

OF THE

GOVERNORS AND SUBSCRIBERS OF THE STRATFORD-UPON-AVON HOSPITAL

was held at THE HOSPITAL, STRATFORD-UPON-AVON,

ON SATURDAY, APRIL 29TH, 1939,

When the following Reports of the Committee of Management and the Medical Board were submitted.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT FOR THE YEAR ENDED DECEMBER 31ST, 1938.

- 1. The Committee of Management begs to present the Annual Report (with Statement of Accounts) for the year ended December 31st, 1938.
- 2. Your Committee desires to place on record its deep regret on the death of Mr. Frederick Ballance, who was a generous supporter of this hospital, and for the past seven years the very able Chairman of the House Committee.
- 3. Five hundred and seventy-six In-Patients were admitted during the year, as compared with 594 the previous year.

The Out-Patients treated numbered 2,533, with 8,947 attendances, as compared with 2,232 Out-Patients and 8,196 attendances the previous year.

4. In view of the heavy demands upon the services of the Honorary Medical Staff, your Committee desires again to call special attention to No. 56 of the Hospital Rules, and extracts from the regulations adopted by the Medical Board, referring to an important matter.

Rule 56.—"All persons contributing to the Hospital Maintenance Fund, Stratford-upon-Avon, shall not be charged for Maintenance, but all, other than necessitous persons, shall continue to be liable for Medical and Surgical attendance as if they were treated at home."

Extracts from Regulations adopted by the Medical Board:—

"That there is no Resident Medical Officer. That the entire Honorary Staff—Physicians, Surgeons, Ophthalmic Surgeon, Dental Surgeons and Radiologist—give their services freely to all in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Hospital, and, therefore, they expect Rule 56 to be adhered to in all Departments—In, Out and Special."

"All Contributors to the Hospital Maintenance Fund, Stratford-upon-Avon, whose income does not exceed an average of £3 per week shall be entitled to the gratuitous services of the Honorary Medical Staff, but all above this amount should be inquired into and treated

according to circumstances."

"The Medical Board suggests that all admission orders should vouch that the bearer has a claim upon the free services of the Honorary Staff."

5. The Ordinary Receipts for the year amounted to £6,755 4s. 9d., as compared with £6,308 1os. 4d., last year: an increase of £446 14s. 5d.

The Ordinary Expenditure amounted to £7,104 16s. 6d., as compared with £6,550 os. 5d.:

an increase of £554 16s. Id.

There is a balance of Total Expenditure over Total Income for the year of £155 7s. 8d.

6. The Collections for the Hospital made at the various places of worship amounted to £95 18s. 4d.,

as compared with £98 8s. 7d.

Whilst tendering its best thanks to all the Clergy and Ministers for their assistance, the Committee desires most strongly to urge that these collections should, as much as possible, be given as "Free Gifts" to the Hospital Funds; that Tickets should only be given to really poor persons who are not in a position to contribute regularly to the Hospital Maintenance Fund.

- 7. THE HOSPITAL MAINTENANCE FUND, STRATFORD-UPON-AVON.—Your Committee desires again to tender its best thanks to the Chairman and Members of the Maintenance Fund Committee—also to the Hon. Secretaries and Collectors—for their continued valuable and staunch support. The contributions from this Fund amounted to £1,951 7s. 6d. during the past year.
- 8. The Hospital Linen League.—The Committee of Management desires to express again its appreciation of the excellent assistance of the Linen League. At the eighteenth exhibition held in December last, 365 articles were presented to the Hospital, and £60 was received in donations to be spent on blankets, etc. With Mrs. W. R. West as President, and Miss Chadwick as Honorary Secretary, the Linen League is serving a most useful purpose in providing the whole of the linen equipment of the Hospital.
- 9. The Annual Ball.—The Annual Ball was held on January 22nd, 1938, the Lady Willoughby de Broke being the Lady Patroness, and it was a very successful function. The profit on the Ball amounted to £76 14s. 6d. and donations to the amount of £117 2s. od. were received, making a total of £193 16s. 6d. for the general funds.
- 10. Donations and Gifts.—Your Committee desires to record its best thanks to :—

Mrs. Graham Rees-Mogg for her gift of £1,520, given during the year; £1,000 of which is placed to the endowment of a bed to the memory of the late Mr. Gilbert Douty.

Mr. Richard Matthews for organising the Hospital Dance which realised £38 17s. 8d. for the funds of the Hospital.

Miss Eileen C. Earle for a donation of £25.

Mr. John Clements Ansell for a gift of £25 for the purchase of a Dressing Trolley for the Men's Ward.

The Hospital Mitchell Football Cup Committee for the sum of fir ios. od., being the takings

at the final match last season. Since its presentation by Mr. J. J. Mitchell in 1923, this Cup has been the means of adding the sum of £244 13s. 11d. to the funds of the Hospital.

The Avon Insurance Company Ltd. for again covering the insurance of the Motor Ambulance amounting to £9 2s. Id. free of cost to the Hospital.

The following for organising performances in aid of the Hospital:—Miss Sylvia Atkinson, Mr. Randle Ayrton, Miss Leslie and The English Folk Dance

and Song Society.

- II. Improvements and Alterations.—Through the generosity of the donors to the Special Appeal made in 1937, several important improvements have been carried out during the year. The main corriders have been laid with quarter-inch rubber, and up-to-date fittings have been installed in the lavatory blocks. All the wards are now equipped with new bedsteads and mattresses, and various alterations in the old theatre, etc. have been carried out for the convenience of nursing and treatment. The oil-burners for the heating and domestic supplies have been converted to the use of heavy oil, and this has already made a considerable decrease in the expenditure on oil-fuel. All these improvements, etc., have been carried out at a cost of £899 14s. 3d.
- 12. Legacies.—Your Committee desires to record its gratitude for the following legacies received during the year:—

The Executors of the late Evelyn Percy Gem—£100. The James Henry Stephens Bequest per Lloyds Bank—£50.

13. The Committee desires to acknowledge the generosity of all who have sent presents of dressings, clothing, fruit, vegetables, books, and many other useful gifts for the patients and, in asking for a continuance of similar gifts, takes this opportunity of assuring the donors how much their kindness has been appreciated.

The Committee especially desires to thank the members of the Women's Institutes and others who

responded to the Matron's appeal for eggs. Owing to their kindness over 4,000 eggs have been preserved for winter use.

14. The Committee, in concluding this Report, tenders its best thanks to the Medical Staff for their skilful and gratuitous services; to the Chaplain, the Clergy, and all who have ministered to the patients at the Hospital; to the Matron and the Nursing Staff; the Administrative Staff, and to all who have in any way assisted in carrying on the work of the Institution.

X-RAY DEPARTMENT.—The very important work of this department again shows an increase; 906 attendances were recorded during the year. For some time past the fact that the present X-Ray apparatus is not shock-proof has caused the Medical Board to very seriously consider the position. Mrs. Graham Rees-Mogg having kindly intimated that her donation of £500 should be appropriated for the X-Ray department, the Medical Board has, since the close of the year, recommended to the Committee of Management the absolute necessity of installing a shock-proof apparatus the cost of which is £1,120.

MASSAGE AND ELECTRICAL DEPARTMENT.—The work of this department continues to be of great service to the community. Five thousand one-hundred and fifty-one treatments were given during the year.

OPHTHALMIC DEPARTMENT.—The number of patients treated during the year was 328, involving 638 attendances.

Dental Department.—The number of cases treated in this department also shows an increase and much good work is being done. During the year 482 attendances were made, 249 dental operations were performed, and 38 patients were supplied with dentures.

GENERAL OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT.—During the year one thousand four hundred and ninety attendances were recorded in the general out-patient, casualty and dressings departments.

The Medical Board desires to record its sincere appreciation of the excellent work performed by the Matron and the Nursing Staff.

45.—Subscribers and Donors shall be entitled to recommend Patients to receive the benefits of the Hospital according to the following scale:—

An In-Patient Ticket may at any time be exchanged for six Out-Patient Tickets on application to the Secretary, but under no circumstances will Out-Patient Tickets be exchanged for In-Patient Tickets. These privileges shall not extend to Donors or Subscribers to a building or any other Special Fund.

- 46.—Bodies Corporate, Clubs, Societies, or Firms shall recommend Patients through a nominee, but the privileges acquired by donations shall be limited to ten years.
- 47.—Ministers making Congregational or Parochial Collections for the benefit of the Hospital shall be entitled to recommend Patients in accordance with the Scale of One In-Patient Ticket and Five Out-Patient Tickets for each three guineas collected. Such recommendations must be confined to the poor of the parish in which the collection is made, and limited to twelve months from the date of such collection.
- 49.—Any Subscriber or Donor may authorise another person to recommend Patients in his name by communicating to the Secretary, in writing, the name of the person so delegated.
- 50.—Subscriptions shall become due on the first day of January. Subscribers shall not have the right of recommending Patients until after payment of their subscriptions.
- 51.—All persons who have once become Subscribers to the Hospital shall be answerable for their subscriptions until they have given notice to the contrary, in writing, to the Secretary.
- 53.—Patients, other than regular contributors to the Hospital Maintenance Fund, Stratford-upon-Avon, and those in "necessitous circumstances," if recommended by a Medical Officer, may be admitted upon payment, provided there is room in the Hospital, such admission to be confirmed by the House Committee; the scale of payment to be arranged by the House Committee and the Medical Officer in charge of the case.

Should any difficulties arise respecting the term *necessitous*, they shall be referred by the Medical Officers to the House Committee.

- 55.—All In-Patients, except regular contributors to the Hospital Maintenance Fund, Stratford-upon-Avon, shall contribute towards their *Maintenance* a minimum fee of 2s. a day, in addition to providing an In-Patient Ticket.
- 56.—All persons contributing to the Stratford-upon-Avon Hospital Maintenance Fund shall not be charged for *Maintenance*, but all, other than necessitous persons, shall continue to be liable for Medical and Surgical attendance as if they were treated at home.
- 58.—Dental Patients are admitted every Friday at ten o'clock without a Ticket for extractions not requiring an anaesthetic.
- 59.—Dental Patients requiring an anaesthetic must present an Out-Patient Ticket, and, in addition, pay a Registration Fee of Two Shillings upon admission, and, if required, must procure additional Out-Patient Tickets.
- 60.—Artificial teeth are supplied in a limited number of cases. Patients requiring dentures will receive a certificate from the Dental Surgeon, which must be taken to the Secretary to be exchanged for an application form to be filled up and submitted to the House Committee. The House Committee reserves the right of refusing any application. No work will be commenced until the required number of Out-Patient Tickets have been deposited with the Secretary.
- 63.—The Medical Officer shall have the power of admitting any Out-Patient into the Hospital without further recommendation, on payment of the maintenance rates fixed by Rule 64.
- 64.—Cases of severe accident, or emergency, may be admitted as In-Patients at any time, without a Recommendation Paper, which must be procured afterwards; and, if unable to procure an In-Patient Ticket, may be permitted to remain on procuring an Out-Patient Ticket, which may be accepted in lieu thereof, subject to the following minimum rates of payment:—Adults, 5s. per day; children under 12 years of age, 2s. 6d. per day.
- 65.—Persons suffering from fractures, dislocations, or other severe accidents, or requiring important operations, shall not be admitted as Out-Patients.
- 66.—Women advanced six months in pregnancy (unless recommended by a Medical Officer), persons of unsound mind, or suspected to have any infectious disease, shall not be admitted as In-Patients, and, if inadvertently admitted, shall not be allowed to remain.

- 67.—In-Patients suffering from incurable disease which, in the opinion of the Medical Officers, is incapable of being materially relieved, shall not be allowed to remain in the Hospital; and no persons shall be permitted to remain as an In-Patient who can be relieved equally well as an Out-Patient.
- 69.—In-Patients, if not discharged within two weeks, must procure a new In-Patient Ticket, or pay the maintenance rates fixed by Rule 64, and Out-Patients, if not discharged within four weeks, must procure new Out-Patient Tickets.
- 74.—Friends of the Patients shall be allowed to visit them on Sundays from three to four o'clock p.m., and on Tuesdays and Fridays from two to four o'clock p.m., and on no other day of the week without leave of the Medical Officer or Matron.
- 76.—Out-Patients must attend at the Hospital on Tuesdays at twelve o'clock, as the Medical Officer may direct. Those who are unable to attend personally at the Hospital must send papers by a relation, nurse, or other proper person. Any Patient neglecting to attend to this rule for the space of three weeks, unless by permission of the Medical Officer, or prevented by unavoidable circumstances, shall be discharged.
- 77.—Ophthalmic Patients must attend at the Hospital on Fridays at 12.30 o'clock p.m., and Dental Patients on Fridays at ten o'clock a.m.


