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

REPORT FOR 1947

Throughout the year the Cheyne Hospital for Children ran the hospital in an admirable manner, as many old friends of the Hospital can testify, and they renewed their lease at Christmas ; but on December 1st a working arrangement between the two hospitals, suggested by the respective Committees, was endorsed by a Special General Meeting of subscribers. By the terms of this the Hip Hospital agreed to pay, for those children who would be suitable patients under its own rules, the difference between the amounts paid to the Cheyne Hospital by Local Authorities and the total weekly cost per patient. It was also agreed to pay half the cost of various improvements and labour-saving appliances installed by the Cheyne Hospital, by these means establishing a real working partnership.

To enable the Hospital to meet these commitments up to July next it will have to rely on the continued help of voluntary subscribers, and the grateful thanks of the Committee are due to those who paid their subscriptions for 1947. It is hoped that some of those whose subscriptions were not paid will renew them in 1948, now that they can know that the funds are being used directly for the benefit of sick children.

A total sum of £926 8s. 8d. was paid to Cheyne Hospital, made up of £673 19s. 7d. shown under "Extraordinary Expenditure, for Maintenance of Patients," which covered no less than 35 Hip Hospital children, and £252 9s. 1d., included under "Domestic (1) Repairs and Renewals." It will be seen that the Expenditure for the year exceeded the Income by £548 6s. 1d. If the Hospital had not started the year with a balance of over £1,000 accumulated income, the payments to Cheyne could not have been met without a large overdraft or by selling out capital. The Hospital is also faced with the necessity of entirely re-roofing Hope Lodge, as well as paying half the cost of an electric lift and other improvements not yet completed.

It is hoped to start building the new Staff Dining Room very soon, if the permit can be obtained. For this the "Blue Bird" Fund has been accumulating ; this now stands at £1070 17s. 3d., but the estimated cost of the Dining Room, with the consequent alteration to Pantry, Scullery and Lavatory will now be in the neighbourhood of £4,000.

Good news is received of Miss Reid, the retired Matron, who is living with her sister in Dorset, and of Miss Sharpe who, though

retired on March 25th, 1947, is still dealing with the secretarial work. The Committee were very sorry to lose Mr. and Mrs. Howson Devitt, who have left Sevenoaks, but are pleased that Mr. Devitt has consented to continue as Trustee and Hon. Treasurer.

The Committee thank Mr. G. Young, the Hon. Auditor, for once more auditing the hospital accounts free of charge.

It is possible that this may be my last Annual Report (I have had the honour of being Chairman for 22 years) as well as the last Report of Sevenoaks Hip Hospital, as the Health Act comes into force on July 5th, 1948, but there is every reason to hope that the South Eastern Metropolitan Regional Hospital Board will be glad to continue the combined Cheyne and Hip Hospitals as they are now, under a new Orpington and Sevenoaks Hospital Management Committee, and so, after more than 75 years beneficent work, Miss Emily Jackson's Hospital will not die but enter on a new life of healing for the children for whom she founded it.
