

Annual Report.

THE Board of Management herewith present their Report and the Accounts of the Hospital for the year 1942.

During the year the services of the Hospital to residents and evacuees in the district which it serves were fully and efficiently maintained in spite of increasing difficulties caused by the war.

Income and Expenditure Account shows an adverse balance of £1,764 5s. 0d., as against £939 9s. 6d. for 1941, but this increase is due to the fact that, with a view to simplification and economy of labour, it has been decided to keep the accounts on a cash basis and to include in them only such receipts and payments as were actually received or paid during the year.

On this basis subscriptions amounted to £2,130, as against £2,393 received for the year 1941.

Receipts by the Hospital of weekly contributions under the Contributory Scheme amounted to £4,500 out of a total of £5,101 9s. 7d. actually collected in the year, as compared with £3,519 for 1941, but this increase, due to the raising of the weekly contributions from 1d. to 3d., by no means represents the full amount of the increase which may be expected, for, owing to the change in the method of book-keeping above mentioned, the £4,500 actually received by the Hospital represents only three-quarters of the year's income from that source, as one-quarter of the contributions is not received until after the close of the year. In a full year, beginning from 1st January, 1943, it may be fairly estimated that the total receipts from the Scheme will amount to upwards of £7,000.

Alexandra Rose Day produced £579 4s. 11d., a record total.

The Board acknowledge with deep appreciation the following gifts:—

To the end of the year £656 10s. in donations for the new X-Ray Examination Couch, together with £200 received from Mr. W. H. McAlpine, which, being in excess of the amount required, has, with his consent, been reserved for other purposes.

Twenty-five blankets from the Ladies' Association.

£30 10s. in Savings Certificates from Mr. George T. Howell for use in connection with the Children's Ward and placed to a Special Fund. Mr. Howell has also presented a microscope and appliances to the Pathological Laboratory.

£8 5s. from prize winners in the window display in connection with the Borough Fuel Economy campaign, also placed to the Children's Ward Fund.

Linen from the East Surrey Hospital Linen League, valued at £45.

On the 16th July, 1942, one of the Orthopædic Wards was dedicated by the Bishop of Southwark and the Rev. A. Shirley, Hon. Chaplain to the Hospital, to the memory of the late President, Sir Jeremiah Colman, Bart., and a commemorative tablet has been fixed in the Ward.

A pleasant ceremony was held at the Nurses' Home on the 23rd October, 1942, on the occasion of the first prize-giving to members of the Nursing Staff who passed examinations with distinction, and it is hoped that this may become an annual event.

At the State Examination held by the General Nursing Council for England and Wales, eight Nurses completed their training and passed the Final Examination, and eleven Nurses passed the Preliminary Examination.

Affiliation with the Dorking and District Hospital for the training of their Nursing Staffs has been sanctioned and is a welcome event.

It is too early yet to express any opinion upon the effect of the proposals of the Beveridge Report upon the Status of Voluntary Hospitals, but they are viewed with some anxiety.

The Board once again desire to express their grateful thanks to all the friends and supporters of the Hospital, including members of the Ladies' Association and ministers of religion, who have helped them with gifts and services, and to excuse a more detailed acknowledgment of them in the interests of economy of space and paper.

We have to record with great regret the deaths of Mr. A. J. Stratton, who, until his retirement owing to ill-health in 1941, had given devoted service as a member of the Board of Management since 1927; and also, since the close of the year, of Dr. T. Anstey-Chave, who had acted as Hon. Radiologist since 1914.

At the last Annual Meeting of the Governors, Mr. W. W. Paine was elected President in succession to the late Sir Jeremiah Colman.

The Board have been happy to welcome as colleagues the Mayor, Alderman A. Windsor-Spice, J.P., and the late Mayor, Lieut.-Col. F. J. Spranger, O.B.E., J.P., whose appointments as members of the Board will be submitted for confirmation at the Annual Meeting.

Members of the Board retiring by rotation are Messrs. W. W. Paine, J. A. Paton, Norman M. Walker, G. L. Norman, The Mayor of Reigate, F. D. Sladen, F. S. Shorter, and Dr. D. Mallam, all of whom offer themselves for re-election.

The Auditors, Messrs. Alfred Simmons & Co., offer themselves for re-appointment.

Finally, the Board desire to express their grateful thanks to the members of the Hon. Medical and Surgical Staffs; to Matron and to all members of the Nursing Staff; to the Secretary and Secretarial Staff; and to all their employees for their unstinted services in these anxious times; and they say with confidence that the Hospital has never been served better or with greater harmony and goodwill by all of them than it is to-day.

The President is issuing an appeal to all our subscribers to take advantage of the opportunity which Parliament has given them greatly to increase the value of their subscriptions, without any extra cost to themselves, by entering into formal covenants for their continuance.
