





SALFORD ROYAL HOSPITAL.

In the year 1827, this Hospital had its origin in temporary premises in Chapel Street, Salford.

In 1830 the corner stone of a portion of the present building was laid on a

plot of land that had been acquired from the Duchy of Lancaster.

The Institution received the patronage of King William IV., and His Majesty contributed twenty-five guineas annually towards the maintenance of the hospital. The Royal patronage was continued during the reigns of Queen Victoria and King Edward the VII., and His Most Gracious Majesty the King has graciously renewed the privilege so long enjoyed.

For the first eighteen years of the Hospital's existence medical relief was afforded only to Out and Home patients, but in 1845 ten beds were provided in the building for the reception of In-patients. In 1866, two wings were added to the original building, raising the number of beds to forty; in 1871 ten more

were added, and in 1882 the number was increased to sixty-two.

A large legacy left to the Institution in 1882 by the late John Pendlebury, Esq., enabled the Governors to further extend the Hospital accommodation to one hundred and twenty-seven beds.

In the year 1905, the Isolation Block was converted into Male Surgical

Wards, and eight more beds added, making the total number 135.

The Extensions of the Hospital, decided upon in 1906, provided accommodation for 208 beds.

In 1911 the Hospital was further enlarged by the addition of the King Edward VII. Memorial Wing, thus increasing the number of beds to 260.

In the year 1922 the Salford War Memorial Ward, in the above wing, was opened by H.R.H. The Duke of York, K.G., G.C.V.O., who also unveiled in the Entrance Hall a commemorative tablet.

Two Observation Wards containing two Male Beds and one Female Bed

were provided in 1926.

In 1875, the Pendleton Dispensary was built, as a branch of the Hospital, by means of a public subscription amongst the inhabitants of the District. With the approval of the Charity Commissioners this Dispensary was closed in June, 1923, as the work could be more conveniently done at the Hospital, and

the property was sold.

The Medical Staff consists of one Honorary Consulting Physician, three Honorary Physicians, one Honorary Assistant Physician, two Honorary Consulting Surgeons, four Honorary Surgeons, two Honorary Assistant Surgeons, one Honorary Gynæcologist, one Honorary Surgeon for Diseases of the Ear, Nose, and Throat, one Honorary Assistant Surgeon for Diseases of the Ear, Nose, and Throat, one Honorary Ophthalmic Surgeon, one Honorary Surgeon in Charge of Orthopædic Department, one Honorary Surgeon in Charge of Genito-Urinary Department, two Honorary Medical Officers for the Electro-Therapeutic Department, one Honorary Dermatologist, one Honorary Dentist, one Pathologist, four Anæsthetists, four Registrars, one Radiologist, a Resident Surgical Officer, four House Surgeons, a Casualty House Surgeon, a House Physician, and a District Medical Officer for Broughton and Salford, and a District Medical Officer for Pendleton.

The original site of the Hospital was presented by the Duchy, and the site of the Pendleton Branch Dispensary (which has now been sold and the proceeds —£2,169 8s. 4d.—invested by the Official Trustee of Charitable Funds) was presented by the late Sir William Agnew, Bart. In addition to the investments, the property of the Hospital comprises the Hospital buildings in Chapel Street, Adelphi Street and Adelphi Place, Salford, and the land and buildings in Chapel Street, St. Philip's Place. Adelphi Place, Peel Street and Wilton Place, Salford, the Pilkington Home, "Oakwood," Swinton Park, together with the furniture and fittings in these establishments and Edenholme, Swinton Park.



The Board of Management has pleasure in submitting its 104th Annual Report and Statement of Accounts, being in respect of the year ended June 30th, 1932.

In spite of the fact that the average length of stay of each In-Patient was only 20.16 days and that during the whole of the year the average number of beds occupied was 218.65 (83.14%), unfortunately no fewer than 618 Patients remained on the waiting lists at the end of the year.

Motor Accident During the year, 317 Patients were treated as the result of traffic accidents, 128 of these were In-patients.

The total cost of the treatment of these cases was £654 13s. 10d., towards which only £98 16s. 5d. was received, leaving a deficit of £555 17s. 5d. to be found out of the General Funds of the Institution.

It is clear that the Road Traffic Act has done little to improve the position of Voluntary Hospitals. The relative clause in the Act which provides for payment of Hospital expenses, up to £25 in any one case, has been found to contain many loopholes, with the above disappointing result.

Motorists' Association.—With the object of helping to meet the heavy cost of this work, a Motorists' Association was formed in 1931, with a minimum subscription of 2/6 per annum. During the year the sum of £33 10s. has been handed over. The Board earnestly appeals for increased support.

Convalescent Patients. During the year many patients have with great advantage been treated in Convalescent Homes through the kind offices of The Cotton Districts Convalescent Fund.

The Board desires to record its appreciative thanks to the Governors of this Fund for their valuable co-operation which has enabled the Hospital at small expense to provide this very necessary after-care treatment.

Income and Expenditure. The total ordinary income for the year was £34,502, which is £130 less than the previous year and £651 less than the average of the past three years.

The total ordinary expenditure has been £48,458, which is £477 less than the previous year. The deficiency of income for the past year is therefore £13,956. After payment of £5,251 Extraordinary Expenditure, the total deficit is £19,207.

The widespread industrial depression has unfortunately persisted during the year, and has resulted in a further decrease in the Hospital's income. Some benefactors have been obliged to reduce their contributions; but, happily, there is evidence of a general desire to postpone such a step as long as possible. The Board tenders sincere thanks to all for help received in these difficult times.

A welcome decrease of £477 is reported in expenditure as a result mainly of falling prices and careful administration. The annual deficiency of £19,207, however, is an alarmingly high figure, and the consequent drain on its slender reserves is proving a very serious handicap in the Hospital's work.

Faced with this serious shortage of funds, the Board is hopeful that the proposed scheme for a joint appeal on behalf of all local Hospitals with the object of increasing income by organised collections in Works, Warehouses, Offices, etc., which is now in contemplation, will commend itself to all and that a generous response from both employers and employed will result. In spite of the present difficult times, there is every reason to believe that an efficient method of centralised contributions would result in an increased income and enable the existing accommodation to be maintained without the necessity of closing any of the wards.

ENDOWMENT:

Nursing Staff. The thanks of the Board are accorded to members of the Nursing Staff for their loyal services, and to the members of the Honorary Medical Staff who have been responsible for lectures to Nurses.

The Board records with regret the death of Mrs. H. Marsden, who rendered much valuable service as Principal of the Massage School during a period of 14 years.

Linen Guild. The tenth Annual Meeting of the Guild was held on July 11th, 1932 (see page 84). During the year Linen to the value of £114 has been purchased, in addition to which garments and other articles of linen to the value of £27 have been presented for the use of patients in the Hospital. The Board tenders grateful thanks to all helpers of the Guild, including the energetic members of the Dorcas Society. There is an urgent need for more members to assist in meeting the heavy annual maintenance of linen.

Annual Report have now been completed. Dr. A. Corsar Sturrock, Honorary Consulting Physician, has kindly undertaken to conduct, in collaboration with the Lancashire Mental Hospitals Board, an out-patient clinic for cases of early mental disorder. It is hoped that this department will still further increase the usefulness of the Hospital, and the Board is grateful to Dr. Sturrock for his ready and most valuable co-operation.

Acknowledgments. The Board wishes to express its sincere thanks to the Honorary Medical Staff for their valuable services to the Hospital. The work of the Hospital has again necessitated very heavy demands on their time.

The accommodation in the Out-patient, Accident and other Special departments has long been inadequate, and the Medical Board in its report again draws attention to the difficulties experienced by both patients and staff.

The rapid growth of specialised medical science has rendered much of the existing accommodation unsuitable for modern requirements, and the Board renew their earnest appeal for assistance in providing funds for much-needed improvements. Plans are already in existence for a good deal of this work; but in view of the serious financial position of the hospital, developments have been necessarily postponed. In the meantime the Board is making arrangements for the temporary occupation of the former bank premises adjoining the Hospital in order to relieve some of the most serious congestion.

Gifts of Provisions, Requisites, etc.

Welcome gifts received during the year have reduced expenditure, and the Board tenders to all donors their grateful thanks.

Eggs. 16,000 eggs were received, mainly through the efforts of school children during a very successful Egg Week. 10,000 eggs were very kindly sent by the Bury Infirmary.

oxygen, etc. The British Oxygen Company, Ltd., have again kindly supplied Oxygen and Nitrous Oxide free of cost to the Hospital, a concession enjoyed during the past four years.



Annual Report of the Medical Board.

The year which ended on June 30th, 1932, has been one during which the resources of the Hospital have been taxed to their utmost capacity. There is still a good deal of unavoidable waiting for admission, particularly on the surgical side of the Hospital. As was pointed out in the medical report last year, the large number of industrial accidents and the increasing number of motor injuries occupy many beds which would otherwise be available for general surgical work. There is great difficulty, with the present inadequate out-patient accommodation, in dealing with the increasing number of patients who attend this department. It is hoped that improved and increased accommodation may be provided in the near future.

The members of the Medical Board greatly regret the the death of Mr. Andrew Boutflower, the senior Consulting Surgeon, who had devoted so many years of his life to the service of this Hospital. During the year, Dr. A. Corsar Sturrock has resigned his post as Honorary Physician, and Dr. W. J. S. Bythell has resigned as Honorary Radiologist. Both of these gentlemen have been appointed to the Honorary Consulting Staff in recognition of their service to the Hospital. Dr. C. S. D. Don has been appointed as Honorary Physician.

The death of Mr. George Ruddle, who had been General Superintendent of the Hospital for so many years, was very deeply regretted by the Medical Staff, all of whom have many happy memories of his kindliness and tactful dealing with the problems of hospital work.

It has been decided to hold, in collaboration with the Lancashire Mental Hospitals Board, an out-patient Clinic for cases of early mental disorder, and it is hoped that this department will prove of value to the community in connection with the milder stages of mental disease.

The Nursing services of the Hospital have been carried on through the year in the most efficient manner, and the Medical Board offer their thanks to the Matron and the whole of her staff for their unsparing devotion to their duties.



During the year, 11,879 specimens were examined, and 487 autogenous vaccines were prepared.







IN, HOME AND OUT-PATIENTS.

IN-PATIENTS.

Persons are admitted as In-Patients without a Subscriber's recommendation, for a term of one month's treatment, should their case require it; and may be re-admitted on the recommendation of their medical officer for a second period of one month; but any patient who seeks for further re-admission must obtain the sanction of the House Committee for such extension.

HOME PATIENTS.

All applications for medical relief from persons who are unable to attend, must be made at the Hospital between 9 and 9-30 o'clock in the morning, or they cannot be visited on the same day.

OUT-PATIENTS.

Applicants for admission as Out-Patients must attend for Registration between 8-30 and 9-30 in the morning.

Children under 15 years of age will not be admitted unless accompanied by an adult.

No Applicant will be allowed more than One Admission Card.

The circumstances of all Patients will be enquired into and only those persons who are found unable to pay for Medical Attendance, and are not in receipt of parochial relief, will be admitted to the benefits of the Hospital.
