





Patients attending the Out-Patient Department other than accident and emergency cases are requested to bring a letter from their Doctor and ascertain from him at which Department they should attend.

Surgical Out-patients are seen by the Surgeons or Assistant Surgeons. If In-patient treatment is required the name is entered on the waiting list, and the patient is admitted by the Resident Medical Officer to the next vacant bed of any Surgeon.

New Medical Out-patients are seen by the Physician and the Assistant Physician.

Members of Visiting Staff in charge of Special Departments see their own Out-patients.

Any patient who has been examined by a member of the Visiting Staff shall, where that member has beds in Hospital, be admitted under him.

A Gynaecological case which has been seen by one of the Physicians or General Surgeons in consultation before admission into the Hospital, may be admitted into a General Ward and be treated by such Physician or General Surgeon.

The Resident Medical Officer, acting on the instructions of the Board, is responsible for the admission of patients as the rules enact, that In-patients shall be deemed to be admitted and discharged by the Board.

PATIENTS' CONTRIBUTIONS.

Free treatment is provided for necessitous cases only.

Each In-patient is expected to contribute as his or her circumstances will permit, and to reimburse the Hospital the whole cost of maintenance if in a position to do so. This does not apply to members of the Contributory Scheme.

**INSTRUCTIONS AS TO ADMISSION OF PATIENTS TO THE
GENERAL WARDS.**

The Hospital is not intended for chronic or incurable cases.

Patients for admission should attend for examination at the Out-Patient Department of the Hospital on the days and at the times appointed when notes of the cases are taken, and the names are passed to the Secretary to be entered on the waiting list.

No patient, other than a case of accident or emergency is admitted to the Hospital unless the name is on the waiting list; but if it is absolutely impossible for patients to attend at the Hospital for examination, they should ask their medical attendant to send particulars and preliminary diagnosis of the case to the Secretary at the Hospital. Due notice will be given in writing by the Secretary to each patient on the waiting list when there is a vacant bed.

To meet the requirements of the authorities, notice is hereby given that no one living outside the Borough will be admitted as a patient unless a Doctor certifies that such patient is free from infectious disease, and that there has been no infection in the house for three months. Form of certificate will be sent with notice of admission.

Medical Practitioners sending In-Patients are asked to assist the Management by giving the Secretary any information they can as to the patients' circumstances.

No person is admitted as a patient without a card if the patient is a contributor, except in case of accident or urgency.

Non-contributors admitted as emergencies, or as a result of motor accidents, will be expected to reimburse the Hospital towards the cost of their treatment while there at the same rate as that fixed for cases sent in by Local Authorities, which at the present time is 8/- per day—a sum which is less than the actual cost to the Hospital.

When the Patient is of such a financial position as to warrant transfer to the private wards or a nursing home he will be transferred so soon as his condition permits.

Patients on admission are asked to state the names and addresses of relatives to be sent for in the event of grave emergency. These are notified when patients are on the danger list and permission is given for them to visit at any time.

Arrangements are also made, provided there is no interference with the work of the Hospital, for the legal advisers of patients to visit them any afternoon provided permission is first obtained from the Secretary's Office.

Each member of the Board of Management acts in rotation as a weekly visitor, and is prepared to consider any complaint or suggestion. Patients wishing to see this official visitor can notify the Secretary's clerk any morning.

Every person sent for admission as an In-patient must be decently clothed and provided with a change of Linen. This should consist of two night-dresses, (or in the case of men, two shirts or pyjamas,) also two pairs of stockings, one pair of slippers, hair brush, comb, tooth brush, two towels, two face flannels and soap.

Ordinary razors or knives may not be brought into Hospital by patients, or supplied to them by their friends.

Patients are allowed to bring safety razors, but these must be handed to the Ward Sister who will decide when the patients can use them.

REGULATIONS FOR VISITING TO THE GENERAL WARDS.

ADULTS.

Two Visiting Cards are issued to each patient on admission so that the patient may send these cards to the nearest relatives or friends he desires to visit him.

The visitors to whom the cards are handed by the patient may transfer them to other visitors if they think fit, but will be responsible for their safe custody.

No visitor will be admitted who has not in his possession a visiting card.

The hours for visiting patients are Tuesdays and Sundays between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m.

Children under 16 years of age are not allowed to visit the Hospital or to enter the grounds of the Institution.

The entrance for visitors on Tuesdays and Sundays is from Ivry Street.

The regulations for visiting will not apply to patients on the "Danger List," the near relatives of whom are allowed to visit at all times on receiving notice to do so.

Persons coming from a house in which there is infectious disease are strictly forbidden to visit the Hospital.

Clergy and Ministers are allowed to visit members of their Churches at the patients' request any day between the hours of 2 p.m. and 4 p.m., providing such visits do not interfere with the work of the Ward.

Numerous visitors cause disorganisation of work and the Board therefore regrets it is unable to allow the wives of clergy and ministers, district visitors, subscribers or governors of the Hospital to visit patients except on regular visiting days.

Owing to lack of space, motor cars conveying visitors to patients cannot be allowed in the Hospital grounds.

Visitors must not give food or drink direct to any patient, but may deposit gifts of food or delicacies with the Sister in charge of the Ward, for a patient's consumption, subject to the Doctor's approval.

CHILDREN.

No visiting is allowed to child patients under the age of twelve years, except to those on the danger list and under special circumstances to those who have been in Hospital for a long period. If a child has been in Hospital more than a month and there is no infectious disease in the home, a permit will, on application, be issued to the parent or guardian to visit once a month. If there has been infectious disease in the home, a Medical certificate of freedom from the infection must be obtained and produced at the Hospital before the permit will be issued.

PRIVATE PATIENTS.

Visiting daily from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m.

THE BARTLET CONVALESCENT HOME

AT FELIXSTOWE.

This Home is managed by a Committee appointed by the Board of the East Suffolk and Ipswich Hospital under the scheme approved by the Court for the regulation of this Trust.

Admission to the East Suffolk and Ipswich Hospital now carries with it the benefit of admission to this Convalescent Home, if necessary. When in the opinion of the Medical Staff, the treatment of any patient can be equally well continued in the Convalescent Home, the patient will be transferred there provided that accommodation is available. The transport to and from Felixstowe will be undertaken by the Hospital and free treatment provided at the Home for members of the Contributory Scheme. Other patients are expected to contribute towards the cost of their maintenance. The Home, situated on a valuable site facing the sea and abutting on Undercliff Road, Felixstowe, provides accommodation for men, women and children, and is equipped and staffed as a branch Hospital or Home of recovery.

The 102nd ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT TO THE
GOVERNORS OF THE EAST SUFFOLK AND IPSWICH
HOSPITAL, PRESENTED BY THE CHAIRMAN.

PREAMBLE.

It has always been my wish to reduce this annual statement to the shortest possible dimensions in the hope that the Governors and general public would read it through. I regret it has been impossible to do so on this occasion, as events of outstanding significance demanding more than a cursory reference, have taken place.

A GREAT EVENT.

The chief event of 1938 was the official opening on 8th February, by the Rt. Hon. Sir Kingsley Wood, M.P. (then Minister of Health), of the Orthopaedic Out-patient Department and Fracture Clinic. Particulars of the new building were given in our last annual statement and in the special booklet issued for the occasion.

MORE BEDS REQUIRED FOR WOMEN. A NEW WARD BLOCK AND AN EXTENSION OF THE GYNAECOLOGICAL WARD.

The scheme foreshadowed in our last report has taken definite shape. The plans have been approved by the Local Authority whose representatives in conference with ours agreed the scheme. The detailed drawings for the Quantity Surveyor have been prepared and we hope shortly to be in a position to obtain tenders. The major part of the old barrack building, acquired some 10 years ago, has already been adapted and used for hospital purposes, and the remaining portion has recently been reconstructed at a comparatively small cost to form an essential annexe to the proposed new ward block. The estimated cost of the whole scheme is £25,000, for which we hope shortly to make an appeal.

This will be known as "The 1940 Extension Scheme."

PROPOSED REGIONAL RADIUM CENTRE.

The Cancer Bill now before Parliament has given prominence to the subject of radium and publicity to the ravages of cancer. The greater voluntary hospitals of this country have raised and expended millions of pounds in research, diagnosis and treatment of this terrible disease. Indeed it is an incontrovertible fact that the vast majority of these services have been and are being provided under the voluntary

system. While we have done our part in the past, we recognise our responsibility for a great work which lies ahead. The following short statement of our position appears to be warranted:—

A few years ago Sir William Burton, K.B.E. gave £3,500 for radium, which was purchased on expert advice and has been in constant use since its acquisition. When the X-Ray department which formed part of the last great extension scheme was designed, a new department for medium or surface X-Ray therapy was installed, but the question of the installation of deep X-Ray therapy, which was then somewhat in the experimental stage, was postponed. Treatment by deep X-Ray has now been linked to that of radium and the apparatus has been standardised. In 1936 we were asked to form a Regional Radium Centre at this hospital, and the subject has been constantly before us ever since. Difficulties so far insuperable have prevented the accomplishment of this scheme, not the least being the difficulty of obtaining the specialist services of a Radiation Officer to take charge of the centre and in co-ordinating the scheme with other Hospitals. In the meantime, progress has been made in the treatment of cancer along scientific lines. Patients requiring deep X-Ray therapy are transferred to one of the greater London hospitals on our financial responsibility. Excellent results have been obtained from our medium therapy set in certain selected cases, while for other suitable cases we have purchased radon seeds. Over 6 per cent. of all our in-patients are suffering from cancer in one of its forms.

On the 2nd November, 1938, we asked our Secretary, Mr. Arthur Griffiths, to obtain information on the subject of Regional Radium Centres and Deep X-Ray therapy, and to present a report thereon. This report was presented on 31st December, 1938, and it received the careful consideration of our Joint Committee, on whose recommendation we are now endeavouring to ascertain if it is possible to secure the services of a Radiation Officer with the necessary qualifications and experience. The report has been reviewed by experts, including the National Radium Commission, which states:—

“The Commission was impressed by the completeness of the report and by the interest which it displays in the subject of cancer treatment, and gathers that it is the desire of the Ipswich Hospital to proceed with the organisation of a Regional Radium Centre.”

Despite the many obstacles in our way we hope, during the ensuing year, to be able to proceed with the scheme.

NATIONAL EMERGENCY.

The splendid record of this hospital's achievement in the Great War is still fresh in our minds and the members of the Board of to-day are as anxious as those who formed the Board in 1914 that that record shall be maintained in any national emergency which may occur now or hereafter. Some extra expense was incurred last September, and additional subsequent expenditure. We consider it is our

obvious duty to maintain a standard of efficiency, a constant system of modernisation and an adequate reserve of equipment to meet any emergencies whether of a local or national character.

NEW HOSPITAL REGIONS.

This Institution has been scheduled as a key Hospital, but it was first necessary to carry out certain re-organisations and alterations of our regulations to comply with the requirement of the Provisional Central Council set up under the Sankey Commission. The formation of the new County Regions is proceeding and when complete, a Divisional Council will be elected. Collaboration with Local Authorities will be an essential part of the scheme.

PATIENTS.

The work in all wards and throughout all departments has been of a most intensive character.

The number of in-patients treated to a conclusion was 6,595. The average number of patients resident daily throughout the year, 323. New out-patients numbered 28,687 and the number of attendances registered was 130,441. All these are record figures. The average number of days each patient was resident was 17.87, the lowest figure recorded.

Notwithstanding the enormous effort put forth to deal with patients, the waiting list still increases and the need for further accommodation which will be provided in the new ward block becomes daily more insistent.

THE ORTHOPAEDIC DEPARTMENT.

The phenomenal increase in the number of out-patients, as mentioned in the preceding paragraph, is consequent upon the inauguration and successful operation of this new department, where no fewer than 49,444 out-patient attendances for special treatment and 4122 for Radiography were registered during the year.

This indicates the magnitude of the special work which the hospital has undertaken.

In our last Annual Report we mentioned the fact that the work of the new Orthopaedic and Fracture Department was closely associated with that of the Local Authorities.

The greater Voluntary Hospitals of this country were called upon to set up these departments. We feel we have complied with the recommendations of the Inter-departmental Committee, other Committees and Associations by providing a special service for the community, the responsibility for which would otherwise have fallen upon the Local Authorities.

The East Suffolk County Council, in collaboration with this hospital, has appointed a whole-time specially qualified orthopaedic nurse for duty in the country parishes and attendance at our clinic.

INCOME AND EXPENDITURE.

The most encouraging feature of the year's income is the amount received from the contributory scheme, a record figure of £37,680. We desire to express our special thanks to the Honorary Collectors, our gratitude to those who have rendered voluntary assistance in the works and offices and our appreciation of the support of all contributors.

It is with pleasure that we report increases under the heads of annual subscriptions, donations and entertainments, while the receipts on account of services rendered follow the upward curve of the work done.

Our Capital Account has been augmented by £4,900 from free legacies and £1,500 from legacies for endowment. Particulars of these are given in our statement of accounts.

It would be invidious to differentiate between our generous supporters, and impossible to mention all, but we must not forget the most acceptable addition to our funds of £553 12s. 3d. from the Ipswich Town Football Club as the result of the Hospital Cup Match.

The total revenue income is a record figure of £68,095, while the expenditure on revenue account is also a record of £67,770, hence there is a small balance of income over expenditure of £325 which is satisfactory.

The total expenditure under six of the main heads shows very little variance from that of the previous year.

Increases are shown under the heads of Surgery Account—drugs, instruments, apparatus and X-Ray films; Domestic Account—coal; and Salaries Account for augmented staff and increased salaries, especially in the nursing section. The new regulations under the Unemployment Act which brought in domestic workers have also added to our expenditure.

The average cost of each in-patient per week has been £3 6s. 6d. as against £3 5s. 5d. Whilst this represents the highest cost on record, it is not caused by extravagance, but by circumstances over which we have no control, nor is there likely to be any reduction in the future.

Our budget for the ensuing year shows no great divergence from that of 1938, except that a considerable increase is foreshadowed in the expenditure on salaries and emoluments of our nursing staff, following a record high figure for the year under review. Possibly there will be a further increase in the expenditure for domestic workers undertaking some of the duties previously scheduled to probationers.

EQUIPMENT.

A sum of £3,216 has been expended during the year on surgical instruments, appliances, apparatus and X-Ray films. The general equipment of the Hospital has been maintained at the high level reached in recent years and which is essential when so large a number of accidents and emergency cases have to be dealt with.

This was one of the first hospitals to secure the latest type of so-called "Iron Lung," the Bragg-Paul Pulsator, which on several occasions has been loaned to other Hospitals.

Considerable changes and modernisation have been effected in the wards for the comfort of patients.

PENSIONS.

After many years we have been able to give effect to a scheme for pensions which was decided upon 15 years ago, when the nucleus of the fund was formed.

Additions have been made to this nucleus from year to year, whereby a considerable sum has been amassed which has enabled us to pay the back premiums for pensions of all our long-service employees amongst the works staff, porters and others—and to include all the male staff not covered by the Federated Superannuation Scheme for Nurses and Hospital Officers.

This new pensions scheme has now been put on a contributory basis and will be applicable to all new male entrants into the hospital service. We feel sure our action gives general satisfaction to the Governors and Subscribers as it does to the men affected.

RATING.

We view with deep concern the fate of the Voluntary Hospitals (Relief from Rating) Bill and we are pressing the British Hospitals Association to continue its efforts to obtain redress by legislation.

The rating of Hospitals is manifestly unfair in view of the exemption of other charities.

THE PRIVATE WARDS.

A remarkable feature of the raising of the money for the scheme is provided by the fact that £39,000 was given on what is known as "the seven year plan," with deduction of tax, and that all the instalments have now been paid.

Had it not been for the munificence of many generous donors, this private ward block which has become so popular would not have been made available for patients of moderate means.

MEDICAL STAFF, VISITING AND RESIDENT.

Certain changes, decided in principle three years ago, have been made in the constitution of and regulations for the Visiting Medical Staff, which in consequence, is now composed of Consultants.

On behalf of the patients, we extend to the members of the Visiting Medical Staff grateful thanks for services rendered and we also thank them for their helpful attitude at the various conferences with us during the year.

We extend our thanks to the Honorary Anaesthetists, whose number has been augmented under the new regulations.

Our Honorary Dental Surgeons have ably collaborated with the Visiting Medical Staff and deserve the thanks of the patients.

We combine in our annual report a record of the Pathological department which merits your perusal, and we acknowledge the valuable services of Dr. Eric Biddle, who is in charge of that department which has recently been approved by the Ministry of Health for microscopical and cultural tests.

Again we acknowledge the loyal enthusiasm, strenuous work and high professional skill of Dr. G. F. Langley, our Resident Medical Officer, who is also Medical Superintendent of our branch establishment at Felixstowe, and the services rendered by the Resident Medical Staff under his charge.

We would also mention the valuable services rendered by Mr. R. J. Stratton, our Pharmacist and Mr. C. F. Betts, our Radiographer.

THE NURSING STAFF.

We are substantially in agreement with the findings of the Inter-departmental Committee on Nursing Services as set out in its recently issued report.

We are pleased to announce that we have put into practice the 48-hour week (96 hours-per-fortnight schedule). To effect this, far reaching changes have had to be made in the organisation. The ratio of nurses to beds has been increased; the schedule of duties amended; the list of duties diminished by the elimination of all domestic work except that which is essential for practical training.

The full Hospital examination which has existed since the training of nurses started here has been abolished in favour of a trial examination to be conducted twice yearly by our own medical staff, as a helpful preliminary to the State Examination.

New uniforms have been introduced of a simpler and more hygienic type.

Special mention was made in our last report of amenities for our nursing staff—their comfort, recreation, food and general well-being. These have been further augmented during the year and include the provision of special quarters for our Sisters by the purchase of a large house standing in beautiful grounds situated near the Hospital. While this provides the conditions and creates the atmosphere of a private house—a home from home for our Sisters, the need for a large central home for nurses mentioned in our previous annual reports has not been lost sight of.

In a year fraught with difficulties in the sphere of nursing Miss S. Shaw, our Matron, has dealt with changing situations and fresh developments in an able manner and we extend our thanks to her and all her staff.

While we are being asked to make provision for the instruction of older women as emergency nurses in the event of war, we cannot help feeling that the first call is for young women to train and qualify as State Registered nurses. Greater facilities and advantages are now offered in our training school, and we appeal to all those who have the necessary education and vocation for nursing to equip themselves for this branch of the nation's service.

AUXILIARIES.

The work of this great voluntary hospital is not confined within its building, nor is it carried out entirely by its honorary and salaried staffs. The auxiliary forces play their part and a very important part too. First amongst these comes the Hon. Collectors for our contributory scheme to whom reference has already been made. Then we have the ladies of the Linen Guild, that great body of loyal helpers in all the towns and villages served by the hospital. The success of their efforts is shown in the annual statement of the Guild attached to our report.

Regularity and punctuality characterises the gratuitous services rendered by the ladies of the Hospital Library, under the leadership of Mr. A. J. Colthorpe, but with the expansion of the services, further honorary workers are needed and those willing to assist are asked to send their names to the Honorary Librarian at the Hospital. These services are a real blessing to the patients.

The egg collection helps the hospital materially and those who make it a success, whether in the annual event or week by week throughout the year, are doing a good service to the hospital.

We commend to the attention of the Governors the reports from the Almoner's Department and the Samaritan Fund, showing the general expansion of the Hospital's activities.

The sacrifices made by our voluntary blood donors for the benefit of suffering humanity, demand our admiration. Reference is made to the transfusion service in the annual report of the Pathologist.

We extend cordial thanks to the clergy and ministers for their helpful co-operation, also to the police, the railway officials and any of our voluntary workers not previously mentioned.

Finally we desire to recognise the valuable financial help which is coming from the whist drive tournament throughout the parishes served by this hospital, and extend our thanks to the organisers.

OBITUARY.

We pay tribute to the memory of Dr. Frank Fowler Ward (who died on 25th May, 1938). For many years he gave of his best as a member of our Medical Staff.

THE BARTLET CONVALESCENT HOME, FELIXSTOWE.

Although the finances of the Home generally are satisfactory, we view with concern the drop in our dividend income consequent upon re-investment in Trustee Securities as the older investments fall due for repayment by effluxion of time.

For many years we have considered the possibility of selling the Old Bath Hotel premises and the Bath Tap site, and building new quarters for our nurses, but as the property market continues unfavourable, we have developed the Bath Tap site in an inexpensive manner which will add to our revenue.

During the year the maximum number of patients have been dealt with since the Home opened, 1,354 having been treated to a conclusion, while the average number of patients resident daily throughout the year was 63.61, a remarkably high average of occupied beds out of a total number of 65 available.

The esteem in which this Home is held by all those who have convalesced there is shown by the unanimous opinion expressed in their letters of appreciation.

We desire once again to accord our thanks to Miss K. J. Jenkins, the Matron of the Home, and to her staff.

ADMINISTRATION.

We acknowledge with grateful thanks the efficient way in which the members of our Secretarial Staff have carried out their heavy and responsible duties, and would pay tribute once again to the able and devoted services which Mr. Griffiths continues to render, not only to this Hospital, but also to Voluntary Hospitals in general.

A further increase of about 10% is noted in the figures for this year over the large number recorded for 1937. The large number of examinations now being done, prompted a report which was submitted to the Board of Management recommending a re-organisation of the staff to deal with the increasing amount of work. After due consideration the Board adopted all the chief recommendations, the most important of which was the appointment of an Assistant Pathologist.

Miss Freida Young, M.B. took up her duties on October 1st, 1938, and since then, not only has the quality and quantity of work increased, but new investigations have been undertaken.

This Laboratory is now recognised by the Ministry of Health for a large proportion of the bacteriological investigations of the Venereal Diseases department. This transfer was considered advisable by the Medical Officers of Health concerned, who thought the proximity of this Laboratory would increase efficiency and mean closer co-operation.

RADIUM.—Radium applications show a slight increase, but no marked changes can be expected until the complete apparatus and personnel of a Regional Radium Centre is available.

TRANSFUSIONS.—With the primary object of avoiding any delay in the administration of blood for transfusions, investigations have been carried out to test the practicability of using stored or conserved blood for this purpose. A new technique and apparatus was designed and has been in use for some eight months of the year, during which time 146 pints of blood have been stored for a period up to 14 days, and subsequently successfully administered. All this blood has been withdrawn by the staff of this department.

The scheme has been an outstanding success from every point of view and as it obviously has great practical advantages in time of emergency, a report has been prepared for publication.

PSYCHOLOGICAL CLINIC.

Report for the Year 1938.

It is again my pleasure to submit a report on another year's work in the Out-patient Department of the Hospital.

One hundred and ten patients (55 of each sex) attended for advice and treatment. Of these, ninety (43 females, 47 males) were new cases and thirteen children (8 females, 5 males) were referred to the Clinic on account of difficulties in adjustment, etc.

The total number of attendances was approximately 400 and sessions are still held on one afternoon weekly. Only well-established Psychotherapeutic measures were employed and roughly 50% of the patients were relieved of their anxiety symptoms.

The Clinic is now in its eighth year and would appear to be a useful adjunct to the Mental Health Services in the Borough and surrounding districts.

My best thanks are due to all those members of the Staff who so willingly assist me.

There have been 764 appliances supplied as against 669 the previous year. The following is a summary:—




Grants from the Approved Societies have been given in as full a measure as their funds have permitted, and help from Public Assistance Committees and Local Authorities has been encouraging.



AMBULANCE SERVICE.

The mileage covered by the ambulances during the year was 43,549. Of this, 17,500 miles were in respect of the Bartlet Convalescent Home service, and the remainder general ambulance service.

BARTLET CONVALESCENT HOME.

The past year has been a record for the work of the Bartlet Convalescent Home at Felixstowe. While admission to the Hospital carries with it the benefit of admission to this Convalescent Home, it must be understood that such admission can only be arranged at the instance of the Medical Staff, and cannot of necessity apply to all cases—only to those for whom the Staff consider that convalescence at the seaside is essential.

During the year, 1,354 patients have been treated in the Bartlet Home, the average stay being 17 days.

REPORT FOR 1938.

The Committee of the East Suffolk and Ipswich Hospital Linen Guild have great pleasure in presenting their Report for the past year and wish to express to all subscribers, Vice-Presidents, Secretaries and members very grateful thanks for their generous contributions of work and money. They are pleased to report an increase in the number of Branches and a large increase in the supply of linen and donations.

The Annual Exhibition was held in the Hospital Lecture Hall on November 22nd and 23rd, from 10.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m., when it was visited by a great number of members and friends.

The President of the Guild, Lady Cranworth, the Mayor and Mayoress (Mr. and Mrs. E. L. Hunt), and members of the Board of Management paid a visit to the exhibition, and expressed their surprise and pleasure at seeing such a fine display of gifts to the Hospital. These gifts were tastefully set out on tables round the hall under the name of each individual Branch, thus giving the visitors an opportunity of inspecting and comparing the work.

At intervals during the two days, short talks were given by Mr. F. L. Bland, Mr. H. S. Gotelee and Mr. A. Griffiths, when each speaker took the opportunity of expressing the sincere thanks of the Board of Management to the members of the Guild for their continued help to the Hospital in this practical way by supplying the greater part of the linen annually required. An appeal was made by each speaker asking all those present to do their best to encourage girls to become nurses. The speakers pointed out that nursing was a great vocation and that efforts were being made to make the conditions as easy and comfortable as possible for nurses, and nowhere would they find those conditions better than at the Ipswich Hospital. Parties of senior girls from the various schools in the town attended to see the work exhibited and to listen to these talks.

The Committee regret the retirement as Vice-Presidents of the Hon. Mrs. Louis Johnstone, Mrs. Day and Mrs. F. Packard, who have worked so splendidly on the Guild for the past 10 years.

We are happy to announce the names of the new V.P.'s: Mrs. Anthony White for Woolverstone, Lady Hamilton for Rendham and district, Mrs. Fitzroy for Capel St. Mary, Mrs. Maxwell for Semer, Mrs. Cooper for Iken, Mrs. Stuart Paul for Freiston, Mrs. F. Parker for Ipswich Division of Old Guides, Mrs. Spinks for Wolsey Branch, Ipswich, Mrs. Ian Allen for Framlingham, Mrs. R. L. Rieve for Shottisham, Miss Lynn Allen for Kelsale.

The ideal of the Guild is to raise annually £1,000 in goods and money, and towards this amount the 81 Branches have contributed in 1938: 4,306 articles valued at £527 17s. 1d., and £293 18s. 10d. in cash, making a total value to the Hospital of £821 15s. 11d., an amount exceeding last year's figure by about £115. This is a record amount in goods and money and the Committee tender their thanks to all members who have made it possible to attain such a result from one year's work, and express their gratitude for the continued loyal support to the Linen Guild.








