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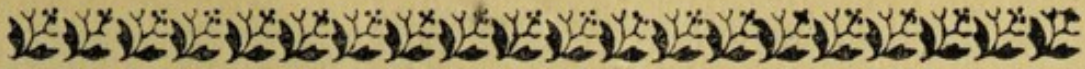
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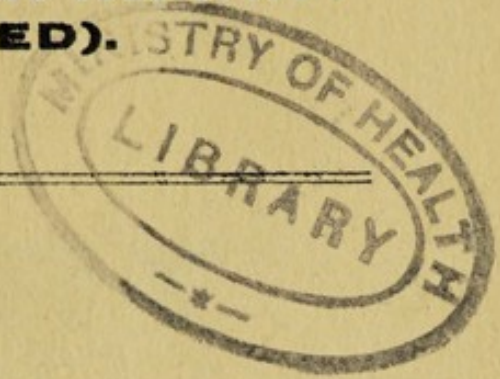

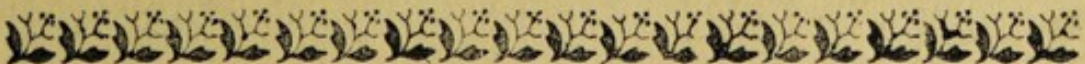

ANNUAL REPORT**

of the
COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT,

For the Year ended 31st December, 1928.

Ladies and Gentlemen,

I have great pleasure in submitting to the Governors and Subscribers the 121st Annual Report of the Committee of Management.

The Committee is pleased to be able to report that in spite of adverse circumstances the amount of work carried on by the Institution during the year was even greater than that in any previous year since its Foundation. The actual Number of In-patients treated was 409 as compared with 397 in 1927 (the highest number previously recorded) and 357 in 1926. The Number of Private Patients was 57 the same number as in 1927 the number in 1926 being 56.

There was again a decrease in the number of Free Bed Patients, viz., 49 as compared with 67 in 1927, and 70 in 1926.

The number of Outpatients was 125 which is an increase on the numbers in 1927 and 1926, viz., 93 and 100 respectively, the number of attendances of outpatients for dressings, etc., is also increased from 161 in 1927 to 259 during the past year. The average number of attendances per outpatient being 2.07 as compared with 1.73 in 1927 and 6.01 in 1926.

The number of operations performed during the year was 250, an increase on the number in 1927 which was 206.

With regard to the Finances of the Institution the ordinary income shows a decrease from £2,852 19s. 11½d. in 1927 to £2,746 0s. 9d. during the past year and there has been a slight decrease in the ordinary expenditure, viz., from £3,178 0s. 2d. in 1927 to £3,117 4s. 8½d. in the past year.

The work of remodelling the buildings and the erection of New Laundry, Sanitary Block, Matron's Bath Room and

Porter's Lodge was commenced in February last and all the internal work was completed by the end of the year, and there now only remains certain external work to be completed. With regard to the Porter's Lodge, in view of the shortage of accommodation for the Nursing Staff, the Committee has decided to utilise this for the present as a Nurses' Home.

The total amount subscribed to the Remodelling Fund up to December 31st, 1928, was £4,827 16s. 3d., the total amount promised and subscribed up to date (February 28th, 1929), and including Bank Interest, sale of old materials, etc., is £5,034 15s. 3d., and the total expenditure up to December 31st, 1928, was £8,021 0s. 11d., and the total expenditure up to date (February 28th, 1929), is £8,164 19s. 10d. In addition to this there remains approximately £1,200 still to be paid which will bring the total cost to approximately £9,365, leaving a balance of approximately £4,330 additional money required to be raised.

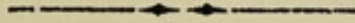

ABSTRACT OF THE RULES.

In-Patients.

1.—No Patient suffering from an infectious disease, nor one whose case is unlikely to be benefitted, can be received.

2.—Every Patient is required to have a sufficient supply of clothing, and change of linen.

3.—No patient is admitted, except under emergency, without an undertaking (if required) from a responsible person to meet the weekly charge, and any other expense that may arise on his or her account.

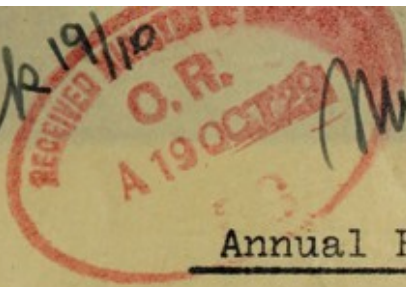
