## Edenbridge & District War Memorial Cottage Hospital.

### Death of the President, Mr. H. S. Whitmore.

The Committee deeply regret to record the death of their President, Mr. H. S. Whitmore, whereby the Hospital lost the advice and assistance of one who, from the inception of a Scheme for a Cottage Hospital, was not only a most keen worker but invariably gave generously to support and further the best interests of the Hospital.

### REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 1928.

**Member-ship.** The number of Members under the Scheme for 1928 is 2369: 78 of these have been admitted to Hospital. Nineteen patients have been treated in the Private Ward, 7 of these being Members. Forty-seven Non-Members and 1 Hospital Staff in the General Wards. It is a matter of regret that there is a decrease of £22 16s. 3d. in Members' Subscriptions and that Donations and Non-Members' Subscriptions are also less by £70 3s. 7d. Non-Members' and Private Ward Patients' Fees show an increase of £48 18s. 8d.

Thirteen casualties were admitted during the year.

Four deaths occurred, 2 of these cases being moribund on admission.

Forty-three Radiographs were taken of patients besides screen examinations.

Two patients received massage treatment.

The cost per patient per week is £3 16s. 2d.

Only those closely associated with the work of the Hospital can fully appreciate what it means to have their advice and skill available always at any time, day or night.

The work of the Hon. Medical Staff has been ably supplemented by the Matron and her Staff and many letters bearing testimony to their kindness and attention have been received.

**Queen Alexandra Rose Day Collection.** Rose Day involves a considerable amount of preparatory work in addition to the labour on the actual day and it is gratifying to note that a small increase in funds was again obtained. After all expenses were paid £48 19s. 7d. was paid into the Hospital account and the Committee tender their sincere thanks to the Collectors in all districts for their willing participation in making the day a success.

**Pound Day.** This was again held in the Autumn, on Saturday, 20th October, but the weather was unkind, for it rained incessantly, which to some extent accounted for the receipt of fewer gifts in kind, but £12 5s. 0d. was contributed in cash to the "Matron's Fund" for providing extra "luxuries" for the patients, and a fair supply of groceries and other useful commodities were again received.

The Committee are most grateful to all who gave so generously.

**Vegetable Collection.** Miss Laurence continues to take the keenest interest in this most useful scheme whereby the Hospital is supplied throughout the year with fresh vegetables, and the Committee greatly appreciate her efforts on its behalf and the generosity of the donors.

**The Linen Guild.** The Guild this year has supplied all the Hospital's needs, but fresh efforts will be needed next year to endeavour to provide Linen for the new Hospital in the near future.

A detailed report of the year's work will be found later.

**Election of new President.** The Committee consider the Hospital and themselves most fortunate in having obtained the consent of Major the Hon. J. J. Astor to be their new President. He has always had the welfare of the Hospital much at heart and he is taking the keenest interest in the new building scheme.

**Contributions.** It is with great pleasure the Committee acknowledges the continued support of the Hospital Football and Sports Committees, which resulted in the sums of £28 4s. 4d. and £131 1s. 5d. being added to the Hospital funds, and they wish to convey their sincere appreciation of the efforts which have produced such gratifying results.

Many and varied gifts were presented to the Hospital during the year, which have been regularly acknowledged in the Public Press, and to all who have helped in any way the Committee offer their cordial thanks.

**Eliza Quickenden Memorial Fund.** A very welcome gift of £150 3½% Conversion Loan was presented to the Hospital by a son in memory of his mother and it is to be known as "The Eliza Quickenden Memorial Fund," the donor requesting that this should be treated as Capital and the annual income from it used for the general purposes of the Hospital.

**Convalescent Home Letters.** The demand for these is ever increasing, and in thanking all who have given so generously in the past, the Committee appeal for further gifts of free Convalescent Home Letters.

**Building Fund. A new Hospital.** After much consideration the Committee feel that it is very desirable in order to meet the constant demands made on the resources of the Hospital to provide a modern up-to-date build-

ing capable of providing an increased number of beds available for the neighbourhood and for the greater comfort of the patients and those attending them. Plans have been submitted for a hospital capable of containing 20 beds at an approximate cost of £17,000, but as the Committee realize that the upkeep of a larger hospital must entail increased expenditure they feel strongly that a certain amount should be allocated for its maintenance and are therefore appealing for £20,000.

A number of generous promises of sums amounting to about £3000 have already been made towards the Building Fund.

With the increased accommodation and Staff it is intended that one of the many advantages of the bigger hospital will be to do away with the present necessity for closing the Hospital during a month each year whilst the necessary painting, cleaning and repairs are carried out.

**Acknowledgments.**

The Committee in conclusion offer a sincere vote of thanks for the untiring services of so many who help the work of the Hospital and they take this opportunity of acknowledging the efforts of the Hon. Officers, Miss Winch, the Hon. Secretary, Mr. Rogers, the Hon. Treasurer, Mr. James, the Hon. Auditor and Miss Allwork for her labours in supervising and auditing the Collector's Accounts throughout the year.

**Conditions as to Admission of Patients.**

---

1. Persons who subscribe as below shall be entitled to treatment as under :

- A.** For weekly or daily wage earners—  
Twopence a week for each adult over 16.  
One penny a week for each child under 16.  
With a maximum of eightpence a week for each family.
- B.** For all other persons—  
Ten shillings and sixpence per annum for each adult over 16.  
Seven shillings and sixpence per annum for each child under 16.
- C.** For persons who subscribe—  
One Guinea per annum for each adult over 16.  
Ten shillings and sixpence per annum for each child under 16.

The word "Family" shall be held to mean a parent or parents and all children under 16.

2. For these subscriptions Subscribers will be entitled to full hospital treatment for themselves and members of their families subscribed for, when and so long as considered necessary by the Medical Staff, such treatment to include board, nursing, drugs and dressings for A and B class, but not drugs and dressings for Class C, for such period not exceeding two months in one year as the medical staff shall consider necessary.

Patients will be attended by such member of the visiting medical staff as they may select.

3. Patients under Classes A and B can have the use of the Private Ward when available on the payment of an extra weekly fee, the amount thereof shall be fixed by the Committee. In such case patients under Classes A and B will have to pay fees for medical attendance and Consultant's fees.

Patients under Class C can have use of the Private Ward when available without extra weekly charge, but will have to pay for medical attendance, drugs, dressings and Consultant's fees.

The Medical Staff shall attend gratuitously all patients in the General Wards, but in the case of patients treated in the Private Ward the Medical Staff may make their own arrangements as regards remuneration.

4. Arrangements have been made with certain London Consultants to act as Honorary Consultants, so that in grave cases the best medical and surgical skill is available, whose services will be free for patients in a General Ward, but not for patients in a "Private Ward."

5. A fee will be charged for use of the X-Ray Installation.

6. No subscriber under Class A who has not paid subscriptions for the 26 weeks prior to his application for admission, and no subscriber under Class B or C who shall not have commenced subscribing more than six months prior to his application for admission shall be entitled to the benefits under this scheme.

7. Non-subscribers will be admitted only if there are beds available and not required by subscribers, on a payment varying from 10/6 to £7 7s. 0d. a week, according to the position and means of the applicant as the Committee may determine, but the Committee have the power under the rules to reduce or remit such payments in any case they think fit.

8. Patients suffering from a disease which in the opinion of the Medical staff is incurable will not be admitted and infectious, mental and maternity cases are also not admissible.

9. This scheme shall hold good until the 1st January, 1922, and thereafter until (if necessary) modified by a General Meeting. These conditions as to admission shall apply to all subscribing after the 1st January, 1921. Those who have subscribed under the previous provisional Scheme shall continue under the provisions of that Scheme until 12 months from the date of their subscription.

#### **DOMESTIC SERVANTS.**

Any person employing a domestic servant or servants, by subscription under Clause A of the Scheme for such servant or the total number of such servants shall entitle such servant or servants to the benefits conferred on persons insuring under Clause A of the Scheme, but in the event of an employer desiring to subscribe for a less number of servants than the total number in his employment, then he shall give the names of such of his servants as he desires to benefit.
