submitted to the Governors at the Annual Meeting held on February 23rd, 1927.

THE Board of Management have pleasure in presenting to the Governors and Subscribers the following Annual Report and Balance Sheet for the year ending 31st December, 1926.

It will be noted that the great increase on In-Patients in 1925 is maintained in the past year, the average number of occupied beds daily having been 50.3. In fact in the later months of the year the number reached 60, a number too great for the capacity of the building.

The number of casualties treated at the Hospital in 1926 was 1813, as compared with 1418 during 1925. This great increase is largely due to road accidents.

In the Dispensary Department, the numbers both of out-patients and patients attended at their own homes show great increases, and this double increase has entailed heavy work on the two Resident House Surgeons.

The Ultra Violet (or Sunlight) Ray Apparatus has shown itself to be a valuable treatment in many cases, especially with children, and the Ministry of Health have approved the Department for the use of patients under the charge of the County Medical Officer.

The work of the Rontgen Ray Department has been fully maintained, and the approval of the Ministry of Health has been renewed for another period of 3 years.

The efficiency of the Department has been greatly improved by the addition of certain apparatus, through the generosity of the Worshipful Masters and brethren of the local Masonic Lodges. They have provided the sum of £145 19s. 9d., which not only paid the cost of this additional apparatus, but leaves a balance available for further improvements to it.

A most valuable acquisition has been a new table in the Operating Theatre, given by an anonymous donor, through Dr. Dick and the thanks of the Board are heartily given to the donor.

The Board has given careful consideration both to the number, salaries and grade of the Nursing Staff and both additions and changes have been made to bring the nursing organization to a state considered advisable for present requirements,

During the year, 4 of the Nurses have passed the Preliminary Examination under the General Nursing Council for State Registration, and 3 have passed their Final Examination and are now fully Registered Nurses under the new Act. The Board are most grateful to the members of the Honorary Medical Staff, the Matron and House Surgeons for the courses of lectures, periodic examinations and practical demonstrations which, together with the industry of the Nurses themselves, have led to this very satisfactory result. The Board would express their thanks to the York County Hospital for kindly admitting our Nurses for the six months extra medical training required by the General Nursing Council.

Considerable improvement in accommodation has been provided for the Sisters by the conversion of certain rooms into bed-sitting rooms, an improvement which was much required.

The Board regret to report that acting under medical advice Miss Williams resigned her post as Matron in July, and Sister Potts was appointed Acting Matron and subsequently became Matron.

The Board have been pleased to be able to join in a plan designed by the St. John Nursing Division to provide, in cases of crisis or extraordinary need, a temporary Hospital. The Nursing Division will provide the extra beds and nursing, the Board providing provisions and hospital requisites when beds are occupied by patients.

The comfort of the patients has been increased by the kindness of the local Toc H Group in providing the nucleus of a Library, the case for which has been kindly provided by Mr. W. Plaxton. The members of the Toc H Group visit weekly to perform the duties of librarians.

The Board regret deeply the loss of Mr. James Dippie, Mr. John Whitfield and Mr. Oscar Wilkinson. Both Mr. Dippie and Mr. Whitfield had been members of the Board for many years, the former having been Treasurer for ten years and the latter having showed the greatest practical interest in every department of the Hospital, more especially in that of the Nursing Staff.

The Board may now be permitted to say that Mr. Oscar Wilkinson, in addition to being an annual subscriber of £50, was on two occasions the "Anonymous" donor of £500, and had every Rose Day contributed an "Anonymous" sum of £25 to be added to the collection.

Hospital Extension.

Throughout the past year, the Board have given continuous thought to the urgent need of additional beds. In the last Annual Report it was stated that the services of Colonel Mackintosh, C.B., M.V.O., M.B., had been obtained, and in conjunction with him, Mr. Tugwell had designed an extension to the present buildings, the cost of which was estimated at £40,000. This extension would have provided an additional 50 beds, together with certain improvements in the provision of balconies, increased nursing accommo dation and domestic alterations in the old portion of the building.

On the other hand, more mature consideration showed that the present form of the Hospital and present site could not satisfactorily meet the needs considered essential to-day for a modern Hospital building. The site is already congested and would become more so with the proposed extension. To-day all Hospitals need large balconies for open-air treatment, more open space for their patients in the early stage of convalescence, and space also for future extension, a more convenient relationship of theatre to wards, and domestic offices throughout. It is estimated that a modern Hospital can be provided at a cost of £700 or rather less per bed, and the cost of the extension would be more than half the cost of an entirely new Hospital of at least 100 beds on a larger and more spacious site.

In view of the above considerations the Board have recently decided that the bolder and better course to take is to face now the problem of building an entirely new Hospital on a fresh site. There is no doubt whatever in the minds of the Board that an increase of beds is urgently needed; the town is increasing in size, each month the wards are becoming more and more taxed for accommodation and there is no prospect of any diminution in the

demand. It rests with the generous supporters of the Hospital in the Town and in the District whether the Board will be enabled to realise what they firmly believe to be the best solution, namely to build a new and up-to-date Hospital which will be a credit to the town.

Income.

The income on Revenue Account is £6,900 15s. 4d., as compared with £6,540 8s. 9d. The following figures are interesting as shewing the fluctuations in the various items.

This is a wonderful result, especially in view of the conditions obtaining during the greater part of the year. The Board are deeply grateful to the Committee, and also to the Committee of the Children's League who have increased their contribution from £75 in 1925 to £,100 for 1926.

The Board are thereby enabled to show a credit balance for the year in addition to liquidating the deficiency on the 1925 accounts.

Expenditure.

The expenditure on Revenue Account for the year has been £6621 15s. 3d., as compared with £6924 4s. 5d. the previous year.
