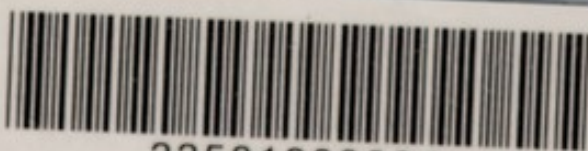

Foundation of the Hospital.

This Hospital was founded as a Memorial of Queen Victoria's Golden Jubilee of 1887, and the present building was erected as a Memorial of Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee of 1897. At the opening of the Hospital on July 23rd, 1898, the following gracious message from Queen Victoria was read :—

" Her Majesty has learned with much satisfaction of the liberal and charitable manner in which the people of Emsworth, generously assisted by others, have commemorated her Diamond Jubilee by building a Village Hospital.

" While thus showing their loyalty and devotion to the Queen, they have nobly contributed to a work of mercy with which Her Majesty heartily sympathises."

The ceremony of opening the Hospital was performed by the late Sir Samuel Wilks, Bart., President of the Royal College of Physicians. In the report of his address upon the occasion, appears the following passage :

" As to the desirability of Cottage Hospitals, the need was so obvious in places like Emsworth, that there is (he said) no need to dwell upon it at length. Next, as to the building he spoke with the greatest appreciation. As to situation, sanitation, convenience, ventilation, cubic space, and arrangements of wards, light, aspect, and all such matters, he pronounced the Hospital all that could be desired. He spoke of the arrangements made by the Managers of the Prince of Wales's Hospital Fund for experts to visit the London Hospitals, not for the purpose of giving praise, but of pointing out defects ; and assured the audience that having looked out for the faults of the Cottage Hospital he could find none : that it appeared to him to be perfect."

Report of the Committee.

As in previous years the work of the Hospital still increases, 132 patients were admitted as compared with 126 last year. The number of patients treated but not detained in Hospital is 137, 11 more than last year. With regard to the 132 admissions, 107 were operation cases; 6 patients died, 4 of whom were fatal accidents; 15 cases of appendicitis, most of them acute, were successfully operated on; 7 cases of rupture were cured by operations.

A change in the Nursing Staff, occasioned by the resignation of Miss Gascoin, to the great regret of all concerned, has necessitated the appointment of an additional assistant-nurse. Miss Florence Young was appointed Matron out of a large number of applicants, and has already fully justified her selection. Out of the 137 patients not requiring to be detained no less than 109 were operation cases, of which 45 were for enlarged tonsils and adenoids.

The work of the Honorary Medical Staff has been enormous, and the thanks of all are tendered to them for so generously giving so much time, skill, care and attention to the patients. Attention is called to the fact that for the first time in the history of the Hospital, the work has been continuous throughout the year, arrangements having been made for the annual cleaning of former years so that the Hospital has not been closed; that during the extra month no less than 3 severe accidents, all unfortunately fatal, were admitted; this called for additional expenditure and work. In spite of this, the Committee has the happiness to report an increase in all the sources of income with the exception of the Collecting Boxes.

RULES.

1. This Hospital is primarily intended for the reception of persons from Emsworth and the neighbouring parishes, who may be suffering from accident or disease which cannot be adequately treated at their own homes.

2. Applications for admission to the Hospital are to be made to the Committee through the Matron, except in cases of accident or emergency, which will be received at once if there be a vacancy.

3. No patient to be admitted to the Hospital without a "Letter of Recommendation," except in case of urgent necessity, or under Rules 10 and 11.

4. Patients will be admitted according to the urgency of the case. None will be received who are insane, or who are subject to fits, or who have been in association with infection, or who are suffering from any incurable malady, where no decided benefit from treatment can be expected.

5. Patients admitted to the Hospital may be attended by their own Medical Practitioner if they so desire it.

6. No patient shall remain in the Hospital more than eight weeks, except under special circumstances.

7. No liquors or provisions are to be brought to the patients without the permission of the Committee.

8. Every requisite, except personal clothing, will be provided in the Hospital.

9. Patients treated in the Hospital will be charged a fee according to their ability to pay. Such fee to be fixed by the Committee.

The payments shall be in advance, and no patient will be admitted without a sufficient guarantee for the weekly payments, and for the payment of the expenses of removal or burial in case of death.

10. The Committee may admit for treatment without "Letters of Recommendation" persons who are ready to pay per week such sum as the Committee may determine. Medical practitioners attending such cases will be permitted to charge their ordinary fees. Such persons, however, cannot be admitted to the exclusion of the poor, for whom the hospital has been founded.

11. The Committee will be ready to receive applications for the admission of convalescents and others outside the district at a charge of not less than 15/- per week, so long as persons of the neighbourhood are not thereby excluded.

12. Poor Law patients can only be admitted on the understanding that all cases entitling the Medical Officer to extra payment shall be paid for by the Board of Guardians as before.

13. Annual subscribers will be entitled to "Letters of Recommendation," one for each £1 subscription, or one annually for five years for each £5 donation. These "Letters" will be issued with receipts.

14. The annual subscription will be due on the 1st of October, and shall be collected as soon after as possible.

15. Incumbents of Churches, or other ministers of religion, giving offertories or collections, and persons organising entertainments on behalf of the Hospital, or collecting funds, will be entitled to receive one "Letter of Recommendation" for every £1 sent to the Hospital.

16. The management of the Hospital shall be vested in a Committee consisting of not less than 11 and no more than 16 members to be elected from donors of £10 and upwards, and subscribers of 10/- and upwards, besides the *ex-officio* members, and those other Honorary Officers of the Hospital who have been elected members of the Committee. Vacancies on the Committee may be filled each year at the Annual Meeting of Subscribers, which shall be held on such date in October or November as the Committee may fix in each year, and by the Subscribers of 2/6 and upwards who are present.

The Committee may elect at any time during the year other members on the Committee so long as the Committee does not consist of more than 16 members besides the *ex-officio* members and those other Honorary Officers of the Hospital who have been elected members of the Committee. Members of the Committee are elected for a period of two years beyond the next Annual Meeting of the Subscribers following the date of their election.

The Committee may elect additional members without the above qualifications, and in this case for one year only.

17. The Committee shall meet at least once in every month.

18. In the event of a vacancy occurring in the office of President, the Committee shall proceed to fill the same forthwith, in accordance with Rule 19.

The Honorary Officers of the Hospital shall be elected by the Committee at a December meeting. The term of office shall be three years, at the end of which term they are eligible for re-election. The President, the senior Honorary Medical Officer, and the Honorary Secretary shall be *ex-officio* members of the Committee.

Provided that notice has been given to the Committee of the proposal at least one calendar month before the day of election, the Committee may elect any Honorary Officer as a member of the Committee, who, after election, shall remain a member of the Committee as long as he holds his honorary office in connection with the Hospital

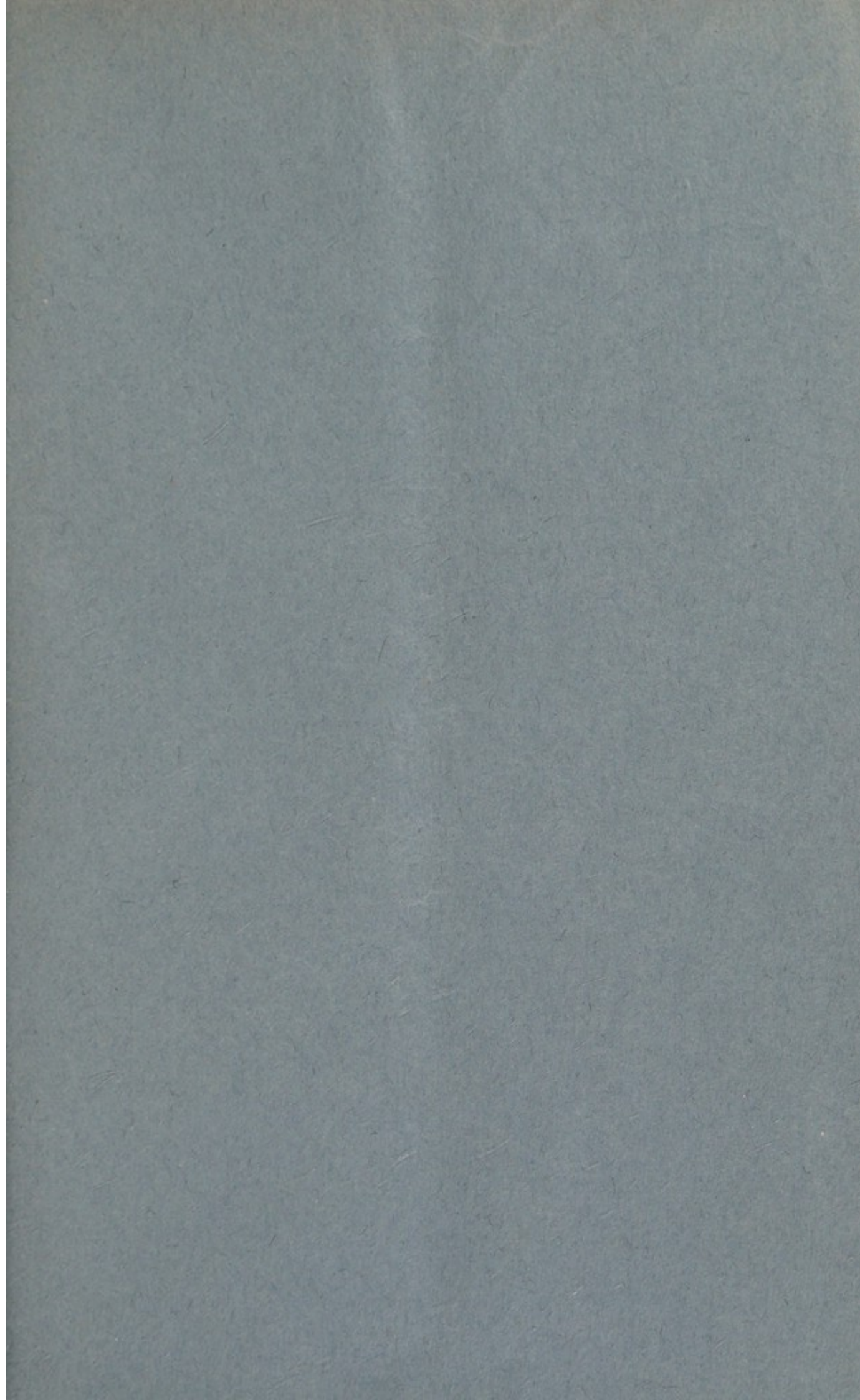
19. The Committee shall have power to alter or amend any of these Rules, or to make additions thereto from time to time as they may think fit ; provided that no alteration of these Rules shall be made without the assent of a majority of at least two thirds of the members present, nor at a meeting at which there are less than twelve members present, nor without notice of the intention to propose such alteration having been given to the Committee two previously.

20. In the event of a patient dying in the Hospital, or of a dead body being brought to the Hospital, the cost of burial and other expences shall fall upon the parish to which the deceased legally belongs.
