

THE TUNBRIDGE WELLS EYE AND EAR HOSPITAL was founded in 1878 for the relief of the poor suffering from diseases of the eye, ear, nose and throat.

The resident nursing staff now consists of a Matron and five to six Nurses. Operations are usually performed on Monday, Wednesday and Saturday mornings at 9 o'clock, and medical practitioners may attend on presentation of card.

The Hospital is dependent on Voluntary Contributions, and is managed by a House Committee, which usually meets on the first Thursday in each month. The Committee is elected from among the Governors of the Hospital. Four members retire annually, but are eligible for re-election.

Patients are admitted to the benefits of the Hospital on presentation of Subscribers' Letters of Recommendation. List of Subscribers may be obtained from the Honorary Secretary, Eye and Ear Hospital, Tunbridge Wells. Accidents are admitted without Letters, but Patients must obtain one afterwards.

Accidents are admitted at any time of the day or night, and Out-Patients are seen on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday afternoons at one o'clock, and should bring a Subscriber's Letter which is available for six weeks.

An In-Patients' Letter of Recommendation entitles a Patient to professional attendance and medicine for a period of four weeks, after which a Patient must get a new Recommendation or pay Ios. 6d. a week.

In-Patients may be visited by their friends on Thursdays and Sundays, from 2 to 4.

Subscribers of One Guinea and upwards are Governors of the Hospital for the current year, and for One Guinea are entitled to Two Out-Patients' Recommendations, and for Two Guineas One In-Patients' and Two Out-Patients' Recommendations. Subscribers of Half-a-Guinea receive One Out-Patients' Recommendation.

The qualification of a Life Governor is a donation to the General Maintenance Funds of not less than $\pounds 25$ in one sum. The Life Governor is entitled to one In-Patients' and two Out-Patients' Recommendations annually.

Subscribers are specially requested to bestow their Recommendations on suitable Applicants, as only poor persons are eligible to receive the benefits of the Charity.

Spectacles are provided at reduced prices, and the Spectacle and Instrument Fund of the Hospital and also the Royal Surgical Aid Society enables those Patients who cannot afford to pay, to obtain them gratuitously.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1932.

THE Committee of Management has pleasure in presenting to the Governors and Supporters of the Hospital the 54th Annual Report and Statement of Accounts.

The figures showing In-Patients, Out-Patients, Attendances, etc., are given on page 7 and the table of Theatre Operations on page 8.

At the invitation of the Trustees of the Tunbridge Wells and Counties General Hospital and Eye & Ear Hospital, the Charity Commissioners prepared a scheme of amalgamation of the two Hospitals, carrying into effect the terms mutually agreed upon and approved by the Governors of both Hospitals. The scheme provides that until the new joint hospital building is ready for occupation, each Hospital will continue as heretofore.

The need for the increased and improved accommodation which the new Hospital will provide becomes more and more urgent. During the year your Committee converted a portion of the basement of the existing building to form an emergency isolation ward, at a cost of approximately f_{19} .

The outstanding event of the year was the visit of H.R.H. The Duchess of York in July to lay the foundation stone of the new Kent and Sussex Hospital. The function was a complete success and good progress is being made with the new building. While acknowledging the great generosity with which the appeals for funds have been met by the public, the Committee sincerely trusts that at an early date the remaining $f_{31,000}$ required to complete the Hospital and Nurses' Home will be forthcoming.

A joint committee with the Tunbridge Wells & Counties General Hospital was formed during the year to consider the conditions under which Hospital Letters of Recommendation are issued, and the steps which should be taken to ensure increased support for the institutions. As a result of the deliberations of this Committee, together with the friendly co-operation of the Committee of Management of the Hospital Saturday Pay Day Fund, a comprehensive contributory scheme has been devised for the district covered by the Hospitals, and it is felt that this will materially increase the valuable support which the Hospitals have received for many years from the Pay Day Fund.

The Committee reports with sincere regret the loss it has sustained by the death of Mrs. Macartney, a member of the Committee of Management, whose very keen interest in the work of the Hospital will be missed by all.

It was reported last year that the Hon. Chaplain to the Hospital (Rev. Walter Plant) would be leaving the district, and the Committee takes this opportunity of welcoming the new Hon. Chaplain (Rev. Largie) and assuring him that his visits to the Hospital are enjoyed by all.

The Committee also welcomes Mr. T. B. Salt, who was co-opted a member of the Committee during the year, as the representative of the Tunbridge Wells Friendly Societies' Council.

On the 22nd May members of the Committee of the Tonbridge Friendly Societies Hospital Sunday and Benevolent Fund visited Tunbridge Wells and inspected the Hospital and the site for the new joint Hospital. They are keenly interested in the work which is being carried on, and the Committee very much regrets losing the services of their representative (Mr. J. Nicholls) who has left the district. It is hoped that a new representative will soon be elected to fill the vacancy.

Once again very sincere thanks are due to the Tunbridge Wells Hospital Saturday Pay Day Fund, who have given valuable support. Their contributions for the year amounted to $\pounds 387$.

Miss Davies very kindly undertook the supervision of the Tent at the Tunbridge Wells Horticultural Society's Flower Show, for the sale of fruit and flowers by which the Hospital funds benefited to the extent of f_{22} 5s. 4d. The sincere thanks of the Committee are due to Miss Davies and other helpers, to those who so kindly provided the fruit, flowers and vegetables, and also to the Horticultural Society for allowing the erection of the tent.

With a view to increasing the Hospital's income application was made for permission to hold a Flag Day, but this was not granted by the Local Authority.

While the Committee is very grateful for the keen interest taken in the Hospital by its existing subscribers and other contributors, it is necessary to secure additional donors. The Hon. Secretary or Collector will be pleased to send full particulars if subscribers and others will bring to the notice of their friends the sterling work which is being carried on by this Hospital. The Committee wishes to thank the Matron for organising the Pound Day, and also all those who contributed to the excellent result.

A legacy of f_{30} from the late Miss K. F. Steele (for many years a subscriber to the Hospital) is gratefully acknowledged by the Committee.

The Committee also wishes to thank the various Hospital Saturday and Sunday Funds, Friendly Societies, Churches and other contributors for their valued support, which is very welcome in the difficult times through which the Country is passing.

The Committee wishes to record its gratitude for the services rendered to the Hospital by the following :--Mr. D. Davies, Dr. J. Walker Wood, Dr. E. A. Starling, Dr. Cyril Starling (Hon. Anaesthetist), Mr. E. R. Tebbitt (Hon. Dental Surgeon), Col. A. R. Cheale (Hon. Solicitor), Mr. Ernest Moore (Hon. Treasurer) and Mr. Percy Wickenden (Hon. Secretary), and to the House Surgeon (Dr. Chidson), the Matron (Miss Wardell), the Nursing Staff and the Dispenser (Miss Shearer), and Miss Birley for assistance in the Out-Patients' Department.

It will be remembered that on Miss Swindale's retirement a fund was opened with a view to endowing a cot, permanently to associate her name with the Hospital. The Committee sincerely trusts that the sum of approximately $\pounds 40$ required to complete the fund, will be subscribed during the current year.





JOINT BUILDING FUND.

Report, 1932.

NEW HOSPITAL BUILDING FUND.

The past year has been one of advance in every direction.

The amount collected has increased by $\pounds 23,000$, that sum being $\pounds 7,000$ more than the amount received in the previous year.

The Contract for building the New Hospital has been signed and the work is progressing rapidly.

The foundation stone was laid on the 19th July, 1932, by H.R.H. The Duchess of York, amidst scenes of great enthusiasm.

These advances have been the result of very much hard work and the Committee are deeply grateful to all those who have helped them and especially to the Marquis Camden and the ex-Mayor (Mr. Alderman A. Dennis), and to their chief helpers, Col. C. E. Kitchen and Major H. G. James. Special thanks must be given to the Marquis and Marchioness Camden for their further generous gift of $f_{1,000}$ (making $f_{3,000}$ in all) and to the Marquess and Marchioness of Abergavenny for their further generous gift of $f_{1,000}$ (making $f_{2,000}$ in all). Also, to Lord Richard Nevill in obtaining the generous grant of f_{500} from the League of Mercy.

The fund for $\pounds 2,500$ as a memorial to the late Dr. T. C. Guthrie has been completed, so that the chief operating theatre in the New Hospital will be named after him to perpetuate his memory.

The main contract for the Hospital to contain 185 beds amounts to $\pounds 112,677$, but to this has to be added the cost of the land, fees, equipment, incidental expenses and the cost of building a Home to accommodate 75 sisters and nurses and 12 maids. The total cost being estimated at $\pounds 21,000$. The Committee is very desirous of proceeding with the erection of the Nurses' Home in order to take advantage of present low costs. It is of paramount importance that the Home should be ready for occupation upon completion of the New Hospital. To enable the Committee to do this, further substantial donations are required as soon as possible.

Towards the total amount required, $\pounds 113,520$ has already been received and allowing for the value of the existing sites and buildings there is still a balance of $\pounds 29,000$ required. The Committee realise the efforts which were made last summer, but the need is still very great and they would urge all their friends not to relax their efforts, but by means of sales, dances, whist drives, fetes, etc., to continue the raising of funds. They would also stress the need of further donations, large and small, also collections in household boxes, and they would suggest the desirability of bequeathing Legacies to the fund. Subscriptions to the Building Fund may be spread over a period of years if desired.

The Charity Commissioners have passed the scheme for the amalgamation of the two Hospitals as soon as the building is ready for occupation.

In order to minimise the expenditure on printing the Committee has agreed to publish contributions received to the Building Fund under the various districts. Sincere gratitude is extended for the support given and it is hoped that subscribers will accept the Committee's decision as practicable.




