The Committee has much pleasure in presenting the Accounts, Balance Sheet and Report for 1928.

The Hospital has been more fully occupied during 1928 than in any previous year. The number of patients treated was 335, 25 more than in 1927.

There were 54 Medical cases, 130 Surgical, 10 Dental. 114 X-Ray examinations were made.

Fifty-four cases of Accident were dealt with. The Surgical cases demanded 9 major operations and 121 minor.

Of these latter 38 were for removal of Adenoids and Tonsils.

The number of Accidents treated shows in common with nearly all Hospitals an increase from year to year. The cost of these cases becomes a most serious matter for all Voluntary Institutions.

Annual Subscriptions. The Committee much regrets having again to report a decrease in Annual Subscriptions. These have realised £332 1s., a falling off of £20 19s. 6d. An effort will be made during the present year to secure that this source of income shall be substantially increased. The Committee earnestly appeals to all who are not Annual Subscribers to consider the desirability of assisting in this way whether givers to the Annual House to House Collection or not. A sum of at least £500 per year is regarded as a satisfactory minimum. The Committee hopes this will be attained before the next Report is issued.

House to House Collection. Miss Silley and the ladies whose names appear at the heads of their respective sections of this Annual effort have collected £114 11s. 2d.

The Committee is grateful to them and to all who assisted with donations. The hope expressed in the last report that this collection would attain to its former sum was not realised. An effort will again be made this year to increase it.

Electric Light. During the year the Hospital has been lighted throughout by electricity through the generosity of Mr. F. J. Ward, who kindly defrayed the whole cost. The Committee is sensible of its deep obligation to Mr. Ward and gladly avails itself of this opportunity of thanking him. A notable feature of the installation is a Zeiss Pantophos lamp for use over the operating table during operations.

Patients' Payments. Patients' fees actually received during the year amounted to £478 8s. 0d.

Accounts. The Accounts show a deficit of £130 7s. 3½d., accounted for by increases in the Domestic, Establishment and miscellaneous sections, and decreases in Subscriptions and Patients' Fees, particularly the latter. They also show how largely the Hospital is dependent upon income from special donations, and how desirable it is that a larger regular income from subscriptions shall be assured.

Dainty Club. The Dainty Club, under the organisation of Mrs. A. E. Jones, has provided extra dainties for patients and staff throughout the year. Mrs. Jones will be glad to hear from any lady who desires to contribute to the amenities of the Hospital in this way.


Pound Week. The results of the Pound Week were very gratifying. No less than 550 lbs. of various groceries, etc., were received, and £3 7s. 6d. in cash.

Various Gifts. Special gifts received have been Lead, Aluminium and Tin foils from various sources. The Matron will welcome further supplies of these foils which are sold with profit to the Hospital.

Owing to unforeseen circumstances the Annual General Meeting of Donors and Subscribers is postponed until JUNE 13th, 1929.

It will be held in No. 5 Room, Victoria Buildings, Epping, at 8.30 p.m. on that date.

X-RAY INSTALLATION.

As the year passed, it became quite clear that our old installation, which had done good service for many years, was inadequate to meet modern requirements; so much so that certain cases could not be dealt with and had to be sent elsewhere.

The funds of the Hospital were insufficient to provide a solution, and the Committee accepted an offer made by the Hon. Secretary, Mr. E. H. Slater, to raise the necessary money by personal appeals, as a separate fund, without touching the Hospital's general funds. In this way, he succeeded in collecting £623 6s. 9d., a very gratifying and rather surprising feat; and a new X-Ray installation is now at work.

The Committee wishes to convey to all subscribers to this special fund their warmest thanks, and to express in the same connection their gratitude to Mr. Slater for this most valuable addition to his long record of service to the Hospital. To that end, the Committee has made this addition to the Report, through the Chairman.
