis, W. Allan Reid, Mrs. L. S. R. Stroyan, and Mrs. W. Woolley. The Children's Hospital, he said, had always had an excellent name. He reminded the previous speakers that there was such a thing as the Mayor's Hospital Fund, and added that during the last nine months it had reached a record figure. There was still three months to go. He did not take any credit for the record, but gave it to the weather, which had been ideal for outdoor events.

MR. GERARD H. SMITH seconded, and said all the people mentioned in the resolution had been tried in the public service and had not been found wanting. The appeal for the Extension Fund had come at a time when two other institutions in the town

were also making appeals for money and this no doubt had some effect. They must not be down-hearted; he felt sure the public would realise their responsibilities.

The motion was carried.

THE CHAIRMAN returned thanks, and said it was a sheer delight to know that the efforts of everyone connected with the hospital met with such appreciation. They were not depressed by the result of the appeal, but the board had a feeling that the Extension Fund had not got what it deserved. They only asked that it should get its deserts. The board is not downhearted by any means, he said.

DR. LAVELLE replied on behalf of the Hon. staff, which he said looked upon the work in the light of a pleasure. It was very much easier to work because the board was always open to receive suggestions from the staff. The nursing staff was always willing to help in any way they could. So far as he could see hospitals were going to be very different to what they had been. The original idea of a voluntary hospital was to ease the sufferings of the poor, and the Derbyshire Children's Hospital fulfilled that idea more than some similar institutions. Some of them were becoming mere centres of consultation.

MR. T. BURNHAM, also replying, said the Working Men's Committee was a real live body, and he was very pleased to see the healthy and competitive spirit amongst its members. Every year they were trying to beat the previous year's figures and every year it was being done. He wished to thank the working people of Derby who contributed so as to enable them to pay over the magnificent sums each year. They were doing very well, but he appealed to those people who did not already contribute. The Committee got most of its money from people who were employed with firms giving facilities for its collection and he asked firms not already doing so to allow equal facilities.

ALTERATION OF RULES.

MR FENNELL moved that "the financial year of the hospital shall in future be deemed to end on September 30th instead of June 30th the existing date, and that all subscriptions shall be due in advance on October 1st instead of July 1st and rule 6 altered accordingly." The reason they brought the matter forward, explained Mr. Fennell, was because the Working Men's Committee had had trouble in getting the money in under the existing arrangements.

MR. FRERE seconded.

MR. GERARD H. SMITH asked if the Board supported the idea and pointed out that it would mean running 15 months on 12 month's income.

The Chairman said that was so, but the matter would adjust itself in time.

Mr. Gerard Smith asked if legacies could not be paid to the income account rather than the endowment account, and added that that would help them over the extra three months.

The Chairman said the board had considered the adoption of that course, but the concensus of opinion had been that if they continued as they were, much the same as a business concern relying on income year by year, it would be better for the institution. The hospital compared more than favourably with any other institution of its kind in the country. They always had the sum of the endowment account behind them and if the appeal failed they would not be stopped in the work of extension because of the policy which had been consistently followed by the board.

The motion was carried.

THE CHAIRMAN moved "that children shall be admissible up to the age of 10 as in-patients instead of 'between the ages of 2 and 10 years' and that rule 2 'In-patients' be altered accordingly."

MR. FRERE seconded.

Dr. Sawday thought that 10 years was too low an age to be fixed. It is a question of size, he remarked, you may get a small 15-year-old, or a large 10-year-old who will not go into a cot. He suggested that boys up to 13 and girls up to 14 be admitted.

Dr. Lavelle thought that when the extension came along the rule as to admission should be revised.

The original motion was carried.

EXTRACTS FROM THE RULES.

OBJECTS.

The object of the Hospital shall be to provide for the reception during sickness, medical treatment and maintenance, of the children of poor parents within the Town or County of Derby, and such other cases as the Board of Management may from time to time think fit, and to furnish with medicines and advice as Out-patients those who need not or cannot be admitted into the Hospital.

IN-PATIENTS.

Children shall be admissible up to the age of ten years as in-patients. Very urgent exceptional cases allowed by the Board of Management may be admitted above ten years.

ADMISSION OF IN-PATIENTS.

In-patients shall be admitted at 10 o'clock on Fridays only, except in cases of accident or other emergency. No cases of a contagious or infectious character shall be admitted into the Hospital.

OUT-PATIENTS.

At any age under twelve years children of poor parents can be admitted as Out-patients for medical treatment and advice. They must attend at 2.30 o'clock on Tuesdays or Fridays.

Parents must bring their own bottles for medicines, or deposit the value of the bottles handed to them as a security for their return clean and sound.

QUALIFICATION OF GOVERNORS.

Every annual subscriber of £1 1s. 0d. and upwards shall be a Governor, and every donor of £10 or more shall be a Life Governor, of the Hospital.

The collector of £20 or more at one time for the benefit of the Hospital, or the organiser of concerts, or other entertainments, paying £10 or more within twelve months to the funds of the Hospital, or the Minister of any church or chapel, or other place of worship, paying at one time a collection of £10 or more to the funds of the Hospital, shall be a Life Governor.

The Working Men's Fund Committee may nominate a representative being a member of their Committee to be a Governor—but without any privilege of recommends—in respect of each complete sum of £50 contributed annually.

A committee organising concerts or other entertainments, or collecting subscriptions to the amount of £10 or more for the benefit of the Hospital, may submit to the Board of Management a nominee to represent them as a Life Governor.

The Medical Officers shall be Governors *ex officio*.

A Life Governor renewing his donation or collection of £10 or more shall be entitled to nominate a person as a Life Governor.

PRIVILEGES OF GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS.

Life Governors of £10 qualification shall be entitled to three recommendations in a year; Life Governors of £20 qualification to six recommendations in a year, and so on in proportion, if desired.

Governors being Subscribers of £1 1s. shall be entitled to three recommendations in a year, and Subscribers of £2 2s. to six recommendations in a year, and so on in proportion, if desired.

Annual Subscribers of 10s. 6d. shall be entitled to one recommendation. A family subscribing £1 1s. to a "Cot" shall be entitled to three recommendations in a year.

One recommendation shall be required for an Out-Patient, which shall entitle a child to treatment for eight weeks if necessary, and three recommendations shall be required for an In-Patient, which shall entitle a child to treatment for four weeks, if necessary.

SUBSCRIPTIONS : WHEN DUE.

All subscriptions shall be due in advance on the 1st October, and are considered to be continued each current year, unless notice be given to the contrary. No Governor shall be entitled to vote at any Special General Meeting whose subscription is unpaid, or at the Annual Meeting unless the subscription for the previous year be paid.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.

The Board of Management shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Ex-Presidents, the Mayor of Derby for the time being, Chaplain, Treasurer, Honorary Medical Officers, and Secretary and 12 Governors, and two or more Members of the Working Men's Committee whose number shall be regulated as follows: there shall be at least two such members, and an additional member for every complete £500 in excess of £1,000 collected by them in the preceding financial year with a maximum representation of 5 members.

The direction and general management of the Hospital shall be vested in the Board of Management thus constituted.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT MEETINGS.

The Board of Management shall meet monthly at the Hospital, at such time as may be determined at the first meeting in each year, and at such other times as shall be considered necessary. At the first meeting after the Annual General Meeting the Board shall appoint a Chairman, and shall likewise appoint a House Committee, consisting of four members of the Board and the members of the Honorary Medical Staff. The Chairman of the Board shall be a member of the House Committee *ex officio*.

Three members of the Board shall form a quorum.

DUTIES OF HOUSE COMMITTEE.

The House Committee shall meet once in every week, and at the first meeting after their election shall appoint one of their own members to be the Chairman of that Committee for the ensuing year. The Committee shall have the care of the household arrangements of the Hospital, shall inspect the tradesmen's bills, shall enforce the observance of the Regulations of the Hospital, and shall notice and report to the Board any irregularity or mistake on the part of the officers or servants of the Hospital, and shall appoint and dismiss, and make all necessary arrangements as to duties, salaries or otherwise, with the nurses, porters and menial servants, and shall at every meeting of the Board cause a statement of the household expenditure for the previous month to be produced to the Board. Of the said House Committee three shall form a quorum.

During the interval between their meetings the Chairman of the House Committee shall be authorised to exercise their functions in any matter of emergency, and shall report at their next meeting whatever he shall have done under this authority.

COTS AND THEIR ENDOWMENTS.

A donation or legacy of £500 or more will endow and name a Cot in perpetuity.

Every person subscribing annually £25 or upwards to, or collecting annually £50 or upwards for, the benefit of the Hospital, shall have the privilege of naming a Cot for the then current year.

VISITORS.

Subscribers and other persons interested in the work may visit the Hospital on any day (except Saturday and Sunday) between 2.0 p.m. and 4.0 p.m.

Patients may be visited by their parents and friends once a week, on Sundays or Fridays, between the hours of 2.30 p.m. and 3.30 p.m.
