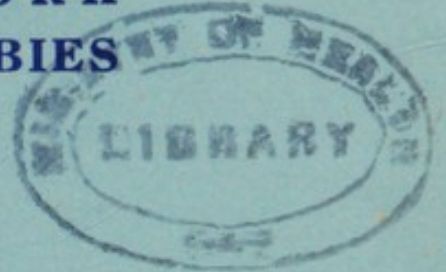

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL MEETING.

The Annual Meeting was held at the Hospital on Wednesday, 25th June, 1947, at 3-30 p.m.

Mr. T. F. Heyworth was in the Chair, and there were present Sir John Stopford, Mrs. J. Goodier Haworth, Mr. T. C. Guthrie, Dr. Catherine Chisholm, Members of the Board and Subscribers.

Apologies were received from the Lord Mayor of Manchester and others.

Minutes of the last Annual Meeting, held on the 19th June, 1946, were read and approved.

The Chairman presented the General Report; Dr. Chisholm, Chairman of the Medical Committee, the Medical Report; and Mr. T. C. Guthrie, the Honorary Treasurer, the Accounts and Balance Sheet for the year ended 31st December, 1946; and on the proposal of Mr. Heyworth, seconded by Mrs. Hewit, it was resolved:—

“ That the Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the year ended December 31st, 1946, now submitted to the Meeting, be approved and adopted.”

Sir John Stopford addressed the Meeting. He spoke of the forthcoming National Health Service and the opportunities and advantages to be gained from Regionalisation and mentioned that local patriotism would still find scope for voluntary service.

It was then moved by Councillor Mrs. Lord, seconded by Mrs. Lancashire, and carried unanimously:—

“ That Mr. T. C. Guthrie be elected Honorary Treasurer for the ensuing year.”

Upon the proposal of Mrs. Cooper, seconded by the Rev. C. A. Chamberlain, it was resolved:—

“ That the Members of the Board, as per list which was read, be elected for the ensuing year.”

It was then proposed by Dr. Wells, seconded by Mr. Whiteley, and carried:—

“ That the Honorary Auditors, Messrs. Walton, Watts & Co., be reappointed for the current year, and that the cordial thanks of the Honorary Officers and Board be extended to them for their work during the year.”

Dr. Charlotte Warner proposed a vote of thanks to Sir John Stopford, which was carried unanimously.

ANNUAL REPORT

for the year ended 31st December, 1947.

This, the thirty-fourth Annual Report of the Hospital, is the last which will be presented by the present Board of Management, since early in July the Hospital will take its place under the National Health Service. This impending event, however, has increased rather than lessened the interest of the Board and of the supporters of the Hospital in its future welfare and has certainly not lessened the work to be done to ensure that welfare.

Some changes have taken place in the membership of the Board. Mr. Anthony Simon has resigned and quite recently the Board has lost the services of Mrs. Pitty by her death. She had represented the Butterfly Guild for many years and had always taken the closest interest in the patients. Two new lay members, Mrs. Sleath and Mrs. Graham Bryce, have been elected. Dr. W. S. Gaisford, Professor of Child Health at the University, has also joined the Board. Councillor Mrs. Mary Knight has taken the place of Councillor McGrath as representative of the Manchester Corporation. Mr. Thomas Moore, Mr. A. H. R. Champion and Miss E. L. Willis have been appointed to the Board as representatives of the Medical Committee.

Dr. Catherine Chisholm has retired from her position as Senior Honorary Physician to the Hospital and has been appointed Honorary Consulting Physician. The services of Dr. Chisholm to the Hospital and to the cause of child welfare in general are too well known to need extended mention here. It is sufficient to say that they have been outstanding and inspiring throughout the history of the Hospital and will be suitably commemorated.

Dr. Nofah Walker has been appointed Honorary Consulting Radiologist in recognition of her services to the Hospital. Professor Gaisford has joined the staff as Honorary Physician and is giving clinical teaching to medical students in the wards. Dr. R. I. Mackay has been appointed Honorary Assistant Physician, and Dr. Judith Savatard has been appointed Honorary Visiting Dermatologist. Dr. John Wainwright has succeeded Dr. Langley as Pathologist and Dr. Margaret Jefferson has been appointed Medical Registrar in succession to Dr. Mackay.

Having regard to the increase in acute cases and the variety of the work now undertaken, the House appointments have been reorganised and the Resident Staff now consists of a Senior Resident Medical Officer with two Junior Resident Medical Officers. During the year a Supernumerary Medical Officer held an appointment under the post-graduate Education Scheme.

Miss Lily Brookes, Head Cook, has retired after twenty-five years of loyal work, and the Board wish to place on record their appreciation of her services.

The financing of the Hospital during the past year has not been free from difficulties. A larger staff, the increase in the cost of many commodities and supplies and the raising of the salary scales of all grades of employees under negotiated agreements have resulted in a very large deficit on income account, and this, in conjunction with the expenditure on extensions referred to below, has required the realisation of all the Hospital's free funds, which, by the time this report is published, will have been exhausted. In these circumstances it is very gratifying that voluntary support has not diminished and gives the best evidence of the high regard in which the Hospital's work is held. The Butterfly Guild has in all contributed £1,500 towards the new X-Ray apparatus and hopes eventually to defray the total cost of £2,000. The Heaton Moor Butterfly Guild has contributed a further £250 which, with money already given, is to pay for the cots and the oxygen installation in the new Premature Babies Unit. Both these contributions are in addition to the annual cot payments. A generous gift of £750 has also been received from the Trustees of the Skelton Bounty towards the cost of the new unit. A third Butterfly Guild has been started at Alma Lodge,

Buxton Road, Stockport, under the chairmanship of Mrs. Patience Cooper, and has contributed £130 to the maintenance of a cot. The various District Committees and Cot Funds have all continued their generous support. Other notable contributions during the year have been £105 16s. od. from the Levenshulme High School for Girls; £100 from the Lord Mayor of Manchester; a surprise donation of £100 brought in by Mr. J. T. Thomas, of Kingsway; and a total of £260 during the year from the Matron and Nursing Staff, proceeds of a Garden Party held in June and of the Christmas Toy Sale. The legacies received during the year included £250 from the Estate of the late Mr. Harry Southern, at one time a Member of the Board of Management; and a further £115 from the Estate of the late Miss Maria Pritchard.

The Board regard it of great importance that the voluntary income available for the benefit of the Hospital should not cease and are considering the formation of a Trust Fund to which subscriptions, donations and legacies can still be given when the Hospital comes under the Regional Board. The Trustees of this Fund will work in close relation with the Management Committee of the Hospital, with the object of providing for special purposes such as additional comforts, experimental work and research.

The work of the Board during the period covered by this report has been largely directed to ensuring that the Hospital to be handed over to the Regional Board shall be as complete, as well equipped and as efficient as is possible under present circumstances, and building and re-equipment has proceeded steadily. The Premature Babies Unit (to be named in commemoration of the work of Dr. Chisholm) is now on the point of completion; the new Ear, Nose and Throat Ward (a successful conversion of the old air raid shelter) is well under way, a third floor is now being added to the Nurses' Home, and a house in Grange Avenue has been bought to provide bed-sitting rooms for the senior nursing staff. This will increase the number of cots by twenty-five and will provide additional accommodation for twenty of the nursing staff. The reorganisation of the Out-Patients' Department has begun and five consulting rooms and a much enlarged physiotherapy department will ultimately be available. The completion of this is eagerly awaited to relieve the serious overcrowding resulting from the greatly increased work now undertaken. The Infant Welfare Centre has now been open for a year and has fully justified itself both in the teaching provided and in the local need which it fills.

Improved equipment includes new gas stoves and sinks in the In-Patients' Diet Kitchen and new washbasins and cork tile flooring in the wards. A new X-Ray apparatus will shortly be installed and the cloak room accommodation for the staff is being much improved.

The short but eventful history of the Hospital as a voluntary organization cannot be ended without some reference to the future. War and finance have prevented the Board from completing the building of the Hospital of their hopes, and they must commend this task to their successors. The most urgent matters are the provision of a modern heating and steam raising service; the construction of a new Out-Patient Department accessible from Kingsway and provision of additional accommodation for both the nursing and administrative staff. The next step will then be to build separate ward accommodation for older children, so that the Hospital can become a complete centre for dealing with all departments of pædiatrics in its area, and can give proper facilities for the teaching of child health in all its aspects to medical students and nurses. The Board remains convinced that such a Hospital can ensure that the best facilities for achieving complete health are given to infants and children in their early years and that no more valuable contribution to the future well-being of the nation can be made.

The Board takes this last opportunity to thank all members of the staff for their loyal service and devotion to the interests of the Hospital, including the Medical, Nursing, Administrative, Medical Auxiliary, Domestic and Works Department staff.

The gratitude of the Board is extended to all friends who have given in kind or in service during the year, and though many must remain unrecorded, the following is as complete a list as is possible:—

This is an epoch-making report, in which a number of changes are recorded or forecast. One feature of the Hospital happily still remains constant, i.e., its reputation and the affection shown by the friends of the young patients. Its steady increase in the number of patients and the variety of the work done is the evidence of this. The general level of the work was well maintained.

Despite the special tendency to infection in babies' hospitals, the low incidence of spread of the specific fevers of infancy is noteworthy. Only five cases were contracted in the hospital, although infection was introduced in 25 cases.

The marked feature of the present year has been the appointment to the Medical Staff of the Professor of Child Health and his Assistant, Dr. Holzel. This development has been long hoped for. The resulting stimulation and the association in their work of the various hospital services should be of great value to the child life of the City and the training of the rising generations of medical students.

During the year the increasing responsibility of the work and ward technique has necessitated the appointment of a Senior Resident in addition to the previous staff of two House Physicians.

We regret the loss of Dr. Langley, who has given us such good service as Pathologist. We also regret the loss of Dr. Battersby and Dr. Norah Smith, who have both given valuable help in Out-Patients. We welcome to the staff Dr. Mackay as Honorary Assistant Physician and Dr. M. Eirlys Jefferson as Registrar, Dr. Wainwright in succession to Dr. Langley and Dr. Judith Savatard as Honorary Dermatologist. Dr. Chisholm has now resigned from the acting staff, but retains the title of Honorary Consulting Physician, with the right to the use of five cots. We are glad still to retain Dr. Norah Walker attached to our staff as Honorary Consulting Radiologist.

At last the Premature Block appears ready for use, and the conversion of the Air Raid Shelter is to provide a very necessary addition for the short stay of the tonsil and adenoid operation cases. This tonsil list has been lengthened by the delay imposed by the Ministry of Health during the infantile paralysis epidemic last summer, and it is proposed to revise it to see if it can be shortened.

The new X-Ray apparatus is welcomed, though it has caused some congestion in the Sunlight Department. It will be a great help to the Medical Staff and arrangements are being made to see that the Heliotherapy is not neglected.

The Out-Patient Department has been increasingly congested all the year, and it is feared that even with the extensive reorganisations which are being made in the old House, if the present demands increase, we shall continue to work under great difficulties. We must hope that the new Regional Board will find some way of supplying more buildings.

The Infant Welfare Department Session, started in connection with the University Teaching Department, has provided good service and is already out-growing the possibility of one session. It is felt that a new session must soon be opened. It is proving a success, both to the children of the neighbourhood and to the final year students.

The ability of the Breast Milk Scheme to supply our own and, where possible, other hospitals, has grown during the year. In association with the Royal

Manchester Children's Hospital more than 1,300 pints of milk have been prepared, stored and used during the twelve months to April, 1948.

In conclusion, we again wish to thank the Butterfly Guild for all the help in many ways which they give us. We mourn the loss of Mrs. Pitty, who, as member of the Board, was so wise as well as devoted.

We would wish to express our appreciation of the Matron and her staff, and also of the Secretarial Staff, especially Miss Rimmington for her work in re-organising the Records. We also wish, at this moment of change, particularly to thank Mrs. J. Goodier Haworth for her long and devoted service, both as a member of the Board, as Honorary Secretary for many years, and now as Vice-Chairman.

To our Chairman also we are deeply indebted for all his help and appreciation of our needs.

We are now anticipating the change over of our work from the Board which has guided the Hospital's development since 1914, when the small twelve-bedded Hospital began, to the well-equipped building of over 100 beds, which now takes its part in the Regional Service. In all humility we say, may its future life be as vigorous and its service to the community as valued in the future as in the past.

The Members of the Medical Committee feel they cannot let Dr. Chisholm's retirement from the position of Senior Physician pass without expressing their regret and recording their affection for her and gratitude to her for all that she has done to make the Hospital what it is to-day. She was the prime mover at its inception and has watched over and moulded it in infancy, teething troubles, childhood and adolescence, until it has emerged as a well-established adult—in the same way that she has watched her young patients, and indeed her younger colleagues, grow up and mature.

It was the first provincial "baby" Hospital in the Country, and it has been a pioneer in many directions ever since, largely as a result of Dr. Chisholm's progressiveness, initiative and foresight, so that milk kitchens, open-air wards, freedom of movement for the child's limbs, to mention only a few points, are now the recognised practice in infant work. The present flourishing Breast Milk Pool is the direct outcome of her original scheme for providing human milk for the ill babies in the Hospital in the early 1920's.

To her we owe our valuable link with the Manchester Royal Infirmary Pathological Department and the close association with the University and Medical School which has been an extra stimulus to our work.

Besides these large conceptions, no detail was too trivial to be considered and weighed in the balance—and this meant achieving greater co-operation and understanding between doctors, nurses, secretariat and lay Board, more real team work than is usual in most hospitals.

She has not been daunted by difficulties, but rather uses them as stepping stones to greater things.

With the Nationalisation of the Hospitals and its associated control from above it is to be hoped that it will still be possible to utilise initiative such as Dr. Chisholm's. The Medical Committee still have the benefit of the inspiration of her mind and the broad humanity of her outlook.
