

## Income Tax and Annual Subscriptions.

By virtue of the Income Tax Act, 1918, and subsequent Finance Acts it is possible for the Hospital to effect an increase in its income by the recovery from the Inland Revenue Department of the Income Tax that has been paid by its Subscribers in respect of their subscriptions. To enable a Hospital to do this, however, it is necessary that a Subscriber should enter into a legally binding contract to pay to the Hospital an annual subscription of a definite amount during a period of at least seven years.

#### EXPENDITURE PER PATIENT.

The expenditure per patient per day was  $7/6\frac{1}{4}$ , as compared with 7/9 in 1933.

#### ORDINARY INCOME.

It is satisfactory to see that the ordinary Income amounted to £9,389 10s. 9d., as compared with £8,693 11s. 8d. in 1933.

Annual Subscriptions shew a slight increase on the previous year, but it becomes more and more difficult to maintain this level. The need for new subscribers is a very urgent one and the Committee would be grateful for any help in increasing their number.

It is disappointing to notice a drop in the receipts from entertainments. The Committee know how much work these entail and would especially like to thank those responsible. For some years past the income from Hospital Sunday and Church Parades had been steadily declining, and it is pleasant to note that this year it shews an increase.

Alexandra Day arranged by the Stroud and District Association of Hospital Contributors resulted in £130 being handed over to the Hospital, and the Committee thank the District Organisers and 260 Collectors for their valuable help.

The Id. in the £ Fund again shews an increase and congratulations and thanks are offered by the Committee to Executive Committee, Officers and Collectors of the Contributors' Association for their great work.

Receipts on account of services rendered to patients have increased, especially the fees received in respect of the treatment of patients in the Private Wards.

#### LEGACIES.

#### EXPENDITURE.

The Expenditure has increased by £710. Of this amount £259 has been spent in the provision of New Bedsteads and Bed Lockers; Expenditure in the X Ray Department has increased by nearly £80, and the cost of patients sent for treatment to other Hospitals has cost £179 more than the previous year.

The cost of milk, since the Milk Marketing Board commenced operations, has increased very considerably. This year it has cost £54 more than in 1933, although the consumption has decreased by 250 gallons.

#### IMPROVEMENTS.

The following improvements, in addition to those mentioned under the heading "Expenditure," have been effected during the Year:--

Installation of "Aga" Cookers and Alterations to the Kitchen ... £316
Relaying Wood Block Floors ... £205

Gas Appliances to the value of £100, kindly offered last year by the Stroud Gas Light and Coke Company in commemoration of their centenary, have now been installed and consist of a cooker, a vegetable steamer and three water boilers.

The Committee Room has also been refurnished.

#### X RAY DEPARTMENT.

Dr. M. R. Clark concluded her appointment as Radiologist on the 31st August, and the Committee have placed on record their appreciation of the valuable services she rendered the Hospital during the 8½ years she held the appointment.

The question of the appointment of a successor to Miss Clark was one to which the Committee devoted considerable time, and information was obtained from practically every Hospital in the Country of a similar size. It was eventually decided that for a trial period of 6 months an Honorary Visiting Radiologist should be appointed and that he should be paid an Honorarium to cover travelling expenses, together with a percentage of the fees received, and at a Special Meeting of the Council, held on 29th September, Dr. S. L. Mucklow, M.B., Ch.B., D.M.R. & E., of Cheltenham, was unanimously appointed. An X Ray Sister, who is also a qualified Masseuse, has also been appointed.

As certain of the equipment in the Department was out of date and required renewal it has been decided to spend £850 on the purchase of New Plant. Mr. Stanley S. Marling has very generously given the sum of £500 towards this expenditure, and the Committee wish to place on record their grateful appreciation of his valuable help, at the same time they earnestly appeal to Friends of the Hospital to supplement this amount by further donations in order that the whole cost may be defrayed without depleting the Funds of the Improvements Account.

#### LADIES' LINEN LEAGUE.

The Ladies' Linen League and also the Sewing Party have again given a great deal of assistance to the Hospital, and the Committee express their warm appreciation of this very practical help.

#### RELIGIOUS SERVICES.

Religious Services for the patients were commenced in January, 1934, and in this connection and for their personal services the Committee gratefully acknowledge the good work of friends of the Churches of all Denominations.

## RADIOLOGIST'S REPORT, 1934.

During the past year 1,086 Out-Patients have undergone X-ray examinations.

Fresh applications of the science of radiology are continually being discovered, while new methods of technique are being evolved, and new apparatus is being manufactured to meet the demands made by increased scientific knowledge.

The coming year will see the installation of a new radiographic apparatus in the Hospital, and it is to be expected that this will result in an increase in the number of the more complicated examinations.

### REPORT OF THE CHILD CUIDANCE CLINIC

(Established June, 1932).

Since its inception in 1932 the Child Guidance Clinic has dealt with 66 cases who now attend only occasionally, so that it is possible to form some idea of the results so far obtained.

The conditions for which the children have required treatment may be classed under the headings of Behaviour Disorders, Personality Deviations, Habit Disorders, Mental Defect, and symptoms associated with other organic disease. Behaviour Disorders include temper outbursts, lying, stealing, wandering, etc.

Personality Deviations consist in emotional disturbance, day dreaming, etc.

Habit Disorders comprise enuresis, nail biting, stammering, etc. Mental Defect denotes that the intelligence quotient has been found to be below 70.

Since only the after history will show whether a cure has been effected, the term "much improved" has been used instead. According to these criteria the results are as follows:

It is convenient to place Magistrates' cases in a class by themselves. The favourable results obtained are probably related to the ease with which, in a comparatively small district, contact can be maintained with them. In addition to the above table, eight patients attended only once, two for purposes of diagnosis. There was also one case of acute mental disease, for which the Clinic does not cater.

We have been encouraged by the fact that the whole family situation has, in one instance, been altered for the better as a result of co-operation between a Juvenile Court and the Clinic. On the other hand, a second child from an unsatisfactory home has come for treatment. So that it would appear that adjustment of a child's environment is preferable and less costly than the sending of successive children to institutions, and that the Clinic therefore meets a need.

We have been fortunate in having Miss F. Blake as voluntary social worker, as her long experience of children's difficulties, and her previous intimate knowledge of the homes from which cases have come, have been factors of inestimable value in the work of the Clinic.

Mr. G. P. N. Goodwin, M.A., Careers' Master at Wycliffe College, has voluntarily taken on the psychological testing of the children, so that we look forward to consolidating the results and improving the quality of the work done during the coming year.

. We desire to express our thanks to the London Child Guidance Clinic, who have on all occasions been most ready to help.

#### INSTRUCTIONS TO COVERNORS.

#### Relating to issue of Letters of Recommendation.

An Annual Subscription of one guinea constitutes an individual Subscriber a Governor.

Letters are issued at the rate of one per guinea subscribed. Subscriptions are due on the 1st January, in advance, and except those paid under Bankers' Order, should be paid direct to the Secretary, Stroud General Hospital.

- CASUALTY CASES.—As far as the accommodation of the Hospital will permit, all casualty cases requiring immediate surgical aid will be admitted at all times with or without Letters of Recommendation. Letters should, however, be secured at the earliest opportunity.
- ONE Letter entitles the applicant (if a fit case) to Four Consecutive weeks' treatment, if necessary, as an Outpatient, or to consult the Honorary Dentists and have extractions with anæsthetic if advisable.

(Persons insured under the National Health Insurance Act requiring dental treatment should apply to their Approved Societies for assistance).

TWO Letters entitle the Applicant (if a fit case) to treatment as an In-patient for a similar period. At the expiration of Four Weeks the Patient will be discharged unless fresh Letters are procured.

A Letter must be properly filled in with the Patient's name, age and address, and must be signed. Governors are earnestly requested to ascertain the circumstances of those who apply to them for these Letters, so that the benefits of the Institution may not be misapplied. Letters cannot be used for the benefit of a Recommender or his family.

Patients not contributing to the "1d. in the £" Fund (and in employment or in receipt of an income) needing institutional treatment for themselves and their dependents will be asked to contribute towards the cost of their maintenance, i.e., for the nursing, food, laundry, etc.

Non-contributors attending the Out-Patient Department will be asked to contribute 6d. for each visit towards the costs incurred.

NECESSITOUS. The Stroud General Hospital, being a voluntary hospital, primarily intended for the institutional treatment of the necessitous. will at all times render to such persons free in and out-patient treatment within the scope of a general hospital.

#### RECULATIONS FOR THE TREATMENT OF PATIENTS.

#### IN-PATIENTS.

Applicants must present their Letter of Introduction (or two Subscribers' Letters of Recommendation) at the Hospital on admission, and bring a change of linen, a pair of slippers, a comb and brush, and tooth brush and paste.

Visiting Days.—In-patients may (except under special circumstances) be visited on Sundays and Saturdays from 2 to 3.30 p.m., and Thursdays from 2 to 3 and 7 to 7.30 p.m., but not more than two persons can be admitted to visit any one patient at the same time.

All articles brought by visitors for patients must be submitted to the Matron or the Nurse in charge, who must refuse unsuitable articles. In foods, only eggs and fresh fruits are permitted.

#### OUT-PATIENTS.

New applicants must present their Letter of Introduction or Letter of Recommendation, together with a letter from their Doctor, at the Hospital.

Medical and Surgical Cases.—Mondays and Fridays at 10.30 a.m.

Ear, Nose and Throat Treatment.—Wednesdays at 10.30 a.m.

Eye Department.—Wednesdays at 10.30 a.m.

Dental Department.—Thursdays, 8.45 to 9 a.m., after which no cases will be undertaken.

Patients requiring an anæsthetic must bring a friend with them, and must have taken no food later than the night before the operation is undertaken.

X-Ray Department.—(Other than emergency cases) Daily except Sundays at 10 a.m.

Massage Department.—Daily, on the recommendation of the Doctor.

Ultra Violet Ray Department.—On the recommendation of the Doctor, Mondays at 9 a.m. and Fridays at 2.30 p.m.

The following cases are inadmissible, except in special circumstances on the advice of the Medical Officers and with the consent of the Committee of Management:—

(a) Persons insane or subject to fits.

(b) Persons suffering from infectious or contagious disease.

(c) Persons suffering from chronic disease whom there is no reasonable hope of materially benefiting.

(d) Persons for whom the Poor Law Infirmary is intended.(e) Women in an advanced state of pregnancy.

### ARRANGEMENTS FOR THE TREATMENT OF PRIVATE IN-PATIENTS.

- 1. Private Patients can only be admitted if a bed in a Private Ward is available.
- 2. A Private Patient (if a suitable case) can be admitted if a bed is available on the application of any Medical Practitioner in the neighbourhood, who may attend, treat and operate on the case, the fee for such treatment being arranged between Doctor and Patient.
- 3. Arrangements for the booking of the Wards to be made through the Secretary.
- 4. Fees: £6 6s. per week. There is a Special Ward at £7 7s. per week, and also a Two Bed Ward at £4 4s. per week per patient if used as such, otherwise the fee is £6 6s. per week. Theatre fee, £1 1s. Private Subscribers of £2 2s. per year and Contributors to the "1d. in the £" Fund who have been registered as Subscribers or Contributors for at least three months are entitled to a reduction of 50 per cent. These fees include Board, the ordinary attendance of a Nurse and the usual medicine, but the following, if required, are charged as extras:—
  - (a) The services of a Special Nurse (day or night).
  - (b) An excessive amount of dressing or special treatment or special medicine.
  - (c) Laundry.
  - (d) Wines and Spirits.
- Patients will be required to make their own arrangements for the payment of the fees of the Physician or Surgeon attending them.
- 6. The limit of time for Paying In-patients to remain in the Hospital is four weeks, subject to the discretion of the Committee.
- 7. If the services of the House Surgeon are required as anæsthetist, the amount of the fee shall be settled between him and the Operating Surgeon.
- 8. Paying In-Patients and their visitors are to be subject to control and discipline necessary for carrying on the general routine of the Hospital.
- Any difference of opinion on the meaning of the Rules of the Hospital or of these bye-laws, or in connection with Paying In-Patients, is to be settled by the Committee.

### STROUD AND DISTRICT ASSOCIATION OF HOSPITAL CONTRIBUTORS.

#### Constitution and Rules.

#### 1. NAME.

The Name of the body shall be known as "The Stroud and District Association of Hospital Contributors.

#### 2. CONSTITUTION.

The Association shall consist of a President and an unlimited number of Members, and all Individuals regularly contributing to the "1d. in the £ Fund" as set out in Rule 7 shall be entitled to Membership.

#### 3. OBJECTS.

- (a) To organise the "1d. in the £ Fund" in connection with the Stroud General Hospital, this being a plan of proportionate contribution to Hospital funds which asks every wage earning and salaried person over the age of 16 years to give at least one penny out of each complete pound of earnings, and, in case of industrial and trading establishments, asks the Employer to add a donation of one-third of the amount contributed by his Employees.
- (b) To conduct active propaganda in support of the Fund.
- (c) To voice the views of the Contributors, members of the Association and their dependents, and to watch over their interests.
- (d) To secure efficient, adequate and prompt treatment, so far as the Hospital will allow, of the before mentioned Contributors and their Dependents.
- (e) To make known the needs and work of the Stroud General Hospital whenever possible and, as far as possible, to work in conjunction with the General Council of the Hospital.

#### 4. DELEGATES.

The affairs of the Association are to be in the hands of, and the Rules of the Association are to be made by Delegates representing Groups of Members and assembled in General Meeting. Works, Contributing Units and District Hospital Committees contributing to the "1d. in the £ Fund" may elect or appoint a Delegate or Delegates to attend General Meetings in proportion to the number of Contributors in such Works, Units and Committees, according to the following scale:—

Where the Number of Contributors does not exceed 100, 1 Delegate.
Where the Number of Contributors exceeds 100, but does not exceed
250, 2 Delegates.

Where the total Number of Contributors exceeds 250, 3 Delegates.

#### GENERAL MEETINGS.

General Meetings of Delegates shall be held at least twice in each year as follows:-

- (a) As soon as possible after the close of the Hospital Accounts, to receive a report as to the work of the Association during the preceding year, to appoint a President and to elect an Executive Committee.
- (b) As soon as possible after the 30th June, to receive a report as to the work of the Association during the period 1st Jan.—30th June. Special General Meetings shall be convened by the Secretary on the

written request of either the President, the Executive Committee, or ten Delegates. Such request to be in the hands of the Secretary at least twenty-one days prior to the date of such Meeting, and the same shall clearly state the purpose of the Meeting, and no other business shall be transacted thereat.

The Secretary shall give at least seven days' notice of all General Meetings by advertisement in the Local Papers, and by post to the Delegates at the addresses furnished to him at the time of the election or appointment of such Delegates, and shall state therein the business to be transacted.

#### 6. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

The Management of the internal affairs of the Association shall be vested in a Committee called the "Executive Committee," consisting of the President and fifteen members made up as follows:—

12 Members to be elected from Delegates representing Contributing

Firms.

Members to be elected from Delegates representing Village Committees.

Of the 12 Members representing Firms, four shall retire each year, and of the 3 Members representing Village Committees, one shall retire

each year.

The election of the Executive Committee shall be by Ballot, and all Candidates for election shall be nominated in writing by a Member of the Association as Proposer and another as Seconder. Forms of nomination shall accompany the notice of Meeting at which the election is to take place, and shall be returned to the Secretary not less than 3 days prior to the date of election.

The Executive Committee shall have power to co-opt not more than 3 Ladies or Gentlemen to serve thereon until the next annual meeting

of Delegates.

The Executive Committee shall have power to fill any casual vacancy thereon, caused by death or resignation, by the vacant position being offered to the Candidate at the previous election who, not being elected a member of the Committee, secured the highest number of votes.

The Executive Committee shall have power to appoint and dismiss such

Officers as they may deem to be necessary.

The Executive Committee shall at the first Meeting after the Annual General Meeting appoint from among their number a Chairman, who shall hold office until the next Annual General Meeting and nine representatives to serve on the General Council of the Hospital, 5 of whom shall be nominated to serve on the Management Committee, it being understood that 1 of these 5 Members so nominated shall be a representative of the Village Committee.

The Executive Committee shall meet at least once in each month, and

5 Members shall form a quorum.

The Executive Committee shall have power to make such Bye-Laws as may not be inconsistent with these rules.

#### 7. "1d. IN THE & FUND."

All Individuals contributing regularly to the Stroud General Hospital "1d. in the £ Fund," either by direct payment or deduction or collection, according to the following scale, shall be entitled to the privileges set out below, it being understood that Contributors needing treatment for themselves or their dependents and whose income enables them to pay Nursing Home Fees and the usual fees of a Physician or Surgeon or Specialist, are not expected to avail themselves of the free facilities of The Hospital, accommodation in the Private Wards of the Stroud General Hospital being available for them at reduced fees.

#### SCALE OF CONTRIBUTIONS.

All persons of 16 years of age and upwards 1d. per week out of each complete pound earned, EXCEPT:—

1. Employees whose wages include Board and Lodging:-

(a) Female Domestic Servants, 6d. per month.

(b) Gardeners, Chauffeurs, Cooks, and higher paid employees according to the value of their wages and board residence, with a minimum of 2d. per week.

 Small Shopkeepers, Proprietors of "One Man Businesses," and the like, an agreed rate of so many pence per week, or, if preferred, a flat rate of one guinea per annum, payable quarterly in advance.

3. Old Age Pensioners and Blind Pensioners, 1d. per week.

#### PRIVILEGES.

Contributors and their Dependents (see note) will, when necessary, receive

1. Free treatment in the Public Wards of the Stroud General Hospital, but not necessarily medical attendance.

2. Accommodation and Nursing in the Private Wards of the Stroud General Hospital at reduced rates.

All Contributors must be accepted by the Doctor or Surgeon of the Hospital as suitable for the Hospital treatment, and must bring a letter or certificate from their own Doctor.

### ADDITIONAL BENEFITS. To be obtained only on application to the Secretary, Stroud General Hospital.

- 1. If treatment is necessary in the public wards of either the Bristol General Hospital, the Bristol Royal Infirmary, the Cheltenham General and Eye Hospitals, or the Gloucester Royal Infirmary and Eye Institution, application, accompanied by a letter from the Contributor's Medical Attendant, must be made to the Secretary, Stroud General Hospital, before making arrangements for admission as an In-patient. This arrangement only applies to cases where, in the opinion of the Committee, the necessary treatment is unobtainable at the Stroud General Hospital.
- 2. Contributors or their dependents who, while away from home, are obliged by accident or sudden illness to enter the Public Wards of any General Hospital in England, will be refunded an amount not exceeding 3/- per day, on sending the receipt for what they have paid, together with a letter of Introduction or their Contribution Card, to the Secretary, Stroud General Hospital.

Contributors and their Dependents are not entitled to receive as a benefit of the Scheme such treatment as is provided by the Public Health Authorities.

Surgical appliances, if required, are not included as a free benefit of the

New Contributors must have been Members for a period of three months before becoming entitled to benefits, or join within one month (a) of the preliminary meeting being held in the District, or (b) of their coming to live in the Hospital area.

The Membership of a Contributor whose payments are in arrears for more than 8 weeks will be cancelled and the Contributor's name will be removed from the Books. Non-Contributors, with the exception of the necessitous, will be required to pay towards the cost of their maintenance as In-patients and to pay a fee as Out-patients.

NOTE. By the word Dependent is meant:-

- 1. Wife.
- 2. Children up to 16 years of age.
- 3. Father or Mother, not being Old Age Pensioners, who are mainly dependent on Contributor.

In addition to the above, the Executive Committee shall have power to admit to the benefit of the Scheme as dependents invalid children over the age of 16 years, and other cases of a special nature. But all cases of this description must be brought before the Committee for their decision.

#### 8. NOTICE OF BUSINESS,

At least 21 days' notice in writing shall be delivered to the Secretary of any business which it is proposed to bring forward at General Meetings.

#### 9. RULES, ALTERATION OF.

These Rules may not be repealed or amended or new Rules made unless at a Special General Meeting called for the purpose.


