THE ONE HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-FOURTH REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT TO THE ANNUAL COURT OF GOVERNORS.

The Committee of Management has pleasure in submitting its report for the year 1939.

In-Patients.—On the outbreak of war, the Ministry of Health's Emergency Hospital Scheme immediately came into operation, and, in consequence, admissions to the Infirmary were greatly restricted during the months of September and October. In spite of these emergency measures, a further record number of admissions during the year has to be reported, the total, 3,296, being 277 more than in 1938. This increase is due to a greater volume of work in the general wards, and also to the opening of the new Private Patients' Ward in June. The average number of patients resident daily is, however, reduced from 157.6 in 1938 to 151.7 in 1939, and the average length of stay of each patient is also lower, 16.8 days, as compared with 19.1 days in the previous year. The number of days of hospital treatment, 55,370, was 2,218 less than in 1938. Since its foundation, 153,010 in-patients have been admitted to the Infirmary.

The Emergency Hospital Scheme is again referred to on page 10.

Out-Patients.—The work in the Out-patient Department has also increased, the number of new patients being 10,912, as compared with 10,344 in the previous year, whilst the attendances were 47,462 and 45,649 respectively.

Financial.—As a result of the year's working, total Expenditure exceeded total Income by £3,519 as compared with £5,164 in the previous year. Whilst it is gratifying to report that ordinary income has increased from £26,803 to £36,372, this surplus is largely accounted for by the interim payments received from the Ministry of Health. In view of the fact that these payments are to be subject to review a reserve of £5,000 has been made, and, in addition, £2,743 has been transferred to Capital Account in respect of investments sold during the year in order to maintain the book values. Annual Subscriptions, Alexandra Rose Day receipts and Box Collections also contribute to the increased income, but taken as a whole voluntary income cannot be regarded as satisfactory. If the inevitable rise in the cost of almost every department is to be

faced, voluntary income must be increased. Whilst there was a substantial rise in the number of patients, expenditure shows only a slight increase, £32,144 as compared with £31,918 in 1938. In consequence, the average total cost of each in-patient is reduced from £9 12s. $9\frac{3}{4}$ d. to £8 17s. $1\frac{1}{2}$ d. The average cost of each in-patient per week is £3 13s. $11\frac{3}{4}$ d. as compared with £3 10s. $9\frac{1}{2}$ d. in the previous year. The average cost of each out-patient is 65.3d., a decrease of 2.4d. on the previous year, and the average cost of each out-patient attendance is reduced from 15.3d. to 15.1d.

It will be seen that the Expenditure Account and the Statistical Tables on pages 18 and 32 respectively, have been prepared this year to show the work done, and the expenditure incurred both prior to, and subsequent to, the outbreak of war. It is from the information so gained that the financial settlement with the Ministry of Health will be reached.

During the year the grave financial position of the Infirmary has been the subject of much serious deliberation by the Finance and Appeals Committee. As a result, sales and transfers of the Infirmary's investments have been made to the extent of £46,858 and, in consequence, the accumulated deficit of £21,593 on the Maintenance Account as reported last year has been wiped out, and the Reconstruction Account reduced by the sum of £25,265 to £5,801. There are still, however, outstanding liabilities on the Reconstruction Account, and it is estimated that the deficit on this Account will be approximately £12,000. The gratitude and thanks of the Committee are due to the Honorary Treasurer, Mr. H. R. Harraway, and the Honorary Auditor, Mr. J. R. Layton, for their efforts to improve the financial structure and for carrying out these sales and transfers.

The Committee has again to report increased expenditure on road accident cases. During the year 156 cases were admitted and spent 3,238 days in hospital at an estimated cost of £1,700, as compared with 152 cases in the previous year, which spent 2,867 days in hospital at a cost of £1,488. Payments from Insurance Companies and other sources in respect of these cases amounted to £,900, and the balance of the cost of their treatment, £800, had to be borne out of the General Funds of the Infirmary. Thus it will be seen that on the year's working, every road accident case admitted became a direct charge on the Infirmary for nearly 50 per cent. of the cost of maintenance and treatment. Committee is gravely concerned by the ever-growing financial loss sustained in treating these patients. Unfortunately, under the terms of the Road Traffic Act, payments by Insurance Companies to hospitals are dependent upon the patients' claims for damages being successful, and in many cases the circumstances of an accident prevent such a claim being made. It is interesting to note that since the black-out restrictions came into operation 68 cases were admitted, as compared with 47 cases during the corresponding period in 1938.

The following legacies were received during the year, amounting to £7,949, of which £6,545 was placed to Endowment Fund and £1,404 transferred to the General Fund Capital Account:—

The legacy of the late Sir Sidney Herbert, Bart., having been placed to the Endowment Fund, two cots in the Ethel Woodrow Ward have been named and inscribed "Sir Sidney Herbert, Born 1891, Died 1939."

Emergency Hospital Scheme.—With the outbreak of war the Ministry of Health's Emergency Hospital Scheme immediately came into operation, as a result of which the bed accommodation of the Infirmary was increased from 225 to 367. In common with other hospitals in this Scheme, and in order to provide as many beds as possible for the use of the Ministry, all those patients who were well enough to go to their homes, were evacuated. This evacuation of over 100 patients was smoothly carried out in accordance with pre-determined arrangements, and in this connection our gratitude is due to Captain W. T. Wootton for his organisation of the transport of the patients, and also to the St. John Ambulance Brigade and the A.R.P. workers who assisted.

During the months of September and October, the admission of in-patients was restricted to urgent cases and, in consequence, there was an increase in the waiting list. This situation was soon relieved, however, when the Ministry of Health gave its authority for a resumption of normal activity. Nevertheless, a large number of emergency beds are being kept in readiness for any calls which may be made upon the Infirmary.

The Ministry of Health has entered into financial arrangements with all hospitals in the Emergency Scheme and, as will be seen from the Income and Expenditure Account, interim payments have been made to the Infirmary. These payments will be subject to review when the cost of maintaining the emergency casualty scheme has been agreed with the Ministry. It is for this purpose that the Expenditure Account on page has been prepared so as to show the Infirmary's expenditure since the outbreak of war.

Arrangements have been made to increase at short notice the Nursing and other personnel, and the British Red Cross Society has created a Men's Detachment, with headquarter at the Infirmary, the primary object of which is to provide Stretcher Bearers for service in the Infirmary in time of emergency. The Commandant of this Detachment is Mr. Charles Harris, who acted as Assistant Commandant to the present Chairman, Mr. R. E. Macan, when a similar Detachment did excellent work at the Infirmary during the last war. The Committee greatly appreciates the action of the British Red Cross Society in again coming to our assistance.

Additional beds have been made available through the kindness and generosity of Sir Bruce and Lady Richmond, who have provided a ward of six beds for Maternity cases at Netherhampton House. Many patients have already been transferred to Netherhampton House and they all express their warm appreciation of the care and kind attention afforded to them. The Committee extends its gratitude to Sir Bruce and Lady Richmond for their kind thought for the patients and for the needs of the Infirmary.

Salisbury Infirmary League.—It is with pleasure that the Committee has to report a further increase in the amount received from the Infirmary League, £12,215, as compared with £11,609 in 1938. To the Council of the League, its Secretary, Collectors and helpers the Committee of Management extends its grateful appreciation of the excellent results achieved in a year of very unsettled conditions.

During the year, the League has also kindly provided the Infirmary with an Oxygen Tent Apparatus, which is greatly appreciated by the Honorary Medical Staff. The following table gives the proportion of Infirmary League in-patients and their cost for the past four years:—

Annual Subscriptions.—The Committee is pleased to again report an increase in the receipts from this source, £2,595, as compared with £2,356 in 1938. The thanks of the Committee are due to those Subscribers who kindly signed Deeds of Covenant in respect of their subscriptions, resulting in this increase. Many valuable subscriptions, however, have been lost during the year owing to the death of subscribers, and other subscribers have been compelled to reduce their subscriptions on account of the war. The Committee of Management earnestly appeals for new and increased subscriptions to replace these losses and

to meet the ever-growing demands being made upon the Infirmary by the war. If subscribers would tell their friends about the Infirmary and its needs in these difficult times, the Committee feels there are many residents in this district who would be willing to subscribe.

Donations.—£309 was received from this source as compared with £311 in the previous year. Several usual donations were not received this year, and the cessation of the Tidworth Tattoo, which is recorded with regret, also accounts for a loss of revenue. The amount received, however, from the Combined Hospitals Broadcast Appeal made on Christmas Eve by Miss Gracie Fields, £69 12s. 9d., prevented a substantial decrease in the income from donations. For the duration of the war, a Combined Hospitals Broadcast Appeal will be made three times in each year, and it is hoped that the success of the first appeal will be maintained. Box Collections.—It is very gratifying to record a substantial increase in the amount received from this source, £322 as compared with £66 in the previous year. Our appreciation and thanks are due to all Box Collectors for their increasing interest in the welfare of the Infirmary.

Alexandra Rose Day.—A record contribution of £414 was received from Alexandra Rose Day, an increase of £78 over the previous year. This was the final collection organised by Major-General Sir H. J. Everett, who has served as Honorary Secretary and Treasurer of Alexandra Rose Day for eighteen years, and the Committee expresses its grateful appreciation of this excellent result. By his enthusiastic efforts, the Infirmary has received from this source over £5,000. Our thanks are also due to Mr. A. E. Lawrence, the rose sellers and helpers upon whose valued assistance the collection so greatly depends. The Committee is pleased to report that Sir Murdoch C. McLeod, Bart., has kindly consented to succeed Major-General Sir H. J. Everett, and it is hoped that he will be well supported in his efforts to maintain the present record results.

Congregational Collections.—The amount received from Congregational Collections, £600, is £126 less than in 1938, and is the smallest sum received from this source since 1880. This disappointing result

is largely accounted for by the adverse effect of the war on Church attendances, as many of the collections are taken in September and October. The Committee is greatly concerned that during the last ten years Congregational Collections have fallen so considerably, and it is hoped that all the Churches will endeavour to arrest this constant decline. If, during 1940, each congregation would increase its collection by £1, a much improved position could be reported next year.

Building Fund Appeal.—Contributions and donations to the Building Fund Appeal amounted to £974, as compared with £2,518 in the previous year. The total amount now raised, including promises, is £52,213. As a result of the sales and transfers of Investments referred to earlier in this Report, the amount now required to free the recent extensions from debt is approximately £12,000. Large contributions to this appeal in 1939 include the following:—

It is pleasing to record an increase of £15 in the amount of Bun Penny Collections, which since 1935 have realised £696 for the Building Fund. The Committee extends its gratitude and thanks to all donors, organisers of entertainments and Bun Penny Collectors for the continuance of their kind support. It is hoped that all efforts on behalf of this Fund will be maintained in order to liquidate the debit balance of approximately £12,000.

Samaritan Fund.—In addition to financing convalescent treatment, the Samaritan Fund has assisted eight patients in obtaining surgical instruments, 33 rail or bus fares have been advanced, one patient was assisted with a temporary loan, and one child was provided with clothing before going to a Convalescent Home. The major part of the expenditure was subsequently repaid by the patients themselves or recovered from other sources. Many patients who were ordered surgical instruments were assisted by the Infirmary League, who also made generous grants to a large number of patients in difficulties over ambulance accounts. As it was possible to raise the full cost of the convalescent treatment from outside sources, arrangements were made through the Samaritan Fund in respect of twelve of the League members who were sent to the Herbert Convalescent Home.

Herbert Convalescent Home.—During the year, 93 cases were sent to the Herbert Convalescent Home, an increase of 33 over 1938. Since the outbreak of war the number of patients sent to the Home has decreased, patients preferring to go direct to their homes on discharge from the Infirmary in view of the uncertainty of events. It is hoped, however, that by the summer, admissions from this Infirmary to the Home will have improved. In addition, 20 cases have been sent to other Convalescent Homes.

Committee of Management.—Mr. Arthur Say, who was nominated by the League to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Mrs. Brinson, has been elected to the Committee of Management.

Honorary Medical Staff.—The Committee of Management acknowledges gratefully the valuable services rendered during the year by the Honorary Medical and Surgical Staff.

The Committee has to report the appointment of Dr. H. M. Boston as an Honorary Anæsthetist and the retirement of Dr. L. D. Saunders from his offices of Honorary Physician and Honorary Anæsthetist. Dr. Saunders has been elected an Honorary Consulting Physician as a token of the Committee's appreciation of his valuable service to the Infirmary since 1914.

Dr. P. B. Barker and Dr. H. M. Boston have been called up for service with H.M. Forces, and Dr. Saunders has kindly agreed to continue his active association with the Infirmary for the duration of the war.

Obituary.—By the death of Dr. A. H. Watson, which occurred on the 3rd January, 1940, the Infirmary has lost one who, during the past 20 years, gave it valued and whole-hearted support. He was appointed to the Staff of the Infirmary as Honorary Assistant Surgeon in 1920 and he became Honorary Surgeon in 1938. His charm and kindly interest in the patients and Staff are sadly missed, and his care and devotion to his duties as a member of the Medical Staff and various Committees have given benefits to the Infirmary which will long be remembered.

It is with much regret that the Committee has also to record the deaths of Dr. W. W. Ord, Canon Woodall, Mrs. W. Brinson, Mr. W. G. Lake and Mr. C. J. Woodrow.

As an Honorary Physician, Dr. Ord was a member of the Medical Staff from 1898 to 1923. He also took a keen interest in the administration of the Infirmary, serving on several Committees, including the Committee of Management, from which he resigned in 1938.

Canon Woodall was Chaplain of the Infirmary from 1888 to 1894.

Mrs. W. Brinson, until her death, was one of the representatives of the Infirmary League on the Committee of Management, and Mr. W. G. Lake served in a similar capacity some years ago until compelled to resign on account of ill-health. Both were League Collectors, and their kind interest and efforts on behalf of the Infirmary produced over £4,000.

Mr. C. J. Woodrow's great interest in the welfare of the Infirmary and his kind generosity are perpetuated by the Ethel Woodrow Children's Ward.

In expressing its appreciation of the work of this lady and these gentlemen, the Committee places on record its regret that the Infirmary has lost loyal and devoted workers.

Chaplain.—The Bishop of Sherborne celebrated the Holy Communion in the Chapel on the occasion of the Anniversary Service, and we have to thank him for preaching at our Harvest Thanksgiving. Canon Quirk gave the address at the Florence Nightingale Memorial Service, and he was good enough to help the Chaplain on two other occasions. The Chaplain is very grateful for the help of the Nursing Staff in carrying on the various Ward Services. Our thanks are again due to Mr. Stanley Sutton for his kind services as Honorary Organist and Choirmaster.

Retirement of Miss Bishop.—The Committee has to report with regret that the Matron, Miss A. M. Bishop, retired from her post during the year on account of ill-health. Miss Bishop had been Matron of the Infirmary since 1928, and during the difficult years which followed her appointment she carried out her duties with conspicuous success. Her splendid organising abilities resulted in over £3,000 being raised for the Building Fund by the Nursing and Domestic Staffs. As a token of appreciation of her work, a presentation of a Silver Casket and a cheque from the Members of the Committee of Management, the Honorary Medical Staff and friends was made to Miss Bishop with wishes for a speedy return to good health and a happy retirement.

Miss E. M. Baker, Assistant Matron of the Royal South Hants and Southampton Hospital, was appointed to succeed Miss Bishop, and she commenced her duties in July. Miss Baker, who received her training at Guy's Hospital and Middlesex Hospital, London, also held nursing appointments at Birmingham General Hospital, St. Chad's Hospital, Birmingham, and the Royal South Hants and Southampton Hospital.

Nursing.—In July, 1939, Miss Doody left the Infirmary after eight years, during which time she filled various posts on the Administrative Staff, including Deputy Matron during the illness of the late Matron, Miss Bishop. We send to Miss Doody our good wishes for happiness in her retirement. Miss Mytton, appointed Assistant Matron in July, was trained at Bristol General Hospital, and during her four years at the Infirmary has held consecutively all available posts on the Administrative Staff. We wish her a long and happy term of office in her new appointment. Miss Wainwright, Sister of Beatrice Ward, relinquished

her appointment on her promotion to Sister in charge of a new maternity unit at Stockport. The good wishes of her many friends and colleagues in Salisbury will go with her.

On the eve of war, Miss Edwards, Miss Lever and Miss White— Sisters of Ethel Woodrow, Private Patients' and Bartlett Wards respectively—were called up for emergency war service, and have since been serving on Home Ambulance Trains.

During the past year over 150 members of the Auxiliary Nursing Services have completed their fifty hours' training in practical nursing in the Infirmary. The willingness of the British Red Cross and St. John Nurses to help in either nursing or domestic duties during emergencies, has been particularly appreciated.

Members of the various Girl Guides Detachments in Salisbury have given most welcome help in the female wards on certain evenings in each week.

We should like to express our gratitude to Dr. Saunders, Mr. Conroy Dixon and Dr. Taylor-Young, who have again lectured to the student nurses, and to Dr. Monnington and other members of the Honorary Medical Staff for their kind attention to the sick staff.

In April the Melksham Cottage Hospital became affiliated to the Infirmary for the training of probationer nurses.

South Wilts Needlework Guild.—The Committee is pleased to again record its gratitude to the South Wilts Needlework Guild, which this year presented to the Infirmary 835 articles, including 76 blankets. The continued kind support and interest of the Guild is greatly appreciated.

Hospitals Supply Depots.—As a result of the excellent work of the Hospitals Supply Depots several thousands of articles have been sent to the Infirmary. Plaster Bandages, Swabs, Sponges, Babies' Cots and Babies' Lockers are some of the many necessities which have been made by ladies at the Depots, and to Mrs. Freeth, Miss Wilson-Fox and their helpers the Committee extends its grateful appreciation of their services for the Infirmary.

Patients' Library.—Thanks are again due to the members of Salisbury Branch of Toc H for their organisation of the library, which is so much appreciated by the patients.

Egg and Pound Week.—Many gifts of eggs and groceries were received as a result of the Egg and Pound Week which was inaugurated this year also by members of Toc H, whose further interest in the welfare of the Infirmary is warmly appreciated.

Reconstruction and Extensions.—The scheme of reconstruction and extensions to the Infirmary commenced in 1934, was completed during the year, and all Departments of the enlarged Infirmary are now in occupation.

Harcourt Coates Ward Balcony.—Dr. E. T. Fison's great interest in the welfare of the Infirmary was further evidenced during the year when he generously defrayed the cost of providing Glass Screens for the balcony of the Harcourt Coates Ward. The Committee extends its gratitude to Dr. Fison for his continued kind support.

Private Patients' Department.—The new Private Patients' Wards were opened in June and 143 patients have been admitted. The service afforded in these wards is greatly appreciated by the patients and there is a good demand for beds.

Acknowledgments.—To the numerous friends upon whom the Infirmary is dependent for its reputation, its work and its support, the Committee expresses its gratitude and thanks for their service and assistance.

The kind help and loyal services of the following are also gratefully acknowledged:—

The Matron's Working Party, who made 1,125 articles during the year. Mrs. Forester for her continued kind interest in the Beatrice Ward.

The Misses Weedon for their assistance in the Housekeeping Department.

Lady Janet Bailey for kindly allowing the Nurses to spend half-days at Lake House.

Miss E. M. Bennett, J.P., and friends, who have kindly promised accommodation for increased emergency staff.

Donors of money and gifts in kind to the General and Building Funds, and to the Matron's Christmas Appeal.

The Women's Institute for the weekly supplies of produce from their Market Stall.

The members of the Salisbury Rotary Club for providing transport for patients in special cases.

The Churches, Chapels, Women's Institutes, Mothers' Unions, Schools, Girls' Clubs, Girl Guides, Brownies and other Associations for supplies of eggs, fruit, vegetables and provisions, received from Harvest Thanksgiving Services, and throughout the year.

The organisers of Concert Parties and Entertainments, which have been greatly appreciated by the patients.

The Press and its representatives for their co-operation and assistance during the year.

The Honorary Auditors and Honorary Solicitors for their services and helpful advice.

Administration.—As a result of Emergency conditions, a great deal of work has been thrown on the Administrative Staff during the past year. We record our appreciation of the efficient manner in which the Secretary-Superintendent, Mr. John Williams, has carried out his work and these additional duties.

Conclusion.—In concluding its Report, the Committee of Management pleads for that continued and increasing public support without which it cannot hope to meet its great responsibilities.

Every effort is being made to improve the financial position of the Infirmary, and, as mentioned earlier in this Report, the deficit on the Accumulated Revenue Account at the 31st December, 1938, has been liquidated and the Building Fund overdraft substantially reduced. Friends and supporters will appreciate that it is in the best interests of the Infirmary that in such difficult and uncertain times it is essential that our liabilities should be reduced to the absolute minimum.

The sale of the Infirmary's investments for the purpose of improving the financial position cannot, however, be continued. It is only by the ever increasing financial support of the public that the seriousness of the present position can be relieved, and the Infirmary enabled to meet the heavier demands which are constantly being made on its services.



PRIVATE PATIENTS' DEPARTMENT.

Admission of Patients.—The Private Wards of the Salisbury General Infirmary are provided for the admission of suitable patients who, while ineligible for the general wards of the Hospital, and unable to afford the fees of a nursing home, can pay appropriate fees for maintenance, nursing and medical attendance. (Admission to the general wards is now limited to patients whose incomes do not exceed £300 per annum.)

Every patient admitted to a private ward must be recommended by his or her own medical practitioner, subject to the income limits.

Patients may be attended in the wards by any registered general medical practitioner whom they may select. Any consultative opinion, operative treatment or specialist service that may be required shall be rendered by a member of the Hospital Staff, or by some other consultant, agreed to by such member of the Hospital Staff.

Maternity cases are eligible for admission.

Mental or infectious cases cannot be admitted.

Visitors are allowed daily between the hours of 2.30 and 4.30 p.m., and 7.30 and 8.30 p.m., subject to the consent of the medical officer in charge.

In the event of no private ward being available for a patient requiring immediate admission, the patient will be admitted to one of the general wards of the Infirmary and transferred to the private wards as soon as a room becomes vacant—usually within one or two days. In such cases maintenance fees will be charged in retrospect.

Applications for beds will be made to the Sister-in-charge by the medical practitioner in charge of the case.

Income Limit.—Patients will be eligible for admission to the private wards subject to the following income limits:—

Single persons with income not exceeding £300 per annum.

Man and wife with income not exceeding £400 per annum.

Man, wife and one child with income not exceeding £475per annum.

Man, wife and two children with income not exceeding £550 per annum, and thereafter, with an addition of £50 per child up to a maximum of £750.

Patients whose incomes are over these limits may, in special circumstances, be admitted at the discretion of the House Committee on the recommendation of the general medical practitioner in charge of the case. In this event the charges payable to the Hospital may be increased under the direction of the House Committee.

Fees.—The fee for main enance of medical and surgical cases will be £5 5s. per week, and for maternity cases £6 6s. per week. This includes accommodation, board, nursing, medicine, surgical dressings and the use of the theatre. Children are admitted at the full rate of charges.

Special nurses, massage, electro-therapeutic treatments, X-Ray, pathological examinations and expensive remedies ordered are extra charges.

Fees for medical and surgical attendance will be privately arranged between the patient and the doctor in charge of the case.

Accounts are payable weekly to the Secretary-Superintendent, Salisbury General Infirmary, from whom all information regarding this Department can be obtained.
