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THE SIXTEENTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

The Board of Management presents its Sixteenth Annual Report and Statement of Accounts for the year ended 31st December, 1945, and takes this opportunity of expressing thanks and gratitude to all those who by financial assistance or personal service have made possible an excellent record of work.

THE WAR.

It is with a profound sense of relief that we record the end of hostilities with Germany and Japan. The Hospital is proud of the part it played during the war and many members of our Services are grateful for the treatment received whilst under our care.

There were many instances of voluntary work freely and unselfishly undertaken during the war and the Board and Staff are very grateful for the services rendered. To stretcher-bearers, fire-guards and all auxiliaries is extended a very hearty "Thank you."

Unfortunately the Hospital's participation in the Emergency Hospital Service and the consequent restriction of civilian admissions resulted in the growth of a large waiting list which the Board is anxious to reduce as quickly as possible.

CONSTITUTION.

At the annual meeting of Governors held on the 27th October, 1945, it was agreed to appoint a Committee to be composed of six representatives from the Board of Management and six representatives from the Governors (three of whom should be from the Ward, Town and Village Committees) to prepare a revised Constitution for submission to the Governors. The following Governors' representatives were appointed at this meeting—Messrs. S. Hornsby, E. Allison, E. V. Callin, T. Morgan, A. Peart and E. Surridge. The Board of Management's representatives appointed later were Lord Quibell, Alderman R. O'Dowd, Mr. C. A. J. Behrendt, Mr. E. Drury, Mr. W. H. Bailey and Mr. E. R. J. Hett.

PRESIDENT.

It was with regret that the Governors accepted the resignation of Mr. Arthur Crooke from the office of President. Mr. Crooke, during his twenty-five years' association with the Hospital in this capacity had rendered valuable service and guided the policy of the Hospital during its growth from Cottage Hospital status to its present day importance as one of the largest general Hospitals in the county.

Lord Quibell, who was unanimously elected as President in succession to Mr. Crooke, paid a glowing tribute to his predecessor's work and a resolution expressing the Governors' appreciation of Mr. Crooke's services was enthusiastically supported.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT.

Reference was made in the Supplementary Report (published last year) to the loss sustained by the death of Mr. W. S. Sanderson. Other members who retired from the Board during the year were Mrs. A. Crooke, Mr. G. Barratt, Mr. W. Cook, Mr. J. P. Marshall,

Mr. J. Owen and Mr. E. Surridge, and this opportunity is taken to record an appreciation of the valuable service given by the aforementioned during their tenure of office. At the same time a welcome is given to their successors, Messrs. A. Boam, C. W. Clark, J. L. Howells, G. N. Sheriff, F. A. Tooze, A. White and G. W. Wilson.

COMMITTEES.

The House, Finance and General Purposes Committees, under the able guidance of their respective Chairmen, again performed their tasks with great credit. The Appeals Committee was re-formed with Mr. A. Willey as Chairman and has already justified itself by contacts with Ward, Town and Village Hospital Committees and outside organisations.

MEDICAL STAFF.

The increased work performed during the year meant further demands upon the members of the Honorary Staff, and the services so ably given are greatly appreciated.

Mr. W. MOIR SHEPHERD, M.D., F.R.C.S. (EDIN.) resigned during the year from the office of Honorary Surgeon and in view of his long and valuable association with the Hospital was appointed as Honorary Consulting Surgeon (see Supplementary Report 1944).

Mr. C. H. CORBETT, M.D., F.R.C.S.—appointed as temporary Honorary Surgeon in succession to Mr. Shepherd commenced his duties in June (see Supplementary Report 1944).

Mr. J. J. RAINFORTH, M.B., F.R.C.S.,—retired from the office of Honorary Ear, Nose and Throat Surgeon on the 31st December. Mr. Rainforth was associated with the Hospital for over twelve years and his services during this period were very highly valued.

Mr. M. E. SPENCER HARRISON, M.D., M.R.C.P., F.R.C.S. (EDIN.)—was appointed to succeed Mr. Rainforth and will commence duty in February, 1946.

RESIDENT MEDICAL STAFF.

It is pleasing to report an improvement in the staffing position. For many months of the year there were only two doctors in residence out of a quota of four. Full establishment was reached towards the end of the year and an approach to the Central Medical War Committee resulted in permission to increase the resident establishment to six.

NURSING STAFF.

The number of Student Nurses admitted during the year for training was twelve.

Fifteen students entered for the Final State Examination, of whom thirteen were successful at the first attempt and the remaining two on the second occasion.

Eighteen candidates sat for the Preliminary State Examination of whom thirteen were successful. One of the remaining five has since satisfied the examiners.

Four unsuccessful candidates in 1944 were re-entered for the Preliminary Examination and two were successful.

The Hospital Gold Medal and the first prize awarded by the Medical Staff Committee were won by Nurse B. O. Cox. Nurse S. M. Shorter gained the second prize awarded by the Medical Staff Committee.

The inauguration of a Preliminary Training School for Nurses has been approved and will be opened as soon as circumstances allow. The provision of a training school badge for successful trainees is under consideration and it is hoped that it may be possible to form a Nurses' League during the coming year.

By the introduction and appointment of Ward Orderlies in November it has been possible to relieve the Nursing Staff of the greater part of the domestic ward work for which they were formerly responsible.

ADMINISTRATION.

The adoption of the National Scale of Salaries recommended by the British Hospitals Association is recorded. Provision is made therein for all grades of clerical staff and shorthand-typists.

DOMESTIC STAFF.

A 48-hour working week was introduced in November. The staffing position for resident and non-resident workers is satisfactory. The social functions arranged during the year were greatly enjoyed and highly appreciated.

APPOINTMENTS SCHEME FOR OUT-PATIENTS.

With the general improvement in staffing it was possible to concentrate on the introduction of an appointments scheme for out-patients to avoid the inconvenience and discomfort generally suffered by patients attending a clinic at a fixed time and having to wait an indefinite period before seeing the specialist. Arrangements were made to introduce the scheme in February, 1946, and with the co-operation of patients, specialists and general practitioners, full success is anticipated.

LADIES' LINEN GUILD.

Once again we extend our sincere thanks to the members of the Guild for the splendid service rendered during the year. The report of work and statement of accounts appear on pages 64 and 65 and give a precis account of an outstanding contribution to the Hospital.

CHRISTMAS.

In accordance with what is now looked upon as an established custom, the Mayor and Mayoress (Alderman R. O'Dowd, J.P. and Mrs. O'Dowd) visited every patient in the Hospital on Christmas morning to convey the Borough's greetings to the patients. They were accompanied by Lord Quibell, the President of the Hospital, and by the Matron and Secretary-Superintendent. Earlier in the day the Secretary-Superintendent had officiated as Father Christmas and distributed gifts to all the patients. Seasonal fare of turkey, pork and Christmas pudding was a feature of the day. The seasonable atmosphere was increased by the carol singing of the St. Lawrence Church Male Voice Choir and by concerts given by members of the clerical staff. The Ministry of Information assisted with film shows.

EXTENSIONS AND DEVELOPMENTS.

The question of further extensions to and the development of the Hospital's services is one that is constantly kept in the forefront. Immediate problems are to provide a second operating theatre and more accommodation for the nursing staff. The prospects of being allowed to proceed with the first of these are much brighter and, although the permanent solution of the second problem might be delayed it is anticipated that a temporary solution will be reached in the near future by the tenancy of property locally on a suitable lease. The provision of a rehabilitation department is receiving attention and will be proceeded with as opportunity offers.

The heavy waiting list previously referred to is a constant source of worry and, although present day circumstances are unfavourable, attention will have to be given as soon as possible to the provision of more bed accommodation.

THE FUTURE.

The setting up of a National Health Service has been the subject of discussion in Government circles for the past few years. Recent reports in the Press on the proposals which are soon to be presented to Parliament by the Minister of Health suggest that the complete absorption of voluntary hospitals is propounded and that the future Health Service will be administered through Regional

Boards and Local Councils. There is no quarrel with the desire to further the fuller co-operation and co-ordination of hospital services both regionally and nationally, but it is considered to be an ill-advised move to attempt to vary the local arrangements of hospital management. It is further felt that a full national service on the lines suggested by Press reports would tend to stifle local interest and enthusiasm and this is regarded as a retrograde step. Perhaps by the time this Report is in print we shall have had the opportunity of studying the proposals in their entirety and of forming judgment thereon, but, if not, Governors are asked to seriously consider the proposals when published and if they are in disagreement to register their protest with their representative member of Parliament.

ALDERMAN R. O'DOWD, J.P.

His colleagues on the Board and members of the Hospital staff offer their hearty congratulations to Alderman O'Dowd on the well-merited honour recently bestowed upon him by his election to the Mayoralty of the Borough and wish him and his wife a very happy and fruitful year of office.

SAMARITAN FUND.

During the year £43 11s. 0d. was received for the Samaritan Fund—£20 of this amount was half proceeds of Whist Drives organised by the Epworth Hospital Committee. This Committee has shown considerable practical interest in the Fund and our thanks are due to them for their assistance. We also thank Mrs. Wright, of Barnetby, for the sum of £2 12s. 0d. from the sale of cakes and the Horkstow First Aid Party for their gift of 10/-. The balance of cash received was from the sale of toys left over from the Toy Fair held in 1944.

In certain instances patients requiring surgical appliances have been assisted through the fund and £20 was spent in this way. A supply of special books on diets for diabetics was also obtained and diabetic patients are allowed to buy these from the Almoner.

It is hoped to extend the scope of the Fund still further as the revenue increases.

VISITS TO THE HOSPITAL.

Arrangements have been approved for the introduction of a scheme to enable Governors to visit the hospital on a rota system. Badges have been ordered and will be issued to contributing establishments, to Ward, Town and Village Committees and to other organisations who are eligible to appoint Governors. Companies, firms, committees and organisations are asked to co-operate by the issue and re-issue of these badges to their representative Governors

on a rota system. Possession of the badges will allow Governors to visit the Hospital on Saturdays at a time yet to be arranged.

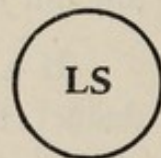

Membership.

Work done by the Sewing Parties and Knitters.

604 garments or articles of linen have been made by the sewing parties as follows—

Scunthorpe: Sewing 489, Knitting 57, Total 546.

Brigg: 24.

Keadby: 34, and 62 mark tabs.

The Scunthorpe party marks all linen, where this is done directly on the article, and has in addition marked tabs, but no record of these is kept.

Mending.

The value of this work cannot be over-estimated. Mending is done every week by the members of the Scunthorpe sewing party.

Dressings.

The dressings party meets fortnightly, and dressings are made for use in the wards and the theatre.

Handed to Matron.

During the year 1945, 1,538 garments or articles of linen to the value of £575/7/7, have been handed to Matron.

In addition, the Guild asked for help from the Red Cross in the matter of garments for which we could not obtain material. From this present 30 pairs of operation stockings and 6 dressing gowns were put into immediate use.
