The number of treatments given to In-patients in Special Departments was as follows :--X-Ray Department :--Deep Therapy, 500, Superficial Therapy, 32, Radiographs, 2962, Screened, 368, Artificial Sunlight, 57, Infra Red and Massage, 1638; Electrocardiograph, 297, Venous Occlusion, 14, Dia-thermy, 208; Physiotherapy Department :--Massage, Electrical Exercises, etc., 8423; Total, 14499.

In the Pathological Department, 41303 examinations were made, as against 31610 in the previous year.

The number of Anaesthetics administered for operations during the year was 9848 as against 9361 last year.

The number of Military cases treated was:-In-patients, 578; Out-patients, 1870. Total, 2448.

Emergency Medical Services.

The Governors will remember that during the War the Infirmary has been privileged to undertake considerable work in connection with the Emergency Hospital Service, and since the outbreak of War, no fewer than 7,718 In-patients and 27,644 Outpatients from the Forces have been treated to the end of 1946.

At the close of the year very few military cases were being allocated to the Infirmary, with consequent relief to the civilian beds.

Patients' Waiting List.

During the year strenuous efforts have been made to organise the routine work of admissions in order to reduce the numbers on the Waiting List, the high figures reported from time to time having been a source of great anxiety to the Board. It is satisfactory to note that as the result of the organisation set up, the numbers have been reduced from 3,918 at the beginning of the year to 2,977 at the end—a diminution of 941.

In this connection the Board desires to record its gratitude for the assistance given by the Derby Borough Health Committee in continuing the arrangements made during the War for admission to the City Hospital of certain cases from the Waiting List.

The thanks of the Board are also conveyed to the British Red Cross Society for their kindness and co-operation in providing beds at the Parwich Red Cross Auxiliary Hospital for cases requiring Rehabilitation treatment.

Medical Services.

Following a very careful survey by the General Purposes Committee during the year, a considerable measure of reorganisation of the Medical and Surgical Departments has been undertaken with a view of providing the best possible services for patients requiring specialised treatment. The position of whole-time Radiologist has been filled by the appointment of Dr. J. C. Tainsh, M.B., Ch.B., D.R., who has been placed in general charge of the Radiological (Diagnostic) Department. He is supported by a whole-time Assistant appointed since the close of the year, and the work of the Department has been organised in such a way as to provide a first class service for the Infirmary. Arrangements have been made for the service of this Department to be available to other Hospitals in the district. The Department has been further equipped by the provision of the latest type of High Power Diagnostic X-Ray Unit with special facilities for examination of the gastro-intestinal tract, and with the plant already in the department the Board feel that the Infirmary is becoming well equipped to be of great service to the community.

The position of Radiotherapist has been filled by the appointment of Mr. A. G. G. Melville, M.B., Ch.B., F.R.C.S., and the re-organisation and development of this Department is proceeding as apparatus and staff become available. An order has been placed for a 250 K.V. Quadracondex Deep Therapy X-Ray Generator Unit and, when this is installed, the Department will be provided with very modern apparatus.

With a view of enabling further work to be carried out in the Infirmary, the National Radium Commission, through the Sheffield Radiotherapy Centre, has made available further supplies of Radium on loan, and it is hoped that the stock of Radium available at all times will be built up to such a standard as will enable almost all treatments to be carried out in the Infirmary, thus avoiding the transfer of patients to other Centres.

In connection with the Radiological services, the Board desires gratefully to acknowledge the valuable help freely given by Dr. J. L. A. Grout, M.C., F.R.C.S., F.F.R., D.M.R. & E., the Chairman of the Sheffield Centre for Radiotherapy; Mr. G. W. Blomfield, M.A., F.R.C.S., M.R.C.O.G., D.M.R., the Honorary Radiotherapist and Director of the Sheffield Radiotherapy Centre in the work of the formation of the Radiotherapy Centre at the Infirmary. Mr. A. G. G. Melville has now been appointed a Deputy Director of the Sheffield Centre with which the Infirmary is affiliated.

It will be obvious that if the work of Radiology and of Radiotherapy are to be developed on the scale envisaged by the Board, further buildings are required. The matter is receiving careful consideration, and Messrs. Young & Hall, Chartered and Registered Architects, have been appointed to advise on the necessary buildings. Preliminary plans have been prepared and are at present the subject of consideration by the Ministry of Health. It is hoped that the provision of these buildings, to include the necessary Wards for specialised treatment, will be incorporated in the Scheme. The re-organisation of the General Surgical and Accident and Orthopaedic Services have also been the subject of consideration by the General Purposes Committee. Since the close of the year an interim report has been presented to the Board and the recommendations contained therein have been accepted.

These provide as follows :---

In General Surgery, Two Units are provided on parallel lines. At the head of each is a Senior Honorary Surgeon, supported by a whole-time Assistant Surgeon, a Registrar and a House Surgeon.

A further Unit for Orthopaedic and Accident work, at the head of which has been appointed a Specialist Surgeon with supporting Staff as provided in the foregoing Units, with a view of developing a first-class Accident and Orthopaedic Service which is considered most necessary in the highly industrialised area served by the Infirmary. The position of head of this Department has been offered to, and has been accepted by, Mr. R. Guy Pulvertaft, M.A., F.R.C.S., who it is hoped will take up his residence in Derby on the 1st June.

For the development of this branch of the work further beds will be required, but the immediate provision of these cannot be contemplated, and the Board will rely for the present on beds at other Hospitals continuing to be available for relieving the pressure on the Infirmary accommodation.

With a view to assisting the Medical Staff in the treatment of patients, a Medical Photographic Department has been established, and has already proved to be of the utmost value.

The Board desires to convey its thanks to the Honorary Medical Staff for their co-operation in connection with this re-organisation and for the continuance of their valued services to the Infirmary and its patients.

During the year Mr. G. F. E. Dyke, M.B., B.S., the Senior Honorary Surgeon, attained the age of retirement as provided by the Rules. The Board, conscious of his long, devoted and eminent services to the Infirmary, has decided to create the position of Surgeon Emeritus, and is glad to be able to report that Mr. Dyke has accepted the post, the appointment to be for a period of three years. In this way the services of this highly skilled Surgeon will be retained.

Miss M. Elsom, M.B., B.S. Lond., one of the Visiting Anaesthetists, resigned her position at the end of the year, after fourteen years' service, and the Board take this opportunity of thanking Miss Elsom for her loyal service.

The Board has pleasure in reporting that the Examining Board in England has agreed to recognise the Infirmary as a Hospital for the training of candidates for the Diploma of Ophthalmic Medicine and Surgery (D.O.M.S.) and the Diploma of Anaesthetics (D.A.). The Royal College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists has recognised the Infirmary as a Hospital for the training of candidates for membership of the College.

The Medical Superintendent, Dr. G. R. Osborn, M.B., B.S., has been honoured by the Board of the Faculty of the University of Sheffield inviting him to accept appointment as an Honorary Demonstrator in the Department of Pathology. The Board has gladly agreed to his acceptance of the position.

Nursing Staff.

The Board desire to record its appreciation of the loyal and devoted service of the Nursing Staff under the able guidance of the Matron, Miss E. Kenyon.

Members of the Civil Nursing Reserve and V.A.D. of the Red-Cross and Order of St. John have continued to give most valuable assistance and their help is gratefully acknowledged.

During the year, 25 Nurses have obtained the Final Certificate, and 22 the Preliminary Certificate, in State Examinations. Of the newly-qualified staff, 34 have left the Infirmary—5 to take Sisters' posts, 22 for Midwifery and other branches of Nursing, and 7 for marriage.

Miss Dora M. Chadwick, the Chief Assistant for Nursing to the Surgeon-General, Madras, a former Assistant Matron at the Infirmary, who was awarded the Kaisar-i-Hind Medal in 1944, has received the distinction of O.B.E.

The Board desire to bring to the notice of the Governors, the serious national position which has arisen during the year in the maintenance of the numbers of Nursing Staff and the recruitment of further candidates.

The Infirmary is fortunate that its position in this respect is not worse, but the future must be looked upon as of grave import, for in spite of a measure of relief given by a reduction of the bed complement from 416 to 357, the pressure of work on the Nursing Staff is such that annual leave is again becoming in arrear and any additional losses in staff are bound to lead to a further reduction in the number of beds, which will be reflected in the ability to treat patients.

It is understood the problem is engaging the active attention of the Ministry of Health, the Ministry of Labour and National Service and the Royal College of Nursing.

The Board has made urgent representations to be allowed to complete the extension of the Nurses' Home commenced during the War. The plans prepared by Mr. T. H. Thorpe, F.R.I.B.A., have been reconsidered by the officials of the Ministry of Health in the light of post-war requirements, and it is understood that strenuous efforts are being made by the Ministry of Health to impress upon the Departments of State concerned with the allocation of materials and labour, the necessity for dealing with this important matter during 1947.

The urgency of the matter will be more readily appreciated by pointing out that the extension provides much-needed study, training, rest and recreation rooms, as well as living accommodation, to cope with the developments of the Hospital as staff becomes available.

Domestic Staff.

The shortage of Domestic Staff continues to cause much anxiety, and with a view to improving the position application was made for the allocation of Displaced Persons from Europe, and since the end of the year the staff has been assisted by the addition of a number of persons from Estonia.

The increased expenditure is solely due to causes outside the control of the Board of Management. Prices of commodities and equipment have increased, and in addition it has been necessary to introduce higher rates of pay for all classes of employees.

The reduction in the number of beds has resulted in fewer In-patients being treated, and consequently this has increased the average cost per patient.

The Board again wishes to express its grateful thanks to the Derbyshire Hospitals Contributory Association, the Derby Hospitals Saturday Fund, the L.M. & S. Railway (Derby Centre) Hospital Fund, Rolls-Royce Hospital Fund Association, together with other Hospital Fund Committees. By continuing to meet the full cost of treating members of the Funds, these Organisations have relieved the Board of much financial anxiety.

Special Efforts.

The Board acknowledges the continued valuable support of His Worship the Mayor of Derby; the Mayoress; the Comforts and Linen League; the Needlework Guild; Congregations of Places of Worship for gifts of money, garden produce, flowers,

etc.; the British Red Cross and St. John's Ambulance Brigade; the County and Borough Police Forces and Special Constabulary; the National Fire Service and members of the various organisations who have continued to assist by willing service.

Most valuable personal service has continued to be given by other voluntary helpers and members of Toc H, to whom the Board desires to record its grateful thanks.

Members of the St. John Ambulance Brigade; Rolls-Royce Ambulance Corps; L.M & S. Railway Ambulance Corps, and the E.M.S. Ambulance Service have rendered willing service on the occasions when convoys have been received, and the Board takes this opportunity of recording their appreciation of the excellent service rendered to the Hospital and patients.

Very welcome gifts of food have been received from Australia, New Zealand, South Africa and West Africa, through the Ministry of Food Overseas Gift Allocation Centre, and the kindly thought which has prompted these gifts from the Dominions and Colonies is warmly appreciated and gratefully acknowledged.

Appreciation.

The Governors will be pleased to learn that Mr. A. J. Flux, a member of the Board for many years and of the House and Nursing Committees, has been honoured by the award of the Insignia of Officer Brother of the Venerable Order of St. John of Jerusalem.

Obituary.

The Board records with regret the passing of Mr. W. J. Willison, who has been a representative of the Derby Hospitals Saturday Fund on the Board since 1939. Mr. Willison had taken a great interest in the work of the Infirmary and rendered willing service at all times.

Staff.

The Staff in all Departments have again carried out their duties with the utmost loyalty, and have endeavoured to maintain an efficient service despite the difficult conditions which have obtained throughout the year.

Mr. Walter Riley, M.P.S., who was appointed Pharmacist in 1910, retired on the 30th September, and the Board records its appreciation of his long and valuable service.

The present Kitchen accommodation is quite inadequate and the necessity for the provision of a larger and more modern Department for which plans were prepared in 1938, is a matter of extreme urgency. Every endeavour is being made for the work to be taken in hand at the earliest possible moment.

Officers of the Ministry of Health have visited the Infirmary and the seriousness of the position has been discussed. The Board is most anxious to maintain the high standard of efficiency which has obtained for so many years, and it is hoped that the recommendations of the Ministry's representatives will enable priority to be given to the urgent requirements of the Hospital.

National Health Service Act, 1946.

In accordance with the National Health Service Act, the Minister of Health is empowered to take over all Voluntary Hospitals with their buildings, equipment, endowments and other funds.

The earliest date of this becoming operative is 1st April, 1948, and it is important that voluntary contributions should be continued until the transfer takes place.

In the interests of the patients it is essential the Infirmary should be maintained in the highest possible state of efficiency, and the Board feels that it may rely upon generous support being forthcoming throughout the large area it serves, to enable the beneficent work of the Hospital to proceed without financial embarrassment.

All employed persons are required to be members of the Derbyshire Hospitals Contributory Association or other Scheme affiliated with the British Hospitals Contributory Schemes Association, or a Works or Hospital Fund approved by the Board of Management.

OT SAF TELEY PREATER TO

Employed persons and their dependents requiring treatment as Inor Out-patients, must submit vouchers from one or other of the above Contributory Schemes or Funds; otherwise, fees will be payable under such regulations as may be laid down from time to time by the Board of Management.

Persons who cannot afford to be members of a Contributory Association, Fund or Scheme, will be required to submit a Subscribers' Letter.

Except where otherwise provided, the qualification for the admission of In- or Out-patients shall be inability to pay for the treatment required.

The Board shall have power to charge In-patients for maintenance such sums as it may from time to time determine.

Persons who require special hospital treatment and who are in a position to pay for it, may be admitted by permission of the House Committee at such fees and under such regulations as may be laid down from time to time by the Board.

Persons who are suffering from any infectious fever or from delirium tremens, or persons of unsound mind, or afflicted with any disorder deemed incurable, shall not be admitted, or, if inadvertently admitted, shall be discharged forthwith.

All patients must conform to the regulations of the Board, and to the directions of the Medical and Surgical Officers.

The House Committee may discharge any patient for violation of the regulations or directions to which such patient ought to conform, or for misbehaviour in any other respect; and the House Committee may also discharge any patient who, in its opinion, ought not to remain as an Inor Out-patient.

IN-PATIENTS.

Urgent cases can be admitted at any time by arrangement with the Infirmary. Telephone-DERBY 44255.

Other cases requiring In-patient treatment must attend in the first instance for examination in the Out-patient Department, or, if this is not possible, a short statement of the case should be sent to the Secretary. Arrangements will then be made for subsequent admission.

Friends of patients are admitted to visit them on Tuesdays between 6.0 p.m. and 7.30 p.m; and Fridays in the afternoon between 2.0 and 4.0 o'clock, and on Sunday afternoon between 2.0 and 3.0 o'clock.
