4. Associates subscribe 6/- annually.

RULES.

1. The Scheme is to be entirely on a voluntary basis and all persons, including domestic servants, are entitled to free Hospital Treatment (subject to the following conditions) in return for a weekly payment of 2d., provided their income be not above £200 and payments have been made for the four preceding weeks.
2. In the case of a married man, the payment of 2d. a week secures free admission also for wife and children, except such children as earn any wage whatever; the latter not being eligible without a further contribution of 2d. weekly.
3. Every case must be certified by a Doctor as suitable for Hospital treatment.
4. When requiring admission contributors will take their Card and a Doctor's Certificate to their Collector, who will give them a signed form, which, upon production at the Hospital, will admit them, subject to accommodation being at the time available.

REPORT.

The Board submit the 55th Annual Report, with Statement of Accounts.

WITH deepest regret the Board have to record the loss after a short illness of their President, the late Lord Sackville. For eight years they have been able to appreciate his great interest in and sound judgment upon all matters concerning the Hospital. Though his time was much claimed by wider interests he constantly presided over the monthly meetings of the Board with a never failing kindness and courtesy which endeared him to all.

They have also to deplore the death of Mr. Gerald Sichel, for many years on the Medical Staff of the Hospital, whose great skill and conscientious devotion to his work was widely appreciated.

The Children's Ward, given by Mrs. Latter in memory of the late Mr. A. C. Latter, was formally opened by Lady Plender on June 1st. It would be impossible to imagine a ward more admirable from every point of view, having an atmosphere of brightness and cheerfulness which reflects the greatest credit upon the architects, Messrs. Pite & Fairweather. The large open-air balcony is proving of great advantage to the health and happiness of the small patients. The ward contains eight beds and was furnished by the further generosity of Mrs. Latter, the linen and bedding being given by the Linen League.

Though the past year has been healthy above the average, the General Wards have frequently been full, with a waiting list, and the Board feel that the need for more beds may at any time become critical. They have to bear in mind that a considerable

time must elapse, even after the large sum of money required has been collected, before the building and equipment of the enlarged Hospital can be completed. The accommodation for the Nursing Staff, already insufficient, has had further calls made upon it by the staffing of the new Children's Ward, and, as a temporary measure, two cottages have been altered and furnished at considerable cost to serve as a residence for a portion of the staff.

In order to assist in collecting the £25,000 asked for to enlarge the Hospital, the Board have appointed a Hospital Extension Fund Committee and have been fortunate enough to get Mr. Calder to act as Chairman, with Miss Crosbie-Hill and Mrs. Arthur Martin as very active Hon. Treas. and Hon. Sec. Only a short period of its existence has been necessary to show that it has infused new life into the appeal. The Board wish to express their warm thanks to this Committee for their assistance, which they feel is the more valuable in that it is giving wide publicity to the work and needs of the Hospital. The amount received up to September 30th totals £3,914 (subsequently increased to £4,261.)

To the Sevenoaks Group of Toc. H. the Board also offer thanks for their great efforts on behalf of the Hospital. A house-to-house collection of eggs was made, which resulted in the large total of nearly 2,000, and in September they organised a "Mile of Pennies" for the Extension Fund, whereby no less than £310 was obtained. Those who have taken part in such work can appreciate the very large amount of time and energy required to achieve such a result.

The Board desire to express their gratitude to the Ladies of the House Committee for their constant care of, and many valuable gifts to, the Hospital. Mrs. Anson has officiated as Chairman, and, Mrs. Millns having unfortunately been compelled to resign for reasons of health, Mrs. Latter has kindly consented to join the Committee. Mrs. Rogers organised the Pound Day with greater success than ever, goods and cash to the value of £321 having been collected for the Hospital.

The Linen League year by year increases the extent of its assistance, and this year a children's branch has been formed. 800 articles, including rubber sheets and hot water bottles, screen curtains, beds and bedding and air cushions were provided. The Board wish to thank warmly the very large number who devote so much of their time to mending the old and providing all the new linen and uniforms for the Hospital.

The steady growth of the Contributory Schemes is one of the most satisfactory features of the Hospital finances. Under the "A" scheme (2d. a week) the amount collected in the last five years were £837, £943, £1,070, £1,145 and £1,286. The figures for the "B" scheme (£1 per annum, covering full cost of maintenance in Hospital and Medical charges) for the same period were £9, £15, £25, £45, £51. The Board desire to express their high appreciation for these remarkable results to the tireless and devoted band of voluntary collectors and to the most efficient Committee which superintends them.

The whole Income for the year was £4,657; the Expenditure was £5,127, with a resulting deficit of £470.

The Ordinary Income, as shewn on pages 30 to 33, was only £18 less than in the previous year. It will be seen that every item but one, down to "Invested Property," shows some increase, and that in two of them it is very large—the "A" Contributory subscriptions being up £109 *net* and "Sundry" £164, owing to the £197 collected on Queen Alexandra Day. The total of these increases is £414.

Against these gains must be set a drop in Church Collections of £23, and on "Payments for services to patients" £309. In 1926-7 £50 was received from a Masonic Service at Kippington, and apart from this the £132 of this year is well above the average. The heavy drop in "Payments for patients" is due to decrease of £187 in the "Payments of Approved Societies," under the National Health Insurance; and to the fact that last year's total was swollen by the sum received on account of sufferers in the deplorable railway accident near Riverhead in August, 1927.

There is another item of diminished income to be noticed. In 1926-7 it was possible to take as income £100 from the rentals of North Bank and The Heights. This year the account shows a balance of £64; but owing to liability for repairs in progress it seemed desirable to keep this sum in hand. These losses of income amount to £432, and exceed by £18 the gains enumerated above.

The ordinary expenditure on provisions is increased by £115; Domestic charges by £30; Salaries and Wages by £87; Administration by £3—together £235. In considering these figures it must be remembered that for the last three months of the year we have had to provide additional nursing and domestic staff for the children's ward.

The expenditure on "Surgery and Dispensary" is increased by £148, of which £139 was for a new and improved operating table. Adding this £148 to the £235 named above, there is a gross increase of expenditure by £383. Against this must be set a reduction of £7 on "Miscellaneous," and of £20 on Rent and Taxes; and also of £137 on "Establishment," making in all £164. The net increase in expenditure is therefore £383, less £164, that is £219. It must be pointed out that the reduction in "Establishment" charges is due to the Board having felt it impossible to set aside any addition to the "Deferred repairs fund," to which they added £140 last year.

Confining attention to Ordinary Income and Expenditure, it will be found that Income is £4,622 and Expenditure £4,488; and that there is a balance on the right side of £134. It is in the extraordinary expenditures that the deficit for the year finds its explanation. The balance of expenditure over income on this part of the account is £604; and the net deficit, after deducting the surplus on Ordinary account, is £470.

A few words must be added as to the outlook for the current year. Mrs. Latter's generous gift of a children's ward has provided an opportunity of extended usefulness of a most valuable kind, for which there was previously no adequate provision. The resulting additional annual expenditure will be about £400. A few

individual subscribers have already increased their subscriptions in view of this need ; and the Board venture to hope that the Appeal they now make—"for the children"—will find a ready and generous response from all subscribers.

The Board find it difficult to acknowledge adequately the very many gifts, large and small ; and the smallest gift may represent the largest effort. They desire to express generally their sincere thanks :—

- (1) To the Subscribers, to the Personal Donors, and to the Societies, Institutes, Friendly Societies and Clubs, whose gifts appear under Donations.
- (2) To the givers of the Gifts in kind, which largely exceed in value the amount shown in the Income Account.
- (3) To those who have sent in Collecting Boxes.
- (4) To the Clergy, Churchwardens and Congregations of many Churches and Chapels, who have made collections for the Hospital.
- (5) To those whose contributions appear in wonderful variety under the heading "Sundry Receipts," including the collection of £197 on Queen Alexandra Day.
- (6) To Messrs. Sidney Young and A. Tye for renewal and improvement of the Wireless Service.
- (7) To the Hon. Chaplain, Hon. Auditor, Hon. Medical Staff, to the Matron, Nursing Staff and Members of the Kent V.A.D., for the time, care and skill devoted to the service of the Hospital.

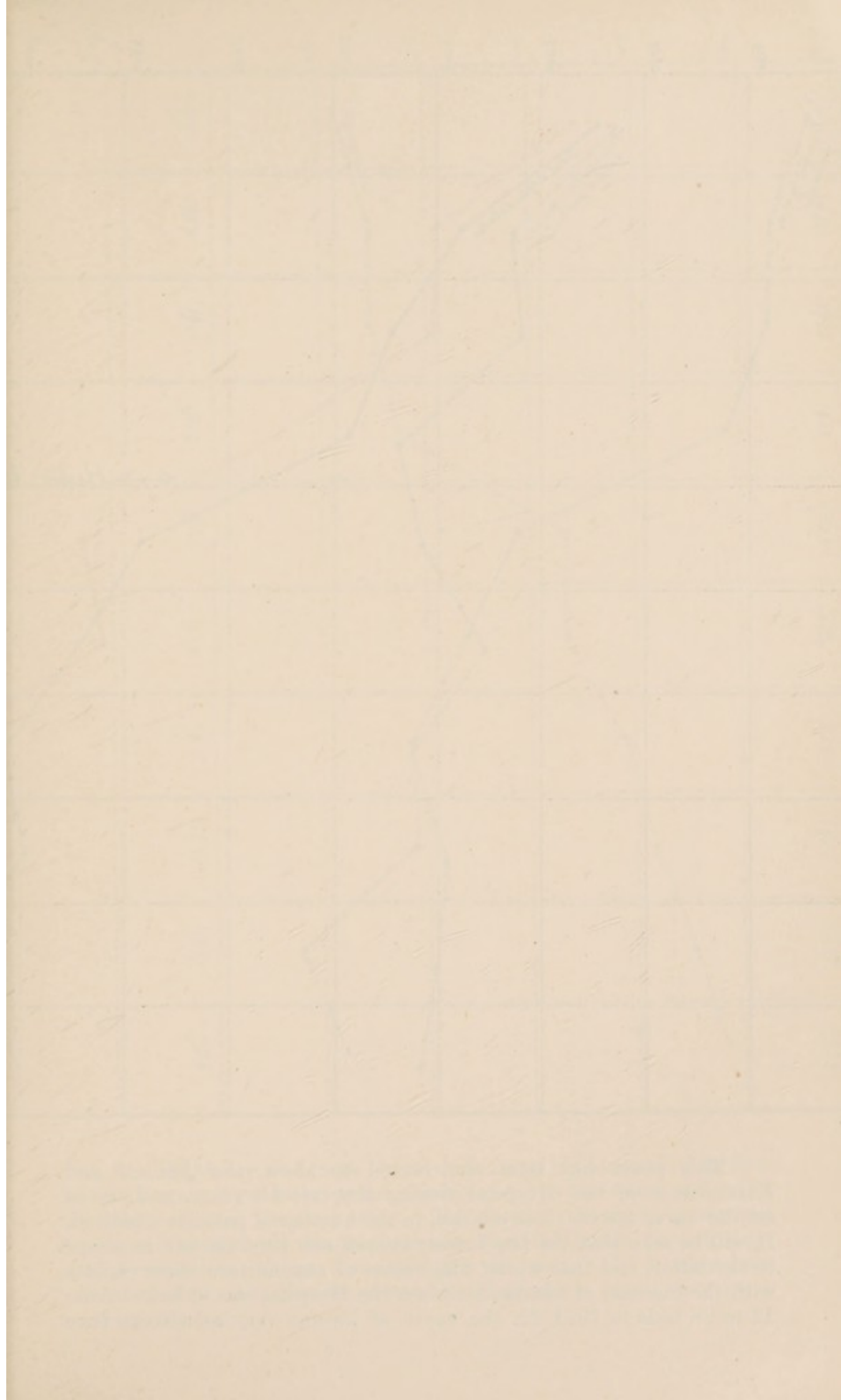

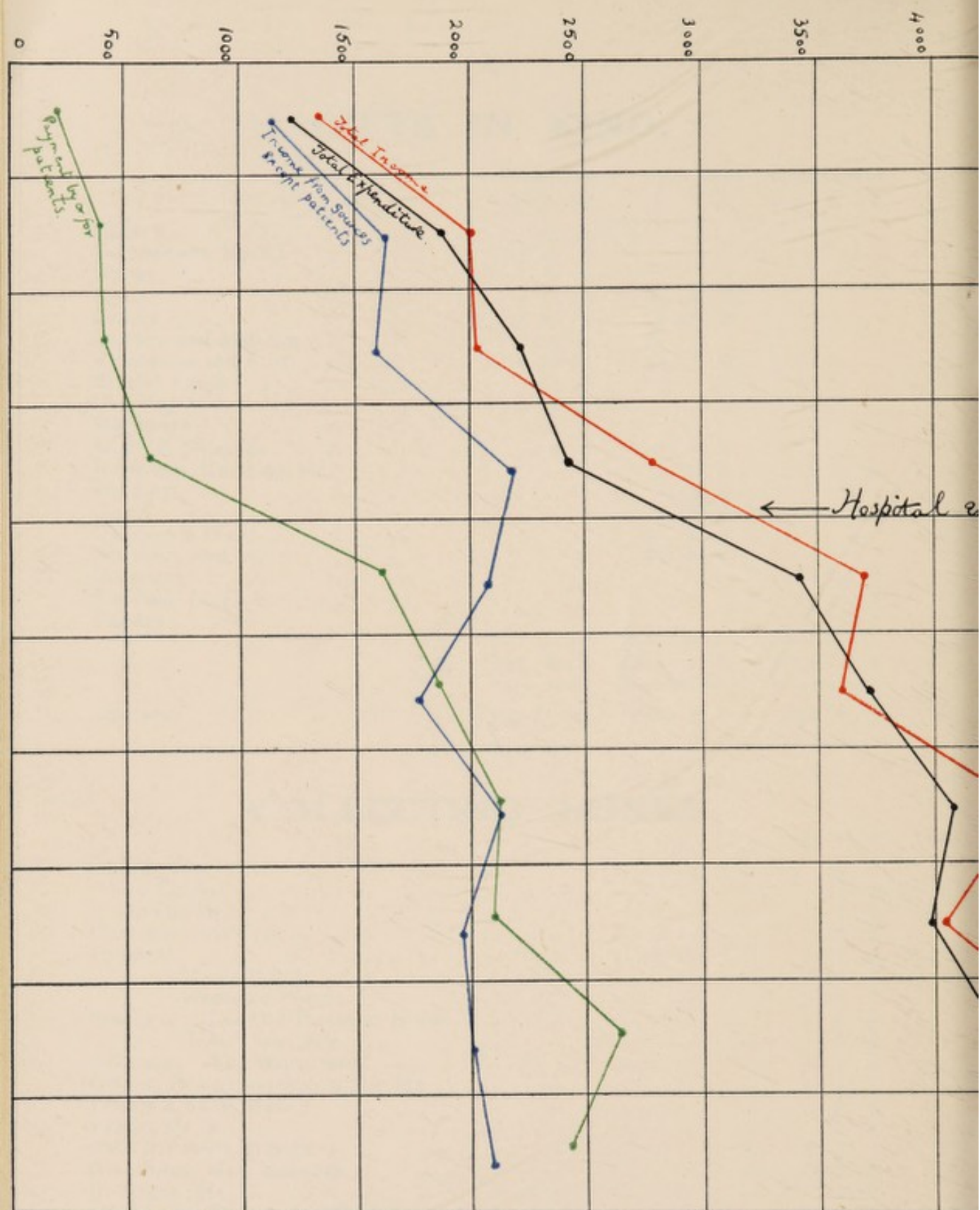

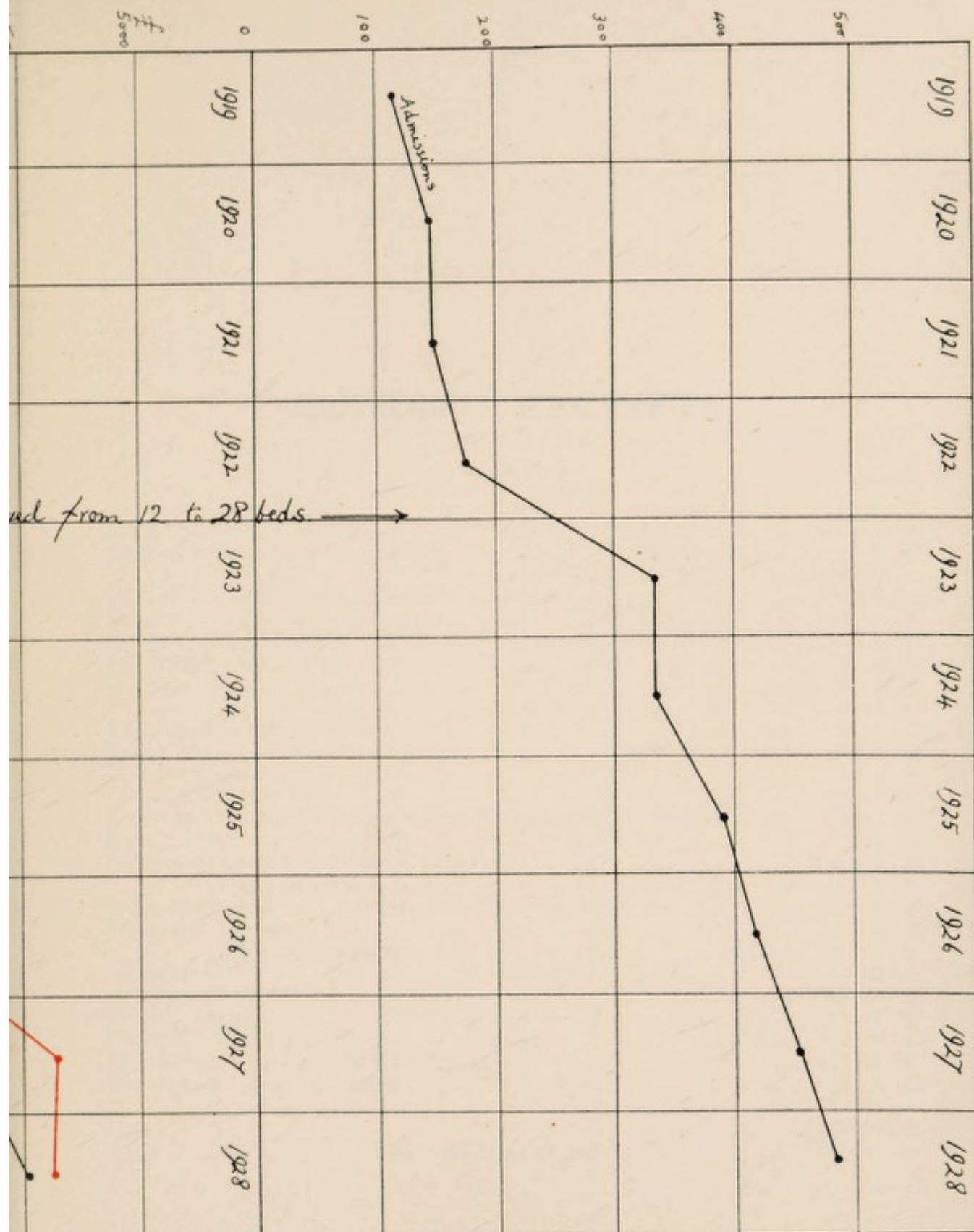

This chart has been constructed to show the Income and Expenditure of the Hospital during the last 10 years, and, by a similar curve above, their relation to the number of patients admitted. It will be seen that the two former curves are very similar in shape to the latter, and that whilst the curve of expenditure rises rapidly with the increase of admissions when the Hospital was enlarged from 12 to 28 beds in 1921-22, the curve of income very soon keeps pace



with it. Below are two more curves indicating the amount of income derived from payments by or for patients on the one hand, and from all other sources, on the other. The former shows a movement corresponding with all the other curves; but the latter, though with annual variations, shows less tendency to rise. It is therefore evident that to an increasing extent the Hospital is being supported by those who use it.

RULES

OF THE

Sevenoaks & Holmesdale Hospital.

OBJECTS.

1. The object of the Institution is to provide medical and surgical aid, attendance, and nursing for those in Sevenoaks and neighbourhood* who are suffering from illness or accident and are in need of Hospital treatment.

MAINTENANCE.

2. The funds in support of the Hospital shall be raised by voluntary contributions and by payments by and on behalf of patients. All annual subscriptions shall become due on the **1st October** in each year.

ANNUAL MEETING.

3. A General Meeting of Subscribers shall be held annually at such time between 1st October and 31st December, and at such place as the President and Board (hereinafter referred to) may determine, to receive the report of the Board for the previous year and a statement of accounts, for the election of officers and other members of the Board, and for such other business as may be necessary.

OFFICERS.

4. There shall be a President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer, who shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting of Subscribers.

MANAGEMENT.

5. The management of the Hospital shall be vested in a Board which shall consist of not more than fourteen elected Members, all of whom shall be Annual Subscribers. The President, the Treasurer, the Secretary, the Chairman and Secretary of the House Committee, the Chairman, Secretary and one Member of the Hospital Aid Committee and two Members of the Medical Staff, shall be ex-officio Members of the Board.

*Crockham Hill, Westerham, Brasted, Sundridge, Ide Hill, Chevening, Riverhead Otford Shoreham, Seal, Kemsing, Sevenoaks, St. John's, Kippington, Weald, Underriver, Halstead, Knockholt, Dunton Green, Seal Chart, Woodlands, Ightham, Wrotham, Plaxtol, Platt.

6. The Board shall meet at such times as they may consider necessary. The Secretary shall give seven days notice of the Annual General Meeting or any Special Meeting of Subscribers, and of all General and Special Meetings of the Board, except, as provided by Rule X., in the case of Special Meetings of the Board convened by requisition, and except the first Meeting of the Board, which may be held immediately after the Annual General Meeting.

7. In the event of any vacancy occurring on the Board or among the Officers of the Hospital, the Board shall have power to fill such vacancy. The Board shall have power to appoint such Medical and other Officers as they may think fit.

8. The Board may at any time, and on the requisition of ten Subscribers (who shall have been subscribers of a sum of half a guinea and upwards for not less than two years), shall call a Special Meeting of Subscribers. The notice shall state the business for which the Meeting is called, and no other business shall be transacted thereat.

9. The Board may delegate its authority and powers either in whole or in part to, and may appoint, Sub-Committees for such purpose and with such authority and powers as they may from time to time determine, and may revoke such appointments.

SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD.

QUORUM.

10. The Secretary shall call a Special Meeting of the Board, if required to do so by three Members, of which not less than three days notice shall be given. Such notice shall state the business for which it is called, and no other business shall be transacted thereat. The quorum for Special Board Meetings shall be seven, and for Board Meetings five.

11. All questions brought before any Meeting shall be decided by a show of hands. The Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

12. The Board shall appoint a Committee to be called the House Committee, which shall number not fewer than five Subscribers. It shall be the duty of the Ladies of this Committee to arrange among themselves to visit and inspect the Hospital from time to time, confer with the Matron and Medical Staff of the Hospital on the question of supplies and other matters affecting the domestic upkeep of the Hospital, and furnish a report to Meetings of the Board. The House Committee shall also confer with the Linen League with regard to the supply of linen, &c., to the Hospital.

HOSPITAL AID COMMITTEE.

13. The Board shall appoint a Committee to be called the Hospital Aid Committee for the management and control of the Hospital Contributory Scheme. Such Committee shall elect its own Chairman and Secretary and have power from time to time to add to its numbers.

INVESTMENT OF FUNDS.

14. The Board may direct the investment of the Funds of the Hospital not required for current purposes, in the names of Trustees, upon trust, for the sole benefit of the Hospital, to be dealt with in such manner as the Board may from time to time direct.

TRUSTEES.

15. The Trustees, of whom there shall not be fewer than two, shall be elected by the Subscribers at the Annual General Meeting.

TREASURER.

16. The Treasurer shall receive all monies, subscriptions and donations, shall give receipt for whatever monies, securities, documents or writings he may receive on account of the Hospital, which receipt shall be sufficient discharge. He shall not pay any monies on account of the Hospital except by cheque, and shall keep the cash account of the Hospital with such Bankers as the Board may direct, and shall prepare a statement of accounts to the 30th September in each year.

AUDITORS.

17. The Accounts shall be audited by the Auditor appointed at the Annual General Meeting.

18. Elections to the Medical Staff shall be made by the Board on the recommendation of the existing Medical Staff.

MEDICAL OFFICERS.

19. No one shall be eligible for the position of Medical Officer unless he is legally qualified and duly registered to practice under the Medical Act.

20. Each Medical Officer shall take office for one month in rotation (such rotation to be approved and regulated by the Board), and during his period of office shall be designated the Medical Officer on Duty and shall have general Medical control.

21. The Medical Officer on Duty shall attend all cases admitted during his month of office, except such as are patients of other members of the Medical Staff, and shall continue to attend them until their discharge. The Board may give the right to attend his own cases in the Hospital to every duly qualified medical man residing in the Hospital District who shall have notified the Board that he desires to do so.

22. Any Medical Officer, after service in that capacity for twenty years, may if he so desire, become a Consulting Medical Officer, and shall have the privilege of attending his own cases in the Hospital.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

23. All cases of severe accident, or admitting no delay, may be admitted at once on the authority of the Medical Officer on Duty or of the Matron.

ADMISSION TO PUBLIC WARDS.

24. (1) Contributors under the Hospital Aid Scheme shall be admitted Free when accommodation is available, on presentation of certificates from Doctor and Collector.

(2) All other patients shall pay a weekly contribution of not less than 10/6. (The Board shall, however, have power to remit the whole or part of this payment at their discretion).

ADMISSION TO PRIVATE WARDS.

25. (1) The terms of admission to Private Wards shall be at the discretion of the Board, and at an agreed charge of not less than £4 4s. a week.

(2) Private patients shall be nursed by the Nursing Staff of the Hospital and, if they require special nursing, shall pay the necessary fees and expenses.

(3) The Hospital is not responsible for the provision of medical attendance for Private Patients.

26. Except in cases of emergency every patient admitted must be provided with decent clothing, slippers and proper change of linen.

27. Cases of the following description shall not be admitted.

Advanced Pregnancy (save in cases of emergency), Confirmed Epilepsy, Infectious or Incurable Disease, Unsound Mind.

28. No patient shall remain in the Hospital more than one month without the sanction of the Board.

29. No liquors or provisions of any sort may be brought into the Hospital to patients without permission of the Medical Officer on Duty or Matron, and no patient shall be allowed to use any diet but such as shall be directed by the Medical Officer in charge of the case.

30. Patients using profane or abusive language or guilty of improper conduct, using spirituous liquors or any other article prohibited by the Medical Officer in charge, or not conforming to the Rules, Bye-laws and Regulations of the Hospital, shall be liable to immediate expulsion.

VISITORS TO PATIENTS.

31. Friends of patients may be admitted between the hours of 2 and 4.30 on Sundays and Wednesdays, or at any other time at the discretion of the Medical Officer on Duty or Matron. No more than two persons shall visit the same patient at one time.

SAMARITAN FUND.

32. A Samaritan Fund shall be dispensed at the discretion of the Board, who shall have power to make grants in aid of such Fund and for Convalescent Homes.

LIABILITY OF OFFICERS.

33. No Officer or Member of the Board, or Medical Officer shall at any time be personally liable for any obligation contracted by them on behalf of the Hospital, and the Funds of the Hospital only shall be liable for such obligations.

ALTERATION OF RULES.

34. No existing Rule shall be abrogated, suspended, or altered, or any new Rule made except at a General or Special Meeting of Subscribers, and no motion for any new Rule, or for the abrogation, suspension, or alteration of any existing Rule, shall be brought forward at any such Meeting, unless notice thereof in writing shall have been delivered to the Secretary at least fourteen clear days previous to the holding of the Meeting, and the proposed motion shall have been inserted in the summons issued to the Subscribers.

4. It is strictly forbidden for any Patient to enter a Public House during residence in the Hospital, under pain of dismissal.

Patients are expected to attend Divine Service on Sundays when well enough to do so,
