



EXTRACT FROM RULES AND INSTRUCTIONS.

Patients attending the Out-Patient Department other than accident and emergency cases are requested **to bring a letter from their Doctor** and ascertain from him at which Department they should attend.

Surgical Out-patients are seen by the Surgeons or Assistant Surgeons. If In-patient treatment is required the name is entered on the waiting list, and the patient is admitted by the Resident Medical Officer to the next vacant bed of any Surgeon.

New Medical Out-patients are seen by the Physician and the Assistant Physician.

Members of Visiting Staff in charge of Special Departments see their own Out-patients.

Any patient who has been examined by a member of the Visiting Staff shall, where that member has beds in Hospital, be admitted under him.

A Gynaecological case which has been seen by one of the Physicians or General Surgeons in consultation before admission into the Hospital, may be admitted into a General Ward and be treated by such Physician or General Surgeon.

The Resident Medical Officer, acting on the instructions of the Board, is responsible for the admission of patients as the rules enact, that In-patients shall be deemed to be admitted and discharged by the Board.

PATIENTS' CONTRIBUTIONS.

Free treatment is provided for necessitous cases only.

Each In-patient is expected to contribute as his or her circumstances will permit, and to reimburse the Hospital the whole cost of maintenance if in a position to do so. This does not apply to members of the Contributory Scheme.

INSTRUCTIONS AS TO ADMISSION OF PATIENTS TO THE GENERAL WARDS.

The Hospital is not intended for chronic or incurable cases.

Patients for admission should attend for examination at the Out-Patient Department of the Hospital on the days and at the times appointed when notes of the cases are taken, and the names are passed to the Secretary to be entered on the waiting list.

No patient, other than a case of accident or emergency is admitted to the Hospital unless the name is on the waiting list; but if it is absolutely impossible for patients to attend at the Hospital for examination, they should ask their medical attendant to send particulars and preliminary diagnosis of the case to the Secretary at the Hospital. Due notice will be given in writing by the Secretary to each patient on the waiting list when there is a vacant bed.

To meet the requirements of the authorities, notice is hereby given that no one living outside the Borough will be admitted as a patient unless a Doctor certifies that such patient is free from infectious disease, and that there has been no infection in the house for three months. Form of certificate will be sent with notice of admission.

Medical Practitioners sending In-Patients are asked to assist the Management by giving the Secretary any information they can as to the patients' circumstances.

No person is admitted as a patient without a card if the patient is a contributor, except in case of accident or urgency.

Non-contributors admitted as emergencies, or as a result of motor accidents, will be expected to reimburse the Hospital towards the cost of their treatment while there at the same rate as that fixed for cases sent in by Local Authorities, which at the present time is 8/- per day—a sum which is less than the actual cost to the Hospital.

When the Patient is of such a financial position as to warrant transfer to the private wards or a nursing home he will be transferred so soon as his condition permits.

Patients on admission are asked to state the names and addresses of relatives to be sent for in the event of grave emergency. These are notified when patients are on the danger list and permission is given for them to visit at any time.

Arrangements are also made, provided there is no interference with the work of the Hospital, for the legal advisers of patients to visit them any afternoon provided permission is first obtained from the Secretary's Office.

Each member of the Board of Management acts in rotation as a weekly visitor, and is prepared to consider any complaint or suggestion. Patients wishing to see this official visitor can notify the Secretary's clerk any morning.

Every person sent for admission as an In-patient must be decently clothed and provided with a change of Linen. This should consist of two night-dresses, (or in the case of men, two shirts or pyjamas,) also two pairs of stockings, one pair of slippers, hair brush, comb, tooth brush, two towels, two face flannels and soap.

Ordinary razors or knives may not be brought into Hospital by patients, or supplied to them by their friends.

Patients are allowed to bring safety razors, but these must be handed to the Ward Sister who will decide when the patients can use them.

REGULATIONS FOR VISITING TO THE GENERAL WARDS. ADULTS.

Two Visiting Cards are issued to each patient on admission so that the patient may send these cards to the nearest relatives or friends he desires to visit him.

The visitors to whom the cards are handed by the patient may transfer them to other visitors if they think fit, but will be responsible for their safe custody.

No visitor will be admitted who has not in his possession a visiting card.

The hours for visiting patients are Tuesdays and Sundays between 2 p.m. and 4 p.m.

Children under 16 years of age are not allowed to visit the Hospital or to enter the grounds of the Institution.

The entrance for visitors on Tuesdays and Sundays is from Ivory Street.

The regulations for visiting will not apply to patients on the "Danger List," the near relatives of whom are allowed to visit at all times on receiving notice to do so.

Persons coming from a house in which there is infectious disease are strictly forbidden to visit the Hospital.

Clergy and Ministers are allowed to visit members of their Churches at the patients' request any day between the hours of 2 p.m. and 4 p.m., providing such visits do not interfere with the work of the Ward.

Numerous visitors cause disorganisation of work and the Board therefore regrets it is unable to allow the wives of clergy and ministers, district visitors, subscribers or governors of the Hospital to visit patients except on regular visiting days.

Owing to lack of space, motor cars conveying visitors to patients cannot be allowed in the Hospital grounds.

Visitors must not give food or drink direct to any patient, but may deposit gifts of food or delicacies with the Sister in charge of the Ward, for a patient's consumption, subject to the Doctor's approval.

CHILDREN.

No visiting is allowed to child patients under the age of twelve years, except to those on the danger list and under special circumstances to those who have been in Hospital for a long period. If a child has been in Hospital more than a month and there is no infectious disease in the home, a permit will, on application, be issued to the parent or guardian to visit once a month. If there has been infectious disease in the home, a Medical certificate of freedom from the infection must be obtained and produced at the Hospital before the permit will be issued.

PRIVATE PATIENTS.

Visiting daily from 3 p.m. to 4 p.m.

THE BARTLET CONVALESCENT HOME AT FELIXSTOWE.

This Home is managed by a Committee appointed by the Board of the East Suffolk and Ipswich Hospital under the scheme approved by the Court for the regulation of this Trust.

Admission to the East Suffolk and Ipswich Hospital now carries with it the benefit of admission to this Convalescent Home, if necessary. When in the opinion of the Medical Staff, the treatment of any patient can be equally well continued in the Convalescent Home, the patient will be transferred there provided that accommodation is available. The transport to and from Felixstowe will be undertaken by the Hospital and free treatment provided at the Home for members of the Contributory Scheme. Other patients are expected to contribute towards the cost of their maintenance. The Home, situated on a valuable site facing the sea and abutting on Undercliff Road, Felixstowe, provides accommodation for men, women and children, and is equipped and staffed as a branch Hospital or Home of recovery.

The 103rd ANNUAL REPORT

OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT TO THE
GOVERNORS OF THE EAST SUFFOLK AND IPSWICH
HOSPITAL, PRESENTED BY THE CHAIRMAN.

THE WAR.

Looking backwards—rather an unusual view to take in drafting the annual report of a great Hospital—and reading the record of the Hospital's war effort contained in the annual report of 1914, I find that in the main it would pass as a record of what we have done in 1939. The war clouds—our preparations—guarantees to the Government—the declaration—clearing the decks for action—our offer to the Navy—the first serious casualties arriving from the sea. Again this hospital becomes a centre for treatment and although there have been, as yet, no convoys of wounded from the British Expeditionary Force, the most serious cases coming within the wide category of the "casualty service," have been admitted.

The voluntary system has again proved its efficacy and efficiency—there has been no lack of helpers. Candidates for our nursing service have come forward to fill the vacancies caused by those who have left to serve with the Forces, and although conditions may be a little difficult at times, the work a trifle harder, dietary not so varied and black-out restrictions annoying, a fine enthusiasm and splendid loyalty has been shewn by all sections.

Of course the war has made the Board's position extremely difficult. Our well laid plans and schemes have temporarily been brought to naught. The project for a much needed ward block for women (orthopaedic fracture and gynaecological cases), has been stopped ere it was fairly started.

The financial position would appear to give rise to considerable anxiety, but we must remember that the last Great War ran the hospital into a very heavy debt, which a generous public in due course wiped out. It is, however, a matter of regret to those who have looked after our exchequer so carefully that after paying our way for 14 years our income for the past year is insufficient to meet our expenditure.

Then there is the large expenditure (nearly £1,000) for a black-out under the lighting restrictions, which is a "total loss," and the still larger one, not yet ascertained but running into thousands of pounds for protective work and the gas-proof shelter in respect of which we entertain a fervent, perhaps unduly optimistic, hope of obtaining financial assistance from the Government.

Supplies have been rather difficult to obtain, particularly certain drugs and specialised hospital commodities, but we have much to be thankful for and the institution is well stocked and equipped ready for any emergency.

Whatever the difficulties of the situation may be we will face the future with courage, determined to do our part for the sick and suffering community we serve and for those who are wounded or maimed in fighting for our country.

To those who have backed our war efforts by generous support, I tender the Board's thanks—I cannot enumerate all, but I must mention Lord Woodbridge (one of the two remaining members of the Board of 1914), who has again placed his beautifully situated convalescent hospital, "Maryland," at our disposal.

FINANCE.

It seems almost impossible to write with any clarity upon this question as it has become so complex under existing conditions. The Capital Account has been augmented to the extent of £3,860, principally by legacies. The value of our Endowment Fund gradually increases by small additions year by year but the amount of free capital is lamentably small, and if in a crisis we had to sell out, it would only be sufficient to maintain the hospital for nine weeks.

The year's income has been good and the amount received from the contributory scheme (£37,897) eminently satisfactory. It is again the scheme's "high-water mark," and calls forth our highest praise for all those responsible for its organisation and maintenance, especially the Honorary Collectors. It is noteworthy that the sum of £2,246 received and entered under the heading "Entertainments," is the largest recorded. This record is due to three events—(a) the Football Cup Competition (Ipswich Town v. Aston Villa), £1,111; (b) Chillesford Polo Matches £250; and (c) the Whist Drive Tournaments £485 (part of £904 for session 1938-39).

For the first named event we extend our thanks to Captain J. M. Cobbold and the Committee of the Ipswich Town Football Club; for the Polo to the Hon. Alastair Watson; and for the Whist Drive Tournaments to all those who supported the effort throughout the county and to Mr. J. Bush, the organiser.

The war, alas, has put an end to all these activities.

Referring to the items "Donations," £1,427, and "Gifts in Kind," £1,142, I must emphasise our indebtedness to the Linen Guild. The former includes a cash donation from the Guild of £325, and the latter the value of articles supplied by the Guild, £565. The other large item under this heading is that of the value of eggs, £468, which we gratefully acknowledge.

The Congregational collections and Church parades which in 1921 amounted to £3,227, have steadily dropped to £1,237. There are undoubtedly many reasons for this, and it is, therefore, rather remarkable that one small country church should be able to send £56 to the hospital from its special harvest festival effort.

To the large but unavoidable increase in the running expenses, must be attributed the year's deficit of £1,952, and this despite the war grants received from the Government for the hospital's casualty service.

It was stated in the last report that we had budgetted for a considerable increase in the expenditure on salaries and emoluments for the nursing staff and for domestic workers. The accuracy of this forecast is revealed by the figure "Nursing salaries" (exclusive of emoluments), £11,650 (1938, £9,883), Porters, domestic servants and day workers, £6,668, (1938, £6,073). In 12 years the expenditure under these headings has doubled.

Since the state of national emergency came into existence our ordinary expenditure has taken a new and unprecedented curve outside the limits of our budget and beyond the capacity of our coffers. The Ministry, probably recognising the possibility of such a situation, has called for a special financial return for the four months ending 31st December last, as against the previous eight months. The average cost of each in-patient per week for the whole year was £3 15s. 7d. as against £3 6s. 6d. in 1938. This increase was chiefly caused by the large percentage of unoccupied beds officially reserved on the declaration of war and the additional accommodation provided, also to a lesser extent by the expenditure on the augmented staff and the general rise in the prices of hospital commodities.

It will be readily understood that the increase occurred almost entirely during the last four months of the year. The figures for the first eight months show an increase of only 1s. 3d. above those of the previous year.

There is an amount of £4,374 shewn in the income and expenditure account as extraordinary revenue expenditure, which has to be met, and this includes such items as A.R.P., Black-out, etc., and there is a further sum of £4,898 on Extension Account for the special shelter and gas-proof room already mentioned. This is an overdraft at the bank as we have no funds to meet it but negotiations with the Ministry are in progress.

NURSING.

History repeats itself—the war, the call for nurses and the response. Our ranks are full—full of candidates who have signed on for the complete term of general training. We have 200 on the pay roll. In last year's report we mentioned the tuition of emergency nurses. We now report that this scheme has been carried out, our hospital being the centre of instruction also for the members of the St. John Ambulance Brigade and others in training.

Several members of the hospital's trained staff, Sisters and Staff Nurses, who were members of Queen Alexandra's Imperial Nursing Service and of the Territorial Army, left to join the Forces. An additional strain has, therefore, been put upon those who remain in charge, especially upon the Matron, Miss S. Shaw, and her administrative staff, to whom we accord our special thanks. We also record our appreciation of the splendid way in which every member of our nursing service has responded to the call of duty.

QUARTERS FOR THE NURSING STAFF.

With the vastly increased numbers of nurses, despite certain arrangements for boarding out, additional sleeping accommodation has become urgent and imperative, and while we had ideas of an entirely new nurses' block and visions of a donor who might be found to pay for it, time pressed and we had to proceed without funds for the purpose, on a less ambitious scheme.

The Hospital has been for some years the owners of the property known as Anglesea House (Nos. 90 and 92, Berners Street), and here, with some reconstruction, repairs and alterations, we have provided a Home for some 36 nurses in light, well-ventilated bedrooms with hot and cold running water and with central heating.

The work has just been completed, but the money has not yet been found.

PATIENTS.

The numbers of both in and out-patients are slightly less than in the previous year but nevertheless are above the average of the previous four years. The figures are as follows:—in-patients admitted during the year, 6,280 (average for the past four years, 6,015); new out-patients, 21,092; out-patient attendances, 112,237. The number of patients resident daily throughout the year showed an average of 308. Number of days each patient was resident was 17.94 as against 17.87, last year's figures, which was the lowest on record.

The slight diminution in the numbers is consequent upon the clearing of beds by Government Order at the outbreak of hostilities. Within a few weeks a return was made to normal procedure, extra accommodation was provided for casualties, local serious and urgent cases were admitted and the civilians' waiting list was reduced to a point below the level of the previous year.

CANCER.

Last year we reported the proposal for a Regional Radium Centre at this hospital, which we were asked to form in 1936, but had been prevented by many difficulties from accomplishing. Some of those difficulties have been overcome and the most important decision arrived at by the Board during the year was that of proceeding with the scheme. This decision was influenced by the fact that we were able to secure the services of a Radio-therapist to take entire charge of a new department of Radium and Deep X-Ray therapy. Immediately after his appointment, the Radio-therapist (Mr. Chas. W. Woodham, M.R.C.S. Eng., L.R.C.P. Lond., D.M.R.E.) was called up and has been serving his country in the medical branch of the Army abroad ever since.

As the setting up of this new department is affected by the Cancer Act, 1939, before the Board's final decision was made or the Radio-therapist appointed, a conference took place between the Board and representatives of the local authorities and the National Radium Commission.

Although the war has caused a serious set-back to the accomplishment of our desires in this and other directions, the principle has been settled so far as we are concerned and we shall proceed to carry out the scheme when peace is restored.

PATHOLOGY.

Our Pathological Laboratory, built and equipped at a cost of £12,000, and officially opened by H.R.H. The Princess Royal on 20th October, 1928, was then considered by those competent to judge, to be one of the best laboratories in the Provinces and considerably larger than our own requirements demanded. Little did we dream at that time of the extensive use which would be made of this laboratory during another great world war.

In addition to increased work in pathology, bacteriology and bio-chemistry consequent upon the outbreak of hostilities, the laboratory is now a centre for blood transfusion which is carried out on the new system of conserved blood in which pioneer work has been done here. The museum of the Pathological Department has been adapted for this purpose and fitted with couches, suction apparatus and all other

necessary equipment. Six voluntary helpers have been trained and the number of voluntary blood donors increased from 200 to 1,400. Some 140 pints of blood have been withdrawn without ill effects to the donors, to whom our most sincere thanks are extended.

This wonderful service which has proved of inestimable value to the very serious cases in our hospital has been extended to assist other institutions and we have also helped them to form their own panels.

ORTHOPAEDIC DEPARTMENT AND FRACTURE CLINIC.

I would like to refer the Governors to our reports on this subject for the past five years, which set out in greater detail than is wanted here the history of the conception of the scheme; the Staff appointment; the start in improvised premises on 1st September, 1936; provision of the funds; the official opening of the new out-patient block on 8th February, 1938, by the Rt. Hon. Sir Kingsley Wood, M.P., then Minister of Health; the Accident Ward of 34 beds which had been provided for men, and the scheme for a similar ward for women. Apart from the fact that the need for this special ward for women continues and becomes more insistent, the acknowledged success of the scheme as a whole has been emphasised by the year's work. Reports to hand indicate that there is still a need for such specialised departments in some of the larger hospitals throughout the country, and that in certain instances where it has been impossible for the voluntary hospitals to make the provision, the responsibility has fallen upon the local authority. It is obvious, therefore, that our department with its staff and organisation, is not only carrying out a great and successful humanitarian work but is saving ratepayers a very considerable sum of money.

OBITUARY.

By the deaths of Mr. Edward A. Oliver, Mr. Philip E. Ripley and Mr. F. E. Rands, the Hospital has lost three staunch supporters.

Mr. Oliver was Chairman of a Working Men's Committee formed in 1898 to organise works' collections for the hospital. This was superseded in 1925 by the contributory scheme committee of which Mr. Oliver was the first Chairman. For 23 years he was a member of the Board.

Mr. Ripley was for several years Honorary Consulting Engineer to the hospital and Chairman of the small Building Committee which

carried out the structural improvement scheme, 1906-1910, the successful completion of which heralded a new era in the history of the hospital. His memory is perpetuated in the Memorial Wing by the "Ripley" Ward.

Mr. Rands, better known in the Borough as Alderman Fred. Rands, was for several years, and up to the time of his death, the representative of the Borough Council on our Board. He showed his sympathy with and strong support for the work of the hospital, especially in its extensions from the time of the War Memorial to the latest addition.

As we go to press yet another death is reported—that of Mr. Geoffry Barnardiston—who up to a few weeks ago was a regular attendant and active member of the Board which he joined in 1918. Mr. Barnardiston was a valuable member of the Building Committee but his chief work was in connection with our branch establishment, the Bartlet Convalescent Home at Felixstowe, of which he was Vice-Chairman. He undertook the laying out and planting of the grounds of the Home and by a personal appeal obtained free of cost all the plants and cuttings. The flowers will continue to bloom and the shrubs to grow and flourish as a lasting memorial to his untiring efforts and horticultural gifts.

MEDICAL STAFF, VISITING AND RESIDENT.

The exigencies of war have created the necessity for re-organisation and re-allotment of work as members have been called up, but nevertheless the work has been carried on smoothly and efficiently, and on behalf of the patients we express our sincere thanks to the Visiting Medical Staff. We should like to include in this expression of gratitude the Honorary Anaesthetists, Honorary Dental Surgeons, Pathologist, the Resident Medical Staff, including the Acting Resident Medical Officer, Pharmacist and Radiographer.

THE BARTLET CONVALESCENT HOME, FELIXSTOWE.


The work throughout the year has been carried on efficiently and has given full satisfaction to the patients and the Management, but it has not been without its difficulties for the Matron and her Staff, whose devotion to duty we acknowledge with gratitude.

On the outbreak of hostilities the Home was entirely cleared of all its patients, but after a few weeks the reception of civilian cases re-

commenced. This unavoidable clearance, however, is reflected in the figures for the patients, the number treated to a conclusion being 1,262 as against 1,354 in 1938, and the average occupied beds 54.62 as against 63.61, the maximum.

ADMINISTRATION.

To all who read this report it must be clear that another year of arduous work faithfully and efficiently done has fallen upon our Secretary, Mr. Griffiths, and his staff, and to them once again we express our grateful thanks.

While the total number of operations performed in the two main theatres remains substantially the same as last year (3,543, 1938; 3,496, 1939), there is a reduction on the grand total of 350. This is due mainly, to the decrease in the number of operations performed in the Ear, Nose and Throat Department and the Ophthalmic Department, and to a smaller degree, to those performed in the two Out-Patient Departments.

It will be noticed that the number of blood transfusions given is 2, as compared to 60 of last year. It is now no longer the custom to record this procedure as an operation. The number of blood transfusions given in the hospital during the year 1939 was 232.

Despite the dislocation of Hospital routine due to the war, this department has still shown a small increase in the amount of work done. It will be noted that a considerable number of specimens have been examined for the V.D. Department under the scheme whereby this

laboratory became approved by the Ministry of Health for such work.

RADIUM. Owing to the war the issue and application of Radium still remains in our hands. Our stock continues to be of great value, but proposed alterations in our equipment have been postponed pending the arrival of the Radio-therapist.

TRANSFUSIONS. Since the war this department has been responsible for the supply of transfusion blood for war casualties at this Institution and for others in the neighbourhood. For this purpose we are equipped to deal with several donors at a time and could supply blood without delay for large numbers. Voluntary workers are being trained for this work as blood for routine Hospital purposes is now withdrawn here. These volunteers have attended on numerous occasions to assist in this work, and two hundred and fifty-seven pints of blood were issued from this department last year.

I should like to express our gratitude to all our voluntary helpers, and particularly to Miss Chatterson, Mrs. Rackham, Mrs. Jepson and Mrs. Duvall Davis.

STAFF. Our senior technician—Sergeant Samson, was called up on the outbreak of the war, which necessitated re-organisation of the staff and the engagement of a junior technician.

The Board of Management, the Medical Staff and Mr. Griffiths have as always, given us their whole-hearted support and co-operation, and the smooth working of this department would be impossible without their help.

PSYCHOLOGICAL CLINIC.

Report for the Year 1939.

Consequent on a series of International crises inspired by a Paranoiac, much-vaunted civilisation is again at war. It is a tragic comment on man's sanity and powers of social adaptability.

The Ninth year's work of the Clinic has continued on the usual lines and though there has been a tendency to an increase in the number of new cases, I take no alarmist views that the present stresses will lead to an undue amount of Psychoneurotic illness. Certain Psychasthenic personalities will assuredly break down, but such occurrences obtain equally under peace-time conditions.

Children's attendances have been definitely more, and I attribute this increase to the importance attached at the present time to "Child Guidance." I, personally, hold the view that "Adult Guidance" is a more correct term and am of the opinion that many of these children are more in need of Physiological investigation than Psychological.

From an intimate knowledge of the work performed at many similar clinics throughout the country, one can readily appreciate the limits placed upon their scope by the Human Factor. Two to two-and-a-half hours of concentrated effort would appear the endurance point of the majority of single-handed Psychiatrists.

My best thanks are due and freely given to all those members of the Hospital Staff who so readily help me in my out-patient work.

Report for the Year 1939.

The income for the past year amounted to £1,551 5s. 9d., made up of £898 15s. 6d. patients' contributions, £613 16s. 10d. contributions by Local Authorities and Societies on behalf of patients, £35 13s. 5d. dividends and interest, and donations £3 0s. 0d. The expenditure was £1,731 2s. 10d. There was a balance in hand at the beginning of the year amounting to £66 14s. 2d. and the year terminated with a deficit of £113 2s. 11d., which was made good by a grant from the general funds of the Hospital.

The Fund has supplied 808 appliances, of which the following is a summary:—

There has again been a considerable increase in the number of appliances supplied as compared with previous years.

Although times have been difficult and consequently greater claims have been made on our funds, the work has progressed to the benefit of all concerned and the patients have contributed as much as their altered circumstances would permit.

Approved Societies have helped by grants and the Public Assistance Committees and Local Authorities have given such support as their statutory obligations allowed.

No less than 105 poor patients have been given assistance towards their travelling expenses, and special monetary assistance has been given to very necessitous cases, which has been most gratefully received.

Report for the Year 1939.

PATIENTS.

Cold statistics cannot convey an adequate idea of time and labour spent in arranging and dealing with the hundred-and-one wants and needs of the never-ending stream of patients passing through the Hospital or attending the Out-patient Department.

This becomes evident to anyone who hears the numerous and varied enquiries of the patients (some 300 to 400 a day) as they come to our Out-patient Department for registration, and particularly so when viewing the numbers passing through the Secretary's Office—many for admission, others for advice, and friends or relatives making enquiries on behalf of patients.

In spite, therefore, of a small decrease in numbers occasioned by the temporary clearing of beds at the outbreak of hostilities, it has been even a busier year than the one before. Times are difficult and abnormal, creating new and unexpected situations, each of which has to be dealt with in a special manner.

The following items which do not come under the category of routine work, may be of interest:—

808 patients have been supplied with surgical appliances through the Samaritan Fund. (See separate report).

105 patients have been helped with travelling expenses and incidental expenses.

58 patients have been found to be unsuitable financially for treatment in our Out-patient Department and general wards, and private arrangements were made.

Approximately 50 patients have been referred to District Nurses.

AMOUNTS RECOVERED.

The following figures show a comparison with the previous year. The diminution in income does not necessarily indicate decrease in work done, but rather emphasises the difficulties arising owing to war conditions.

OBJECT OF THE GUILD.

The Linen Guild was formed in June, 1922, in connection with the East Suffolk and Ipswich Hospital for the purpose of replenishing annually the household linen and providing garments and other necessary comforts for the patients.

REPORT FOR 1939.

Owing to our inability to hold the usual Exhibition this year on account of the war, the Committee felt that it would be advisable to issue a Report immediately after the receipt of the contributions in goods and money, so that the Branches might hear at once of the immensely successful year's work.

It is our pleasure to report that in spite of all the difficulties under which the Vice-Presidents and members have been working, the value of the articles contributed has exceeded that of last year by £26 16s. 8d. and there is an increase of £33 4s. 8d. in the money

subscribed and collected. For this wonderful accomplishment the Committee wish to express their grateful thanks and appreciation to all who have worked so hard for the Linen Guild. By their self-sacrifice and real anxiety to help the Hospital the members have won the admiration and thanks of the Board of Management, who, under the chairmanship of Mr. R. H. Paul, accorded a very hearty vote of thanks to the Vice-Presidents, Patrons and Members for their continued loyal support of the Guild.

The Hall in which the Exhibition is usually held is turned into an Emergency Ward and the Members will be interested to hear that many of the men rescued from the *Simon Bolivar* were brought there and received the help and attention of our medical staff. The very necessary linen was supplied from the Linen Guild stores, for which the patients expressed their deep gratitude.

We report with sincere pleasure the receipt of many valuable articles from the Mason Branch and £100, a most generous gift which has enabled us to increase last year's contribution to the Hospital.

Many of the Branches have made special efforts to send in extra money contributions this year, in addition to their linen. Otley raised £18 by a garden fete and sent it intact to the Hon. Treasurer. Our new Branches have all made a good start. The Wolsey Branch in its first year has contributed £10 10s. and an exceptionally valuable collection of linen, etc. Hadleigh, Kelsale and St. Michael's also in their first year, have contributed well and are following in the footsteps of our numerous Branches who have been working untiringly for the last ten, twelve and even more years, and we do realise that all have made special efforts to help the Hospital this year.

We regret the death of one of our loyal supporters, Miss Sawyer, of Aldeburgh, and because of her work, the Branch is still nobly carrying on.

Three of our earliest Vice-Presidents have retired during the year—Mrs. E. Day, of East Bergholt, Mrs. Aldrich, of Westerfield, and Mrs. Henry, of Debenham. We offer our sincere thanks to them for their long and loyal support. Miss Hunter has taken the place of the first-named and Miss Walker was kind enough to collect in Westerfield. We hope someone will come forward and become the Vice-President for that Branch.

The ideal of the Guild is to raise £1,000 yearly, and towards that sum the contribution for 1939 is 4,111 articles valued at £554 13s. 9d. and £327 3s. 6d. in cash, the total value to the Hospital being £881 17s. 3d., an amount exceeding last year's figure by £60 1s. 4d.

May we ask our Branches to try and keep up to this high standard in 1940, as we feel that the Hospital will need our help more and more.
