

### BYE-LAWS AND REGULATIONS.

1.—The Hospital is intended primarily for the benefit of persons resident in Devizes and the neighbouring recognised contributory Parishes who cannot afford to pay Medical fees and who are unable to obtain in their own homes the treatment necessary for their speedy recovery.

Except in case of accident or serious emergency requiring immediate treatment, such patients will be admitted to the Hospital only upon a Certificate signed by a Medical Practitioner that their case is a proper one for Hospital treatment, or upon an admission order given by the Officer appointed for that purpose by the Board of Guardians. Subject to the Committee being satisfied that they fulfil the conditions above mentioned no charge of any sort will be made to such patients.

- 2.—Subject to accommodation being available other patients from the above area may be admitted to the Hospital who will be required to pay for or towards the cost of their maintenance and treatment such sum as they can reasonably afford, the amount to be fixed by the Committee. In every instance in which the Hospital charge is fixed at a rate of under one guinea a week the patient will be entitled to free professional attendance on the part of the Medical Staff. In all other cases the Medical Staff will be entitled to charge to patients of this class such fees for professional attendance in the Hospital as they may consider reasonable having regard to the circumstances of the case.
- 3.—Subject to space being available Private Patients may be admitted, who in addition to paying the fees of their Medical Attendant, shall pay the following charges for their maintenance and treatment, namely:—
  - (a) If the patient reside within the Hospital area as above defined, a charge not exceeding four guineas a week if treated in the Public Wards, and not exceeding seven guineas a week if treated in a Private Ward.
  - (b) If the patient reside outside the Hospital area, a charge not exceeding five guineas a week if treated in the Public Wards, and not exceeding ten guineas a week if treated in a Private Ward.

In either case there will be charged in addition a fee of one guinea for the use of the theatre if an operation is necessary.

- A Private Patient from outside the Hospital area as above defined will be admitted only upon the express condition that, if the bed occupied by him is required for someone resident within the area, the Committee may require that he shall vacate the bed and be removed from the Hospital at the earliest possible date that his condition will admit.
- 4.—Out-patients may be admitted for treatment in the Out-patients' department or for X-ray examination upon such terms as the Committee shall from time to time fix having regard to the circumstances of such patients.
- 5.—The Patients shall obey the orders of the Matron, who acts under the instructions of the Medical Officers.
- 6.—Patients shall not leave the grounds of the Hospital without the permission of the Matron.
- 7.-No one is allowed to visit any Ward without the permission of the Matron.
- 8.—Patients may be visited by their friends on Sundays and Thursdays, from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m., provided the Medical Officer does not consider it undesirable. In cases of serious illness they will be summoned and admitted at the discretion of the Matron. Not more than Two Visitors at one time will be admitted to a Patient.
- 9.—Visitors are not allowed to bring any Food, Liquor, or Sweets, or other articles, to the Patients. All parcels are to be placed in the charge of the Matron, for the use of the Patient with her approval. Any Visitor breaking this Rule will not be again admitted to see the Patients except in case of emergency.
- 10.—Patients of all religious denominations may be attended by their respective Ministers at any time that is convenient. Patients should make their wishes known to the Matron.
- 11.—Every Patient shall be sent to the Hospital in decent clothing, and be provided with proper change of linen while there.
- 12.—Patients who offend against any Rules to be observed by Patients made by the Committee for the benefit of the Hospital, or who behave themselves irregularly or improperly, shall be liable to expulsion, and if expelled shall not be re-admitted without an express order of the Committee.

The Secretary would remind Subscribers that Subscriptions for 1929 were due the 1st January, 1929, and it would be greatly to the advantage of the Hospital if they could be paid forthwith.

Subscriptions are received at Lloyds Bank, Devizes; or can be paid to the Secretary.



From the above analysis of Income and Expenditure it appears that the year ended with a balance in hand of £91 4s. 4d., as compared with a balance of £68 13s. 5d. for the year 1927. The total expenditure for the year (£2,312 9s. 2d.), which includes a special payment of £19 8s. 4d. in connexion with the appointment of new Trustees of the Hospital, compares with £2,389 2s. 8d. for 1927, a reduction of £76 13s. 6d. While the cost of mere maintenance per patient per week was practically the same as last year, the total weekly cost, including Medical and Establishment charges, was 1s. 8d. less, viz., £2 13s. 5\frac{3}{4} as against £2 15s. 1\frac{3}{4}d. The reduction in cost per patient is no doubt largely to be accounted for by the fact that the Committee have been fortunate enough to have had a comparatively light bill for repairs and renewals during the past year.

The total number of patients treated in the Hospital (including four members of the Staff) was five more than in the previous year (272 against 267). The total number of patient days was less by 83,

and of patient and staff days combined was less by 164.

Of the 272 patients who passed through the Hospital during the year 122 were absolutely free cases. In several other cases the Committee made no charge, but small payments were volunteered by the patients or their friends, or by Friendly Societies.

The Committee regret to report that three times during the year cases of surgical scarlet fever occurred, which necessitated the temporary closing of the Hospital on each occasion. These occurrences have emphasized the desirability, of which the Committee have long been aware, of providing a small detached Ward to which septic cases could be moved. The question whether anything admits of being done at the present juncture has been referred to a Sub-Committee for consideration and report.

The receipts from private patients occupying the two single wards exceeded those of the previous year by £77—£239 as against £162. The excess payments made by these patients over their actual cost of treatment is an appreciable help to the finances of the Hospital.

The change over to the public supply of electric current for lighting and power purposes was completed in the early part of the year, and the Hospital generating plant was dismantled and disposed of. After taking credit for the amount received for old plant the capital cost of the change worked out at £200 16s. 1d. This cost has been charged as to £96 0s. 9d. against balances standing to the credit of the old Emergency and X-ray Appliance Accounts, closing those accounts, and as to the remainder against Special Reserve Account.

From the working point of view the change over has proved satisfactory. As regards consumption of current and working costs the total consumption for light and power combined was 1808 units (power taking 171 units), and the cost £43 2s. 3d. For the year 1926, the last year throughout which the Hospital ran its own plant, the consumption was 1,254 units, and the estimated cost £72 10s. For the year 1928 the consumption of gas for heating and sterilizing purposes was 99,000 cubic feet, and the cost £27 13s. 3d., while for the year 1926 the consumption was 119,000 cubic feet and the cost £34 15s. 8d. It will thus be seen that the change over to the public supply has produced a very substantial saving even on a nearly 50 per cent. extra consumption of current.

The Committee have again to express their thanks to Captain Gundry for his valuable services in connexion with the carrying out

of the changes in the electric lighting and power system and the installation of the new plant.

The amount derived from private subscriptions during the past year (£246 10s. 6d.) is the same within a few shillings as that received in 1927. The Committee would welcome an increase in the numbers of annual subscribers, for, as has been pointed out on previous occasions, a reliable certain income is of great importance in carrying on the work of the Hospital, and will become of even more importance when the question of meeting the working cost of desirable extensions has to be faced. They would again venture to ask subscribers to remember that the value of their subscriptions is enhanced by payment as early as possible in each financial year.

The Committee again have to record their warmest gratitude to the Mayor of Devizes and the band of workers who assisted him in the effort made last year on behalf of the Hospital, which resulted in the contribution of the very generous sum of £1,054 0s. 4d. to the funds—a sum considerably in excess of what the Committee had ventured to hope for. Of the amount so received £304 0s. 4d. has been applied in aid of the ordinary income of the year, and £750 has been carried to the Special Reserve Fund. It is anticipated that at no very distant date occasion will arise for the expenditure of a substantial portion of that fund in further development of the Hospital.

The sincere thanks of the Committee are again tendered to supporters in several Parishes in the area who during the year have made special efforts in aid of the Hospital funds. As a result of these efforts the following substantial contributions have been received:—Market Lavington and Easterton, £100; Potterne, £19: Urchfont, £15; Rowde, £12; Chirton, Marden and District, £10; and Bromham, £9.

For the third year in succession the Wilts Police Athletic Club have repeated a generous donation of £21 out of the receipts from their annual Sports meeting, and the Committee again express their great appreciation of the gift.

The annual "Egg and Pound Day" organized by the Matron produced £9 15s. 3d. in cash, 529 packets of groceries of various sorts, one sack of flour, a quantity of fruit, flowers and vegetables, and 2,563 eggs. The Committee thank all the various donors, and the school children who greatly helped in collecting the eggs. They also thank Mr. W. Gibbons for again so generously making provision for the pickling of the eggs received.

Another gift, which the Committee report with warm thanks to the donor, is one of a new operating table of most modern pattern received from Mr. Thomas Sloper.

During the past year a start was made with the organization of a collection of waste tin-foil, from the sale of which it appears that other Institutions manage to derive a substantial amount. The collection is in the hands of a small Committee of ladies, and the Committee trust that their efforts will receive support. Boxes have been provided and fixed about the town in which tin-foil may be placed, and it is hoped that in each of the Villages someone may be found to help the collection.

The Committee record with deep regret the deaths during the past year of Captain John Spicer, Major F. W. Giddings, the Rev. Paget Bayly, and Mr. T. H. Chandler, all of whom were regular Subscribers to and supporters of the Hospital. Captain Spicer was

also for many years one of the Trustees. The Rev. Paget Bayly bequeathed to the Hospital a legacy of £100, which has since been paid over to the Trustees and invested as an addition to the Endowment.

The Committee have again to express their gratitude for help afforded during the year:—

To the Clergy and Ministers for Church and Chapel collections.

To Miss Thynne for massage of patients.

To Mrs. Ferris for mending Hospital linen and sewing work.

To Mr. Taplin for advising upon and supervision of painting work at the Hospital.

To the holders of collecting boxes.

To the numerous contributors of flowers, fruit, vegetables, and other gifts.

To the Honorary Medical Staff the Committee again accord their warmest thanks for all their invaluable services.

As in the past the Matron, Miss Rixon, has continued to carry out her responsible work at the Hospital in a most efficient manner, and the Committee have the greatest pleasure in recording the appreciation of her services which they hear in all quarters. The other members of the Staff have carried out their duties through the past year efficiently and satisfactorily.

Finally the Committee again voice their thanks to Mr. Baker for the efficient and zealous manner in which he continues to discharge his duties as Secretary.




