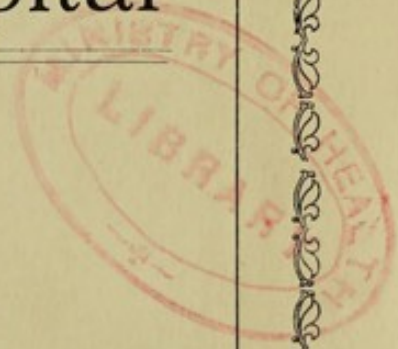

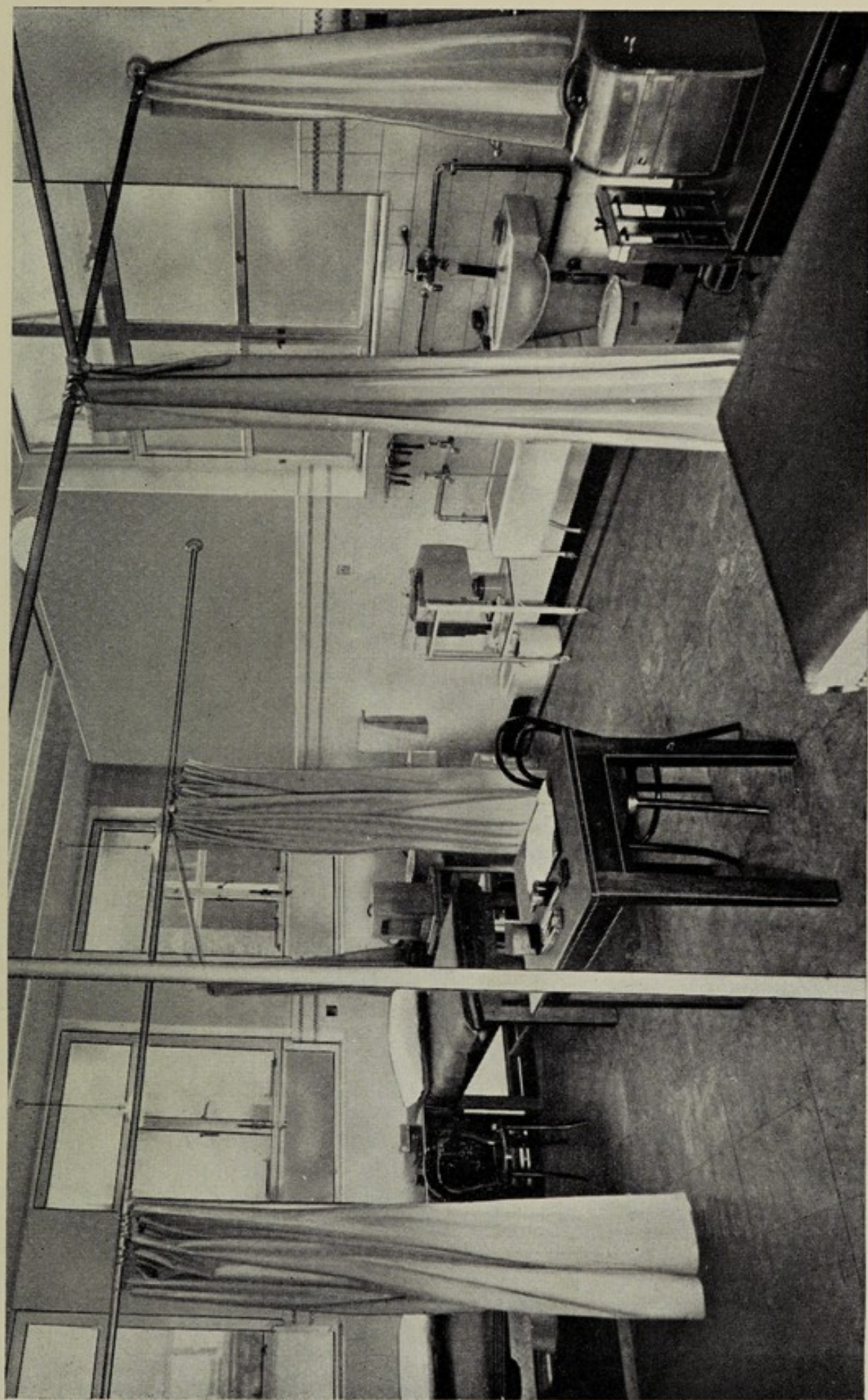

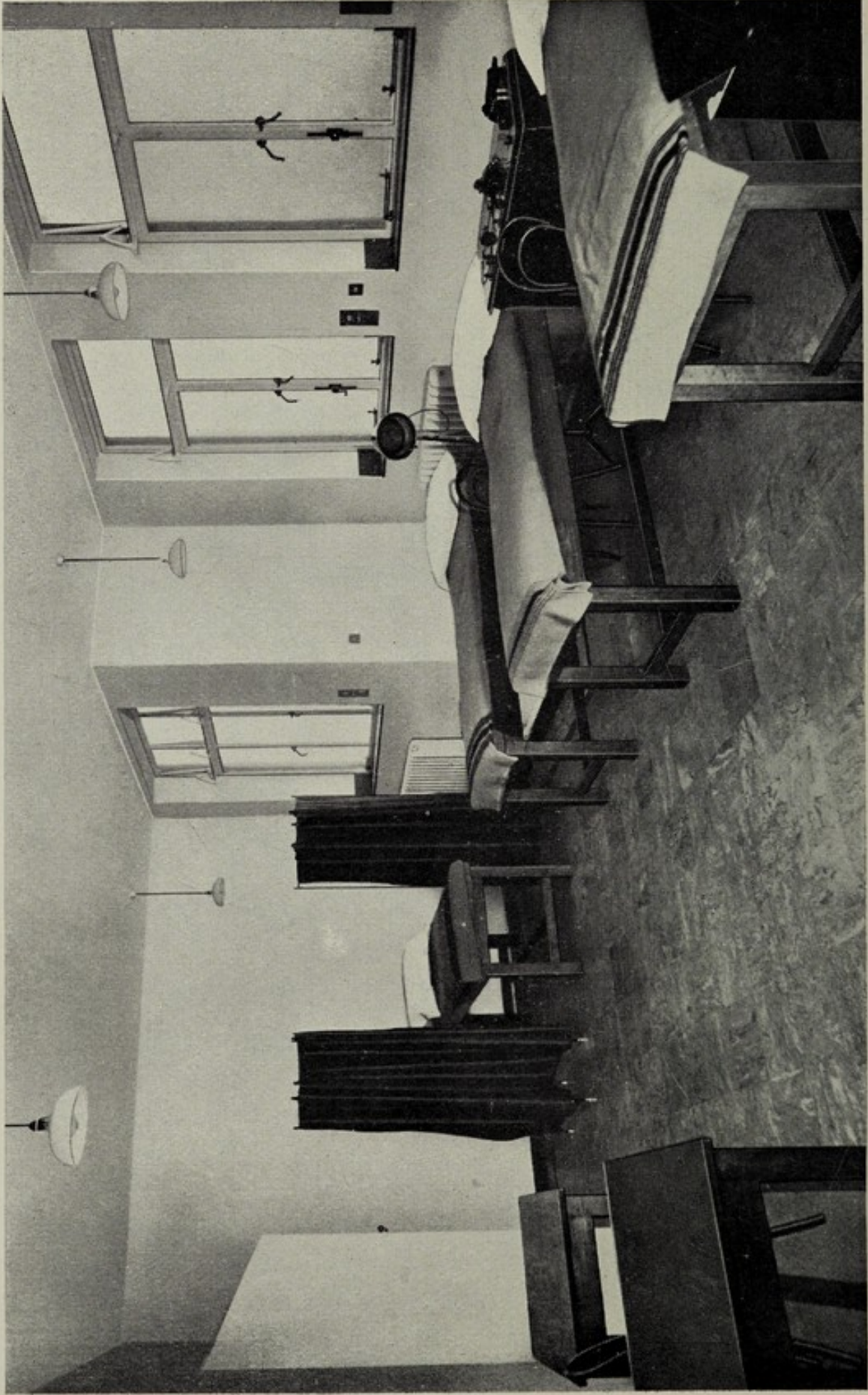

EXTRACT FROM RULES AND INSTRUCTIONS.

Patients attending the Out-Patient Department other than accident and emergency cases are requested to bring a letter from their Doctor and ascertain from him at which Department they should attend.

Surgical Out-patients are seen by the Surgeons or Assistant Surgeons. If In-patient treatment is required the name is entered on the waiting list, and the patient is admitted by the Resident Medical Officer to the next vacant bed of any Surgeon.

New Medical Out-patients are seen by the Physician and the Assistant Physician.

Members of Visiting Staff in charge of Special Departments see their own Out-patients.

Any patient who has been examined by a member of the Visiting Staff shall, where that member has beds in Hospital, be admitted under him.

A Gynaecological case which has been seen by one of the Physicians or General Surgeons in consultation before admission into the Hospital, may be admitted into a General Ward and be treated by such Physician or General Surgeon.

Cases of Genito-Urinary disease specially admitted under the Physicians or General Surgeons may continue to remain in the beds of and be treated by the Physicians or General Surgeons, unless they wish the case transferred to the Genito-Urinary Surgeon.

The Resident Medical Officer, acting on the instructions of the Board, is responsible for the admission of patients as the rules enact, that In-patients shall be deemed to be admitted and discharged by the Board.

PATIENTS' CONTRIBUTIONS.

Free treatment is provided for necessitous cases only.

Each In-patient is expected to contribute as his or her circumstances will permit, and to reimburse the Hospital the whole cost of maintenance if in a position to do so. This does not apply to members of the Contributory Scheme.

INSTRUCTIONS AS TO ADMISSION OF PATIENTS TO THE GENERAL WARDS.

The Hospital is not intended for chronic or incurable cases.

Patients for admission should attend for examination at the Out-Patient Department of the Hospital on the days and at the time appointed when notes of the cases are taken, and the names are passed to the Secretary to be entered on the waiting list.

No patient, other than a case of accident or emergency is admitted to the Hospital unless the name is on the waiting list; but if it is absolutely impossible for patients to attend at the Hospital for examination, they should ask their medical attendant to send particulars and preliminary diagnosis of the case to the Secretary at the Hospital. Due notice will be given in writing by the Secretary to each patient on the waiting list when there is a vacant bed.

To meet the requirements of the authorities, notice is hereby given that no one living outside the Borough will be admitted as a patient unless a Doctor certifies that such patient is free from infectious disease, and that there has been no infection in the house for three months. Form of certificate will be sent with notice of admission.

Medical Practitioners sending In-Patients are asked to assist the Management by giving the Secretary any information they can as to the patients' circumstances.

No person is admitted as a patient without a card if the patient is a contributor, except in case of accident or urgency, or necessitous patient.

Non-contributors admitted as emergencies, will be expected to reimburse the Hospital towards the cost of their treatment while there at the same rate as that fixed for cases sent in by Local Authorities, which at the present time is 8/- per day—a sum which is less than the actual cost to the Hospital. When the Patient is of such a financial position as to warrant transfer to a nursing home or to the Private Wards of the Hospital he will be transferred so soon as his condition permits.

Patients on admission are asked to state the names and addresses of relatives to be sent for in the event of grave emergency. These are notified when patients are on the danger list and permission is given for them to visit at any time.

Arrangements are also made, provided there is no interference with the work of the Hospital, for the legal advisers of patients to visit them any afternoon provided permission is first obtained from the Secretary's Office.

Each member of the Board of Management acts in rotation as a weekly visitor, and is prepared to consider any complaint or suggestion. Patients wishing to see this official visitor can notify the Secretary's clerk any morning.

Every person sent for admission as an In-patient must be decently clothed and provided with a change of Linen. This should consist of two shirts, two night-dresses, two pairs of stockings, one pair of slippers, hair brush, comb, tooth brush, two towels, two face flannels and soap.

Everything else is provided for an In-patient at the expense of the Hospital.

REGULATIONS FOR VISITING TO THE GENERAL WARDS.

ADULTS.

Two Visiting Cards are issued to each patient on admission so that the patient may send these cards to the nearest relatives or friends he desires to visit him.

The visitors to whom the cards are handed by the patient may transfer them to other visitors if they think fit, but will be responsible for their safe custody.

No visitor will be admitted who has not in his possession a visiting card.

The hours for visiting patients are Tuesdays and Sundays between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m.

Children under 16 years of age are not allowed to visit the Hospital or to enter the grounds of the Institution.

The entrance for visitors on Tuesdays and Sundays is from Ivy Street.

The regulations for visiting will not apply to patients on the "Danger List," the near relatives of whom are allowed to visit at all times on receiving notice to do so.

Persons coming from a house in which there is infectious disease are strictly forbidden to visit the Hospital.

Clergy and Ministers are allowed to visit members of their Churches at the patients' request any day between the hours of 2 p.m. and 4 p.m., providing such visits do not interfere with the work of the Ward.

Numerous visitors cause disorganisation of work and the Board therefore regrets it is unable to allow the wives of clergy and ministers, district visitors, subscribers or governors of the Hospital to visit patients except on regular visiting days.

Owing to lack of space, motor cars conveying visitors to patients cannot be allowed in the Hospital grounds.

Visitors must not give food or drink direct to any patient, but may deposit gifts of food or delicacies with the Sister in charge of the Ward, for a patient's consumption, subject to the Doctor's approval.

CHILDREN.

No visiting is allowed to child patients under the age of twelve years, except to those on the danger list and under special circumstances to those who have been in Hospital for a long period. If a child has been in Hospital more than a month and there is no infectious disease in the home, a permit will, on application, be issued to the parent or guardian to visit once a month. If there has been infectious disease in the home, a Medical certificate of freedom from the infection must be obtained and produced at the Hospital before the permit will be issued.

PRIVATE PATIENTS.

Visiting daily from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m.

THE BARTLET CONVALESCENT HOME AT FELIXSTOWE.

This Home is managed by a Committee appointed by the Board of the East Suffolk and Ipswich Hospital under the scheme approved by the Court for the regulation of this Trust.

Admission to the East Suffolk and Ipswich Hospital now carries with it the benefit of admission to this Convalescent Home, if necessary. When in the opinion of the Medical Staff, the treatment of any patient can be equally well continued in the Convalescent Home, the patient will be transferred there provided that accommodation is available. The transport to and from Felixstowe will be undertaken by the Hospital and free treatment provided at the Home for members of the Contributory Scheme. Other patients are expected to contribute towards the cost of their maintenance. The Home, situated on a valuable site facing the sea and abutting on Undercliff Road, Felixstowe, provides accommodation for men, women and children, and is equipped and staffed as a branch Hospital or Home of recovery.

The 101st ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT TO THE
GOVERNORS OF THE EAST SUFFOLK AND IPSWICH
HOSPITAL, PRESENTED BY THE CHAIRMAN.

This Report contains a record of the past year's work and a reference to finance as revealed by the audited accounts for the year 1937, and it also refers to outstanding events which have occurred during the past two months.

A NEW DEPARTMENT.

The chief event of the year 1938 was the official opening of the Orthopaedic Out-Patient Department and Fracture Clinic by the Rt. Honourable Sir Kingsley Wood M.P., Minister of Health, on 8th February.

In our last Annual Report we mentioned that the cost of the new building would be defrayed by a donation of £3,000 from Sir Bunnell H. Burton, and £3,000 from Sir William A. Churchman, but at that time we did not know how the money could be found for the equipment of the department. By a generous donation of £1,500 from Lord and Lady Belstead, the building was equipped and opened complete in every respect and free of debt.

As the work of this department is so closely associated with that of the Local Authorities, the opening ceremony was arranged in collaboration with them, and the Board of Management gratefully acknowledges the generosity of his Worship The Mayor, Councillor George Underwood, in inviting the members of the Board to the civic luncheon which he gave at the Town Hall on that occasion.

The work of the department commenced on 1st September, 1936, and until a few days before the official opening, had been carried on in improvised premises.

SCHEME FOR NEW WARD BLOCK.

The Accident Ward of 34 beds provides accommodation for the male adult patients suffering from fractures and orthopaedic conditions. No such accommodation, however, exists for the female cases, and the rapid increase in the numbers of these patients has had a most serious effect on our waiting list and calls for our immediate attention. Equally serious is the position with regard to the gynaecological waiting list. The extension of this ward to make provision for these cases can be easily accomplished from the building point of view, but it would put out of commission for some months both the Accident Ward and the Gynaecological Ward above it. Such a step, therefore, cannot be contemplated until temporary accommodation has been provided elsewhere. Hence we have decided to proceed, so soon as the money is available, with a new Ward Block for female fracture and orthopaedic cases, using the new block as soon as erected for gynaecological cases while the extension of that ward is being made.

THE NURSING PROBLEM.

Never in the history of the voluntary hospitals of this country has such prominence been given to the nursing service as it has received during the past twelve months, and perhaps never before in time of peace has the number of nurses in this country fallen so short of requirements. This is not due to lack of entrants, but to a rapid expansion of hospitals and the increased demand for trained nurses. Difficulties were experienced here last August, and we decided to close a ward for a few weeks rather than curtail the holidays of any of our nursing staff. At the close of the financial year we had, and at the present moment we have, a full staff of 165 of all ranks. We are anxious, however, that everyone should know the advantages of this hospital as a training school so that our numbers may not only be maintained, but increased, to cover the requirements of contemplated new wards.

For several months a special Committee has been engaged in considering all the different phases of the nursing problem as it affects this Hospital. On the recommendation of this Committee we have already agreed to certain measures for the benefit of the nursing staff. In considering the nurses' working hours we are in entire agreement with the principle of a 96-hour fortnight, and we gradually shall introduce such a schedule.

We have fixed a new scale of salaries for the trained staff which, with emoluments, will entail an additional annual expenditure of approximately £2,000. We do not, however, consider any alteration should be made in the existing scale for probationers in training, which is already above the average. Salary is not the most important factor for trainees. Especial attention is being paid to the comfort, recreation, food and general well-being of the probationers.

A re-organisation of the system of serving meals to night nurses has been carried out. A substantial hot midnight meal is now served in the central dining room, and extra off-duty time is allowed to night nurses. This arrangement has entailed an augmentation of both nursing and domestic staffs.

The advantage of having a separate residence for Sisters has been advocated in certain quarters. Be that as it may, we were forced into the position of having to obtain further accommodation for our nursing staff and we were fortunate in securing suitable near-by premises which we equipped especially for our Sisters. It is satisfactory to note that they are very pleased with their new quarters.

With the increase in our work, the shortened hours of duty, and consequent increase of staff, further development must be made within a few years and we look forward to the time when we shall have a large central home for our nurses with every modern facility.

NURSES' EXAMINATIONS.

The examination results of candidates trained at this Hospital have been most satisfactory. In the Hospital examinations the percentage of passes was 97, and in the State examinations, 87.5.

Despite this however, we consider that the Test Educational Examination has been introduced at a most unfortunate time. We also consider that the examination syllabus and the questions put by State Examiners require investigation.

We have decided to abolish the Hospital examination as such, but to institute a test preliminary to the State Examination. We are pleased that one of our Nurses qualified for the Gold Medal, and are gratified by the general high standard shown by the examination results and in practical work. We extend our thanks to the Matron, Miss S. Shaw, to the members of our administrative staff, to the Ward Sisters, and to all those serving under her.

PATIENTS.

Increases are shown in all departments, but a better idea will be gained by comparing the following figures:—

Average occupied beds 316.38 as against 304.13, and increase of 4.02%.

New out-patients 25,253 as against 21,177, an increase of 19.24%.

Attendances registered 106,809 as against 94,672, an increase of 12.82%.

Despite the activities of the year, the general waiting list has crept up to 300 and we are greatly concerned with the women's list, particularly gynaecological cases and fractures.

DIETARY.

The meals provided for patients on ordinary diet are as follows:—

- 6 a.m. Cup of tea with biscuits.
- 8 a.m. Breakfast, consisting of tea, bread, butter, porridge, egg, bacon, fish, sausages or potted meat.
- 10 a.m. Cup of bovril or milk, etc.
- 12 noon. Dinner, consisting of meat, potatoes, vegetables, milk pudding, or suet pudding, etc.
- 4 p.m. Tea. Tea, bread and butter, jam or cake.
- 7 p.m. Cup of cocoa or hot milk with a piece of bread and butter or biscuit.

Representations have been made to us that there is a long lapse of time between tea and breakfast, and we have authorised a more substantial supper to patients whose conditions necessitate more nourishment.

MILK SUPPLIES.

Milk is one of the principal items of invalid dietary, if not the most important. Our milk bill for 1937 amounted to £2,431 and it is a matter of some concern to us that we are now paying £395 more for the same quantity than in 1933.

In a statement issued by The British Hospitals Association it is shown that there has been an advance of £500,000 in the cost of milk to the voluntary hospitals under present regulations and apparently no means of redress despite the fact that the suppliers are willing and anxious to meet the hospitals.

RATING.

Of greater importance than the price of milk is the subject of assessment of hospital buildings, including nurses' quarters. We welcome the action of The British Hospitals Association in the steps taken to promote a Bill for the de-rating of voluntary hospitals, and we appeal to Members of Parliament to support that measure when the time comes.

WORKING EXPENSES.

Is it surprising that the working expenses have increased? The average cost per occupied bed per week is £3 5s. 5d. as against £3 2s. 4d. in the previous year, an increase of approximately 5% which we understand is less than the average increase shown in the majority of the greater hospitals. Our budget for the ensuing year, however, presages unavoidably heavier commitments. The possibility of running a modern hospital on the small costs of pre-war days is gone for ever.

INCOME AND EXPENDITURE.

A small increase over the previous year's figure makes another record for the contributory scheme with a total income of £36,705—a really splendid result, which calls forth our warmest thanks to all concerned, especially to the Honorary Collectors. The total of voluntary gifts is slightly above that of the previous year, but a decrease in annual subscriptions is deplored. We make a very strong appeal for new subscriptions. It is so difficult to find new-comers who will take the place of our old generous supporters as they die out. While we are indebted to all our subscribers, donors and organisers of entertainments, we would especially wish to thank the Hon. A. J. Watson for his organisation of polo matches which resulted in £287 17s. 1d. for the hospital.

The ordinary expenditure has reached the rather alarming figure of £60,979, an increase of £5,415 over the previous year, consequent upon a 5% increase in patients and a sharp advance in the price of many commodities.

On capital account it is pleasing to announce the receipt of £2,500 for endowments, £2,000 being from legacies and £500 for the endowment of a cot in celebration of the golden wedding of the Hon. Douglas and Mrs. Tollemache.

The legacies for general purposes amounted to £2,456 4s. 9d. the amount being transferred to property account for the purchase and equipment of a Sisters' Home.

TINFOIL.

As a result of tinfoil collection a sum of £500 has been accumulated and a cot endowed—thanks to the untiring energies of our many collectors. A substantial start has been made towards a further endowment. While we do not accept coupons nor collect used postage stamps, we earnestly appeal for tinfoil and leadfoil which have a cash value.

INVESTMENTS.

Our investments consist substantially in endowment funds, the amount of free capital being negligible. The fall in the market value of securities between 1st January and 31st December, 1937, was considerable, resulting in a depreciation in the Hospital investments of £3,050, and in those of the Bartlet Trust of £6,975.

PRIVATE WARD ACCOUNTS.

For the first time the income for the year has exceeded the expenditure, but only to the extent of £83 16s. 3d., thus reducing the accumulated deficit on revenue to £1,273 9s. 8d.

The incidence of occupied beds has increased by 10.29% and the membership of the Private Patients' Subscription Scheme by 17.51%. The popularity of the wards increases, and the thanks of the patients so freely given are passed on to the donors by whose generosity the scheme for the treatment of persons of moderate means on strictly moderate payments was made possible.

LINEN GUILD.

Some 2,000 copies of the report of the Linen Guild have been distributed to its members. It contains a record of a really wonderful work which is of great assistance to the Hospital, and for which we tender our cordial thanks.

SAMARITAN FUND.

The work of the fund has shown a remarkable increase during the year, and the assistance given to needy patients has been greatly appreciated. The annual statement of the fund and Almoner's work will be incorporated in our annual report book, and is worth perusal.

LIBRARY.

One of the new features of the year has been the organisation of a library for patients. We are indebted to the Right Honourable the Earl of Stradbroke for a generous donation of £100 for the library fixtures and we have to thank the many donors of books which have gone to make up a library of 3,500 volumes, but in particular, we would thank our Honorary Librarian, Mr. A. J. Colthorpe, through whose untiring efforts the new scheme was initiated and organised and we ask him to extend these thanks to all those who are engaged in the distribution of the books.

AUXILIARIES.

We cannot of course, in this report, thank everyone who has helped the Hospital during the past year, but we ask them one and all to accept the gratitude of the patients. While it is invidious to differentiate, we must make special mention of the Clergy and Ministers, railway officials and police.

OBITUARY.

We record with sincere regret the death of Mr. F. Gladstone Hines, whose services in an advisory capacity on pharmaceutical subjects was of great value.

MEDICAL STAFF, VISITING AND RESIDENT.

Again we place on record our sincere thanks for the valuable services gratuitously and willingly given to the Hospital by the members of our Visiting Medical Staff. Their best reward must be the sincere gratitude of the patients. We would extend our thanks to the Honorary Dental Surgeons whose assistance is such a valuable adjunct, also to Dr. G. F. Langley for his able and loyal service, and to all members of the Resident Medical Staff.

THE VOLUNTARY HOSPITAL'S COMMISSION.

The Commission's report issued last April foreshadows a new era in Voluntary Hospital organisation. While great changes in co-ordination and control will probably take place it is with some satisfaction that we find that the Commission's recommendations concerning a key hospital of this type have already been substantially carried out in this Institution.

THE BARTLET CONVALESCENT HOME.

Although the number of patients transferred was slightly less than in the previous record year, the Home has fulfilled its function more as an auxilliary hospital than as a convalescent home, the majority of the patients having been transferred as stretcher cases.

It will be seen from the statistical tables attached to the annual report that the average cost per occupied bed per week was £2 1s. 9d. as against £1 18s. 6d. in the previous year. This increase follows the curve of advanced prices and working expenses in all similar institutions.

Expenditure exceeded income by £55 19s. 7d. The market value of investments on capital account shows a depreciation of £6,974 16s. 5d., but as it was not necessary to sell out any of the securities no actual loss was sustained.


We view with some anxiety the probability of a loss in dividend income in the near future, consequent upon having to replace investments due for repayment in other trustee securities which will not bear the same rate of interest.

The Convalescent Home Committee, the Medical Superintendent (Dr. G. F. Langley), the Matron (Miss K. J. Jenkins) and the Nursing Staff of the Home have received the unqualified thanks of the patients who have convalesced at Felixstowe under their care during the year. We add our thanks to those of the patients.

ADMINISTRATION.

We wish once again to put on record our grateful thanks to Mr. Arthur Griffiths for another year of strenuous and efficient work in his difficult and exacting position as Secretary of this Hospital, and in doing so we wish to include in our thanks all the members of his staff for their faithful services.

Mr. Griffiths is more and more called upon to share in the work of hospital administration from a National point of view, and it is undoubtedly due to this that we are so fully and promptly informed of all that takes place in the sphere of Voluntary Hospitals throughout the country.

The work in this Department has again shown a substantial increase of 40.8% over that for the previous year. The specimens from outside sources have shown an equal increase.

RADIUM.—As is to be expected, radium therapy is now less experimental than when first introduced, and now the cases that receive it are only those for whom it has been proven to be beneficial. It is practically only in Gynaecological and Dermatological cases that it is now used, but here it produces unrivalled results.

AUTOPSIES.—It is gratifying to note that the number of these examinations has maintained the increase observed last year, and we are grateful for the opportunity of performing them.

As usual our work has been facilitated by the co-operation of the Medical Staff and Board of Management, to whom our thanks are due.

REPORT OF THE PSYCHOLOGICAL CLINIC.

For the Year 1937.

It is again my pleasure to submit a report on another year's work in the Out-patient's department of the Hospital.

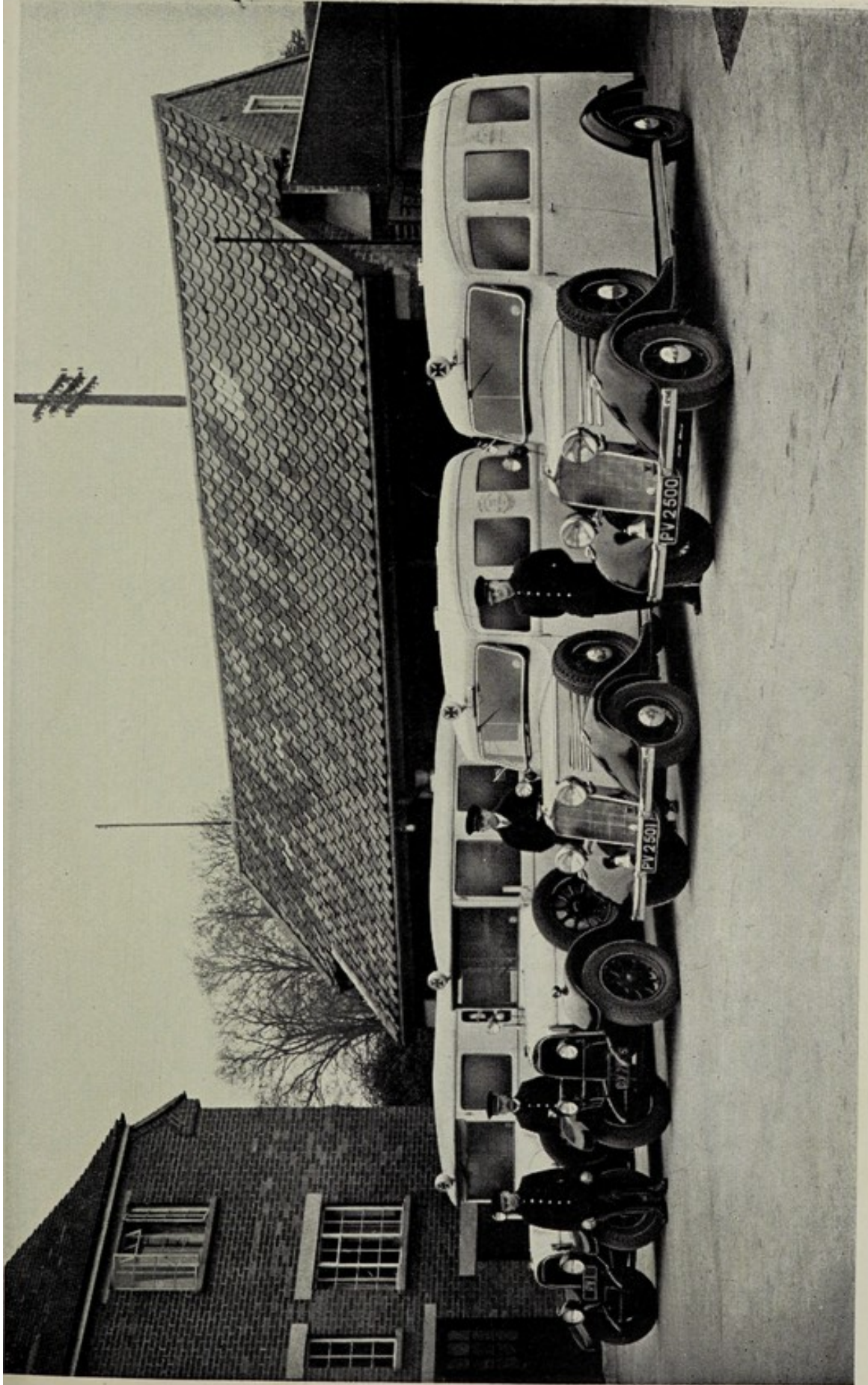
One hundred new patients (56 females, 44 males) were referred for advice and treatment. This is the highest number recorded in one year so far, and 25 in excess of the previous twelve months. The attendances numbered 253. This number is lower than in previous years, but is accounted for by the fact that chronic types of patients are being referred to their own medical advisers, thereby permitting more lengthy investigation into cases which are likely to benefit from Psychotherapeutic measures.

One afternoon weekly is still devoted to the work and visits to the Wards are made when requested. The scope of the Clinic is undoubtedly increasing owing to the co-operation of the medical practitioners of the district.

My best thanks are due to all those members of the Staff who so willingly assist me.

Report for the Year 1937.

The income for the past year amounted to £1,040 6s. 9d., made up of patients' contributions £649 18s. 2d., contributions by Local Authorities and Societies on behalf of patients, £355 16s. 11d., subscriptions, dividends and interest, £34 11s. 8d. The expenditure was £1,176 13s. 9d., and it was necessary at the end of the year to apply to the Funds of the Hospital for a grant, £136 7s. 0d., to meet the deficiency.

There have been 669 appliances supplied as against 341 the previous year. The following is a summary:—

There has been a considerable increase in the number of appliances supplied, and it is gratifying to record that patients have been able to provide a substantial quota of the cost, in many cases by instalments.

Grants from the Approved Societies have been given, and the increased help from Public Assistance Committees and Local Authorities has been much appreciated by the recipients.

Needy patients have been assisted through the special section of this Fund, and fares for rail or bus have been given to 58 patients during the year.

THE EAST SUFFOLK AND IPSWICH HOSPITAL.

Almoner's Department.

Report for the Year 1937.

At the end of another very busy year, during which the work has increased both in scope and volume, we pause for a moment to reflect on all that has passed since the last report, and we cannot but wonder at the endless variety of problems that have arisen day by day.

The statistics on pages 38-39 will show the increase in numbers of patients admitted and those treated in the Out-patient Department, but, of course, the real work of the Almoner's Department cannot be calculated in figures or written on paper.

At the end of the day there sometimes seems very little to show for the long time spent in conversations with patients, but many have been admitted to the Wards, some two or three hundred interviewed in the Out-patient Department, and their particular needs have been attended to. Then there are those who have appealed for special help—fares paid, surgical appliances supplied, transfer to other Hospitals for special treatment, help obtained from Public Assistance Department, Charity Organisation, etc., a chat over some special difficulty, suggestion regarding special diet, the supply of dentures or clothes, and the interviewing of a patient who refuses to come into Hospital, the reason discovered and the difficulty overcome. Then, too, advice is often given regarding the making of a road accident claim.

A large proportion of the work of the Department is explained by the fact that 669 surgical appliances have been supplied during the year. The statistics of the Samaritan Fund will show how some of the cost has been recovered and the extent of grants which have been made.

Some 241 pairs of crutches have been loaned to In-patients leaving the Hospital during the year, also to those attending the Out-patient Department.

3. ROAD TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS.

4. AMBULANCE SERVICE.

The mileage covered by the ambulances for the year has been 42,714. This service is much appreciated by all who are unfortunate enough to need it, but it is a great boon, especially to those living in country districts.

5. BARTLET CONVALESCENT HOME.

We are in the very fortunate position of having our own Convalescent Home near at hand for the transfer of those to whom a short stay by the sea in congenial surroundings means so much. A period of convalescence before returning to take up normal duty in the home, on the land or in the workshop is often the best way of giving help. The many letters received is ample proof of gratitude for this important service.

One patient who had not had a day's outing for 25 years was in need of a holiday with medical supervision. She gained much benefit from three weeks at the Convalescent Home, and returned home to her duties once again able to carry on.

During the year 1,146 patients have been treated in the Bartlet Home, the average stay being 19 days.

6. OPINIONS OF PATIENTS.

The following phrases have been taken from some of the thousand letters of praise and gratitude received during 1937:—

“My treatment at the East Suffolk and Ipswich Hospital has been of the best. I am very grateful for the splendid service rendered whilst a patient. It is a Hospital that East Anglia should be proud of, being a wonderful organisation.”

“I cannot speak too highly of the treatment and services rendered to me at both the East Suffolk and Ipswich Hospital and the Bartlet Convalescent Home. In fact, I might say they were jointly a veritable ‘Home from Home’ and I do not think I can suggest a thing for any improvement whatever.”

“I do not think it possible to improve on the service maintained in the Hospital. Our King himself could not have more kindness or attention than which I received.”

“On behalf of my wife who has with this occasion been a patient three times, and also has my little girl some time ago, I would like to express my thanks and gratitude for the excellent facilities and services placed at their disposal through the Hospital, just as much for me a working man as for anyone better placed.”

7. BLOOD TRANSFUSIONS.

As the testing and grouping of donors is carried out by the Pathologist, the Board decided to place the whole organisation in his hands, hence no reference in my report as heretofore.

OBJECT OF THE GUILD.

The Linen Guild was formed in June, 1922, in connection with the East Suffolk and Ipswich Hospital for the purpose of replenishing annually the household linen and providing garments and other necessary comforts for the patients.

REPORT FOR 1937.

In presenting the Report of the East Suffolk and Ipswich Hospital Linen Guild the Committee once again wish to express to all Subscribers, Vice-Presidents, Secretaries and members their grateful thanks for continued generous support to the Guild.

The Annual Exhibition was held in the Hospital Lecture Hall on November 27th, 28th and 29th, from 10.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. each day, when members from nearly every Branch were present to view the display of goods, which from every point of view was remarkably good.

During the Exhibition, Mr. R. H. Paul, Chairman of the Board of Management of the Hospital, was present and in a few happily chosen words expressed his sincere appreciation of the Guild's efforts. He said he could not emphasize too strongly its value to the Hospital, and urged the members to continue in their good work and encourage others to do the same. He added that as the Hospital grows so do we hope that the Guild will reach its ideal of raising £1,000 annually in value of articles and subscriptions, which would cover the yearly outlay for the supply of linen.

The year's contribution consisted of 3,819 articles, including many beautiful blankets, sheets, quilts, operation gowns and towels, pillow cases and children's garments.

These were tastefully arranged on tables and all clearly labelled under the name of each Branch, enabling the members to quickly discover their own particular contribution and compare it with that sent in by other Branches. This creates a friendly rivalry and encourages the workers to do as well or better than their neighbours.

The contribution of goods was not quite equal to that of 1936, owing to the fact that several Branches had been unable to contribute. The subscriptions were less, too, but that has been generously made up by the Mason Branch, so that our Balance Sheet will not suffer.

The Committee sincerely regrets the loss by death of three valued Vice-Presidents and one Secretary. Mrs. Sopper, who for over 10 years had with her daughter organized a most successful branch at Martlesham. Mrs. Cracknell had also for 10 years carried on a splendid branch at Wickham Market and Miss Meinertzhagen and Mrs. Clarke a very useful branch for Rendham and district. We are very grateful to those ladies who have so kindly come forward and offered to carry on the work of these and other branches. Mrs. Pitt Miller, V.P. for Martlesham; Mrs. Keer, V.P. for Wickham Market; Mrs. Blois Brooke, V.P. for Ufford; Mrs. Barrett Lenard, V.P. for Semer; Mrs. Greenland, V.P. for Hintlesham and Chattisham.

The Guild consists of about 75 Branches with over 3,000 members, who have contributed this last year 3,819 articles valued at £476 5s., and subscriptions and donations amounted to £230 10s. 11d.

This is a very valuable gift to the Hospital, and our heartiest thanks go out to all who have helped to make the Linen Guild the success it is.

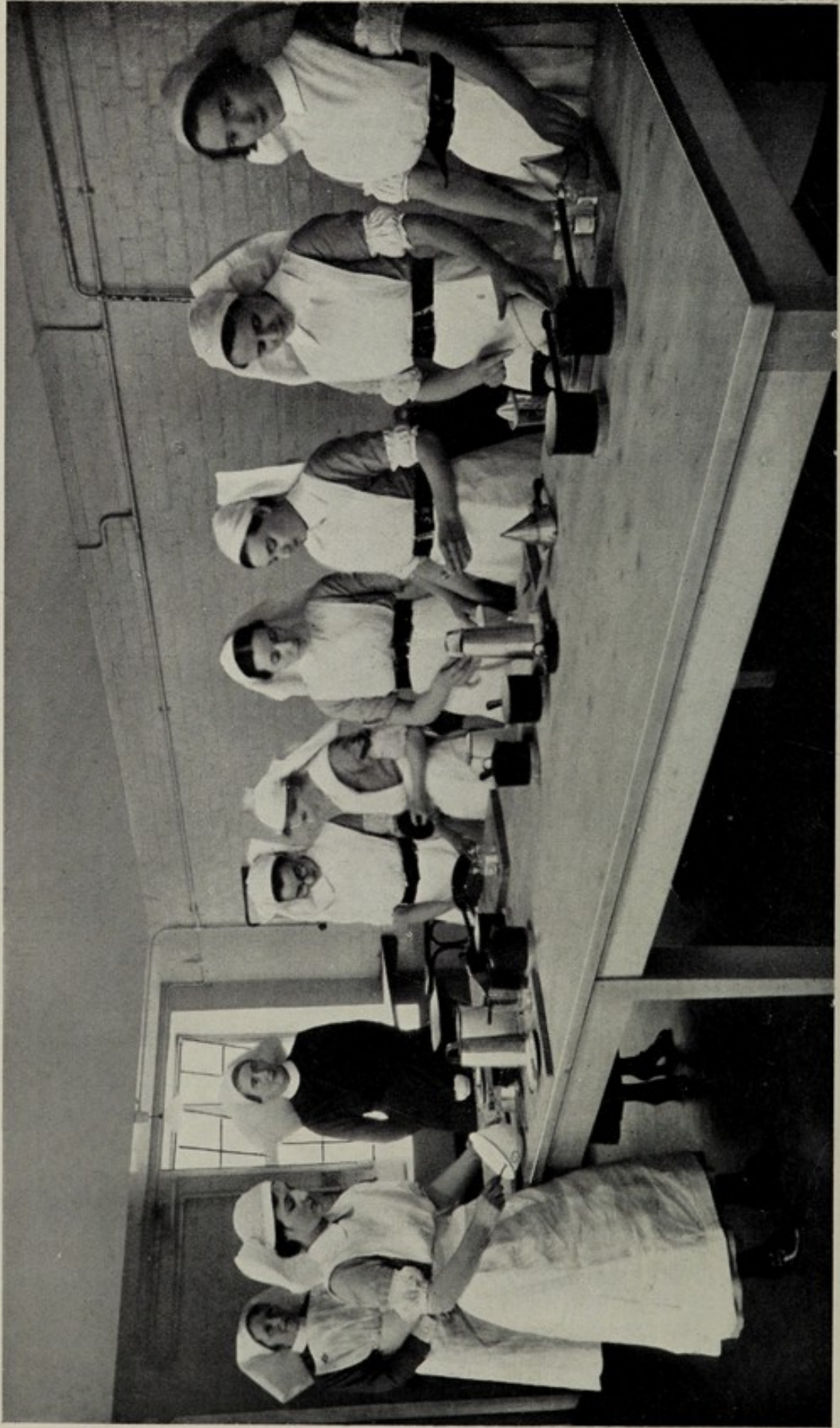

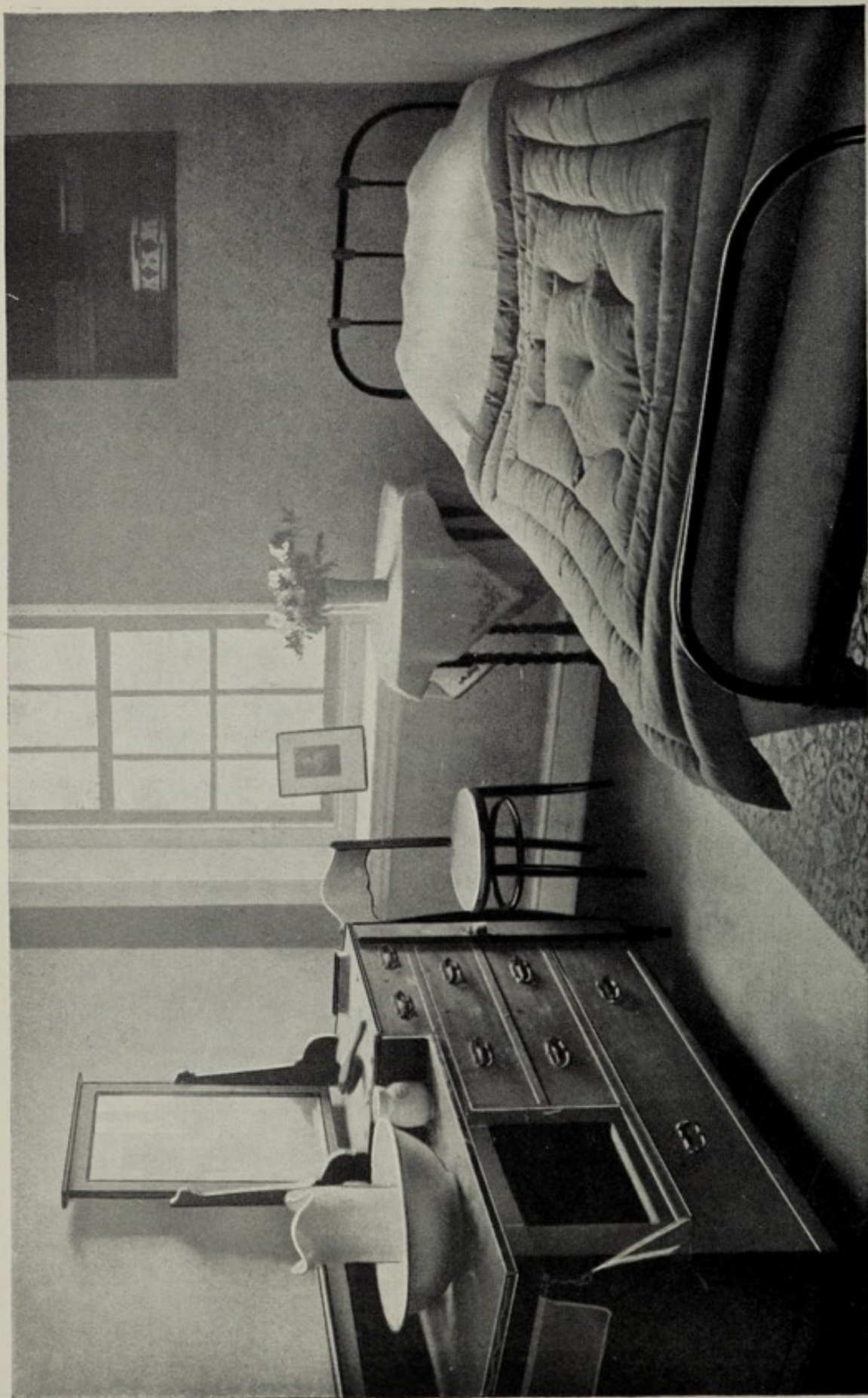

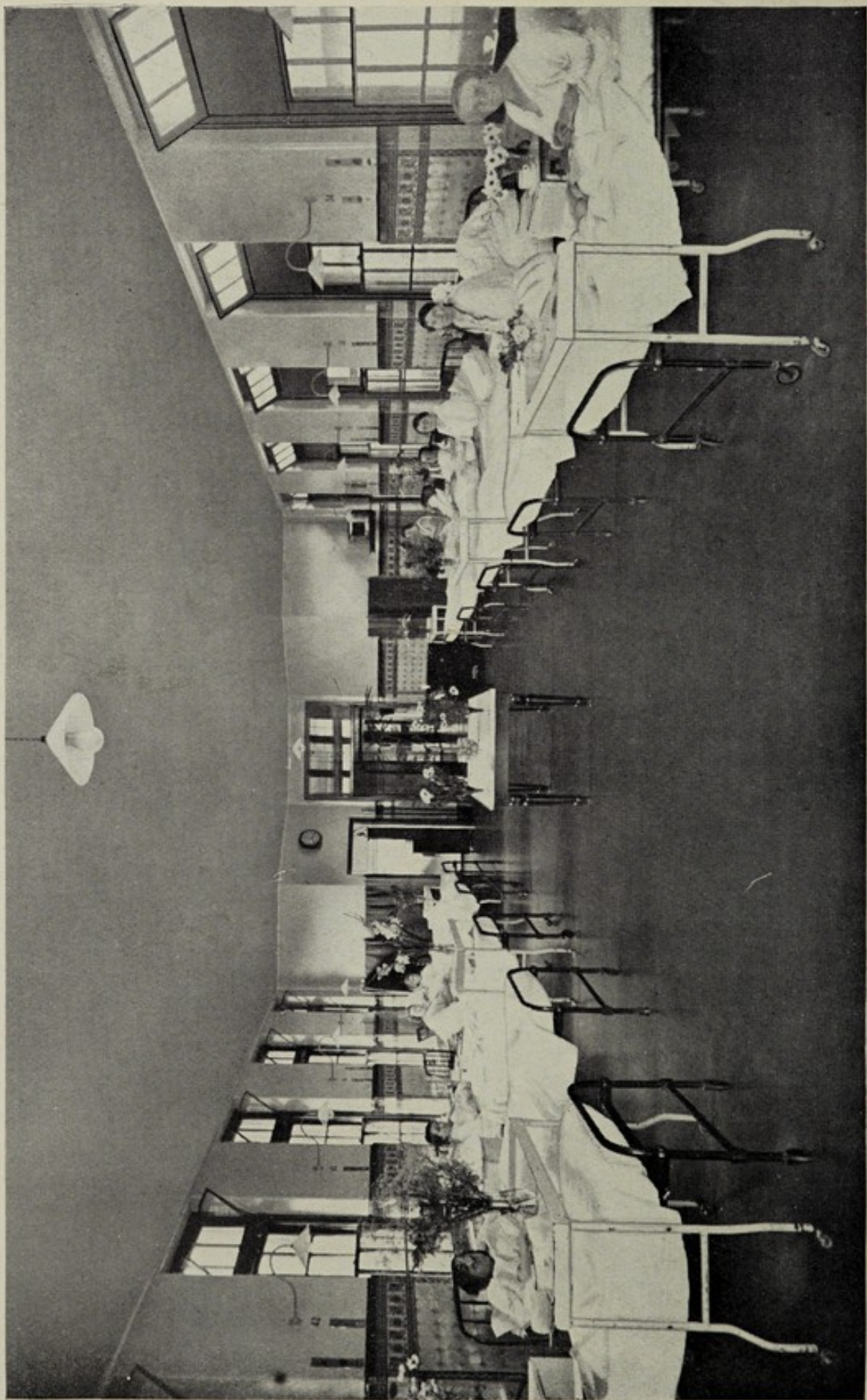
