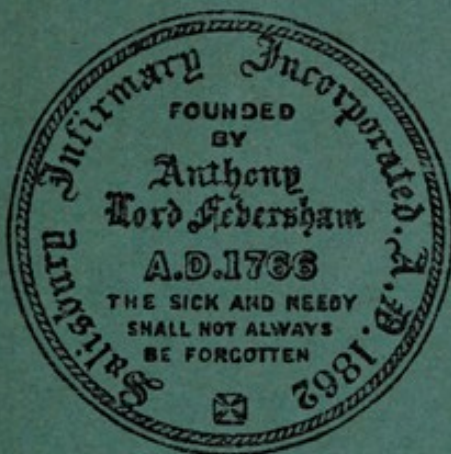

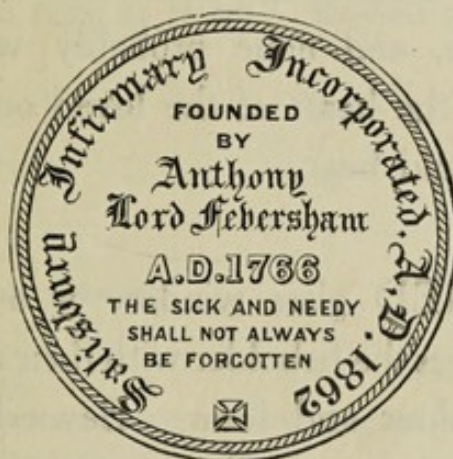

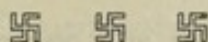

THE ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTIETH REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT TO THE ANNUAL COURT OF GOVERNORS.

The Committee of Management present to the Governors their one hundred and seventieth Report relating to the year ending 31st December, 1935.

The various Standing Committees have given much time and thought to the problems brought before them, and they have rendered their reports to us at our monthly meetings. Specially would we mention the Works Committee, upon which rests the chief responsibility for the present reconstruction of the buildings. We hope that the services of the busy medical and professional members of this Committee is appreciated, as it should be. The reports of the various Committees are given hereunder.

Early in January, 1935, the Committee suffered a severe loss in the death of Mr. Cecil G. Bennett, a Life Governor and member of the Finance Committee since its inception. On more than one occasion Mr. Bennett was responsible for organising efforts which raised large sums for the benefit of the Institution, and the loss of his helpful advice will be severely felt.

MEDICAL COMMITTEE.

Since its foundation the Infirmary has admitted within its walls 141,271 In-Patients.

In 1771, the earliest year for which statistics are available, 726 Patients (192 In-Patients and 534 Out-Patients) were treated.

In 1935, 2534 In-Patients were admitted, the number of days of Hospital treatment being 48,189, a decrease of 3769 as compared with the previous year.

The largest number treated in any one day was 152, and the smallest 110, the daily average being 132.

The average "days of stay" were 19.1, compared to 19.5 in 1934.

Of the In-Patients treated during 1935,

1584 were discharged "cured,"

430 were discharged "improved,"

193 were discharged "unimproved,"

79 were discharged to Convalescent and other Institutions,

119 died, and

134 were still under treatment at the end of the year.

Last year the number of operations in the In-Patient Department were 904 and in the Out-Patient Department 552.

In the Maternity Department 49 Patients were admitted for Ante-Natal treatment prior to confinement. 402 confinements took place in the Maternity Ward, 380 live babies being born.

In the Ante-Natal Department there were 431 new cases this year, who were kept under observation until the time of their confinement.

In the Salisbury Maternity District 83 confinement cases were attended this year and nursed in their own homes by midwives from the Infirmary. At least 13 visits were made in each case. These cases all did well.

This is the sixth year in which this Maternity District Service has been working, and 559 cases have been confined during that time.

Nurses for Maternity cases at a fee of 30s. can be booked at any time by applying at the Infirmary.

THE OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT.

In 1935 there were 9430 new cases, who made 26,788 subsequent attendances, as compared with 9213 new cases, who made 26,911 subsequent attendances in the previous year.

PATHOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT.

THE GREVILLE LABORATORY.

The work of the Department continues to increase, both in quantity and scope. The application of the results of recent medical research to practical treatment necessitates more and more the services of a fully-equipped Laboratory, and every endeavour is made to keep both technique and equipment abreast of the latest requirements. The quarters in which the Laboratory has heretofore been housed having proved inadequate, entirely new accommodation has now been provided, and the department moved into its new home at the end of 1935. The accommodation is now nearly double that previously available, and has been fitted up throughout to satisfy all the requirements of a thoroughly up-to-date modern Laboratory.

Services working in conjunction with the Pathological Department include the Rheumatism Clinic and the Salisbury Association of Blood Donors. Both these units have done excellent work in the past year, and have contributed valuable additions to the facilities available for the relief of hospital patients.

The Blood Donors' Association has responded to seven calls for blood transfusion. It now numbers 61 donors available in case of emergency, and its services has proved of the greatest value to Surgeons and Physicians alike.

RECONSTRUCTION AND ENLARGEMENT OF THE INFIRMARY.

During 1935 the response to the Building Appeal amounted to £11,814 18s. 9d. in cash and promises, making the total amount collected on 31st December, 1935, £37,435 14s. 1d. The largest donation, £3000, was given by Mr. C. J. Woodrow, J.P., to name the new Children's Ward in memory of the late Mrs. Woodrow.

Up to 31st December, 1935, excluding the Wireless Appeal and the combined efforts of the Medical, the Nursing and the Domestic Staffs, 1000 persons, Clubs, Committees, &c., have contributed to the appeal. The larger portion of the response to Lord Radnor's wireless appeal is included in this year's figure. On the 31st December, 1934, the sum of £7 8s. was received, and in the early days of January, 1935, the total of this appeal soon reached £393 14s. 2d.

The legacy of the late Dr. Harcourt Coates became payable during 1935. Under the terms of the will the Committee were instructed to provide out of the Capital the cost of a new Surgical Ward; thus the name "Accident Ward" will disappear and the name "Harcourt and Maud Coates' Ward" will be included in the Ward names of the Infirmary. The sum appealed for has consequently been reduced from £85,000 to £80,000.

The Committee appeal to all friends of the Infirmary to come forward now and assist in reducing the amount still to be raised. Particularly is it desired to see the remaining five firms in Salisbury accept the challenge of the Wessex Motors and give the sum of £500 each (spread over seven years if desired), and thus enable the appeal to benefit, both by their own £500 and also the additional £250 promised by the Wessex Motors.

WORKS COMMITTEE.

The first section of new work reported in our last Annual Report as in hand (the extensions to the Nurses' Home, the Special Cases Ward and the new Mortuary) have been completed and handed over.

The construction of the new Children's Ward, the Ethel Woodrow Ward, was commenced in July, 1935, and is now ready to hand over.

The alterations to the "Quillett," conversion of the top floor into a flat for the Resident Engineer and the ground floor into the new Greville Laboratory, were taken in hand. The first was completed and handed over in October, 1935, and the Laboratory is now ready for occupation.

The two outbuildings between the "Quillett" and the boiler house have been completed and handed over.

The construction of the boiler house is finished and the machinery mostly installed, though a few fittings still remain to be completed.

The existing wards, excluding the present Feversham, have been cleared in turn for the installation of central heating and for re-wiring. The modernisation of the old buildings is well in hand.

Work on the second section, Casualty and X-Ray Department, Ophthalmic Ward and Out-Patient Department, Paying Patient Ward and the V.D. Department is progressing. On consideration it was decided to pull down the old V.D. building (it was built as a Laundry about 1848) and rebuild it rather than reconstruct as originally planned.

Arrangements are now being made to proceed with the last section of the work, *i.e.*, the Theatre Block (Kempe Memorial), the construction of the Harcourt and Maud Coates' Ward, the construction of the new Out-Patient Hall and Consulting Rooms and the alteration to the Administration Block, including modernisation of kitchens. The Theatre unit and the Coates' Ward will be taken in hand as soon as the good weather starts in 1936. Thus arrangements have been made for the completion of the reconstruction and modernisation of the Salisbury Infirmary.

HOUSE COMMITTEE.

During the year under review the extensions to the Nurses' Home and the Special Cases Ward have been occupied. The boiler house has been built and the machinery installed, though a certain amount of equipment is still outstanding. The plant commenced working for test on the 1st October, 1935, and since then parts of the buildings have been transferred to the new plant for lighting and heating.

The Resident Engineer took up his duty in September.

Dr. A. C. Price, M.B., Ch.B., resigned his post as Resident Medical Officer to date 10th July, 1935, and Dr. G. F. Hudson, M.D., M.R.C.P., was appointed to succeed him. Dr. Hudson asked to be relieved at the end of his three months' probationary period, as he had secured an appointment at his teaching hospital, and on the 25th November, 1935, Dr. P. B. Barker M.B., Ch.B., came to fill the vacancy.

FINANCE AND APPEALS COMMITTEE.

The Finance and Appeals Committee regret to report an excess of Expenditure over Income of £1789 18s. 6d.

Ordinary Receipts have fallen by £494 16s. 6d., partly due to revenue which has previously gone into the General Fund being given by the donors to the construction Fund. As was expected, expenditure has risen. The increased cost of milk, due to the rise in price, is £121 18s. 7d. There is also an increase of £74 0s. 2d. in the cost of dressings, due to market prices. The change over from the old to the new system of heating has been taking place during the last quarter of the year, and this, with an increase in Staff, accounts for higher running costs. Bank interest has risen. The revised rating assessment has cost the Infirmary £63 15s. 4d.

Eighty cases of road accidents were received in 1935, necessitating 1607 days of treatment at a cost of £712 10s. 6d. Of this sum, £270 3s. 6d. has been recovered from the Insurance Companies or from the patients themselves.

This is a reduction of 24 in the number of cases treated and of £181 9s. 6d. in the cost of treatment, whilst the sum recovered has risen by £9 18s. 6d. At the same time, the situation is far from satisfactory. The Infirmary has suffered a definite loss of £442 7s. 2d. In 28 of these cases no second vehicle was involved, so that no claim arises under the Road Traffic Act.

NURSING COMMITTEE.

During the year there were forty-one requests for particulars of the Training School. Twenty-six candidates applied, and eight were accepted. Five of these are already on the Staff, and the rest will fill vacancies in 1936.

Thirteen probationers signed the agreement for full training, and two came from the South London Hospital for Women as third year nurses to finish their training at this Hospital.

Four nurses gained our four years' certificate, two nurses the certificate of affiliated training from the Salisbury Infirmary and the South London Hospital for Women, and one the certificate of affiliated training from the Salisbury Infirmary and the Yeatman Hospital, Sherborne. Three of these are taking midwifery training here, three left to take Staff Nurses posts, and one joined the Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service.

Ten probationers passed the final examination of the General Nursing Council, and their names are on the State Register. The following Sisters resigned their posts:—

Miss F. Barwell, Theatre Sister, to take up an appointment in London.

Miss M. Coleman was appointed temporary assistant in the X-Ray and Massage Department during the absence of Miss Hayward, who is taking a course in massage and medical electricity at King's College Hospital.

The number of nurses was increased at the end of the year to provide the Staff necessary for the Ethel Woodrow Ward. These extra nurses are in the Nurses' Home Extension, which was put into use during the year.

The Midwifery Department has been particularly busy ; there were 402 cases in the Ward and 83 on the district.

Eight pupils passed the examination of the Central Midwives' Board, and one nurse came from the Guildford Queen's Nurses' Association for a month's training in hospital work. Six of the pupils stayed on as Staff Nurses for six months.

Four trained nurses took our four months' course in Institutional House-keeping and gained the certificate.

Lectures in Medical and Surgical Nursing were given to the probationer nurses by Dr. Saunders and Dr. Taylor-Young, and midwifery lectures to the pupil midwives by Dr. Armitage and Dr. Gordon.

The Nursing Staff much appreciated the help of Dr. Monnington in illness, and of the other members of the honorary Medical Staff in special cases.

CONTRIBUTIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS.

At the Annual Court of Governors held on April 30th, 1925, it was decided that, in future, Recommendation Forms shall be issued in the following proportions :—

All Benefactors of Fifty Pounds at the least, in one or two sums, and the first-named Executor in a Will of a Testator or Testatrix leaving a Legacy of One Hundred Pounds at the least (clear of all deductions), shall be entitled to Eight Recommendation Forms in every year. In case of Benefactions, for every Fifty Pounds, and in the case of Legacies, for every One Hundred Pounds. And all Annual Subscribers shall be entitled to One Recommendation Form for each Half-Guinea subscribed in every year. The Consulting and Acting Physicians and Surgeons shall be entitled to Eight Recommendation Forms, in addition to their rights as Subscribers, if they should be such. And every Benefactor of Twenty-Five Pounds shall be entitled to Four Recommendation Forms in every year. Members or Governors elected by any Annual Court as authorised by the Charter shall enjoy such privileges as the Governors at such Annual Court shall think proper. And every Clergyman and Minister who shall make or authorise Collections to be made in his Church or Chapel for the benefit of the Infirmary, and every person who shall pay to the Treasurer Two Guineas or upwards, the amount of a collection within one or more Parishes, shall have the same privileges of recommending patients as an Annual Subscriber. And all Friendly Societies who shall pay Two Guineas each year shall have the same privileges of recommending patients as an Annual Subscriber. All recommendations from Poor Law Unions shall be signed by the Presiding Chairman of the day.
