## THE ONE HUNDRED AND SIXTY-NINTH REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT TO THE ANNUAL COURT OF GOVERNORS.

The Committee of Management present to the Governors their one hundred and sixty-ninth Report relating to the year ended 31st December, 1934.

We record with deep regret the loss sustained through the death of Mr. H. N. Devenish, M.A., a Member of the House Committee and of the Committee of Management. He was elected a member in 1914, and took an active part in the management of the Hospital right up to the time of his death.

The Standing Committee and the two Special Committees have given much time and thought to the reconstruction of the Hospital, and their reports will be found in these pages. These reports record only the more important items discussed, and the Committee of Management appreciate the large amount of time freely given in settling the details, both large and small. When the present extensions are complete, Salisbury and district will possess a Hospital modern in all essentials, of which it can be proud.

#### MEDICAL COMMITTEE.

Since its foundation the Infirmary had admitted within its walls 138,737 In-Patients.

In 1771, the earliest year for which statistics are available, 726 Patients (192 In-Patients and 534 Out-Patients) were treated.

In 1934, 2668 In-Patients were admitted, the number of days of Hospital treatment being 51,958, an increase of 4498 as compared with the previous year.

The largest number treated in any one day was 160 and the smallest 123, the daily average being 142.3.

The average "days of stay" were 19.5, compared to 19.7 in 1933.

Of the In-Patients treated during 1934,

1877 were discharged "cured,"

434 were discharged "improved,"
181 were discharged "unimproved,"

31 were discharged to Convalescent and other Institutions,

142 died, and

129 were still under treatment at the end of the year.

Last year the number of operations performed in the In-Patient Department was 995 and in the Out-Patient Department 565.

In the Maternity Department 55 Patients were admitted for Ante-Natal treatment prior to their confinement. 356 confinements took place in the Maternity Ward, 337 live babies being born.

In the Ante-Natal Department there were 393 New Cases this year, who were kept under observation until the time of their confinement.

In the Salisbury Maternity District 85 confinement cases were attended this year and nursed in their own homes by midwives from the Infirmary. At least 13 visits were made in each case. These cases all did well.

This is the fifth year in which this Maternity District Service has been working, and 445 cases have been confined during that time.

Nurses for Maternity Cases at a fee of 30s. can be booked at any time by applying at the Infirmary.

#### THE OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT.

In 1934 there were 9213 new cases, who made 26,911 subsequent attendances, as compared with 7647 new cases, who made 23.748 subsequent attendances in the previous year.

109 cases were admitted to the Ward, 47 major operations being performed.

#### PATHOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT.

#### THE GREVILLE LABORATORY.

This year has again shown a considerable increase in the work done by this Department, not only on behalf of the Infirmary, but of Public Bodies over an increasingly wide area.

During 1934 the Department dealt with over 10,500 specimens, many of them requiring a number of tests. Of these, 2266 were received from the Infirmary.

A Clinic for the treatment of Rheumatoid Arthritis and other forms of rheumatism has been working during the past year at the Infirmary.

Up to February, 1935, 91 cases have been treated with very promising results, bearing in mind that the great majority of cases are patients who have been suffering from their complaint for a number of years and have previously undergone other treatments.

Of the 91, 23 have been cured and 35 improved. 15 cases shown no change, 10 have been under treatment for too short a time for any definite result, and 8 abandoned or were unable to continue treatment.

## RECONSTRUCTION AND ENLARGEMENT OF THE INFIRMARY.

A great Appeal for Funds to finance the above was made by the Visitor and the President at the end of May, 1934, the sum required being £85,000. Some 10,000 Appeals were issued throughout the whole of the district embraced by the Infirmary.

Up to and including 31st December, 1934, the sum of £25,620 15s. 4d had been subscribed in cash or promised over a term of years. This sum included welcome grant of £5000 from the League for furnishings.

The Committee appreciate the generous support, which has up to the end of the year been given by 505 donors, including the combined efforts of a large number of Villages and Salisbury Entertainments, and they earnestly hope that the many Residents and Traders in Salisbury and the surrounding neighbourhood who have not yet subscribed will come forward this current year and follow the example of those who gave so generously in 1934.

There still remains the very large sum of £59,379 4s. 8d. to be raised and it is hoped that a great effort will be made to open the New Buildings now being erected clear of debt, and to enable the work to be continued.

Included in the total above mentioned, £387 15s. 0d. has been given to the Kempe Memorial Fund, a Fund being raised to build and equip a new Theatre as a Memorial to the late Dr. Gilbert Kempe.

#### WORKS COMMITTEE.

Acting on the instructions of the last Annual Court of Governors, the final plans for the rebuilding of the Infirmary were approved, and tenders invited from 16 firms for the construction of the new buildings. The lowest tender, that of Messrs. Webster and Cannon, Aylesbury, was accepted and work commenced on the 28th August, 1934, on the first section (the extensions to the Nurses' Home, the Special Cases Ward and the New Mortuary). Thanks partly to good weather, this work is well in hand.

The modernisation of the Old Buildings, Section II. and III. of the Reconstruction Scheme, will be taken in hand as funds permit, when Section I. is completed.

#### HOUSE COMMITTEE.

The first appointment to the post of Resident Medical Officer was made on the 1st February, 1934, Mr. A. C. Price, M.B., Ch.B., being selected. The arrangement is working well.

#### FINANCE AND APPEALS COMMITTEE.

The Finance and Appeals Committee are glad to report an excess of Income over Expenditure of £280 12s. 6d., but they would call attention to the fact that this satisfactory state of affairs arises through reductions in two items of expenditure which are exceptional:—

(a) Annual Repairs and

(b) Interest on Bank Overdraft.

As regards (a) in 1934 no redecoration of Wards and Departments was undertaken on account of building operations. No redecoration, it is hoped, will be undertaken in 1935, but in future years this item of expenditure must recur.

As regards (b) advantage was taken of the credits accruing on the Reconstruction and the Butts Farm account to lend those credits to the General account, and thus save Bank Interest. These credits have now been exhausted, and a rise in Bank interest will appear as payments to the builders are made.

As was to be expected owing to the Building Appeal, the Income derived from donations and entertainments has fallen. The increased bed occupation is reflected in the payments under the headings of Provisions, Surgery and Dispensary and Washing.

Partly owing to the regulations of the Milk Marketing Board the cost of Milk supplied has risen by £132 18s. 2d.

One hundred and four cases of road accidents were treated at a cost of £894 0s. 2d., of which sum £260 5s. 0d. only has to date been recovered. There are still 25 Claims amounting to £302 4s. 0d. outstanding.

The number of cases treated rose by 33 compared to 1933, and the number of days In-Patient treatment by 795 to 1997.

#### LANDS COMMITTEE.

We are glad to report that the negotiations for the sale of a further 35 acres on the Butts Farm have been brought to a successful conclusion. Arrangements have been made for the grassing down of the 14 acres remaining the property of the Infirmary.

We have been able to hand over a further sum of £1600 to the General Account.

The purchasers completed payment of the purchase money on the original building estate on the 13th June, 1934.

#### NURSING COMMITTEE.

Sixty-six enquiries for particulars of the Training School were received during the year. Twelve of the forty candidates who applied have been accepted; some are already on the staff and the rest are waiting to come when vacancies occur.

Eight probationers have signed an agreement for three or four years full training. One candidate came from the Yeatman Hospital, Sherborne, as a second year nurse to finish her course at this Infirmary, and two probationers as third year nurses from the South London Hospital for Jomen.

Ten nurses have finished their training and gained certificates; of these, four are taking Midwifery training in Beatrice Ward, three have been appointed Staff Nurses in other hospitals, and three are doing private nursing.

Seven probationers this year have become State registered nurses.

The following Sisters have left the Infirmary:-

Miss M. Wright, District Midwifery Sister, to take up her appointment as District Nurse for Downton.

Miss B. Hedderman to be married.

To fill these vacancies:-

Miss I. Heslington has been appointed Midwifery Sister for the District.

Miss H. Williams has returned to the Out-Patient Department. Miss S. E. White has been appointed Sister in charge of Radnor Ward.

The work of the Midwifery School has increased; 85 cases in 1934 were undertaken on the district, and 356 in Beatrice Ward. Nine pupils passed the examination of the Central Midwives' Board, and three nurses were sent from the Queen's Nurses' Home at Guildford for a month's training in institution work. Seven pupils stayed as Staff Nurses for six months.

Six Sisters from other hospitals gained the certificate for Housekeeping at this Infirmary, and one Student from King's College for Women came for a special six weeks' course during her summer vacation.

Several members of the Wiltshire (No. 10) Branch of the British Red Cross Society have done regular work in the Wards and Casualty Department. They were particularly helpful during the holiday season, as the Hospital was busier than is usual during the summer months.

Dr. Saunders and Dr. Taylor-Young have given lectures in Medical and Surgical Nursing to the Student Nurses and Dr. Armitage and Dr. Campbell Gordon Midwifery Lectures to the Pupil Midwives.

Dr. Monnington has kindly undertaken the care of the Staff in illness. His help and that of other members of the Honorary Medical Staff in special cases has been much appreciated by the Nurses.



### CONTRIBUTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

At the Annual Court of Governors held on April 30th, 1925, it was decided that, in future, Recommendation Forms shall be issued in the following proportions:—

All Benefactors of Fifty Pounds at the least, in one or two sums, and the first named Executor in a Will of a Testator or Testatrix leaving a Legacy of One Hundred Pounds at the least (clear of all deductions), shall be entitled to Eight Recommendation Forms in every year. In case of Benefactions, for every Fifty Pounds, and in the case of Legacies, for every One Hundred Pounds. And all Annual Subscribers shall be entitled to One Recommendation Form for each Half-Guinea subscribed in every year. The Consulting and Acting Physicians and Surgeons shall be entitled to Eight Recommendation Forms, in addition to their rights as Subscribers, if they should be such. And every Benefactor of Twenty-Five Pounds shall be entitled to Four Recommendation Forms in every year. Members or Governors elected by any Annual Court as authorised by the Charter shall enjoy such privileges as the Governors at such Annual Court shall think proper. And every Clergyman and Minister who shall make or authorise Collections to be made in his Church or Chapel for the benefit of the Infirmary, and every person who shall pay to the Treasurer Two Guineas or upwards, the amount of a collection within one or more Parishes, shall have the same privileges of recommending patients as an Annual Subscriber. And all Friendly Societies who shall pay Two Guineas each year shall have the same privileges of recommending patients as an Annual Subscriber. All recommendations from Poor Law Unions shall be signed by the Presiding Chairman of the day.
