EXTRACT FROM REPORT
OF
Voluntary Hospitals Committee

Appointed by the Ministry of Health,
issued 8th June, 1921.

"The Committee are convinced that it is desirable in the public interest to maintain the Voluntary System of Hospital Management, which secures gratuitous and skilled service, both lay and medical, of inestimable value. If that system falls to the ground, hospitals must be provided by the public, and the expense of so providing them would be enormous. The wages and other disbursements would undoubtedly increase, and the payment of full remuneration to the administrative and medical staffs would at once become urgent. But the money loss to the State would be a small matter compared with the injury which would be done to the welfare of the sick for whom the hospitals are provided, the training of the medical profession, and the progress of medical research.

"The voluntary hospital system, which is peculiar to the English-speaking peoples, is part of the heritage of our generation, and it would be lamentable if, by our apathy or folly, it were suffered to fall into ruin."

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SOUTHPORT INFIRMARY

Rules 17, 24, 26 and 27, bearing upon the Nomination of Vice-Presidents and Members of the Council and Board of Management:—

RULE 17.

A Governor shall have the right to bring forward at an Annual Court of Governors, any question bearing upon the administration of the Institution, provided he or she give written notice to the Secretary not later than January 15th, of his or her intention to do so, together with the exact terms of any motion it is proposed to move.

RULE 24.

The business of an Annual Court shall be:—To elect the following Officers, viz.: A President (the Mayor of Southport for the time being shall be the President, provided he be a Governor); *Vice-Presidents*, not exceeding thirty in number, *to be selected from Governors* who have in the past rendered valuable services to the Institution, or who occupy a prominent representative position in the district; an Honorary Treasurer, an Honorary Legal Adviser, a body of thirty Governors (of whom twenty-two shall be Gentlemen and eight shall be Ladies) to form part of the Council and Board of Management; and a qualified Accountant or Accountants to act as Auditor or Auditors. Also to elect a new Trustee or Trustees as the occasion may require, and such other Officers as may be deemed necessary.

RULE 26.

Every person who has held office as a Vice-President, or as one of the thirty members of the Council and Board of Management referred to in Rule 24, shall be eligible for re-election without re-nomination, provided he or she has not rendered himself or herself ineligible under Rule 65, or ceased to be a Governor. In all other cases (except that provided for in Rule 67) every person proposed for election to the office of Vice-President, or as one of the thirty members of the Council and Board of Management, must be nominated in writing (on a special form to be obtained from the Secretary) by two Governors, and such nomination shall be assented to in writing by the Governor nominated, and the nomination paper or papers must be delivered at the office of the Secretary not later than January 15th, immediately preceding the Annual Court of Governors.

RULE 27.

It shall be competent for any two Governors to nominate for the position of Vice-President a Governor possessing the qualifications indicated in Rule 24, or to nominate for a member of the Council and Board of Management a Governor duly qualified in accordance with Rule 26 ; but the husband or wife of a Governor nominated for re-election to any office shall not be eligible, and if two Governors being husband and wife be newly nominated for election at one time both nominations shall be invalid.

Sixty-ninth Annual Report

OF THE

SOUTHPORT INFIRMARY

IN presenting the Sixty-Ninth Annual Report to the Governors and Subscribers, the Members of the Board of Management mourn the death of the Superintendent and Secretary, Mr. J. H. Cross, J.P., F.H.O.A., F.I.A.C., which occurred on the 9th March, 1940.

At a Special Meeting of the Board of Management held on the 13th March, 1940, the following tribute to his memory was adopted:—

“The Chairman and Members of the Southport Infirmary Board of Management desire to record the heavy loss they have sustained through the passing of Mr. J. H. Cross, J.P.

Mr. Cross was appointed to the position of Secretary of the Infirmary in November, 1929, and in 1932 he was made the Superintendent.

For over ten years he has never spared himself in order to further the interests of the Infirmary and has always maintained it in sound financial circumstances.

At the commencement of his career he superintended the completion of the erection of the Nurses' Home and the extensions to the Wards, and in 1934 the new Out-Patient Department was completed. Last year he supervised the commencement of further extensions to the Wards.

In 1930 he instituted the Householders' Scheme which now has a membership of over 9,000.

In 1932 Mr. Cross was elected a Fellow of the Institute of Company Accountants and in 1938 he was appointed a Fellow of the Incorporated Association of Hospital Officers.

His colleagues of the Liverpool Branch of the Incorporated Association of Hospital Officers elected him as their President in 1938, which position he held at his passing. The Board felt this election to be an honour to the Southport Infirmary.

When War was declared in September last, he prepared the Infirmary efficiently for the emergency.

His kindly and thorough interest in the welfare of the patients has endeared him to their hearts.

The Members of the Board deeply mourn his loss and tender to his widow and her family their very sincere sympathy.”

The Members stood in silence as a mark of remembrance.

RESIGNATION OF CHAIRMAN

In March, 1940, the Members of the Board accepted, with sincere regret, the resignation of Dr. S. Mewburn Brown from the Chairmanship of the Board of Management. He has been attached to the hospital for over thirty-five years, and during the past seven years has held the position of Chairman. The Members desire to record their grateful thanks to him for all the service he has rendered to the Infirmary especially during his Chairmanship and trust that he will soon regain his health and strength.

APPOINTMENT OF CHAIRMAN

The Members of the Board, on the 13th March, 1940, appointed Dr. T. H. Harker as the Chairman of the Infirmary Board of Management. Dr. Harker has rendered valuable voluntary service to the Southport Infirmary for over nineteen years and his colleagues trust that he will have a long and happy service in his new position.

PATIENTS

During the year under review, 3,093 cases were admitted as In Patients and 7,323 new cases were treated as Out Patients, giving a total of 10,416 Patients. The daily average beds occupied were 134 and the average days' treatment for each patient was 16.04.

MOTOR ACCIDENTS

The total number of motor accident cases calling for In-Patient treatment during the past year was 70, being an increase of 11 on the previous year, at a cost to the Infirmary of £506/13/2. Of this amount £212/19/10 has been received showing a loss of £293/13/4.

In addition, during the current year £264/17/10 has been recovered for previous arrears, making a total received during the year of £477/17/8.

Under Section 16 of the Road Traffic Act, 1934, which came into force on the 1st January, 1935, a sum of 12/6 is recoverable from the person using the car at the time of the accident, in respect of each person first treated at a Hospital.

The number of patients receiving emergency treatment was 166, being an increase of 39 over the previous year, and the sum of £66/5/- has been received from 106 of these cases, leaving 60 cases still outstanding, amounting to £37/10/-.

THANKS TO THE HONORARY MEDICAL, SURGICAL AND DENTAL STAFFS

The Members of the Board desire to accord their grateful thanks to the Members of the Honorary Medical, Surgical and Dental Staffs for their devoted and efficient service in the interests of the patients, for their lectures to the Nurses in training, and for their co-operation and help in the administration of the affairs of the Hospital.

NURSES' STATE EXAMINATIONS

The results in the State Examinations for Nurses by the General Nursing Council remain exceedingly good. Five Nurses passed their Final Examination. Eight Probationers passed their Preliminary Examination. The Sister Tutor is to be congratulated on such satisfactory results.

EGG COLLECTION FROM SCHOOLS, &c.

Special thanks are again due to Mr. Tom Anderton, J.P., the Hillside Fruit Stores, the Southport Co-operative Society, Messrs. J. Leigh and Sons, Mr. E. W. Raynor, Mr. W. Howard, Messrs. W. Sawyer and Son, also to the Local Education Authorities, the Teachers and the Scholars in the Local Schools and those in the surrounding county areas and Formby, for their valuable help in connection with the collection of 28,306 eggs.

The value of the eggs collected represented the sum of £206/7/11.

INFIRMARY SUNDAY COLLECTIONS

This Fund amounts to £476/11/1, a decrease of £87/15/4 compared with last year. The Board is grateful to the Clergy and Ministers for their continued support to the Infirmary.

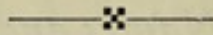

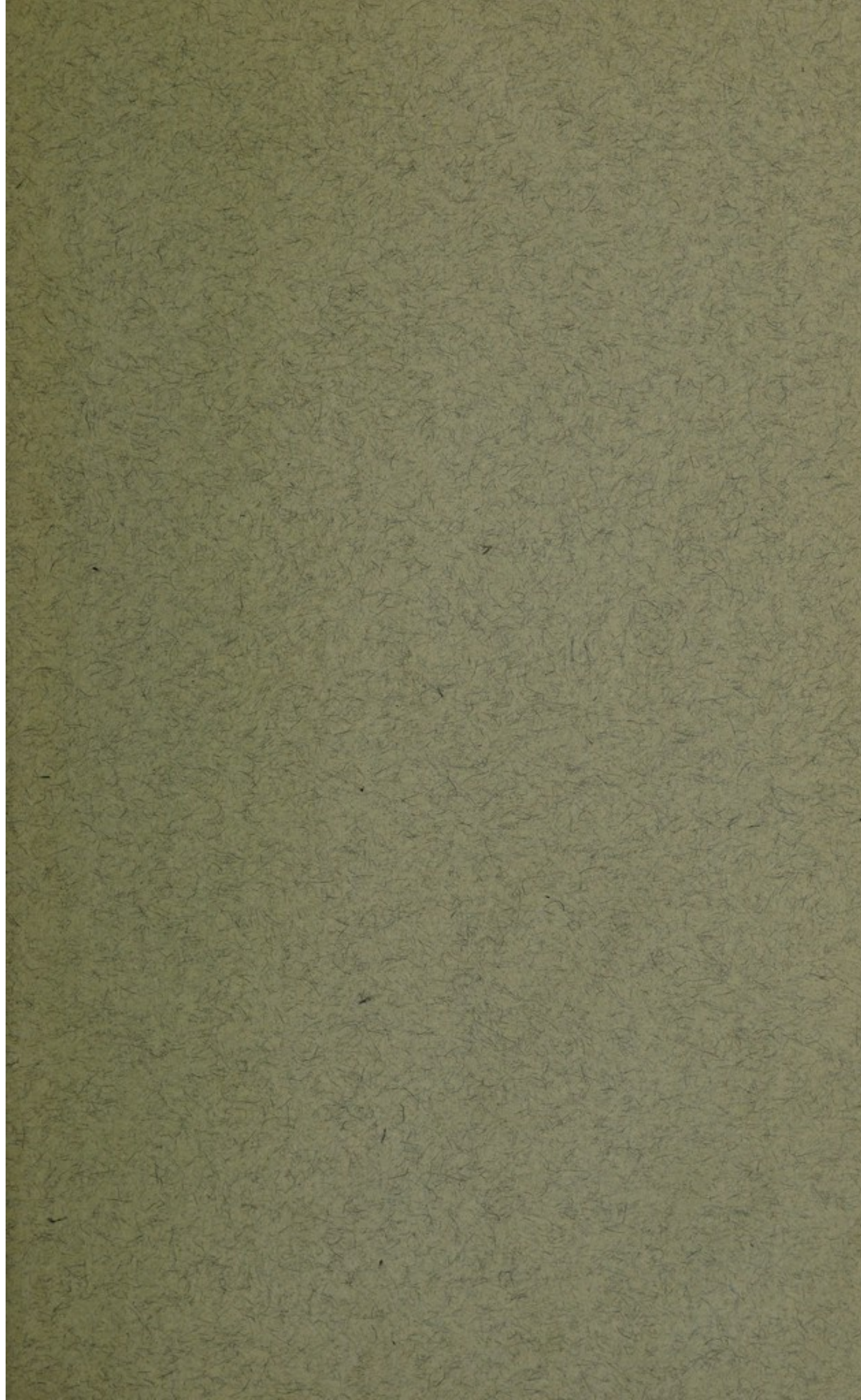
