Annual Report

THE Board of Management herewith present their Report and the Accounts of the Hospital for the year 1941.

Since the close of the year, the Hospital has suffered a grievous loss in the death of Sir Jeremiah Colman, who for nearly 20 years had been its President, and during that time was not only a most generous friend and supporter, but always took a keen personal interest in its affairs. His loss will be deeply felt, and the Board offer their sympathy to Lady Colman and her son.

Much to the satisfaction of the Board, Mr. Gordon C. Touche, M.P. for the Reigate Division, has accepted appointment as a Vice-President, which the Governors will be asked to confirm.

During the year the Board have accepted with great regret the resignation, due to ill-health, of Mr. A. J. Stratton, who for many years had given the Hospital valuable and unstinted service.

The Board also regret the resignations, due to their removal from the district, of Miss L. M. Warman, who rendered valuable service as Chairman of the Ladies' Committee, and, since the close of the year, of Mr. R. Edwin McAlpine.

Vacancies on the Board have been filled by the appointment of Mr. E. E. Daglish, Mr. W. J. MacAndrew, Mr. J. C. Woodall and Mrs. D. Pym, which the Governors will be asked to confirm.

During the year under review the services of the Hospital to residents and evacuees in the district have been fully and efficiently maintained. The numbers of the In and Out-Patients treated, with further particulars, will be found in the accompanying Medical Report.

Subscriptions totalled £2,393 2s. 3d., as against £2,346 12s. 6d. in 1940—a very satisfactory result, but in view of the probable falling-off in these difficult times of income from that source, Subscribers are reminded that by entering into covenants for the continuance of their subscriptions during

their life-time or for the duration of the war, whichever may be the shorter, they can double the value of their subscriptions to the Hospital, through recovery of income tax upon them, **without any extra cost to themselves.** A form of covenant will be gladly sent in response to the enclosed application, and subscribers are again earnestly invited to adopt this method of increasing their support.

Contributions through the Contributory Scheme (Working Men's Fund) amounted to £4,172 4s. 10d. as against £4,131 12s. 6d. in 1940, a result which in these times is very satisfactory. The Scheme plays a valuable part both in the relief of its contributors in the case of accident or illness and in the support of the Hospital; and the Board desire once again to express their thanks for the great services voluntarily rendered by the Chairmen, Officers, and Collectors of the different branches.

The Board gratefully acknowledge the following special gifts:—

The use of a mobile X-ray unit from the British Red Cross Society, being one of several similar units generously contributed by people in the United States of America.

The grant of £50 by the Nuffield Trust towards the cost of electric wiring for the use of that unit in the Wards.

A gift of £15 by the British War Relief Society towards the cost of providing teas and beverages for air raid casualties and for stretcher bearers and other voluntary helpers in the case of air raids.

The gift of £5 each from the Rotary Clubs of Redhill and Reigate, which, added to a balance in hand of the Wireless Fund, enabled a new receiving set to be installed at the Hospital and the headphones in the wards to be completely overhauled.

Alexandra Rose Day, held in the Borough and neighbouring villages on June 24th, resulted in a collection of £563 12s. 4d. for the Hospital, as against £503 11s. 1d. in 1940, and the Board's thanks are due to all who assisted in the collection with this satisfactory result.

In order to economise in the use of paper, certain tables and statistics previously included have been omitted from this Report, and for the same reason the Board ask the many friends, including the Ladies' Association and Ministers of

Religion, who have helped with gifts and services, to excuse the absence of a more detailed acknowledgment of them, and to accept this general expression of their grateful thanks.

The Board are pleased to report the acceptance by Dr. Donald Paterson as Consultant to the Children's Department and of Dr. John Beattie as Consulting Gynæcologist.

During the year eleven candidates from the Hospital were successful in the Preliminary State Examination of the General Nursing Council, and three nurses completed their training at the Hospital and passed the Final State Examination.

The members of the Board retiring by rotation are:—Wing Commander G. G. Braithwaite (Chairman), Mr. B. W. Bloomer, Mr. J. W. Neale, Rev. A. Shirley, Rev. R. Talbot, Lieut.-Col. E. G. Waley, Dr. W. Weir, Mrs. G. G. Braithwaite, and Mrs. J. C. Woodall, who offer themselves for re-election.

The Auditors, Messrs. Alfred Simmons and Co., offer themselves for re-appointment.
