# 30th ANNUAL REPORT

### For Year ending December 31st, 1927.

The Committee have pleasure in presenting to you their Annual Report and Financial Statement for the year ending 31st December, 1927.

#### Medical Report for the Year.

There has been 2,130 cases treated during the year; which, with 9 on the books at the end of 1926, make the total of 2,139 cases having been treated. The total number of attendances and dressings have been 9,360. The foregoing figures show that the Institution has a good reputation and record, of which the Committee are proud; and all the patients speak highly of the treatment, care and attention bestowed upon them while inmates and outpatients of the Institution, several having sent letters of thanks and appreciation and also enclosing donations towards our funds.

There has also been 10 Motor Accident cases treated during the year.

There has also been several Dental cases treated during the year, all of which have proved of great advantage to the patient; and Extractions may be carried out by arrangements with the surgeons.

#### Income and Expenditure.

The ordinary income for the year has amounted to  $\pounds 1,973$  10s. 10d., with the balance from 1926 of  $\pounds 343$  14s. 10d., make a total of  $\pounds 2,317$  5s. 8d., which will compare very favourably with previous years, and we would

take this opportunity of expressing our grateful thanks to all who have assisted us. And may we point out to those who have not already commenced to subscribe how possible it is that they may need the benefits of the Institution, and how necessary, therefore, that they should support it financially while they are in a position to do so.

The expenditure for the year has amounted to  $\pounds 1,872$ 12s. 5d., which, when compared with  $\pounds 2,022$  13s. 9d. for 1926, shows a decrease of  $\pounds 150$  1s. 4d. Your Committee think that this is very satisfactory considering that we have had accounts for two years' dressings, viz., 1924 and 1925.

We have had also alterations and additions to the back premises which will not occur again, but which makes the items under this heading to appear very large, all of which are accounted for in the Financial Statement which will be found on page 11.

The House and Finance Committee have carefully controlled all items of income and expenditure and at the same time are keeping up the requirements of the Institution with every consideration for the comfort of the patients and staff.

We desire to record our sincere thanks to Messrs. A. Reyrolle & Co. for their valuable services in looking after the electric light, also for supply of the necessaries in connection therewith at cost price.

The Fifth Annual Whist Drive and Dance was held in St. Andrew's Institute, Hebburn, on Friday, November 25th, 1927, which proved very successful, and from which we benefitted by the sum of £41 15s. 2d. The music was provided by Messrs. Nutt Bros.' Orchestra; and we desire to thank Messrs. A. Davison and H. Brice for again working the limelights, and Messrs. Nutt Bros. for return of £1 towards the Whist Drive and Dance. This is shown in the total of £41 15s. 2d.

We would also place on record our high appreciation for the splendid services rendered in connection with the supper by Mrs. Purves, Mrs. Anderson and the various members of the Hebburn Quay Co-operative Women's Guild. To the donors of prizes for whist drive and other gifts in kind which were collected by Mrs. Purves, Mrs. Anderson, and members of the Guild; also to the Committee of St. Andrew's Institute for again granting the use of their Institute free of charges, which in itself is a good donation towards our funds. Also to the members of the Hebburn and District Radio Society for their kindness in looking after and keeping in repair the wireless set free of all charges.

Your Committee have made the following conversions of Stock during 1927 :--

£100 5% War Bonds, which were due 1st Oct., 1927, into £124 5s. 0d. 4% Consolidated Loan, 1957.

£500 5% War Bonds, which were due 1st April, 1928, into £710 3½% Conversion Loan, 1961.

Your Committee have had Vita Glass fitted in two sashes in the Male Ward, which has proved very beneficial to several patients.

With reference to the treatment of cases other than accidents, concerning those who are non-subscribers to our funds, your Committee have decided that the following shall be the scale of charges :—

The Football Committee again run the Football Cup Competition and the funds benefitted by £12 15s. 0d., an increase of £8 15s. 0d. on the previous year.

The sum of £22 10s. 0d. has been received from Mr. Geo. Fletcher, being the result of the Hebburn Day Schools' Annual Collection, this being a record. The Committee appreciate this very much, as it is made up of small amounts by children, and our thanks are due to Mr. Fletcher, head master, Hebburn Colliery School, for his great interest, and also those who assist him from time to time in this work.

It will be interesting to know that we have received from the School Children's Fund since its inception by Mr. Fletcher in 1909, the sum of £184 3s. 10d. We have received the sum of  $\pounds 5$  from the investment of  $\pounds 1005\%$  War Stock, presented by the members of the Hebburn Sewing Party, which has been primarily used for the upkeep of the bed dedicated to the memory of our local lads who paid the supreme sacrifice in the Great War.

In carrying out the conditions of the investment of the  $\pounds 140$  in North Eastern Railway 3 per cent. irredeemable stock by the friends of the late Alfred Fellows, the dividend derived therefrom has been used for the upkeep of the Alfred Fellows Cot which is placed in the Ellison Infirmary. We are helped by so many people that we are unable to print all their names, but we are none the less grateful to all.

We desire also to place on record our appreciation and thanks to the Wallsend & Hebburn Coal Company for supply of coal, Messrs. Palmers & Co., Hebburn, for firewood.

In acknowledging the generous contributions, the Committee desire to thank all who have contributed in any way, also the firms and companies for the facilities afforded for deducting the contributions from wages, and to all officials of the same for their valuable services.

We desire to again record our thanks to Mr. R. McConway, manager of the Hebburn Branch Bank of Liverpool & Martins, Limited, for his valuable services as Hon. Treasurer of our Institution and he will be pleased at any time to receive subscriptions at the Bank, Prince Consort Road, Hebburn.

In conclusion, the Committee expresses its grateful thanks to all who have shown their sympathy with the work of the Institution during the past year, whether by individual subscriptions or by the promotion of benefit entertainments; and we trust that the work which it has been their privilege to carry on, may continue to receive the liberal support of all who have the interests of the Institution at heart.

I bequeath to the Ellison Hall Accident Infirmary the sum of  $\pounds$ , and I direct that the foregoing bequest shall be paid free from all duties, and that the receipt of the Treasurer for the time being of the said Institution shall be a sufficient discharge to my Executors or Trustees for the sum stated.
