# Annual General Meeting

OF THE

Governors & Subscribers of the Stratford-upon-Avon Hospital

was held at the Hospital, Stratford-upon-Avon, on Saturday, October 13th, 1928, at Three o'clock in the afternoon.

When the following Reports of the Committee of Management and the Medical Board were submitted.

Report of the Committee of Management for the year ended June 30th, 1928.

- 1. The Committee of Management in presenting the Annual Report (with Statement of Accounts) for the year ended June 30th, 1928, has pleasure in announcing that the general affairs of the Hospital continue to be satisfactory.
- 2. 467 In-patients were admitted during the year, as compared with 487 the previous year.

The Out-patients admitted numbered 1,520 with 6,271 attendances—as compared with 1,511 Out-patients and 6,599 attendances the previous year.

- 3. In view of the heavy demands upon the services of the Honorary Medical Staff, your Committee desires to again call special attention to No. 56 of the Hospital Rules and extracts from the regulations adopted by the Medical Board, referring to a very important matter.
  - RULE 56. "All persons contributing to the Stratford-upon-Avon Hospital Maintenance Fund shall not be charged for Maintenance, but all, other than necessitous persons, shall continue to be liable for Medical and Surgical attendance as if they were treated at home."

Extracts from Regulations adopted by the Medical Board:—

- "That there is no Resident Medical Officer. That the entire Honorary Staff—Physicians, Surgeons, Ophthalmic Surgeon, Dental Surgeons and Radiologist—give their services freely to all in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Hospital, and, therefore, they expect Rule 56 to be adhered to in all departments—In, Out, and Special."
- "All contributors to the Stratford-upon-Avon Hospital Maintenance Fund whose income does not exceed an average of £3 per week shall be entitled to the gratuitous services of the Honorary Medical Staff, but all above this amount should be inquired into and treated according to circumstances."
- "The Medical Board suggests that all admission orders should vouch that the bearer has a claim upon the free services of the Honorary Staff."
- 4. The Ordinary Receipts for the year amounted to £5,742 16s. 3d. as compared with £5,795 19s. 4d. last year, a decrease of £53 3s. 1d.

The Ordinary Expenditure amounted to £5,542 16s. 10d. as compared with £5,678 7s. 9d., a decrease of £135 10s. 11d.

An Extraordinary Expenditure of £214 5s. 3d. has been incurred and met by ordinary revenue. For some time past the equipment in the Laundry has been inadequate for the amount of work required from this department, which turns out an average of over fifteen

hundred articles per week. The hand washer, which was completely worn out, has been replaced by an electric one, and a new boiler for supplying steam to the laundry has been purchased, the total cost of these renewals amounting to the sum of £214 5s. 3d.

5. The Collections for the Hospital made at the various places of worship amounted to £135 9s. 3d., as compared with £153 7s. 1d. last year, a decrease of £17 17s. 1od.

Whilst tendering its best thanks to all the Clergy and Ministers for their assistance, the Committee desires most strongly to urge that these collections should, as much as possible, be given as "Free Gifts" to the Hospital Funds; that Tickets should only be given to really poor persons who are not in a position to regularly contribute to the Hospital Maintenance Fund.

- 6. THE HOSPITAL MAINTENANCE FUND, STRATFORD-UPON-AVON.— Your Committee desires to again tender its best thanks to the Chairman and Members of the Maintenance Fund Committee—also to the Hon. Secretaries and Collectors—for their continued valuable and staunch support. The contributions from this Fund during the past year amounted to £2,272 4s. od.
- 7. The Hospital Linen League.— The Committee of Management desires to express its appreciation of the excellent assistance given by the Linen League, which held its sixth exhibition in November last. With Mrs. West, of Alscot Park, as President, and Miss Maud Gem as honorary secretary, the Linen League is serving a most useful purpose in providing the whole of the linen equipment of the Hospital. The number of articles presented this year was 469.
- 8. The Annual Ball was held on December 29th last, at the Town Hall, Lady Throckmorton being the Lady Patroness, and was a most successful function. The profit on the Ball amounted to £65 4s. 8d., and donations to the amount of £97 7s. od. were received, making a total of £162 11s. 8d. for the general funds.
- 9. Legacies.—Your Committee desires to record its gratitude for the following Legacies received:—

The Executors of the late Mrs. Mary Ellen Cooke £500, for the Endowment of a Child's Cot, in memory of the late George and Mary Ellen Cooke.

The Executors of the late William Hyatt £100 (less legacy duty £10).

10. Donations.—Your Committee desires to record its best thanks:—

To the Hospital Mitchell Football Cup Committee for the sum of £22 15s. 3d., being the takings at the final match last season. Since its presentation by Mr. J. J. Mitchell in 1923, this Cup has been the means of adding the sum of £118 2s. 11d. to the funds of the Hospital.

To Lady Wallis for the sum of £25 in memory of the late Sir Whitworth Wallis—for operating theatre equipment.

To Mr. F. Sedgwick for the sum of £14 16s. 6d., being part proceeds of the Boxing Tournament.

To Miss Margaret Slatter for the sum of £14 6s. 8d., being proceeds of performance by The Pilgrim Players at Dunnington.

To the Staff and Pupils of Preston-on-Stour Church of England Schools for the sum of £10 14s. 9d. for the purchase of a Cot for the Children's Ward.

To Mrs. Spencer, of Great Alne, for the sum of £5 15s. od., being the proceeds of "Alexandra Day" in the parishes of Great Alne, Little Alne, Aston Cantlow, Kinwarton and Haselor.

II. EXTENSIONS AND ALTERATIONS TO GIBBINS' BLOCK, ETC.—On May 30th last, the extensions and alterations to Gibbins' Block, etc., were formally opened by The Lady Helen Seymour. The additions comprise a Sisters' sittingroom, large sitting-room for Nurses, kitchen, seven bedrooms with bathroom, etc.; and the alterations provide three extra beds for Patients, sick room for a Nurse, and dining-room for Nurses on the first floor, with service lift, etc.

Since the end of the financial year the total cost of the extensions and various alterations, with furnishing, equipment, etc., has been met, and amounts to the sum of £3,112 4s. 8d. The donations received to date of this report amount to £2,646 19s. 3d., leaving a deficit on the Extension Fund of £465 5s. 5d.

Your Committee desires to acknowledge, with very grateful thanks, the generosity of all donors to this fund, and trusts that other friends and supporters of this Hospital will be good enough to contribute towards the payment of this debt.

- 12. The Committee desires to acknowledge the generosity of all who have sent presents of dressings, clothing, eggs, fruit, vegetables, books, and many other useful gifts for the patients, and, in asking for a continuance of similar gifts, takes this opportunity of assuring the donors how much their kindness has been appreciated.
- 13. The Committee, in concluding this report, tenders its best thanks to the Medical Staff for their skilful and gratuitious services; to the Chaplain and those of the Clergy who have ministered to the patients at the Hospital, and to all who in any way have assisted in carrying on the work of the Institution.

### REPORT OF THE MEDICAL BOARD, 1927-28.

The Medical Board beg to report that during the year 491 In-Patients received treatment, as compared with 515 in 1926-27, and 520 in 1925-26.

Of the 491 In-patients 467 were new cases, Medical 131, Surgical 310, Ophthalmic 2, Dental 24.

Nine cases died within 48 hours of admission to Hospital, 7 within 24 hours, and 2 cases within 1 hour.

THE X-RAY DEPARTMENT. There is a continued increase in the work of this department—390 attendances. Only the most urgent cases should attend without previous notice and a note from the patient's medical attendant.

THE MASSAGE AND ELECTRICAL DEPARTMENT. This department has been improved by the addition of the Diathermy apparatus, which naturally increases the already heavy work of the Masseuse.

THE OPHTHALMIC DEPARTMENT. Notwithstanding the facilities provided by the National Health Approved Societies, the work in this department has increased. 124 children attended for refractions.

THE DENTAL DEPARTMENT. There is still a further increase of work in this department; 239 patients being treated involving 372 attendances. In 44 cases dentures were supplied.

THE GENERAL OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT. There is an increase in the attendance of patients and casualties in this department, and the Medical Board feel there are still patients who could be efficiently treated by their own doctor.

TRAINING OF PROBATIONERS. The scheme inaugurated last year has proved most successful; Seven nurses have passed their Preliminary Examination and are being transferred to the Radcliffe Infirmary and County Hospital, Oxford, for the completion of their training. The additional accommodation provided, which was so essential, has proved the greatest possible boon to the Nursing Staff.

A review of the work shows the strain and responsibility borne by the Nursing Staff. The number of private cases has been relieved by the Nursing Home at Whytegates, thereby affording more accommodation for other patients.

Accidents from the road—nearly always at night—throw additional work on the entire Nursing Staff, and the Medical Board cannot too highly express their appreciation of the constant work of the Administrative Staff.

### The Right aud Privilege of Recommending Patients.

45.—Subscribers and Donors shall be entitled to recommend Patients to receive the benefits of the Hospital according to the following scale:—

An In-Patient Ticket may at any time be exchanged for six Out-Patient Tickets on application to the Secretary, but under no circumstances will Out-Patient Tickets be exchanged for In-Patient Tickets. These privileges shall not extend to Donors or Subscribers to a Building or any other Special Fund.

- 46.—Bodies Corporate, Clubs, Societies, or Firms shall recommend Patients through a nominee, but the privileges acquired by donations shall be limited to ten years.
- 47.—Ministers making Congregational or Parochial Collections for the benefit of the Hospital shall be entitled to recommend Patients in accordance with the Scale of One In-Patient Ticket and Five Out-Patient Tickets for each three guineas collected. Such recommendations must be confined to the poor of the parish in which the collection is made, and limited to twleve months from the date of such collection.
- 49.—Any Subscriber or Donor may authorise another person to recommend patients in his name by communicating to the Secretary, in writing, the name of the person so delegated.
- 50.—Subscriptions shall become due on the first day of July, and must be paid in advance. Subscribers shall not have the right of recommending Patients until after payment of their Subscriptions.
- 51.—All persons who have once become Subscribers to the Hospital shall be answerable for their Subscriptions until they have given notice to the contrary, in writing, to the Secretary.

### OBJECTS OF THE CHARITY.

- 52.—All persons who are in need of Hospital treatment shall be eligible for admission to the Hospital, but no person in receipt of permanent parochial relief (except a boarded-out child) shall be admitted as an In or Out-Patient, unless the case be certified as urgent by one of the Medical Officers of the Hospital, in which case a weekly payment towards the maintenance shall be made by the Guardians of the Union to which the applicant shall belong.
- 53.—Patients, other than regular contributors to the "Stratford-upon-Avon Hospital Maintenance Fund," and those in "necessitous circumstances," if recommended by a Medical Officer, may be admitted upon payment, provided there is room in the Hospital, such admission to be confirmed by the House Committee; the scale of payment to be arranged by the House Committee and the Medical Officer in charge of the case.

Should any difficulties arise respecting the term necessitous, they shall be referred by the Medical Officers to the House Committee.

- 55.—All In-Patients, except regular contributors to the "Stratford-upon-Avon Hospital Maintenance Fund," shall contribute towards their *Maintenance* a minimum fee of 2s. a day, in addition to providing an In-Patient Ticket.
- 56.—All persons contributing to the Stratford-upon-Avon Hospital Maintenance Fund shall not be charged for *Maintenance*, but all, other than necessitous persons, shall continue to be liable for Medical and Surgical attendance, as if they were treated at home.

### ADMISSION AND DISCHARGE OF PATIENTS.

- 57.—Patients shall be admitted every Tuesday and Friday, at 12 o'clock, on presentation of a printed Recommendation Paper, duly signed by a Subscriber, without which no Patient can be admitted save in the case of accident or emergency, such case to be reported by the Matron to the House Committee at their next Meeting. A registration fee of Two Shillings for each In-Patient and Out-Patient shall be charged upon admission.
- 58.—Dental Patients are admitted every Friday, at 10 o'clock, without a Ticket for extractions not requiring an anaesthetic.
- 59.—Dental Patients requiring an anaesthetic or any other treatment, such as "fillings," etc., must present an Out-Patient Ticket, and, in addition, pay a Registration Fee of Two Shillings upon admission, and, if required, must procure additional Out-Patient Tickets according to the number of "fillings," etc., necessary.
- 60.—Artificial teeth are supplied in a limited number of cases. Patients requiring dentures will receive a certificate from the Dental Surgeon, which must be taken to the Secretary to be exchanged for an application form to be filled up and submitted to the House Committee. The House Committee reserves the right of refusing any application. No work will be commenced until the required number of Out-Patient Tickets have been deposited with the Secretary.

- 63.—The Medical Officer shall have the power of admitting any Out-Patient into the Hospital without further recommendation, on payment of the maintenance rates fixed by Rule 64.
- 64.—Cases of severe accident, or emergency, may be admitted as In-Patients at any time, without a Recommendation Paper, which must be procured afterwards; and, if unable to procure an In-Patient Ticket, may be permitted to remain on procuring an Out-Patient Ticket, which may be accepted in lieu thereof, subject to the following minimum rates of payment:—Adults 5s. per day; Children under twelve years of age, 2s. 6d. per day.
- 65.—Persons suffering from fractures, dislocations, or other severe accidents, or requiring important operations, shall not be admitted as Out-Patients.
- 65.—Women advanced six months in pregnancy (unless recommended by a Medical Officer), persons of unsound mind, or suspected to have any infectious disease, shall not be admitted as In-Patients, and, if inadvertently admitted, shall not be allowed to remain.
- 67.—In-Patients suffering from incurable disease which, in the opinion of the Medical Officers, is incapable of being materially relieved, shall not be allowed to remain in the Hospital; and no person shall be permitted to remain as an In-Patient who can be relieved equally well as an Out-Patient.
- 69.—In-Patients, if not discharged within two weeks, must procure a new In-Patient Ticket, or pay the maintenance rates fixed by Rule 64, and Out-Patients, if not discharged within four weeks, must procure new Out-Patient Tickets.
- 74.—The friends of the Patients shall be allowed to visit them on Sunday from three to four o'clock p.m., and on Tuesdays and Fridays from two to four o'clock p.m., and on no other day of the week without leave of the Medical Officer or Matron. Liquors and provisions are strictly prohibited. Friends must confine their conversation to the Patients they respectively visit.
- 76.—Out-Patients must attend at the Hospital on Tuesdays at twelve o'clock, as the Medical Officer may direct. Those who are unable to attend personally at the Hospital must send papers by a relation, nurse, or other proper person. Any Patient neglecting to attend to this rule for the space of three weeks, unless by permission of the Medical Officers, or prevented by unavoidable circumstances, shall be discharged.
