



One Hundred and Thirteenth Annual Report

The Board of Management has much pleasure in presenting the One Hundred and Thirteenth Report of the Infirmary with the Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet for 1941.

WORK OF THE YEAR.

1814 In-Patients were admitted during the year compared with 1336 in 1940. The average length of stay of each Patient was 11.9 days compared with 12.6 last year. 2553 Out-Patients were treated compared with 2230 in 1940, Out-Patient attendances numbered 8979.

FINANCES.

The Board is pleased to record that the year closed with a credit balance of £602 10s. 3d.

INCOME.

Ordinary Income for the year amounted to £18,668 0s. 6d.
Extra-Ordinary Income £70.

EXPENDITURE.

Ordinary Expenditure £16,165 19s. 8d.
Extra-Ordinary Expenditure £1,969 10s. 7d.

EXTENSIONS ACCOUNT.

The Overdraft on Extensions Account at 31st December, 1941, was £4,456 14s. 3d. Every effort will be made during 1942 to reduce this figure substantially.

CONTRIBUTORY SCHEME.

The Income from this source amounted to £6,109 12s. 0d., an increase of £183 2s. 0d. over 1940. The Board desires to express its appreciation and thanks for the very loyal support rendered to the Infirmary by the Voluntary Workers and Contributors.

NURSES' HOME BUILDING FUND APPEAL.

In response to this appeal the amount received in 1941 was £778 13s. 9d., made up as follows:—Donations £472 17s. 9d., Miscellaneous and Special Efforts £60 14s. 11d., Contributory Scheme Appeal £245 1s. 1d. The Board of Governors desire to express their warmest thanks to those who have responded so generously, particularly do they desire to place on record their appreciation of the splendid effort made by the Honorary Secretaries and Collectors of the Contributory Scheme in raising the sum of £245 1s. 1d. The Appeal is continuing and it is hoped that a further large sum will be raised in 1942.

MATERNITY WARD EXTENSION.

The Maternity Ward has been extended and now consists of General Ward—9 beds, Private Wards—5 beds, Anti-natal Room, Disrobing Room, Night Nursery, New Sterilizing Room, New Ward Kitchen. Total cost of alterations and extensions approximately £1,400.

CHURCH AND CHAPEL COLLECTIONS.

The Board is pleased to report that there has been a further increase this year and £142 12s. 3d. was raised. The Hospital is deeply grateful for the continued support received from this source.

HARVEST FESTIVAL THANKSGIVING.

This year the Hospital again received a very large quantity of fruit and vegetables; the Board wishes to record sincere thanks to all Churches and Chapels who continue to send gifts.

ALEXANDRA ROSE DAY.

A record sum of £142 1s. 2d. was raised compared with £132 in respect of 1940.

EGG WEEK.

The Egg Collection amounted to 4,196. This number was smaller than in previous years, but nevertheless it was a very excellent effort during the time when eggs are so scarce.

LADIES' LINEN LEAGUE and THE BRITISH RED CROSS SOCIETY and ORDER OF ST. JOHN.

The Board of Management are deeply grateful for the services rendered to the Hospital during the year by members of the Ladies' Linen League and The British Red Cross Society and Order of St. John.

EMERGENCY HOSPITAL MEDICAL SERVICES.

The Hospital continues to fulfil its obligations under this Scheme, although the demand on this Hospital has fortunately been far less than was anticipated. Wothorpe Annexe has been in constant use throughout the year. Burghley Annexe, though fully equipped and ready for any emergency, has not been brought into use, because the resources of the Infirmary and Wothorpe have proved sufficient to meet the present needs.

NURSING SALARIES.

Increases of salaries have been granted during the year to all Members of the Nursing Staff, pending the report of the Rushcliffe Committee set up by the Minister of Health. The Board is sure that this decision will be endorsed by all interested in the welfare of the Hospital.
