APPOINTMENTS SCHEME FOR OUT-PATIENTS.

A system of group appointments for Out-Patients was introduced on the 1st February with the main object of avoiding long periods of waiting by patients before being seen by the Consultant or deputy. In general, the object has been attained, a further advantage gained being that the work of the Department is spread more evenly throughout the periods of the clinics. Since the inception of the scheme 4,173 out of 4,686 new patients attended by appointment, giving a percentage of 89.04, whilst of 11,468 patients making re-attendances 11,143, or 97.16% were given appointments. The consequent saving of time which previously would have been wasted is considerable and thanks are due to all who have co-operated to make the scheme so successful.

Increased staff and the immediate adoption of salaries and wages recommendations from National Joint Councils and other representative organisations account for the larger proportion of the additional expenditure. Surgery and Dispensary costs are up because of increased purchase prices, replenishment of depleted stocks and, since June, the need to purchase Penicillin previously supplied free of cost by the Ministry of Health. Expenditure on this item alone is in the neighbourhood of £30 per week. Expenditure on Establishment Renewals and Repairs includes the cost of internal re-painting and cleaning of the Hospital Wards and Departments.

HONORARY TREASURER.

At the Annual Meeting of Governors held in May the resignation of Mr. F. B. Groover from the office of Honorary Treasurer was received

with the greatest regret. Mr. Groover, whose health had been unsatisfactory, had a long association with the Hospital and had been actively associated with the satisfactory progress made over the past years. It was unanimously agreed that the valued service given by Mr. Groover be recognised by making him a Life Governor.

Mr. Stanley G. Davies was elected as Honorary Treasurer to succeed Mr. Groover.

BOARD OF MANAGEMENT AND COMMITTEES.

Messrs. C. A. J. Behrendt, H. Martin, W. E. McHarry, J. H. Theaker, Dr. E. J. Tongue, A. White and G. W. Wilson vacated their seats on the Board of Management and were succeeded by Messrs. J. D. Chambers, G. Barratt, F. F. Fisher, S. Hornsby, J. Marsh, Dr. R. J. Stanford and Lt.-Cmdr. Wells. The valuable services rendered to the Hospital by the first-named during their tenure of office is appreciated and the special services rendered by Mr. C. A. J. Behrendt as Chairman of the Finance Committee were recognised by the Governors in Annual Meeting by creating him a Life Governor.

The Appeals, Finance, General Purposes and House Committees have performed their tasks, during a very difficult year, with the greatest credit and their efforts are reflected in the statistical records of continued progress and in other directions referred to elsewhere in this Report.

HONORARY MEDICAL STAFF.

Sincere thanks are offered to the members of the Honorary Staff for the efficient service they have given to the patients during the period under review.

Resignations received during the year and new appointments necessitated the following changes:—

DENTAL SURGEON.—In the early part of the year the resignation of Mr. R. H. C. Johnson was received with the greatest regret. Mr. Johnson had served the Hospital over a period of 35 years and it was unanimously agreed to place on record the Board's appreciation of his valued services. To fill the vacancy Dr. P. G. Trafford, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., L.D.S., was promoted from Junior to Senior Honorary Dental Officer and Dr. R. A. Johnson, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., L.D.S., was appointed Junior Honorary Dental Officer.

RADIOLOGIST.—Towards the end of the year Dr. H. Miller, M.B., CH.B., D.M.R.E., found it unavoidably necessary, owing to pressure of work, to tender his resignation as Honorary Radiologist to be effective on the 31st March, 1947. Dr. Miller was appointed to the Staff in 1931 and the valuable services he has given to the Hospital and its patients since that time are sincerely appreciated. He will be succeeded in office by Dr. Thomas Lodge, M.B., CH.B., F.F.R., D.M.R.E., who, through the co-operation of the Royal Sheffield Infirmary and Hospital, has been assisting with the work of the Radiological Department for the past three years.

ANÆSTHETIST.—Following progressive improvement in anæsthesia and the consequent development of their administration as a specialty it was unanimously decided to proceed with the appointment of an Honorary Anæsthetist and Dr. J. Clutton-Brock, M.A., M.B., B.CH., D.A., of Lincoln, commenced duties in this specialty in July on a part-time basis.

CLINICAL ASSISTANT.—Ophthalmic Department: Dr. B. F. Eminson, M.B., B.S., D.O.M.S. (Lieut.-Colonel I.M.S.) was appointed to this new post and commenced duties in April.

PATHOLOGIST.—The arrangement with the Ministry of Health which provided for the attendance of Dr. J. Hampson on two days per week was terminated early in the year and Dr. J. V. Wilson was appointed as Pathologist on a part-time basis. Dr. Wilson left in July to take up a full-time appointment in Harrogate and was succeeded by Dr. R. B. T. Baldwin.

RESIDENT MEDICAL STAFF.

The resident establishment of the Hospital was increased to six during the year and it is pleasing to record that the staffing has been generally satisfactory. It was decided, however, that the demands of the Casualty Department necessitated the appointment of a full-time Medical Officer and, following permission from the Central Medical War Committee, this appointment will be made early in 1947.

Dr. D. D. G. CURRAN resigned his appointment as Resident Surgical Officer in December and will be succeeded by Mr. V. P. McAllister, M.B., B.CH., B.A.O., M.CH., F.R.C.S. (Ed) in the New Year. Appreciation of the services rendered to the Hospital by Dr. Curran during his tenure of office has been recorded.

ORTHOPÆDIC REGISTRAR.—Following notice from the Grimsby and District General Hospital to terminate the arrangement made in 1944 relating to the joint appointment of non-resident Orthopædic Registrar it was decided that the demands of the Orthopædic Department justified the appointment of a full-time officer and appointed Dr. W. H. Oldershaw to this post.

NURSING STAFF.

The number of Students admitted during the year for training was twenty-two. Twelve Students entered for the Final State Examination of whom six were successful at the first attempt. Four of the unsuccessful candidates have since satisfied the Examiners. Eleven candidates sat for the Preliminary State Examination of whom eight were successful at the first attempt, and one candidate re-entered from 1945 also proved successful. The unsuccessful candidates will be re-entered in 1947.

The Hospital Gold Medal and First Prize awarded by the Medical Staff Committee were won by Nurse Phyllis Peart. Nurse Lucy Humphrey gained the Second Prize awarded by the Medical Staff Committee. Nurse Skinner, Third Year Student Nurse, was nominated and elected to the Central Representative Council of the Student Nurses Association of the

Royal College of Nursing to represent the Student Nurses in the twenty-five Voluntary Hospitals in the East Midland Area.

A Preliminary Training School for Student Nurses was opened on the 28th October with seven Nurses in residence. Application was made to the Registrar, The General Nursing Council for England and Wales, for approval of the Hospital as a Training School for Male Nurses. Approval was granted on 25th October.

Owing to an improvement in the Staffing position, it was possible to re-open Sheffield Ward for Male Medical patients in February. By February it was possible to report a full complement of Nursing Staff and this position has been maintained throughout the year.

DOMESTIC STAFF.

The Staffing position for Resident and Non-resident staff is excellent, and a full complement has been maintained throughout the year.

BLOOD TRANSFUSION SERVICE.

Sincere thanks are expressed to the many volunteer donors throughout the Hospital area for their contribution to this Service and to the devoted work of the local organising secretary, Mr. A. Willey. The officials and staff of the Sheffield Regional Service have been constant and efficient in attending to our requirements, which, during the year, amounted to the equivalent of 673 pints of blood. There is an urgent need for an increasing flow of volunteers to enable this Service to meet the demands now made upon it.

LADIES' LINEN GUILD.

Sincere thanks are once again extended to the Officials and members of the Guild for a splendid effort during the past year, as set out in the report of work and statement of accounts shown on pages 50—51. This report in precis form, gives a very brief summary of the work of an organisation which has, over a period of years, performed a notable contribution to the progress made by this Hospital and it will be very much regretted if recent legislation affecting the health services of the country results in a curtailment of the happy association which has existed for so long between the Guild and the Hospital. It is earnestly hoped that some means will be found to ensure the continuity of this association and it is gratifying to know that the members of the Guild will continue to maintain the library service to the patients.

To facilitate the library service and to provide more reasonable amenities for the volunteer workers it has been agreed to re-house the library, and plans and estimates to this end have been approved.

CHRISTMAS.

Christmas Day was a happy day throughout the Hospital. Seasonal fare was served and the patients and staff were entertained during the Christmas period by the Scunthorpe Male Voice Choir, the Appleby-Frodingham Works Band, Carol singing by the Nursing Staff assisted by

the St. Lawrence Church Male Voice Choir, and by concerts given by the Nursing Staff. On Christmas morning the Mayor and Mayoress of Scunthorpe (Councillor and Mrs. D. Todd) accompanied by Lord Quibell (President), Mr. W. B. Baxter (Vice-President), the Matron and Secretary-Superintendent, visited every patient in the Hospital to convey the Borough's Greetings and good wishes and to present gifts. The Secretary-Superintendent had previously officiated as Father Christmas and distributed gifts to all the patients. Grateful thanks are expressed to all those who assisted in any way in the entertaining of the patients and staff and in the provision of gifts.

VISITS TO THE HOSPITAL.

On the 2nd June, following structural alterations in connection with the second operating theatre and the consequent loss of an assembly point for patients' visitors it was agreed that the future assembly point should be the Out-Patient Hall in the Coronation Block and that visiting periods should be:

Adult patients—Sunday and Tuesday afternoons from 2-30 to 4 p.m.
Thursday evenings from 6-30 to 8 p.m.

Child patients—Sunday and Tuesday afternoons from 2-30 to 4 p.m.

On the 9th November a scheme was introduced to enable Governors to visit the Hospital on Saturday evenings between 7 and 8 p.m. Badges were issued to the larger contributory firms and Hospital Committees and a small number retained at the Hospital for occasional issue to representative governors of smaller firms and committees. It is pleasing to report that comments recorded in the Visitors' book have been satisfactory.

The Secretary-Superintendent will be pleased to make arrangements for organised parties to visit the Hospital.

EXTENSIONS AND DEVELOPMENTS.

Reference was made in last year's Report to the desirability of proceeding as quickly as possible with certain extensions and development of the Hospital's services and an account of the progress made is now given.

SECOND OPERATING THEATRE.—The long-awaited permit for this work was received in June and work was commenced almost immediately. The opportunity was taken to re-organise the steam and heating service to the present theatre and this work was incorporated in the above. Unfortunately the general position of supplies has interfered with the progress of the work and although the work is nearing completion no fixed date can yet be arrived at.

The opportunity is taken here of expressing grateful thanks to the Scunthorpe Agricultural Society for agreeing to devote the proceeds of forthcoming Annual Shows towards the capital cost of this Theatre. This gesture is a great encouragement and highly appreciated.

ACCOMMODATION FOR NURSES.—Arrangements for the tenancy of numbers 5, 7 and 9 Wells Street were completed in September, but permission to proceed with the adaptation of the properties into a hostel was

not received until January, 1947. Work has been commenced and when completed will allow for the housing of twenty-four nurses. Transport to and from the Hospital will be arranged as required.

LABORATORY.—The demands made upon the Laboratory—set up temporarily during the war—emphasised the urgent necessity of providing adequate permanent accommodation, equipment and staff to deal satisfactorily with this section of the Hospital's work. Consideration was given to the possibility of adapting part of the basement for this purpose but it was eventually decided to build a new Laboratory and plans are under consideration.

BED ACCOMMODATION.—The heavy waiting list, of which patients awaiting operative treatment for Tonsils and Adenoids constitute the larger proportion, has given the Board much concern. A plan to adapt part of the basement (formerly equipped as a First-Aid Post) was approved and eighteen beds and cots will shortly be available for the reception of patients suffering from Tonsils and Adenoids. It is then proposed to make an intensive effort to reduce this particular waiting list and avoid much of the ill-health and inconvenience now being suffered by many children.

RADIOTHERAPY CENTRE.—Plans have been approved for the provision of a workshop for the Physicist's Department and for the building of two day-rooms to the male and female wards. A permit for the installation of an electric lift was received and it is hoped that this will be in use towards the end of 1947.

KITCHEN EQUIPMENT.—A new battery of Esse Cookers has been ordered to cope with the demands now made upon the Kitchen.

ENTRANCE FROM CLIFF GARDENS.—It has been agreed to make an entrance for pedestrians attending the Out-Patient Department midway between the existing entrances and thereby to segregate pedestrian and vehicular traffic.

STAFF LOCATION SYSTEM.—Much thought was given to the installation of a system by means of which members of the medical, administrative and nursing staffs could be speedily contacted anywhere in the Hospital and it was decided to instal a system of coloured lights (with warning buzzer) to be controlled by the telephonist.

ELECTRIC CLOCKS.—Another decision which will meet with approval was that of providing electric clocks in all the wards and certain of the departments and offices throughout the Hospital.

WIRELESS.—The wireless service to the patients by means of headphones and loud speaker had fallen out of repair during the war years. It was agreed that this service be restored and thanks are given to the Scunthorpe Male Voice Choir for kindly arranging to devote the proceeds of one of their Celebrity Concerts to this object.

CLEANING AND PAINTING.—During the early part of the year the interior of the Wards and several departments were cleaned and re-decorated and directional signs arranged in advantageous positions.

NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE ACT, 1946.

The proposals relating to the future health services of the country were outlined in the National Health Services Bill published early in the year. Many of these proposals met with adverse criticism and were the subject of amendments during the Committee stages of the Bill with the result that the Act appears to provide a workable plan for the hospital services. Under the Act the Minister of Health will be responsible for providing the whole of the health services in England and Wales and for this purpose he will be entrusted with the ownership of all existing hospitals. He will be advised by a central council of experts and will delegate many of his powers regarding the hospitals services to

- (a) Regional Hospital Boards—who will be responsible to the Minister for regional planning and provision of hospital services, including the grouping of hospitals where necessary.
- (b) Management Committees of non-teaching hospitals—these Committees will be appointed by the Regional Hospital Boards and will be responsible to the Minister through the Regional Hospital Boards for the control and management of their hospitals or group.
- (c) Boards of Governors—who will be responsible to the Minister for the management and control of the teaching hospitals.

With reference to (a) above, the Minister has to determine the areas for which the Regional Hospital Boards shall be responsible, these areas so far as practicable to be such that the hospital and specialist services can conveniently be associated with a University having a medical teaching school. Accordingly England and Wales have been divided into fourteen areas and this Hospital has been placed in the Sheffield area. All existing organisations concerned with health services have submitted nominations to the Minister relating to the appointment of the Regional Boards. With reference to (b) a Hospital Management Committee shall consist of the chairman appointed by the Regional Hospital Board and such other members so appointed as the Board think fit and these shall include

- (a) persons appointed after consultation with any local health authority whose area comprises the area or any part of the area served by the hospital or group.
- (b) persons appointed after consultation with any Executive Council whose area comprises the area or any part of the area served by the hospital or group.
- (c) persons appointed after consultation with the senior medical and dental staff employed at the hospital or the hospitals of the group.
- (d) persons appointed after consultation with such other organisations as appear to the Board to be concerned and, in the case of a Committee appointed before the appointed day, the original members of the Committee shall also include persons appointed after consultation with the governing body of any voluntary hospital concerned.

It will be the duty of the Management Committee to control and manage their particular Hospital or group. They will have corporate legal entity; be free to undertake medical research; be free to receive gifts and legacies and to apply them for the purposes for which they are given. The Minister has also given an assurance that regulations will provide that Management Committees will be able to appoint their staffs except senior medical staff, who will be appointed by a Sub-Committee of the Regional Hospital Board and Management Committee concerned.

The many friends of this Hospital will be reassured by the knowledge that local interest and management are to be a feature of the new service.

HOSPITAL SURVEY.

The following is an extract from the report of the survey of the Hospital services of the Sheffield and East Midlands area, undertaken in 1942 by the Ministry of Health, to ascertain what modification or developments would be necessary to conform to the principles of post-war hospital policy laid down by the Ministry of Health in October, 1941.

“Scunthorpe—This centre has developed very rapidly in the last ten years. The number of beds provided is, however, not yet equal to the requirements of the ordinary acute work and this centre will have to be enlarged to provide for a considerable area around as well as for any growth of population which may occur.

The Staff should undertake the clinical supervision of the County Maternity Home and the County Infirmary, Brigg. All the acute work should be concentrated at Scunthorpe where the number of beds will be increased. The ultimate number of beds required in this area, excluding tuberculosis, would be about 700. Including accommodation for infectious disease, the present number of beds in Scunthorpe is over 300. The site of the voluntary hospital is a large one on which considerable development could take place.”

DEDICATION OF NAMED BEDS AND COTS.

In July a very pleasing ceremony was observed when plaques commemorating the endowment or naming of beds by local people and organisations were simultaneously dedicated in the presence of patients and representatives of the testators, donors and organisations concerned. A list of the beds and cots so named appears on page 52.

ALMONER'S REPORT.

Although appointed Almoner in 1943, owing to Staffing difficulties during the war it was not until September, 1945 that the Department was established and, in consequence, this is the first full year of its existence. We are not yet functioning in our true sphere but progress is now being made in that direction.

The Department has been considerably hampered by lack of proper office accommodation but with the conversion of the Dental Clinic into a suite of offices early in 1947 this obstacle has now been removed and privacy established for the interviewing of patients or relatives.

A good deal of the Almoner's time is spent in interviewing and assessing patients who are not members of the Contributory Scheme and in rendering various accounts covering patients treated privately, through the P.P.I. Scheme and under Public Authorities, etc.

Additional to the above In-Patients are seen by the Almoner either before or after admission to the Wards and help given with many personal difficulties.

Diabetic patients are all given special identity cards to carry, advised re obtaining syringes, insulin, etc., and told about the Diabetic Association which can help them in many ways. Ration Books are changed to enable the correct diet to be obtained and they report for check examination at required intervals.

Already we have instituted a follow-up system for some types of cases but there is still considerable scope for after-care and it is most desirous there should be a follow-up system for all patients.

Arrangements have been made with a large firm of Instrument Makers for the loan of hearing-aids and certain types of deaf patients attending the Ear, Nose and Throat Clinic are allowed to have one at home on trial for a week and if found to be of advantage to them steps are taken to make the necessary purchase—it is hoped to extend this facility in the near future.

Lip-reading classes are now held at the Scunthorpe Evening Technical School and patients who are hard-of-hearing are advised to attend.

Many patients have been helped during the year through the Scheme for Resettlement of Disabled Persons and Mr. Feran, the local D.R.O., has visited the hospital on numerous occasions to advise patients re their position when fit to return to work. The advice given has been of great assistance and we place on record appreciation of Mr. Feran's services.

Diversional Therapy is now available for all patients in the Wards and during the past twelve months some very beautiful work has been done. Rug-making, Tapestry, Embroidery, String-work, Soft-toy making and Knitting are some of the handicrafts which help to pass the time for those who, of necessity, have to stay in hospital for long periods. Our thanks are due to Mrs. Beacock, the Handicraft Instructress, for her untiring efforts to make this innovation a success.

SAMARITAN FUND.

Many patients have again been helped through the Samaritan Fund. During the year £48/6/4 has been spent on surgical appliances, transport, etc. for patients who were unable to meet these expenses themselves.

The income for the year amounted to £83/13/4 to which has to be added the further sum of £15 interest due on the investment of £500.

The main item of revenue was the profit from the Canteen, which amounted to £62/14/4.

The Canteen has again proved to be of inestimable value to patients waiting at the various Clinics. Visitors and patients have expressed their appreciation of this facility and we would like to thank the ladies who gave their time voluntarily to make this possible.

Helpers are still required and we should be pleased to hear from any one who would give their assistance for two or three hours each week.

This report, of necessity, only gives a very brief outline of the work done, but it is very pleasing to know we have established a much needed service for the patients and one which we sincerely hope will add prestige to the Hospital.

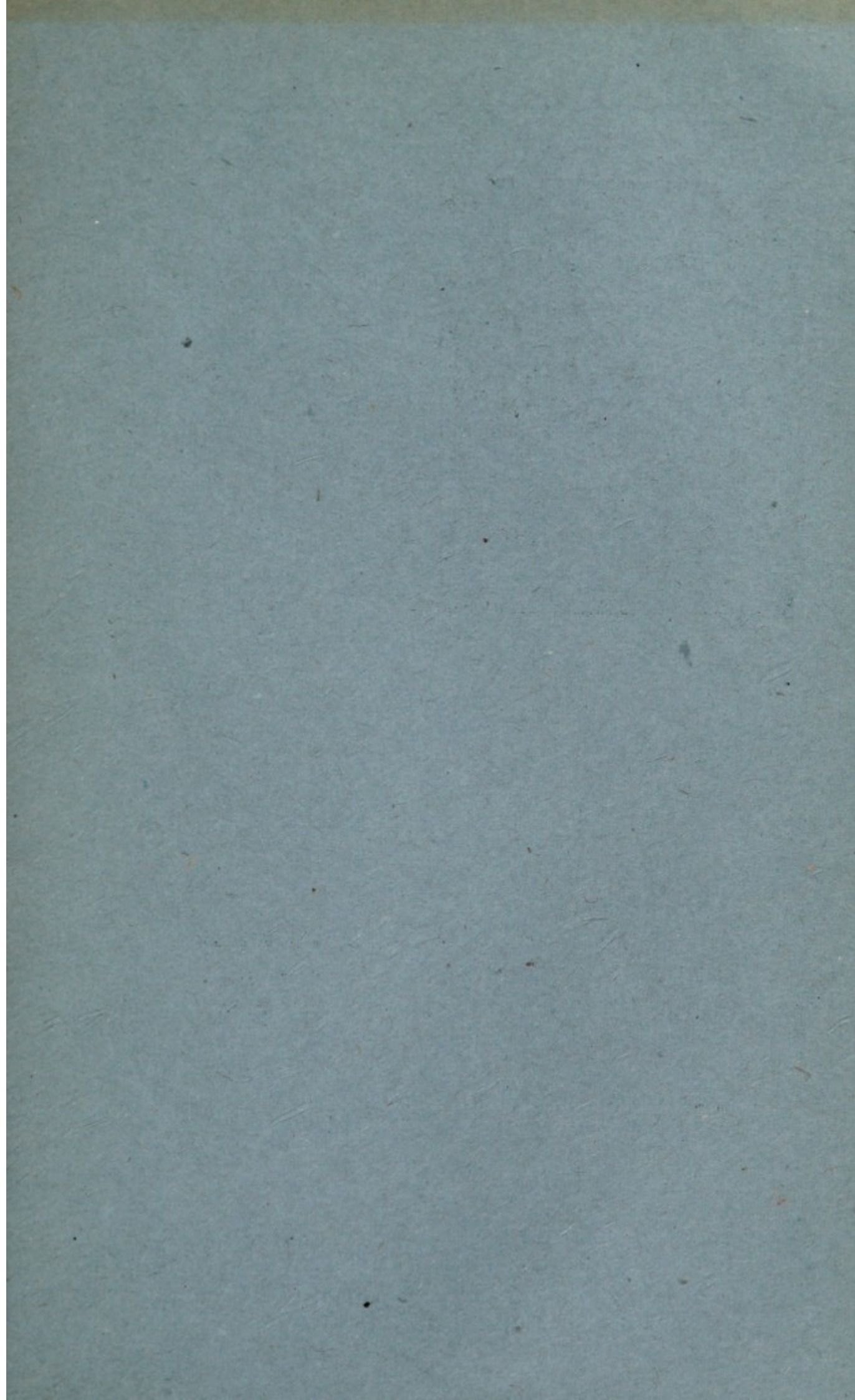
