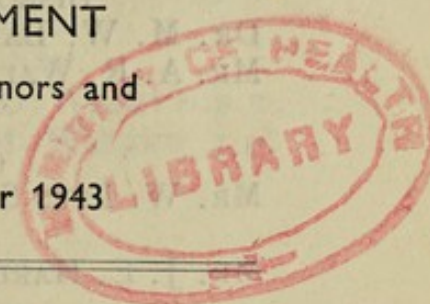

Annual Report.

THE Board of Management herewith present the Report and the Accounts for the year 1943.

It is with deep regret that they record the deaths of Mr. Harrie Stacey and Dr. Anstey Chave. Mr. Stacey joined the Board in 1912, acted as Chairman of the House Committee from 1926 to 1938, and was elected Vice-President in 1941. Dr. Anstey Chave acted as Hon. Radiologist since 1914, and is succeeded by Mr. H. E. Offord, to whom Mr. J. B. McIntyre has been appointed assistant.

In December Dr. James Mennell, Consulting Physiotherapist to the Hospital, resigned on account of ill-health, and the Board of Management desire gratefully to record their appreciation of his services to the Hospital.

Thanks to the work of its Hon. Medical and Surgical Staffs, and no less to that of Matron, her Assistant and the Nursing Staff, the Hospital has rendered another year of efficient service to the sick and injured members of the East Surrey community—a service which has been gratefully acknowledged in many letters received from patients.

During the year the Hospital treated 1,939 in-patients and 24,962 out-patients. The corresponding figures for 1942 were 1,903 and 24,289 respectively.

The accompanying accounts show that the expenditure for the year exceeded the income by £1,198 16s. 5d., against a deficit last year of £1,764. Subscriptions increased by £223, of which approximately £100 is due to new Covenanted Subscriptions. The Board again call the attention of Subscribers to this means of doubling their benefactions, without extra cost to themselves. A Form of Covenant is enclosed herewith and they earnestly appeal to all Subscribers to take this opportunity of increasing their help. Subscribers who have already signed Covenants are asked to pass the Covenant Form to a friend and to recommend this method of subscription.

Donations, which include £228 in gifts from grateful patients, show an increase of £200 over 1942, and entertainments an increase of £287. The Metropolitan Hospitals Sunday Fund raised its contribution from £75 to £270. Receipts from patients' payments and their Societies and from public authorities were up by £500, and the East Surrey Hospital Contributory Scheme yielded £7,888 as against £5,173 for the year 1942.

Against these increases has to be set an increase in expenditure due to the higher prices of many of the articles of equipment and to the general increases in salaries and wages, particularly those of the Nursing Staff, consequent upon the acceptance of the Rushcliffe Report, which the Board had no hesitation in adopting in April, 1943. The Board feel sure that no one will grudge these well-deserved increases.

The receipt of the following gifts is gratefully acknowledged:—

£1,000 from Mrs. C. Maynard to endow a bed in the Men's Surgical Ward in memory of her late husband, Mr. Herbert Albert Maynard.

£251 10s. 11d. from the Merstham Village Club and the Merstham Branch of the British Legion, being the proceeds of the August Bank Holiday Gala organised by them. This has been invested in £315 1s. 10d. 2½% Consols to form a nucleus of "The Merstham Club and British Legion Fund."

£15 15s. from the executors of the late George Thomas Howell, as an addition to the Children's Ward Fund inaugurated by him.

£873 17s. received in response to the appeal for a new X-ray Examination Couch (including £200 from Mr. W. H. McAlpine).

Blankets, an Epidiascope and Lamp, and repairs to the Library Trolley, from the Ladies' Association, and gifts of Linen to the value of £40 from the Linen League.

Alexandra Rose Day yielded £590 2s. 8d., thus exceeding the previous year's record.

Mary Lady Colman presided at the second Annual Nurses' Prize-Giving Day, held in the Nurses' Home on 8th September, 1943, and presented prizes and certificates to the successful candidates in the State Examinations.

In the State Examinations held by the General Nursing Council of England and Wales 10 Nurses completed their training and passed the Final Examination, and 17 Nurses passed the Preliminary Examination.

To economise the use of paper and printing the Board ask the many friends of the Hospital, including the Ladies' Association and the Ministers of Religion who have helped with gifts and services, to accept this general expression of their grateful thanks in lieu of a more detailed acknowledgment.

Once again they desire to express their sincere thanks to the members of the Hon. Medical, Surgical and other ancillary Staffs, to Matron and all members of the Nursing Staffs, and to the Secretary and his Staff, for their loyal and unstinted services; and they repeat, what they said in their last Report, that never has the Hospital been better served.

The members of the Board retiring by rotation are Mr. K. B. Stoddart, Lt.-Col. Dudley Lewis and Mr. R. T. Vernon, who offer themselves for re-election.

The Auditors, Messrs. Alfred Simmons & Co., offer themselves for re-appointment.
