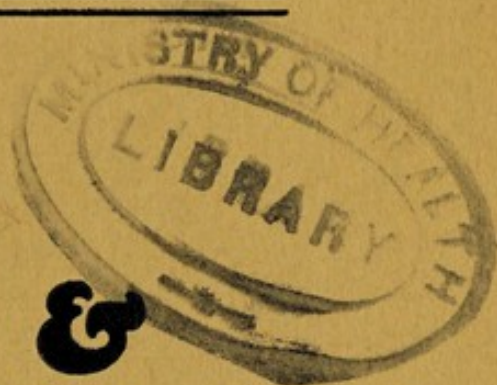

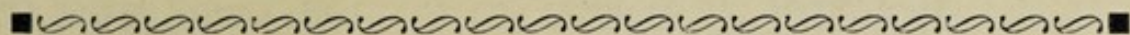

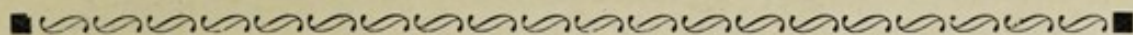

THE ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTIETH ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE

DENBIGHSHIRE INFIRMARY,

For the Year ended 31st December, 1927.

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,

I have great pleasure in submitting to the Governors and Subscribers the 120th Annual Report of the Committee of Management.

So far as In-patients are concerned, a fresh record has been set up, the total number of patients treated during the year having been 397 as compared with the previous records of 362 in 1925, and 357 in 1926.

The number of Private Patients treated in Private Wards, was 57, which compares satisfactorily with the number in 1926, *viz.*, 56 and 52 in 1925.

There was a slight decrease in the number of Free Bed Patients, *viz.*, 67 as compared with 70 in 1926, but is a great increase on the numbers in all previous years; the number in 1925 being 42.

The year has shown a slight decrease in Out-patients and Casualty cases, the number for the past year being 93 as compared with 100 in 1926, and the number of attendances is largely decreased, *viz.*, from 601 in 1926 and 619 in 1925, to 161 in the past year, reducing the average number of attendances per Out-patient from 6.01 in 1926 and 8.47 in 1925, to 1.73 in the past year.

The number of operations during the year, *viz.*, 206, is a slight decrease in comparison with 218 in 1926.

Turning to the financial side of the working of the Institution, there has been a decrease in the ordinary income from £2974 0s. 5d. in 1926 to £2,852 19s. 11½d. in the past year. Taking into consideration the amount which has been contributed to the Infirmary for another purpose during the past year, the Committee does not consider this comparatively small decrease as unsatisfactory.

The ordinary expenditure has risen from £2,952 16s. 8½d. in 1926 to £3,178 0s. 2d. in the past year, an increase of £225 3s. 5½d. which is very largely due to the increased number of patients.

As a result of the Public Meeting held in February last, an appeal was launched for funds for the re-modelling of the Infirmary buildings and the erection of a Porter's Lodge. As a result of the appeal, the sum of £4,281 19s. 0d. has been either promised or given. In this sum is included £750 which Mr. Keith Turnour has generously given for the provision of a new X-ray apparatus in memory of Mrs. Turnour. Mr. Crosland Graham, the president for the past year, has also endowed a Free Bed in the Maternity Ward in memory of Mrs. Crosland Graham, and the bed will be known as the " Marah Graham " Free Bed.

A special Building Committee was appointed, which has gone exhaustively into the scheme of reconstruction and a special report will be submitted to you at the Annual Meeting.

The Committee regrets to record the death of the following Governors and Subscribers: Mrs. Turnour, Mrs. Pickup Dutton, Mrs. Crosland Graham, Mrs. Jones-Mortimer, Mr. W. D. W. Griffith, Mr. W. James, Mr. W. H. Hasler, Mrs. Davey and the Hon. Mrs. C. H. B. Williams.
