



THE ONE HUNDRED AND NINETEENTH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

DENBIGHSHIRE INFIRMARY,

For the Year ended 31st December, 1926.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

I have great pleasure in submitting to the Governors and Subscribers the 119th Annual Report of the Committee of Management.

The Committee is able to report that, during the year, the amount of work done has been well maintained in comparison with that of the year 1925 and is well in excess of that in previous years.

The number of In-patients treated during the year, was 357, or only 5 less than the number in 1925, viz., 362, which constituted a record, the numbers in the 2 previous years being 291 and 186 respectively.

The number of Private Patients treated was 56, as compared with 52 in 1925 and 27 in 1924.

A very large increase has taken place in the number of patients who occupied Free Beds, the number being 70 as compared with 42 in 1925 and 34 in 1924.

The number of Operations continues to increase, having risen eac of the past four years from 74 in 1922 to 218 during the year 1926.

Out-patients and Casualty Cases have increased from 73 in 1925 to 100 during the past year but the total number of attendances has decreased from 619 in 1925 to 601 in the past year, making the average number of attendances per Out-patient 6.01 as compared with 8.47 in 1925, and 6.83 in 1924.

There has been a slight decrease in the Ordinary Income, the total Ordinary Income for the past year being £2974 os. 5d. as compared with £3113 7s. 1d. in 1925 which may be largely attributed to the decrease in the amounts received from Patients, owing to the large increase in the use of the Free Beds.

The Ordinary Expenditure shows an increase of approximately £110, the amount for the past year being £2952 16 $8\frac{1}{2}$ as compared with £2842 os. $10\frac{1}{2}$ d. for the previous year. This increase, as the accounts will show, appears under nearly every heading to a slight extent, with the exception of Surgery and Dispensary expenses which show a decrease.

During the year the Committee made an effort to secure for the Infirmary the two blocks of Cottages in Park Street, viz., Nos. 27 and 29 and Nos. 33 and 35, which would have put the Infirmary in possession of the whole of the land bounded by the Railway, Park Street, Ruthin Road and the Park. Negotiations in respect of No. 27 and 29 were not successful, but the two Cottages No. 33 and 35 adjoining the East side of the Nurses' Home were purchased for 7,100. It may be noted here that although this property was purchased out of Ordinary Income, the accounts still show a balance in hand at the end of the year amounting to $\pounds 233$ 5s. $8\frac{1}{2}$), which under the circumstances may be considered satisfactory when compared with the balance of $\pounds 316$ 19s. 3d. at the end of the previous year.

During the year the Committee has given a very considerable amount of time and thought to the question of the improvement and modernising of the Infirmary buildings, more especially with a view to the provision of Maternity Wards, the need of which is admittedly urgent, and the provision of additional Private Wards. Many schemes have been considered and eventually one has been provisionally adepted, for the re-modelling of the Buildings, the provision of a New Laundry, a Porter's Lodge and a new entrance from Ruthin Road.

The Committee has decided to convene a Public Meeting to inaugurate an appeal for funds, and as full details of the S heme will then be propounded, it is unnecessary in this report to go further into details.

The Committee regrets to record the death of the following Governors and Subscribers :- Mis. Frank Wynne, Mrs. Platt, Mr. James Hughes, Mr. W. Mellard.

The Infirmary has also suffered a great loss during the year by the death of Dr. David Lloyd who ha! served on the Hon. Medical Staff for 21 years. He resigned that position only a few weeks prior to his death, and had been appointed an Honorary Consulting Surgeon.



ABSTRACT OF THE RULES

Persons presenting Donations that are the proceeds of Church or Chapel Collections, or of Concerts, or the like, are entitled to recommend Patients during the year next following, according to the amount of the donation.

Donors of *Ten Guineas*, and Subscribers of *One Guinea*, are entitled to have one In-Patient and two Out-patients on the books at a time, and so in proportion for each additional guinea or donation. Subscribers of *Half-a-Guinea* are entitled to have one Out-patient on the books at a time.

In-Patients.

1.--No Patient suffering from an infectious disease, nor one whose case is unlikely to be benefitted, can be received.

2.—Every Patient is required to have a sufficient supply of clothing, and change of linen.

3.—No patient is admitted, except under emergency, without an undertaking (if required) from a responsible person to meet the weekly charge, and any other expense that may arise on his or her account.

Donations of Old Linen and Calico are always most acceptable.
